## 'Choice' plan unveiled for Novi schools

BY SUZANNE HOLLYER

Novi school officials took "choice" one step further for district students at a Thursday Board of Education meeting.

A schools of choice committee recommended a plan that would allow parents to enroll their children in any school in the district. A new requirement would put transportation in the hands of the district.

Under state law, school districts are required to implement a schools of choice plan or allow voters the option of having one in an election.

A committee working for Novi schools recommended the district follow the state plan, including the transportation requirement. In the past, Novi students have been permitted to enroll in any elementary school when they enter the district in kindergarten. Transportation has been left up to the parents.

The new plan will put transportation in the hands of the schools. something Superintendent William

"So schools of choice is a solution to what, we asked. Our feeling is most parents made their choice of schools when they moved to their neighborhood."

Barr expects to cost very little. Barr said the schools already have shuttle buses transporting students around the district for special programs. If many students participate in open enrollment, then transportation costs could go up, Barr said.



According to police reports, the man was jumped from the rear as he was walking to his vehicle. He was reportedly shoved to the ground by a suspect who threatened to shoot him, then took his wallet and fled on foot.

The victim told police that, after the unknown suspect shoved him to the ground, he sat on the victim's back and said "I have a gun and will kill you. Give me your money." He then reportedly pulled off the victim's coat and searched it, then began to walk away.

The victim told police that he got up, ran to the suspect and punched him in the face. The suspect then allegedly pushed him back down to the ground and struck his face against the pavement, knocking out two front teeth. He then reportedly searched the victim again, and found his wallet in his pants

At that point a witness drove up. The witness, a Wixom man, said he arrived at the Novi Hilton and was driving through the parking lot when he saw the victim lying on the pavement, the suspect standing a few feet away.

The witness told police he stopped and asked what was going on. The suspect reportedly said the victim fell and he was trying to help

The board last year rejected plans to institute Japanese and strings music lessons into district curriculum

Board delays lacrosse decision year are expected to begin next month.

Byers asked board members to address the lacrosse program as a financial issue, rather than as an issue of possible student injuries. "That's not fair to the game or the kids," he

said, adding that football would never have been brought to public schools if possible injuries were the only consideration.

"Out of the budget will come do we or don't we do lacrosse," Byers said.

Board Secretary Craig Foreback said he is concerned about the availability of space for another sport on district athletic fields and in gym lockers. A consultant has been reviewing the needs of Novi High School facilities.

After a school board discussion about lacrosse, eighth-grade student Ron Witechowsky said he was left with the feeling the school board will not institute a lacrosse program. Witechowsky said he has played lacrosse since Novi Community Education began offering the program in April 1991.







The Novi Police Department does that better than anybody around, according to statistics handed out recently by Police Chief Doug Shaeffer.

In 1991, Novi police made more arrests on drunk driving charges than almost any other department in Oakland County. In fact, with a total of 403 arrests. Novi was beat out for top honors in this category only by Troy (450 arrests) and the Oakland County Sheriff's Department (977 arrests).

Well, the sheriffs department ought to be higher. Not only does it cover a great many communities in Oakland County, a much larger land area with a much larger population, it also has a special alcohol enforcement squad dedicated to precisely this job. The alcohol enforcement team targets areas of the county known to have drinking and driving problems and then makes special ment as well.







According to the February 1992 issue of Connoisseur, in 1990, at Sotheby's London, the Romanov imperial cellars were finally auctioned, 73 years after Czar Nicholas II and his family were murdered by the Bolsheviks.

Approximately 13,000 bottles were sold for a total of \$1,074,544. Those who garnered highest bids included a Swiss who paid a record \$12,705 for three bottles of 1891 Port. Why?

A link with history, perhaps. Tasting something remarkable? That could be, since this bottling was fit for

While the Ann Arbor WineFest can't promise wines of this stature, they do contend that some of the area's finest wine collectors have dug deep into their cellars for some rare bottlings to keep the paddles raised at this year's event.

Ed Sbragia, Beringer Vineyard's winemaster is the 1992 auction honorary chairperson. WineFest attendees will have the opportunity to meet Sbragia and to sample an array of Beringer wines.

Over the past several years, we've recommended many of Beringer's Knights Valley wines as Wine Selections of the Week. Recently, we had the opportunity to sample a vertical of Beringer Knights Valley Cabemets from the 1980s and were impressed at their ageability given their modest release price modest, that is, by current Napa Valley cabernet sau-

vignon prices from many producers. Knights Valley is a small appellation 17 miles north of the Beringer Winery In St. Helena. Flanked by Alexander Valley to the north, this small area is widely recognized for premium cabernet sauvignon and sauvignon blane because the microclimate and gravelly soils are ideally suited to the varietals.

Although the Beringer family planted grapes in Knights Valley in the 1960s, the region's name didn't appear on a Beringer label until 1974. The winery was so enamored with the fruit emerging from this region that it, in concert with other growers in the region, petitioned for the establishment of a new appellation. Knights Valley was granted this status in 1982.

The following is a sampling from our tasting notes referring to Beringer Vineyard's Knights Valley Cabernet Sauvignon produced a 100 percent varietal.

1982: "Inherent to all Knights Valley cabernet sauvignons is a rich, ripe berry flavor - almost reminiscent of raspberries," commented Winemaster Sbragia. We agree. Age has added a significant bottle bouquet and aromas of black cherries, blackberries with fragrant spicy oak. Almost 10 years after the vintage, the wine is hanging in there with abundant soft fruit and good balance.

1985: "The Knights Valley vineyard is characterized by low-yielding, rocky soils producing fruit of rich, cassis-berry flavors and good acidities," Sbragia remarked. This wine is elegant, refined and aging gracefully with mature blackberry and black cherry fruit and an appealing herbal background.

1987: Exuberant black cherry aromas, spicy oak with dusty, smoky hints. Finesseful yet powerful fruit is accented with hints of black olives and a delicious lengthy finish.

1988: This wine mirrors the same attractive fruit

## Nix the mix

### Homemade concoctions can replace 'conveniences'

By RICK BYRNE

Progress brought us indoor nlumbing, and modern conveniences to free us from the kitchen, or so they fold

But who really thought of the kitchen as a prison anyway? Probably the same people that think the invention of Hamburger Helper is progress.

In truth, the development of pre-mixed, pre-cooked and instant foods has benefited the modern home cook. Instant foods from a mix have a long shelf life and quality control is improved when compared with homemade (have you ever heard of anyone burning Kraft Macaroni & find it)

Unfortunately, there's a tradeoff. Nutritionists are getting the word out that packaged and prepared foods are often high in fat, sodium and cholesterol. In addition, environmentalists point out that packaging used to both contain and market the items are a liability in the solid

Though instant foods are sold on the premise that they are economical and convenient, a little experimentation shows that the economics favor homemade, and the time savings is negligible.

Witness the recipes we've included below. Most require only a couple more ingredients than their instant counterparts, and an extra preparation step or two, often at a significant cost savings. None require any fancy cu-

Oh yeah. We nearly forgot. The real thing tastes better, too. That still counts for something, doesn't it?

If you've ever mixed ketchup, mayo and relish together optional nuts. to make your own Russian dressing (add a teaspoon each of horseradish, worcestershire and grated onion to make it really special), or sliced your own potatoes for french fries, you've taken the first step towards ridding your kitchen of bottles, boxes and polypropylene bags.

Try some of these recipes and nix the mix.

#### **TACOS**

Well, this is one place the major corporations may have the time factor licked. There isn't much easier than browning meat in a skillet, zipping open a packet of Torito Grande or whatever, and simmering.

Or is there? Though you'll need some time to mince garlic for this mixture, you could use the kind in a jar. Also, this taco seasoning recipe needs no simmering. Just cook through and you're ready.

heart: Italian oregano substitutes just fine for Mexican, not over and you'll find uses for cumin once you've tried it.

And by making your own, you cut out a lot of the monosodium glutamate, preservatives and stabilizers.

## Meal description sounds great across ocean



A wonderful letter arrived Tuesday from my dear sister Elizabeth, who was spending 10 days in Paris on a job assignment. I want to share it with you because of its beautiful description of a meal that she had just eaten. Liz is a fantastic cook in her own right. And, as you'll agree, a very adept writer.

You would thoroughly enjoy Paris and should make the effort to learn a few key phrases and take the plunge into the diverse delights of Parisian life.

I write this letter to you well knowing that Chef Mary for my husband, Tom, on is busy and this may give you a reason to converse other than for necessity (since it is "show time"). This letter is somewhat urgent as I have just completed "dinner" and must record the experience lest it become but a rumbling in my stomach.

## Microwave with soup mix

dient most mirowavers take care not to run out of. It's easy to keep on hand and comes in serving-size packets just right for one recipe, adding a rich onion flavor to a variety of recipes. "Soup" mix seems a bit of a misnomer - who actually makes soup with it? One classic use is onion dip: one (1 1/4 ounce) envelope onion soup mix blended with 2 cups sour cream and served with a big bowl of potato chips.

But for microwavers, dry onion soup mix is perhaps most useful as a browning agent. Sprinkle over roasts or roll uncooked chicken in the mix before microwaving. Not only does it add a delicious oniony flavor, but it gives otherwise pale foods a glaze of apealing brown color, too.

For onion-lovers, try this special corn on the cob. Combine 2 tablespoons butter, 2 tablespoons dry onion soup mix and 1 tablespoon water. Microwave about 30 seconds, or until butter melts; stir. Arrange four ears of fresh corn in an 8X8 inch microwave-safe baking dish. Drizzle with butter mixture. Cover with waxed paper and microwave five to eight minutes, or until corn is tender.

To make a tasty onion butter, combine one 1 1/4 ounce envelope dry onion soup mix with one 8-ounce tub soft margarine or whipped unsalted microwaved vegetables; toss with hot 5 minutes before serving.



But seriously. When you make your own croutons, you know what's going into them. If you want to limit cholesterol, use olive oil to fry them. If you want to limit sodium, substitute other spice for the salt. Use a more nutritious wheat bread, or even pumpernickel if that's your taste.


