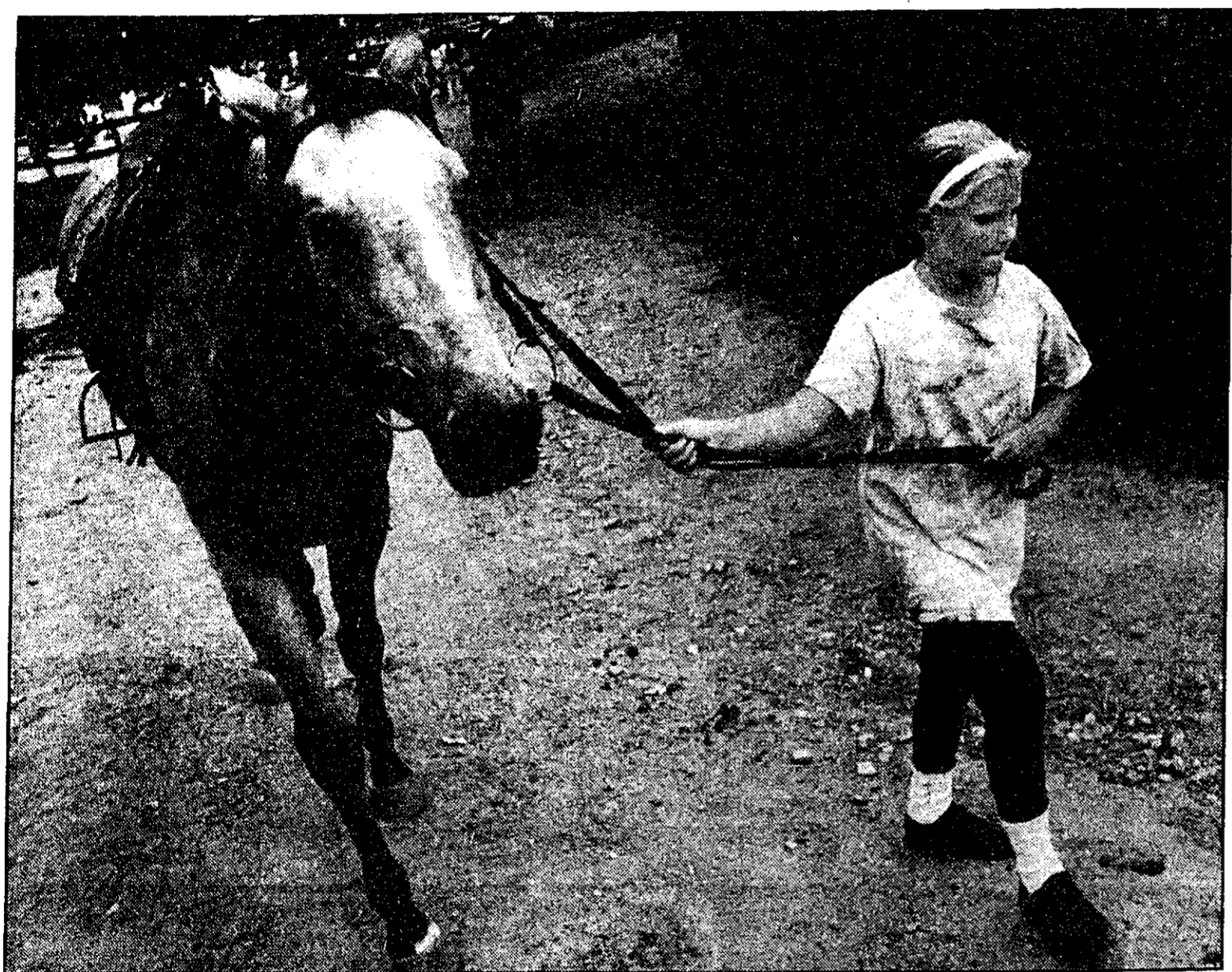

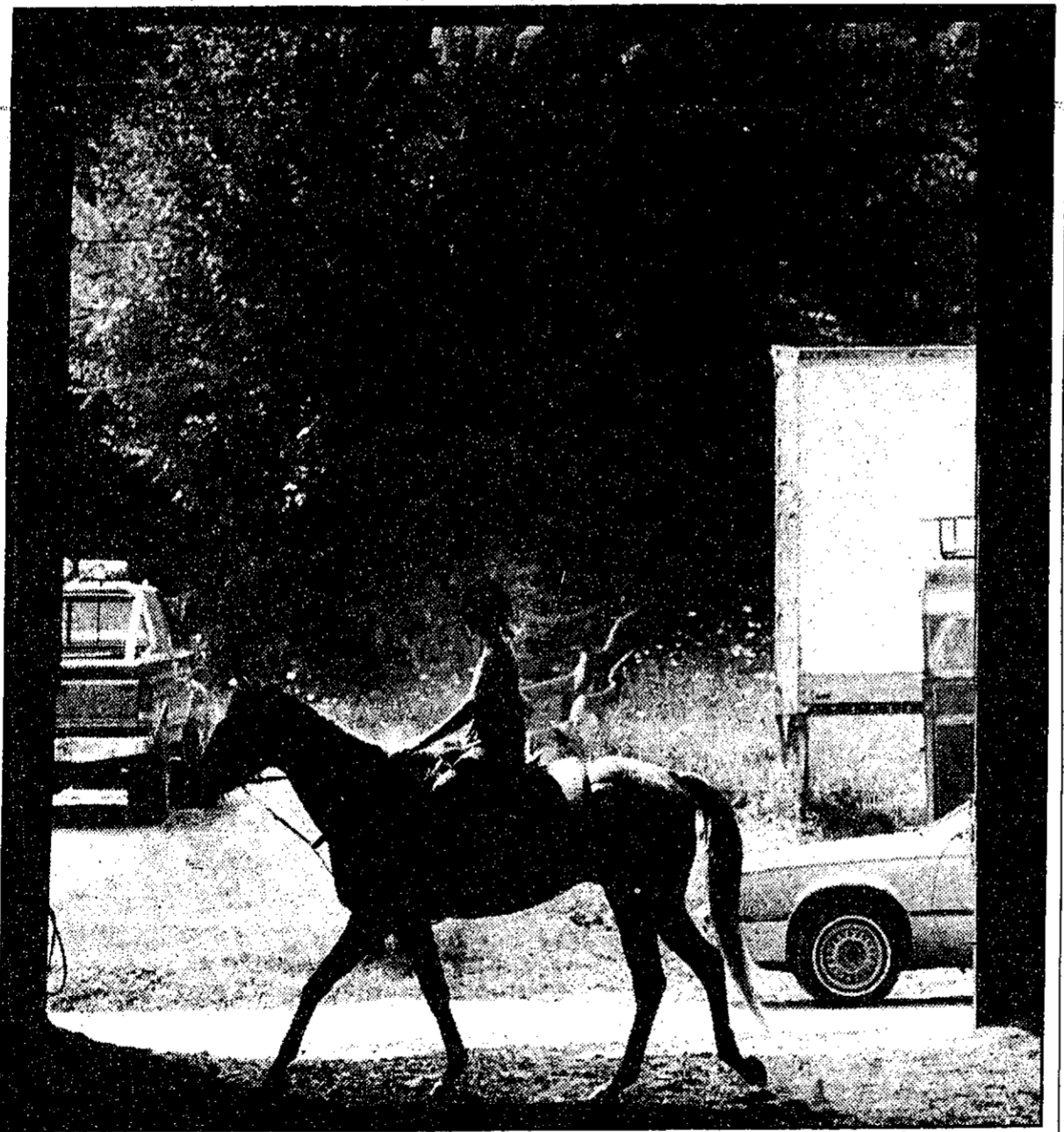

Trends paint path to a 21st century Novi

Novi's on the move — and for the most part in all the right directions. A report city planning department staffers and consultants put together — released last month — paints a picture of a city growing in development, population and a host of other factors. Novi, in fact, leads or is close to leading the southeastern Michigan area in several categories.

The city's building department confirmed that trend with its own report as well. Novi led the seven-county region in residential home construction last year, keeping city staffers busy.

"The building activity for the fis-

Cops, residents on alert for abductors

Residents in the Roma Ridge subdivision are distributing 500 warning fliers following a possible child abduction attempt in their neighborhood Sunday, Aug. 8.

Police are currently looking for the unidentified suspects, and a bulletin has been sent to police departments around the area in an attempt to locate them.

According to the fliers and police reports, two males believed to be in their 20s stopped on Roma Ridge Drive around 5 p.m. and asked two 4-year-old boys if they "wanted to go for a ride." The children ran away and went to their parents.

The suspects then reportedly fled northbound on Roma Ridge "at a high rate of speed" and probably exited onto Beck Road.

Five adult witnesses at the scene described the car as a dull red, mid-to late-1980s Camaro Z28 with a wide yellow stripe along the sides. The car was further described as poorly maintained, with a loud exhaust, dirty windows and dirty license plate. The car had a black "bra" on the front end. One witness said she believed the license may have included the letters U and M.

Novi Police Sgt. Thomas Hesse said he is fairly optimistic about locating the vehicle.

Lake Study group on hunt for funds

Ed Phelps is leading a group of 14 Novi residents who have their hands out.

Armed with a budget of precisely zero, the Walled Lake Sector Study Implementation Committee is managing to make progress by begging funds from other City of Novi committees, Phelps, the group's chairman, said last week.

"It's tough to do anything here with no money. Our main concern is to get the committees that do

have money and hopefully encourage them to contribute," he added. "Starting with nothing, I think we're accomplishing a lot."

A recent coup was the \$18,000 in Community Development Block Grant money wrangled from the Housing and Community Development Committee with City Council approval. The fund will pay for preliminary design and engineering worked needed for safety path construction along East Lake Drive and South Lake Drive. These federal

Family walks a road of tears, pain

Mrs. Carlesco, you've said that you didn't like the way the district handled this from day one. What reaction did they give you?

AFTER THE RAPE

Anna: When they told me about this, the first question from them to me was: "Do you want to call the police on this?"

I felt that that was a very uncharacteristic type of question from an official to a parent, knowing full well what had [just] happened. I was

surprised at the innuendo, the tone.

The way they said it was like, "You want to put your kid through this? You really want to talk to the police?"

Was this a school counselor?

Anna: Yes, it was.

Victoria: She was just like: "Well, whatever you want to do. It'll all be done in a month. You won't hear about this anymore. Life will go on. Vicki will get over it."

Anna: I said [to the counselor] that what concerns me was how the school was going to handle this. What will be done? That's when she told me that it would all be over in a month.

How did other school officials act

towards you?

Anna: They told me they basically felt that it was not something they could sweep under the table. For three days they [two swim team coaches] knew; they did not tell me. When she [Victoria] was starting to have real problems, that's when they called me.

It wasn't going away. If it had gone away, who knows? The question in my mind is how many times does it get swept under the rug? The unfortunate thing is that the aftermath, the reaction, the consequences — all of that is what you have to live with and it doesn't go away.

Nobody wanted to deal with it?

Decision delayed in Kevorkian case

After a meeting last week to review the death of 30-year-old Novi resident Thomas Hyde, Wayne County Prosecutor John O'Hair said his office will not decide any earlier than the end of this week whether to charge Dr. Jack Kevorkian with the felony of assisted suicide.

However, the constitutionality of the Michigan moratorium on assisted suicide remains in question. The Michigan Court of Appeals could rule as soon as this fall on an American Civil Liberties Union challenge of the new law, adopted by the state legislature in November 1992.

Kevorkian threw the gauntlet out to the Wayne County prosecutor in an Aug. 5 press conference, when he disclosed that he provided the equipment needed and was present when Hyde, in the final stages of amyotrophic lateral sclerosis — Lou Gehrig's disease — died from inhaling the contents of canisters of carbon monoxide gas.

A thorough investigation of Mr. Hyde's death requires the review of all available evidence, in addition to the statements of interested parties," O'Hair said.

The prosecutor, who discussed the case Aug. 6 with representatives of the Detroit Police Department and the Wayne County Medical Examiner's Office, explained that certain "critical aspects" of the investigation must be completed before a decision is made, including the results of laboratory tests.

These were not expected to be ready until late this week. At present, assisted suicide is a felony bearing a penalty of up to four years in prison and a \$2,000 fine. The law went into effect April 1 and unless overturned by the appeals court will remain in place until the end of 1994. At that time, a study commission is expected to report back to the state legislature on issues such as the difference between assisted suicide and medical malpractice, and encouragement of suicide and active participation.

A Wayne County Circuit Judge ruled in June that the ban on assisted suicide is unconstitutional. The lawsuit against the legislation was brought by Wayne County resident Theresa Hobbins, who is backed by the ACLU. The attorney general's office, with the support of the Michigan Catholic Conference, entered the appeal on June 2.

Neither party has filed its briefs in the case yet, but they are due soon.

Drugs sold to undercover cops

Two Novi men are facing felony narcotics charges stemming from a July 14 undercover operation by Narcotics Enforcement Team (NET) officers and Novi police.

Matthew Gilberg and Neal Fraley were arrested after the undercover officers purchased marijuana from them around 11 p.m. on Cherry Hill Drive near Park Bridge.

Gilberg faces possible charges as a second offender, police said, because he is currently serving probation on a prior marijuana arrest. During the arrests, police seized approximately \$275 in cash as well as two beepers. Oakland County Sheriff's Department Det. Lt. Beth Moranyi said the items will be forfeited under the Michigan Asset Seizure Law.

The men are currently being held in the Oakland County Jail on a \$50,000 bond for Gilberg and a \$10,000 bond for Fraley.

State rethinks Highland sound wall

Novi's plea for noise protection of Highland Hills Estates mobile home community hasn't fallen on entirely deaf ears.

After the Novi City Council passed a resolution earlier this summer seeking relief for the 200-home Highland Hills, Gloria Jeff, MDOT's Deputy Director of Transportation Planning, responded recently that the department's noise technicians will reevaluate the site and a noise wall may be proposed for this mobile home community.

Unhappy Highland Hills residents, who say they already are awakened each morning by the buzz of workbound traffic, organized in October to protest the state's ruling.

The community's management has already promised to pay Novi's 1 percent share of the cost of the sound wall, if the state agrees to build the fixture.

Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) officials have decided to take a second look at their decision not to build a noise barrier at the community, which already experiences a traffic roar far in excess of federal standards for abatement.

The results will be forwarded to the City of Novi, Jeff added, asking for patience until that time. Highland Hills is at the south side of Interstate 96 between Haggerty and Meadowbrook roads. A 1991 Environmental Impact Statement for the nearby Haggerty Connector — based on 1987 testing — found a decibel level at Highland Hills of 76.5. The Federal Highway Administration's standard for sound barriers kicks in at decibel levels of 67 or above.

However, the environmental study recommended that the approximately \$784,000 barrier not be built at the mobile home community, based on MDOT's prediction that the sound level there would go down to 73 decibels in the year 2010 due to a projected change in lifestyle patterns.

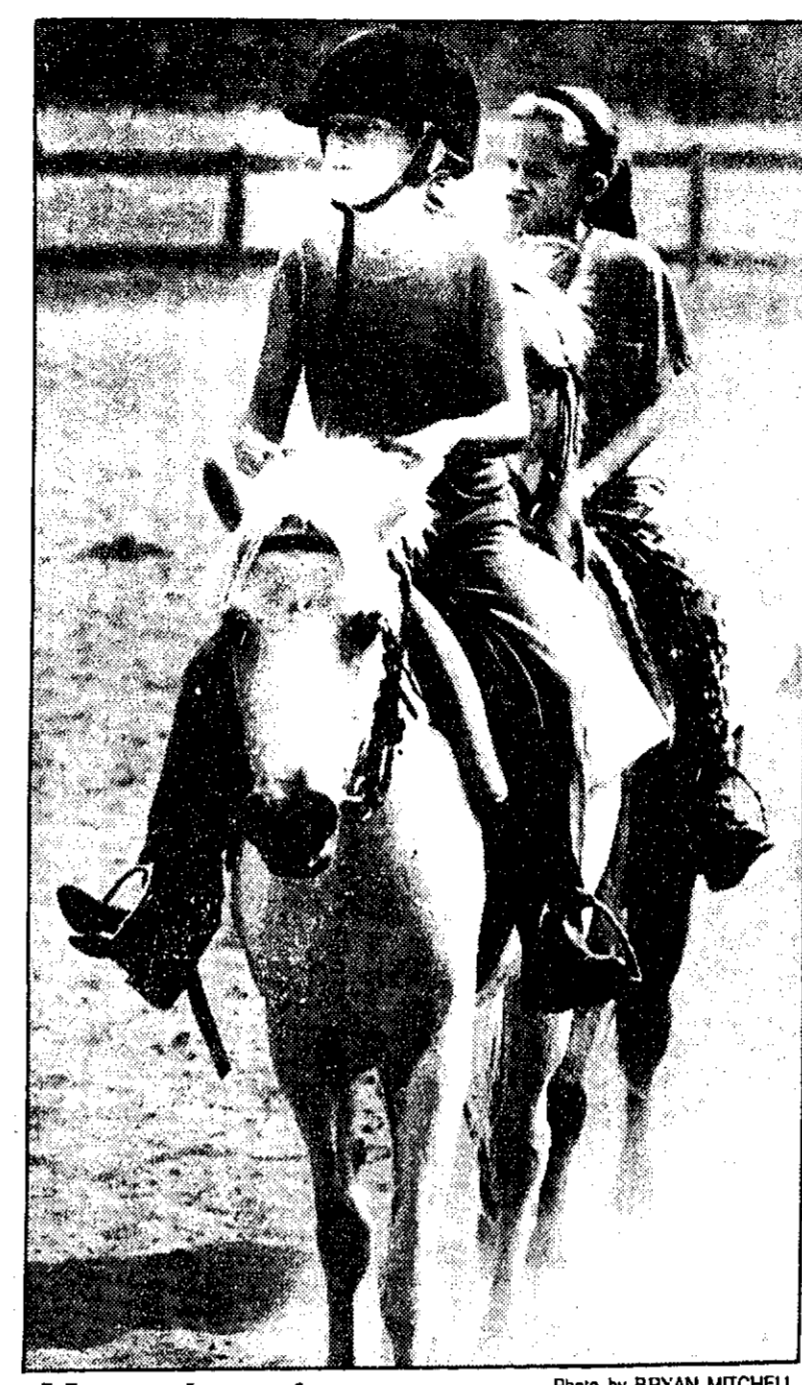

City staff to focus on cost-cutting

Guess what the acronym of New Outstanding Valuable Ideas is? If your answer was Novi, you have your thinking cap on. Which is just the sort of headgear the city hopes its staff will don when it starts up Project NOVIL.

people know about it yet. We just hope it's going to be a success, and we're eager to get it implemented," said Ferris, who will be in charge of the program if it's adopted by the council.

Over the past year, the city council has mulled cash rewards or gifts such as restaurant dinners or theater tickets for those who come up with blue ribbon proposals. Savings bonds are now suggested as prizes because that will be save the city bucks, Ferris said, adding that a \$100 savings bond is purchased for \$50.

An employee would win a plaque for paring city costs by \$100 to \$499; a \$100 savings bond for a \$500 to \$999 plan; a \$250 savings bond for cost-cutting worth \$1,000 to \$4,999 and a \$500 savings bond for brainstormers worth \$5,000 and up.

For months, both the city council and city administration have debated plans to save money which would include some sort of incentive for municipal workers who come up with all the bright ideas. (A light bulb is the symbol of the project.)

Good proposals which don't have a dollar value will be placed in one of the above categories by the committee.

A winning suggestion must save time or material, provide better policies or procedures, or increase efficiency.

Staffers check full of ideas will be steered away from one area: improvements to their own wages and fringe benefits.

Project NOVIL committee members will include Novi's personnel and finance directors, a department head and four members of the administrative staff.

Administrators won't be eligible to submit suggestions because they're supposed to do that anyway as part of their job description, Ferris explained.

America's favorite pets remain kittens at heart

The cats are taking over. With an estimated 57.6 million domestic cats to 54 million domestic dogs in the United States, cats have usurped the latter species' title of "man's best friend." Or, at least, they can lay claim to being the most popular.

Cat lovers list many reasons for the popularity of their feline friends. Besides being furry and warm and cuddly and soft, they also require less care than dogs.

Cats are usually litter trained in a matter of hours or days, while some dogs can take years to learn the ins and outs of housebreaking.

If one is planning to leave home for a few days, a cat can take care of itself if left with a proper supply of food and water. And a cat will never chase the mailman, keep the neighbors awake with its barking, or chew up your favorite pair of shoes.

There is even evidence that shows cat owners tend to be healthier than other people. Friendly physical contact with cats has been shown to reduce stress. Cat owners have been wired in scientific laboratories to test their biological responses as they stroke their pets, and it was found that their

body systems relaxed significantly. It has also been found that violent, mentally ill patients often calm down when they are near a pet cat. And in an early-1990s study of stress-related heart problems, researchers discovered that cat ownership sometimes lowered blood pressure.

Yet there are still dog lovers or, perhaps, cat haters, who dispute the value of kitties. They point to the unquestioning loyalty of dogs — their desire to protect their owners and to learn silly tricks at their master's whim.

Some are even so gauche as to point out that cats will claw up the furniture or litter your front porch with dead mice.

But in the book *Cat Watching* by Desmond Morris, many of the animals' most perplexing habits are explained and, the author points out, many of a cat's actions show an intense loyalty and love toward their human owners.

Morris, an animal expert and zoologist, spent years observing domestic and wild cats to gain an understanding of their odd behaviors.

"The domestic cat is a contradiction," he writes in the book's introduction. "No animal has developed such an intimate relationship with mankind, while at the same time demanding and getting such independence of movement and action. The dog may be man's best friend, but it is rarely allowed out on its own to wander from garden to garden or street to street. The obedient dog has to be taken for a walk. The headstrong cat walks alone."

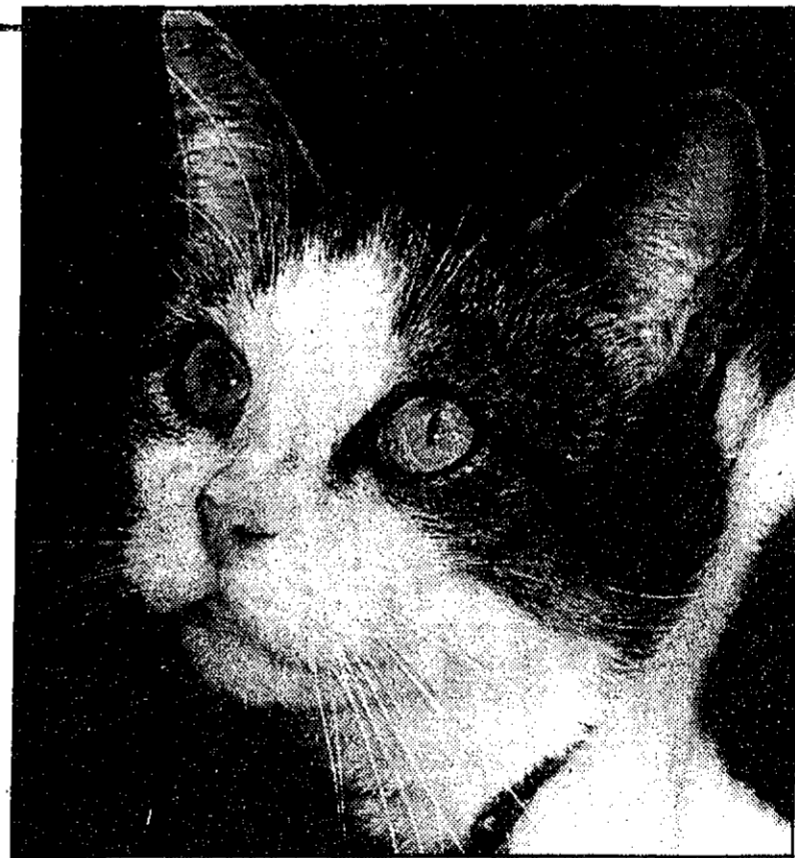
Cats, which have been domesticated for 3,500 years, live and react in a way that bounces between that of an overgrown kitten to that of a fierce hunter in the wild, Morris writes. Much of their behavior can be attributed to either of those kitty mind-sets.

For example, why does a cat purr? Most people believe that a cat purrs because it is happy, but Morris writes that cats in great pain, injured, in labor or even dying have often been known to purr loudly for long periods of time.

Purring, instead, comes from a primal instinct that goes back to the time when the cat was a tiny kitten. Kittens begin to purr when they are just one week old and it usually occurs while they are suckling. Their purring acts as a signal to the mother that all is well. The mother cat can listen to their purring and know without looking that her babies are all there and everything is fine.

When the kittens grow up, they continue to purr when they are feeling friendly and social or, in the case of an injured cat, they need care and attention.

On the last day of the festival, names will be drawn from the fish bowl and prizes awarded — prizes like a manicure, mini-facial, haircut, and hair products.

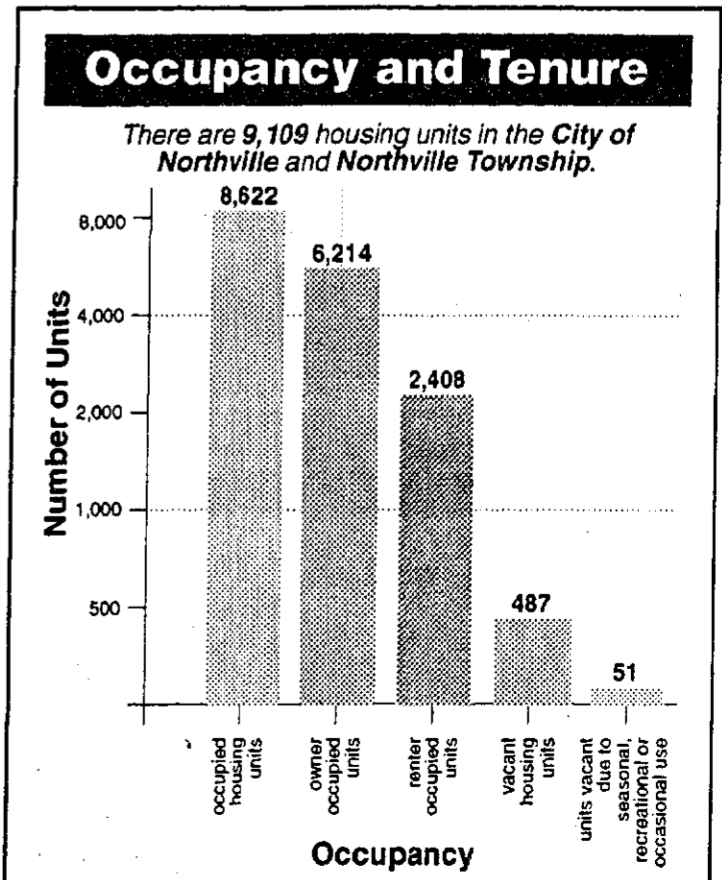
Of course if you want to buy one of the hats, you are welcome to make an offer.

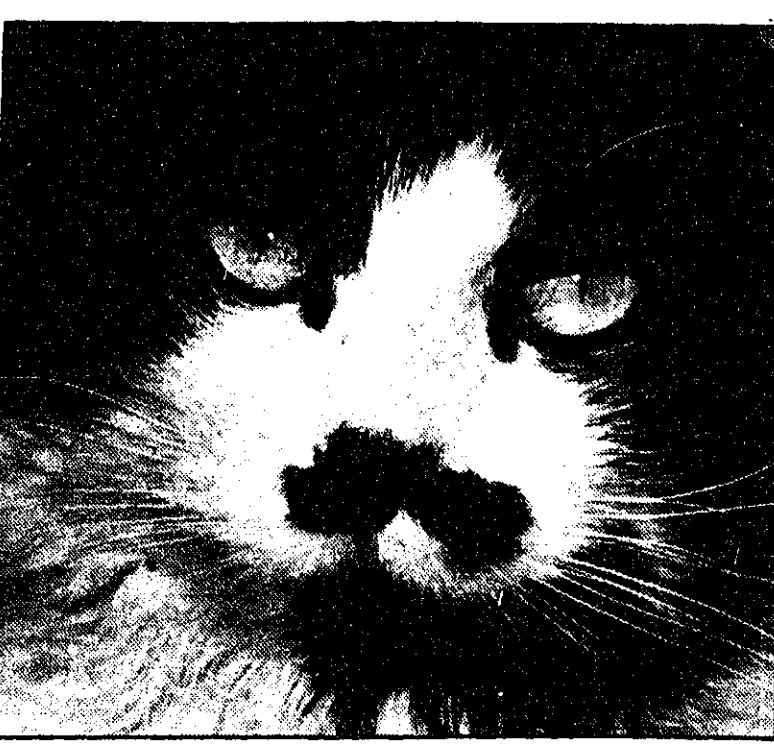

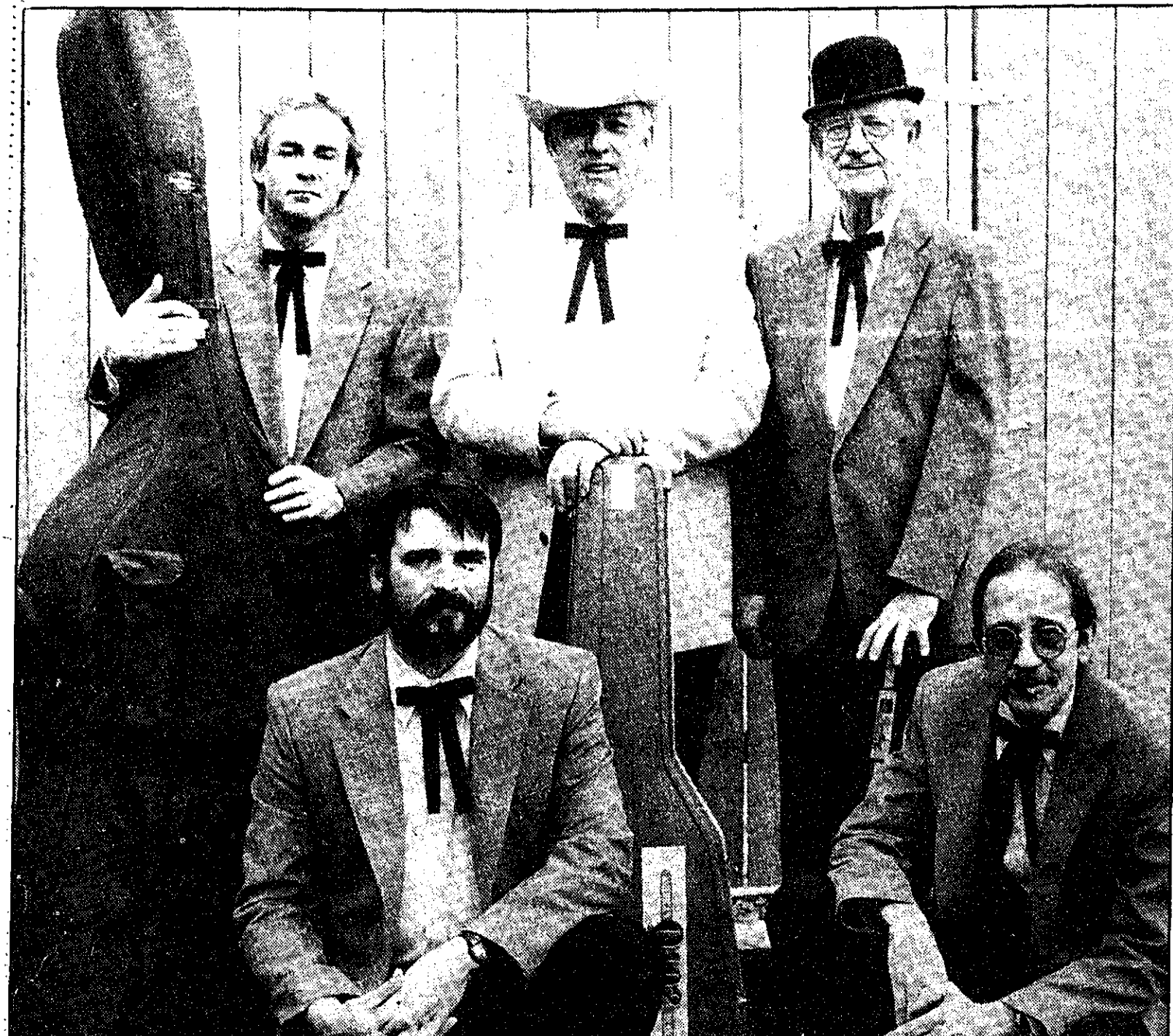

'Free Willy' offers a family film about trust and friendship

Two different worlds define our planet.

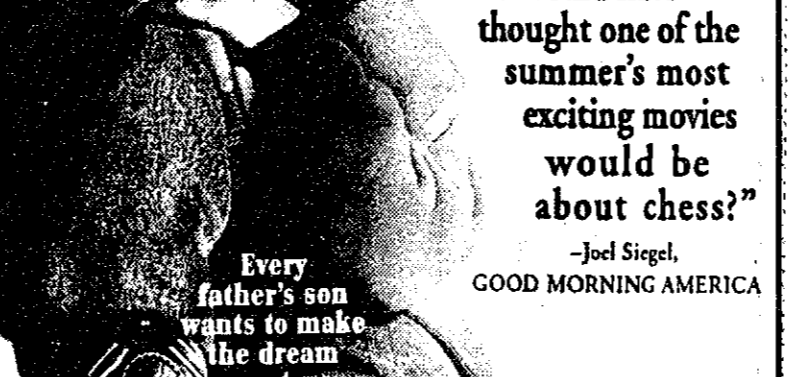

Basketball tournament to benefit cancer victim

Novi residents will have a chance to put their basketball skills to good use later this month.

A three-on-three tournament will be held Aug. 21-22 at a Marty Feldman Chevrolet in Novi to benefit cancer patient Jason Stewart. Proceeds of the event will go to help with the 19-year-old's medical bills and college education.

According to Jason's mother Cindy Stewart, who works for the City of Novi as its public information director, there is no specific fund-raising goal for the tournament.

Stewart was diagnosed with bone cancer in September of 1992. Since then he has undergone extensive treatment, including chemotherapy.

Surgery was required to remove cancer from his right femur. A major portion of the leg-bone was removed and replaced with metal rods.

"He's keeping a positive attitude," said Cindy. "It's amazing with all he's been through."

The family is hoping that the latest round of chemotherapy will provide a cure to the cancer. The treatment will conclude in November.

Jason was enrolled in his first year of college when cancer was diagnosed. Concordia College had offered him a partial basketball scholarship and he had also received grants from Schoolcraft College in Livonia. Because of the illness, Stewart lost the scholarship and grant offers.

Stewart plans to resume college at Michigan State University in January.

"He wants to get into elementary education," said Cindy.

The tournament will feature four age divisions. Youngsters can hoop it up in the 18-and-under bracket while other divisions include: men's open, men's 30-and-over and women's open.

Individual and team awards will be handed out at the tournament, which is sponsored by Marty Feldman Chevrolet, Shteld's Pizza and the South Lyon Hotel. Teams can register at the Novi Parks and Recreation office in the Civic Center until Aug. 19.

Schulter named new hoop mentor

A familiar face will guide the Green and White basketball team this winter.

"I think it helps," Schuller said. "I know these kids."

He added that he has already had a chance to work with his newly players this summer.

Team camps at Siena Heights College and Orchard Lake St. Mary High School allowed players to become more familiar with Schuller. In addition, numerous open gym sessions have given the coach a one-on-one with players on a chance to work with players.

Schuller said attitudes have been excellent during the summer workouts.

"The kids are really optimistic," he commented, "and have worked very hard. They're great kids."

Schuller will inherit a mixture of youth and experience.

Seniors Greg Bernman, Rocky Dunlap and Brian Cordsas will be back. Players like Chad Dicken,

Sean Kramer, Jason Farusov and Brian Cody are the Wildcats' future, offense will take care of itself."

"We are going to be young and small," said Schuller.

A Saginaw Valley State University graduate, Schuller was selected for the job from among some 60 applicants. He went through three interviews with various school district officials before being offered the position in June.

"It was about a month-long process," said Schuller.

While he may be a little shy in varsity coaching experience he brings a vast hands-on knowledge of the game to the job.

"I want the kids to get to know me and know my style," said Schuller. "We want to do well, be really positive and play hard."

Novi's style won't change drastically from the Shoemaker years, he added.

Dearborn tied the game in the third inning. Four straight singles brought in Sitt's first run. Then Ed Roman drew a bases-loaded walk to push across the tying run.

New York put the winning rally together in the fourth inning.

With the game tied at three, Robert Milano doubled home two runs. Two batters later, Dan Blednick crushed a fast ball for a two-run homer over the leftfield fence.

Dearborn rallied for a run in the fifth inning and looked for more in the seventh.

Building by computer

I've toured many homes over the 22 years I've been writing this real estate column. But the tour I recently experienced was different from the others.

The home was creatively designed by architect Jack K. Shaffer, AIA. It's not a huge structure, just 2,800 square feet. But the contemporary Mediterranean-style residence had some particularly interesting features.

Shaffer first guided me through a unique octagonal-shaped entrance. We then entered the living room with impressive fireplace

and loft.

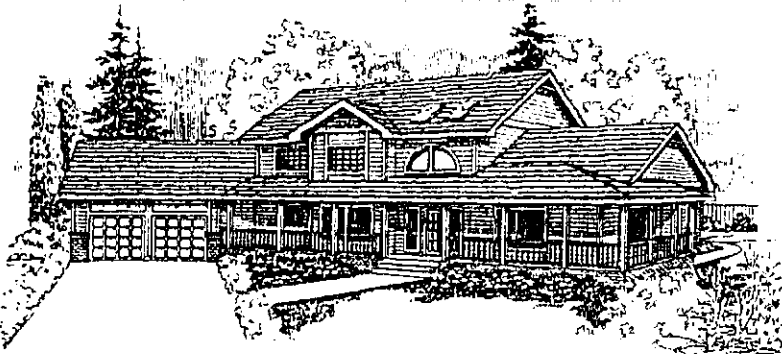
We looked down from the loft, providing an ideal perspective for considering the best positioning of living room furniture. And from this vantage point we had a captivating view of the ocean through large picture windows.

We viewed each room, from the entrance door and a point near the ceiling looking down on the room. We then looked at the exterior of the home from many perspectives — including an aerial view, as from a helicopter.

The most interesting aspect of the tour was that the home didn't

The Duchess is just another farmhouse...not!

From outside, the Duchess looks like a basic country-style home, a little on the large size. But a closer look at the exterior, and a glance inside the lofty sky-lit foyer tells you that this is no old-fashioned farmhouse.

The wide wraparound front porch is country, but the wide custom door isn't. It's flanked by sidelights and crowned, on the second floor level, by a huge haU-round window. This wealth of glass increases street appeal and combines with the skylights to create a strikingly bright entry area. Add a few potted kees, and you've got an atrium.

At the back of the foyer, a graceful polished wood balustrade curves up to reach the three bedrooms on the second floor, where a landing overlooks the foyer.

Two bedrooms have walk-in closets.

Linen storage is in the hallway, and the sky-lit bathroom has two

basins in an extra-long vanity. The master suite has a huge walk-in closet, two basins in the bathroom and another vanity in the dressing area.

Following tradition, the formal dining room is on one side of the foyer and the living room (or parlor) is on the other. But the rest of the lower level is contemporary.

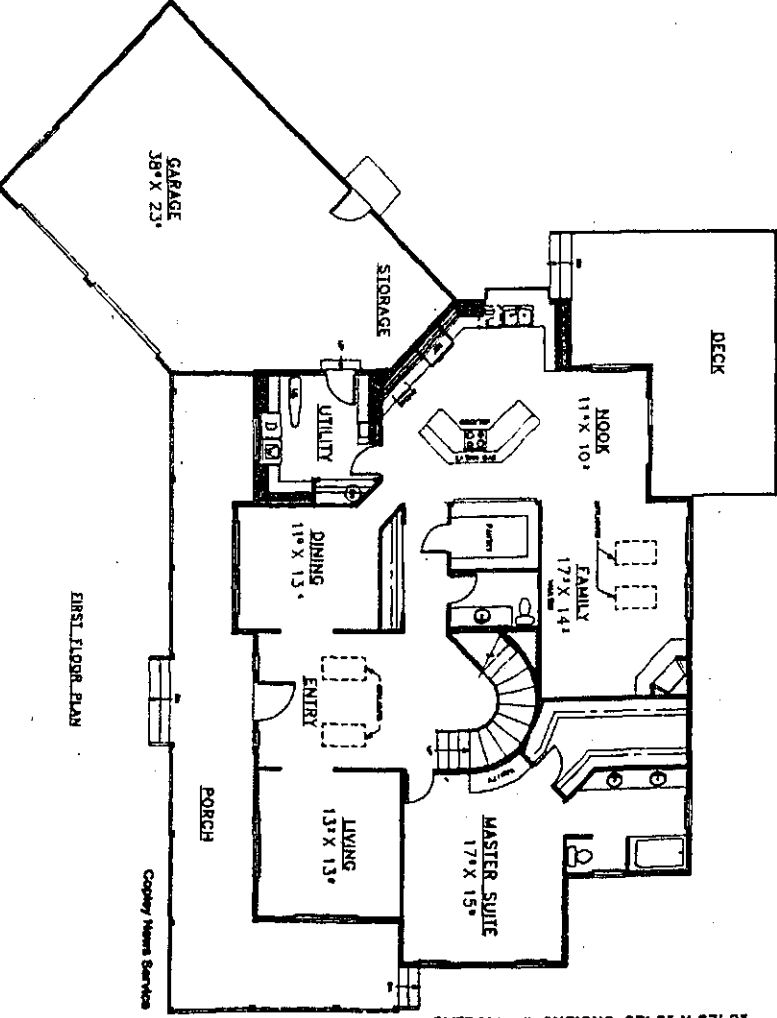
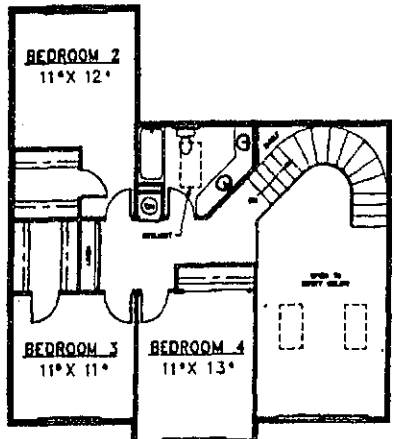
A small bathroom and a long closet are close to both the entrance and the kitchen.

The kitchen is huge, expanded by a garden window and a sun-brightened nook with a sliding door that opens onto the deck. A raised eating bar wraps around three sides of an extended work island with a centrally located cook top. Face framing on one side of the walk-in pantry provides direct access to some of the shelves.

The generously sized utility room has everything — a deep sink, fold-down ironing board, closet, counters for folding clothes and space enough to house a sewing machine. Its location, between the garage and the kitchen, is handy for hauling groceries in from the car, or shucking off messy footwear to avoid kacking carpets.

Skylights brighten the vaulted family room, and a fireplace, or wood-burning stove, nestles in the back corner.

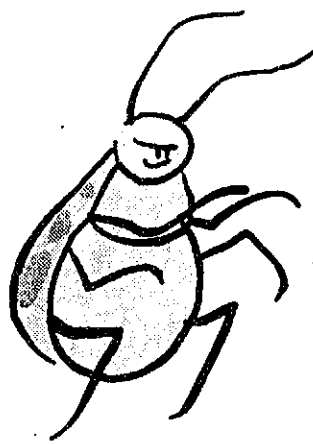


CRIMINAL: Caterpillars, AKA cut-worms, army-worms.

RAP SHEET: Mass property destruction — they eat more than their weight every day.

WARNING SIGNS: Conspicuous by their size, they can be

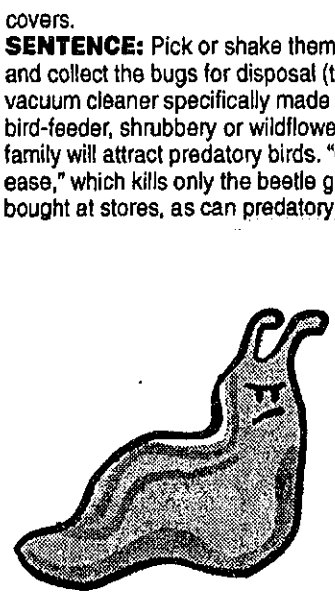
witnessed in their criminal capers. Holes in leaves or sawed-off shoots. Sentence: Wildflowers, bushes, trees and hedgerows can attract predatory birds. Cover plants with lightweight, clear plastic in early season, or buy Trichogramma, a tiny, parasitic wasp that is harmless to humans but a death machine for the caterpillars.



CRIMINAL: Japanese beetles.

RAP SHEET: Shredding leaves and blossoms.

WARNING SIGNS: Easy to spot, the beetles are about a half-inch long with an iridescent blue-green thorax and coppery wing



CRIMINALS: Slugs and snails, AKA the Munching Mollusks.

RAP SHEET: Loitering under leaves, eating plants, fruits and vegetables.

WARNING SIGNS: Look for ragged holes in fruit, leaves and stems as well as nasty slime

trails both leave in their wake. Sentence: Removing mulch (they like the moisture) or attracting predatory birds with cracked corn or sunflower seeds. You can leave a dish of beer — the snails and slugs crawl in to drink and drown. A ring of diatomaceous earth (ground-up fossilized plankton) will cut the slug's skin and cause them to dry up and die.

You reach for that perfect tomato, glowing with a firm opulence of health and taste. Snapping it off the vine, you beam at the final result of a season of intense labor. Turning it in your hand, you examine the shape, the color, the texture — the slug (eww!).

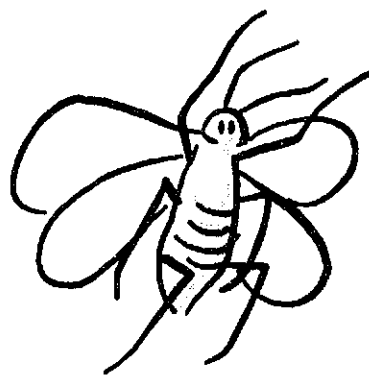


CRIMINAL: Aphids, AKA the Green Mob.

RAP SHEET: Munching plants without a permit and assembly-line breeding.

WARNING SIGNS: Yellowing, curling leaves and/or a sooty mold on stems. Aphids are very visible if you look close at the stems.

SENTENCE: Hosing down plants at least twice a week knocks aphids to the ground where predators can eat them, or you can brush them off by hand. Also try natural predators — lacewing larvae can eat 60 aphids per hour.

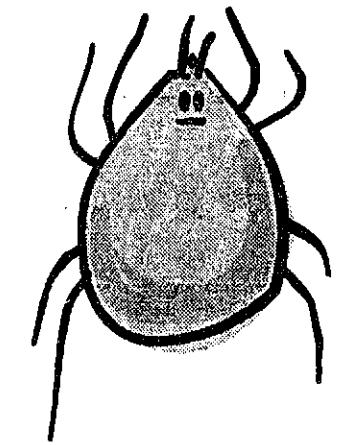


CRIMINAL: Whitefly larvae, AKA insect delinquents.

RAP SHEET: Assault on azaleas, cabbage, tomatoes and brussel sprouts.

WARNING SIGNS: Use a magnifying glass to check older leaves for larvae (translucent, stationary dots) and eggs (greenish-white pointed

tubes that hang from the leaf). Sentence: Make a trap by painting a board yellow and covering it with stickum (whiteflies are attracted to yellow) or buy a ready-made trap. Also use the same methods that stop aphids.



CRIMINAL: Mites, which are arachnids (like spiders).

RAP SHEET: Mass murder of several plants — spider mites aren't picky.

WARNING SIGNS: Small webs under leaves, needle-like holes under leaves, yellowing and falling leaves. Tap leaves over a

piece of white paper and look for tiny specs. Sentence: Keep plants shaded and moist. Use a mulch to increase humidity near plants and mist them on hot days. Spacing plants may prevent spreading. If that doesn't work, you may have to resort to insecticidal soap or chemicals for severe infestations.

Gardening for your pets

If you're a pet-owning gardener, chances are you've spent hours in hot pursuit of a mischievous cat or dog that has chewed up (or eaten completely) your favorite houseplant, garden flower or vegetable.

Instead of struggling to keep the rascals out, I suggest that you plant a garden expressly for your animal friends.

Since most animals require a certain amount of greens in their diets, it's best to provide some for nutrition purposes. This will keep them from invading your garden or houseplants.

A "pet" garden could either be a small patch or container inside, or both.

Find your pets' personal preference (you may know from bitter experience). But, in general, you can count on certain plants to appeal to your animal, such as a bit of the variety that your dog is always going after in your garden.

• Suggested dog gardens: a patch of bare soil for digging; oats — dogs love to munch on them; "dog hole" in hot weather — dogs will dust themselves with the dry soil; a patch of fescue for grazing.

• Suggested cat garden: Plant catnip, also oats.

Cats prefer the young, tender leaves of oats, so plant for successive sowings. If you plant catnip in the garden, start with a few plants in an isolated area, as it tends to take over!

A few plants will make even a stuffy old feline feel his oats and act like a kitten again!

There also are kits of "cat grass" available through some catalogs. These make marvelous presents for cat-owning friends. Some catalogs also offer containers that will sprout birdseed in the cage for your flying friends. After all, birds need their delicacies, too!

• Rabbits are much less choosy about their garden delicacies; they'll munch on just about anything in your regular vegetable garden, so plant their garden with a good mix of legumes and leafy greens.

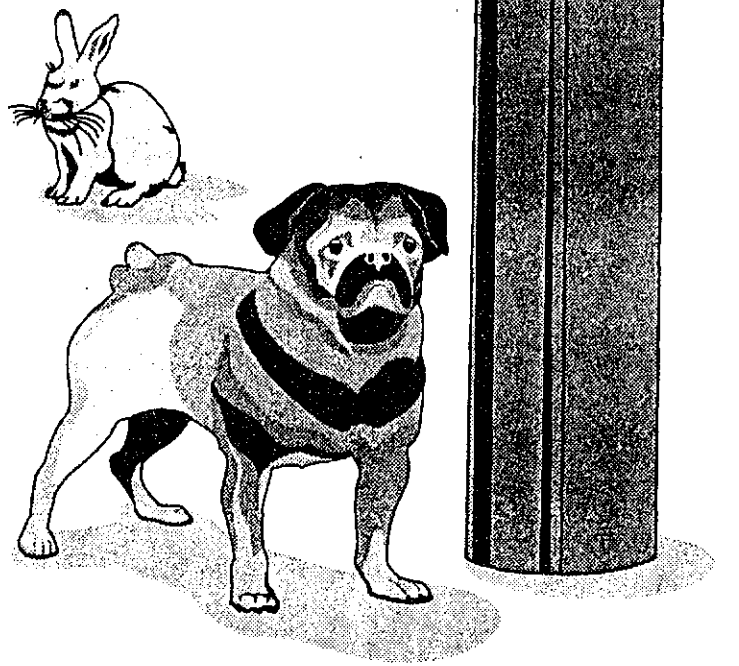

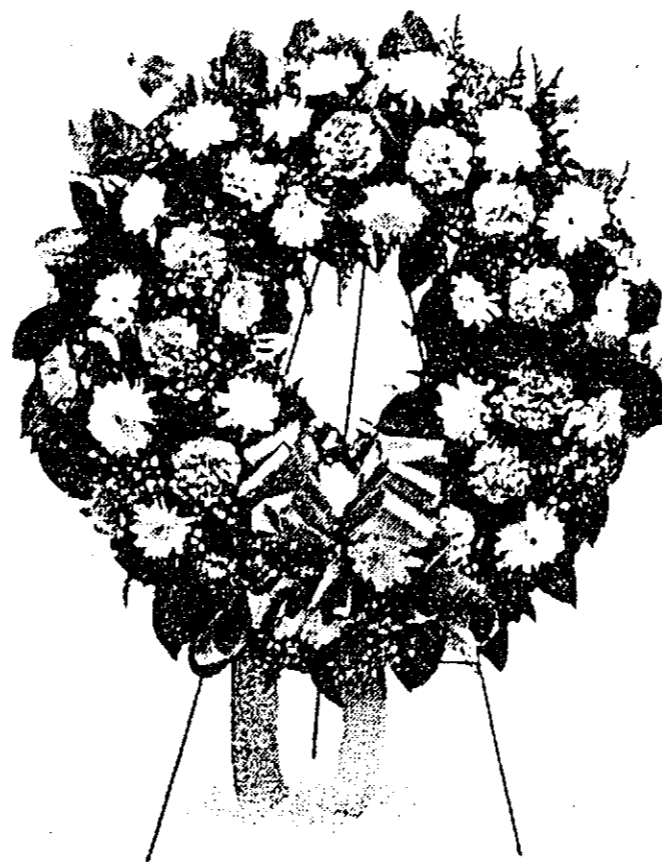

Realty firm finds Northville niche

Sometimes small is better. That's what Jerry Delaney figured a year and a half ago when he opened J.A. Delaney and Co. real estate in Northville. His hunch has proven correct as the firm has grown into such diverse areas that the breadth of service belies the quaint exterior of its quarters, a restored home at the corner of Rayson and Center streets.

Though Delaney started off managing single-family homes as income properties and condominium developments, he recently added commercial property management to his menu, years ahead of schedule.

The company coordinates and supervises maintenance and repairs, collects rents, pays utilities, insurance and taxes, and provides monthly statements for owners of income property. Peter J. Light handles the commercial side of it.

"I had some plans to do commercial management after a couple of years when I opened this company 18 months ago," said Delaney. "But I got to talking with Peter and he said why not do it now?"

Light came to Delaney a year ago, after eight years with a large commercial development firm in the area,

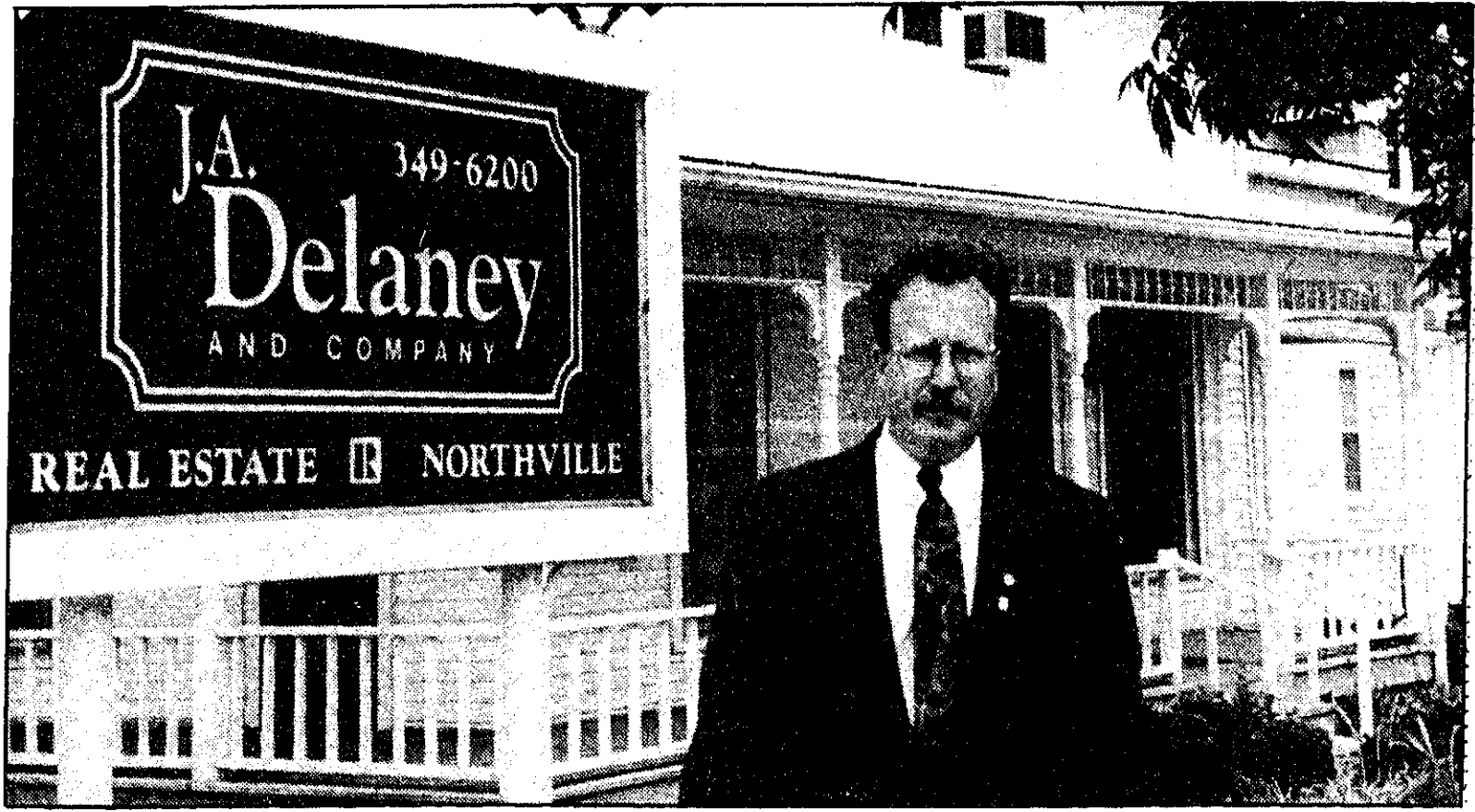

"Unlike the more conventional sites I have built on in Pheasant Hills here in Northville and Grosse Pointe, the West Main location was so steep and so deep it inhibited access and required a road to be built for the foundation engineers and their equipment and the more than 3,500 cubic yards of sand. Extensive grading, retaining walls and landscaping will enable the home to conform naturally to its wooded valley setting."

Delaney acts as the agent, while Smith does the building. Such was the case on the West Main Street home.

"I actually sold her the lot a couple of years ago, and owned the house next door," said Delaney. "She approached the new one differently. Then the Davises on the other side built a new house. Their approach was different as well. So you have three homes on this one ravine and they're all different. It was fun to watch them be built."

That Jerry Delaney should foster such a diverse company would seem no great surprise. In a 24-year career, he's worked in practically every aspect of the real estate business.
