

## Kevorkian charged for assisting Novi man

Dr. Jack Kevorkian, who specializes in granting the final wishes of the terminally ill, got a wish of his own Tuesday when he became the first person charged under Michigan's anti-assisted suicide law.

Kevorklan was arraigned for assisting in the Aug. 4 suicide death of 30-year-old Thomas Hyde of Novi. Hyde was in the advanced stages of amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (Lou Gehrig's disease) and had lost almost all muscle control,

Kevorkian has admitted providing Hyde with the apparatus the man used to take his life while he was in the back of the former pathologist's van on Belle Isle.

Kevorkian stood mute at his arraignment Tuesday afternoon before Magistrate Robert E. Costello in 36th District Court. An innocent plea was entered in his behalf. He was released on \$100,000 personal recognizance bond, a form of bonding which requires no cash payment.

Hyde was the 17th critically-ill patient Kevorkian had helped commit suicide. Previous attempts to bring the so-called "Dr. Death" up on murder charges were unsuccessful, but this is the first time he has been

charged under Michigan's ban on assisted

If convicted, Kevorkian could face up to four years in prison and a \$2,000 fine. Kevorkian all but dared prosecutors to indict him after he went public with the details of the Hyde suicide one day after the Novi man took his life. Kevorkian is known to welcome the chance to challenge the state's newly-enacted ban on assisted

Wayne County Prosecutor John O'Hair explained his decision to charge Kevorkian at a press conference Tuesday morning.

The issue of whether a licensed physican or anybody else may actively assist another in ending his or her life is a profound social and moral question which must be decisively and forthrightly addressed in Michigan," he said.


"Our state cannot continue to keep this issue on the back burner or take incomplete and inconclusive measures. If it takes a criminal prosecution or trial of Dr. Jack Kevorkian to bring this issue to full discussion and resolution, so be it."

Ironically, O'Hair said he believed assisted suicide should be legal in Michigan for terminally ill patients with less than sixmonths to live. He added, however, that it was the law, not his own views, that had to guide his actions.

The state Legislature last year passed a law banning assisted suicide, but it was soon declared unconstitutional by Judge Cynthia Stevens. Attorney General Frank Kelley, however, asked for a stay of the decision nullifying the law, and an Appeals Court panel granted his request.

The law was reinstated on Feb. 25. Though the legality of the statute is still unsettled, O'Hair said, in the meantime, the law is entitled to a presumption of constitutional validity.

## Truck hits train, driver walks away

Roy Joseph Fereskerz is one lucky man. He walked away with only a few scratches and a traffic ticket after driving his semi truck into the path of a CSX train Tuesday morning.

The accident happened shortly after 3 a.m. at the railroad crossing on Novi Road south of Grand River.

Fereskerz, 37, of Ladson, S.C., told police he was looking down at his computer for directions to Gen-Mar street when he looked up and suddenly saw the flashing train lights. He was heading south on Novi Road at the time. The train was heading in a southeast direction across Novi

Fereskerz slammed on his brakes but it was too late. He skidded onto the tracks and stalled his vehicle, just as the train bore down and crashed into the front end passenger side of the

Fereskerz's truck sustained major damage and is likely totalled, police said. Police Records spokesperson Esther McInnis said it was un-

clear what company Fereskerz works for. There was no damage to the train, and no one

in the train was injured. Fereskerz was out of his truck and walking around when police and firefighters arrived at the

He was transported to Botsford Hospital where he was treated for minor injuries and released about an hour later.

Police said that, if the train had been heading northwest instead of southeast, Fereskerz would probably not have survived the crash.

Fereskerz was ticketed for disobeying a flashing railroad signal. The violation carries a \$75 fine, according to a Walled Lake 52-1 District

Court spokesperson.

## City scales back trail system plan

In a major policy change, the Novi City Council has scrapped plans for a 33-mile-long community trail system, calling instead for a much more limited network.

Council members voted 4-3 at their Aug. 16 meeting to delete all trails planned for private lands from the city's Natural Resources Design Plan.

The Council directed city personnel to file right-of-way releases to developers and individuals who

have given Novi easements for trail segments. The move limits the trail system to public parklands and easement corridors Detroit Edison has granted to the city.

Those voting for the measure -Council Members Robert Schmid, Carol Mason, Nancy Cassis and Tim Pope — cited several reasons for doing so. Those included concerns about crime, the privacy rights of those living near the paths and their opposition to the system, as well as long-term maintenance.

## The Carlescos: a hard road back

EDITOR'S NOTE: This is the fifth in a series of articles dealing with two lawsuits filed against the Novi Community School District. The suits allege that district employees' actions contributed to the suffering a Novi High School sophomore experienced when a volunteer diving coach twice sexually assaulted her in the fall of 1987.

That student, Victoria Carlesco, and her mother Anna shared their story with Novi News Copy Editor Rick Byrne and Staff Writer Randy Coble. This is the second part of their personal account; it will continue next week.

You've told us how difficult it was to deal with this once you found out. What happened in the ensuing months?

Anna: At Christmas time. I took her to New Jersey, where our family afraid. I could feel she was going to



lives. I picked her up (from where she had run away to) and said You're going home. She was adamantly mad at me. She was

We missed the airplane. I broke down in the airport, tears in my face - I'm getting hysterical. She's at the counter with me, I'm digging my fingernails in her arm, because I'm

I'm going nuts, digging my fingernails into her. It was really traumatic, because there was another lady there - she had this little baby about the same age as I remember her (Victoria) with this little red dress

She's playing with this child, and I'm about to go over there and shake this woman and tell her You better watch out for this kid."

We got her to New Jersey. She was a basket case, my mother was a basket case. It was just like a horror

My mother was very upset. I said to her "Mother, as long as we can fix her brain we'll be fine." That was bad, but we came back

from there. She got a little bit calmer by that point. When we get back here (however), the same situation started again. We realized she couldn't go back to Novi schools. Novi was just messing her up. Nobody was helping her.

You've told us that everyone at the school knew what had happened. Did someone say "Let's do something" at some point.

Victoria: They didn't (want to) know what was going on. They just wanted to wait. As soon as they found out the police were involved, everyone's like "No way. I don't know her. She wasn't in my class. I have nothing to say."

What did you do next?

Anna: We tried finding another school I could put her into. We tried Ladywood (a Catholic private school in Livonia). I talked to the nuns over there. I begged, I pleaded with them, because her academic scores were so lousy by now (from skipping school after the incidents).

She felt like we were punishing her. The first thing I heard when she

If there hadn't been a few million for the Grand Rapids Museum, which folks around here hardly consider a state asset, the whole bill might have gone down.

Myself, I think it would be social justice to charge rock concertgoers a 6 percent amusements tax to support the symphony and maybe to bring back the Metropolitan Opera. But they declare it would be unfair and ask: What if we taxed symphony goers and DIA patrons to support rock

State Rep. Greg Kaza, R-Rochester Hills, has trouble with any governmental funding of the arts. Kaza is a free market policy wonk and no redneck. He trotted out remarks of many artistic greats in support of his view, notably novelist John Updike: "I would rather have as my patrons a host of anonymous citizens digging into their own pockets for the price of a book or magazine than a small body of enlightened and responsible men administering public funds."

But I fear the Kaza-Updike view ignores an economic reality: The works of Rembrandt and Rachmaninoss will be unavailable to Americans without government money. We had better come up with a method besides the state budget, or kiss our fine arts heritage goodbye.

Dr. John Cotant is convinced that his marriage to wife Katie was the right prescription for a perfect life.

"I'm ecstatic with the way things turned out," said Cotant, who practiced medicine for 50 years. "One thing I ask the prospective residents is what they (want to do with their lives). If what they say is to be happily married, that is the key. It's not where you go to school."

Katie Cotant reminded her husband that it took two for their 51-year marriage to click so smoothly.

"It wasn't just me," she said. "First of all, I love him a lot and secondly, I didn't think there was anything more interesting than being a doctor."

The greatest thing that ever happened to me was when I married Katle," Cotant said. "It was so difficult through the years, not being able to come home right away, working late hours . . . But Katle was always ready to do what was best for me and the patients.\*

In fact, when Cotant first started practicing private medicine in the late 1940s, often making housecalls, the patients would ask for Katie when they called the doctor's home.

She was so sympathetic they would want to talk to her," Cotant laughed.

The couple were high school sweethearts at Holy Redeemer High. located at Junction and Vernor on the west side of Detroit. Upon graduation, the two entered the medical field together - he as a doctor and she as a nurse.

"I had had a couple of uncles who were doctors," Cotant said. "I had watched them and felt they were doing good. I felt I'd like to do the same."

Cotant attended the University of Detroit from 1936 to 1939 and graduated from Wayne State University College of Medicine in 1943. He served his internship at Providence Hospital in Detroit and completed his residency in general surgery in 1949. He served for a year as a captain of a medical corps in the armed forces in the mid 1940s.

After finishing his general surgery residency, Cotant went into private practice with Dr. Frank Harrington. Their medical office was located next to Providence Hospital.

The two practiced medicine together until Harrington's death about 20 years ago.

"He was an excellent doctor," Cotant said of his former partner. "He was thoughtful and had more integrity than anyone I ever knew in my

One of the busiest times in Cotant's career was in 1967. He was practicing medicine, serving as chief of the medical staff at Providence Hospital and was a member of the board of health for the city of Detroit. At the same time his wife was heading the auxiliary at Providence.

"It was a wonderful time," Cotant

No matter how busy Cotant got. though, he would always make time for his family. Thursday was Cotant's only day off so he and the family would take trips into Canada or to nearby parks.

"A doctor is always so jealously guarding his time," Cotant said. They're so busy . . . I, for instance, jealously guarded what I could for my family.'

Before the couple began having children, Katle worked as a nurse at Providence. Shortly though, came the birth of their first son Jim. He is now an attorney residing in Gaylord.

The couple's other children include John, a cardiologist at St. Joseph Hospital in Pontiac; Julianne Raven, a schoolteacher; Kathy Cronin, a nurse; Christine DiGiovanni, also a nurse; Sue Vincent, a special education teacher; and Michael, a urological surgeon also practicing at St. Joseph's in Pontiac.

The Cotants also have 28 grandchildren.

Cotant said it was exciting to have two sons and a daughter-in-law as doctors because they always had new cases to discuss. He also continues to work with surgical residents in the surgical clinic at Providence Hospital in Southfield a few days a week.



"I've always liked younger people," the doctor said. "It's nice to be with young people. It keeps me young."

Although technology has made great advances in the field of medicine, Cotant said doctors still need to follow certain steps in making a diagnosis.

"If you do it half-way or haphazardly, it shows up in your diagnosis," he explained. "... you have to go through a logical step-by-step process and whatever conclusions you reach you have to follow that path. correct."

Cotant said he enjoyed performing gall bladder surgery because it was the most common procedure. Other surgeries were more demanding, though, like breast cancer and stomach surgeries. Today, both are less frequent because of medicine or new techniques. "He always loved doing the surge-


An understanding temperment was the key to Cotant's success.

"(A good doctor) is somebody who is thoughtful, considerate of the patient and intelligent enough to apply the necessary thought processes to make a diagnosis that is least noxlous to the patient," Cotant said.

A member of the Wayne County, Michigan State and American medical societies, Cotant said it just isn't true, at least not for him, about what they say regarding doctors spending all their time on the golf course.

"Katle and I didn't start playing until we were 50 years old," he exclaimed. "Golf is a very time consuming game. Thursdays were my only days off. I wasn't about to spend all my time on the golf course."

When a player has experienced head trauma he should receive immediate medical attention and not be allowed to return to practice or a game without permission from the proper medical authorities.

Coaches should conduct preseason meetings with players and parents to explain the risk associated with playing football.

Coaches and officials have key roles in making football safe. As representatives of the Michigan High School football coaches association we enthusiastically join forces with the MHSAA in pursuit of making the game free from serious injury.

It is a tribute to both coaches and officials in Michigan football that we are successful in providing a safe environment for the students of our schools. Safety is a prime responsibility for all of us, but pride alone is not enough to continue in our pursuit to maintain or improve our current records. We must remind ourselves to play by the rules and coach and officiate with the best interests of our participants foremost in our minds at all times.

The following are reminders for coaches:

Coaches should re-emphasize the sound, educational principles of lastic sports, particularly sportsmanship, to enhance the safety of the student-athlete.

Coaches should conduct preseason and in-season safety clinics for players. Coaches clinics should include

sessions on sports medicine and safety. Coaches should enforce existing

rules and support officials calling the infractions as they are explained in the rules.





#### FHA a viable financing option

Jeff and Tricia Janson have

been living in rental apartment They tried to find a home they could buy and finance, but nothing seemed to work out.

Finally, they found a comfortable three-bedroom older home that suited them. Financing appeared to be a problem until they learned about currently available mort-gages insured by the Federal Housing Administration.

The Jansons had almost forgotten about this decades-old form of home financing until their real estate agent brought it to their attention. For years there was such a wide difference between the

FHA maximum loan amount and the price of homes in Janson's area (and all higher priced markets) this type of financing was dismissed as virtually useless.

In recent months the situation has changed. After considerable research, it became apparent that an FHA mortgage was the only way the Jansons could swing their purchase transaction.

Most consumers, and many brokers, still consider FHA financing to be of little value in areas with high home values. The maximum loan amount is too low and prices of homes too high, they reason.

But that scenario is changing. The higher maximum amount for


For even more storage space, the Gentry 3 can be built over a basement.


Luxury amenities in the master suite include a vaulted ceiling, a large walk-in closet and a second vanity in the dressing area.



### The popular perennial

Why are perennials so popular? That's a much-asked question.

I say because they're just that- perennials - they return every season bigger and better, unlike annuals, and thereby, give you longer-lasting rewards for your gardening

For sheer beauty, perennials are hard to beat, they're hardy, easy to grow and reliable. Even if you live in a temperamental climate, have little sun and questionable soil, at least some perennials will be happy to call your garden home.

You may ask, what exactly is a perennial? A precise definition is tough, but generally speaking, perennials are plants that live for three or more years-many, like peonies, up to several decades. Perennials grow fresh tops each spring from roots and stems that overwinter in the

Most of us, when we think of perennials, think of flowering garden plants with herbaceous stems that die to the ground each winter, such as columbine or hosta.

Herbaceous perennials generally die to the ground during cold weather. Other perennial

varieties such as phlox and periwinkles have woody stems that often survive winter freezes and from which fresh growth appears in the spring.

How do these woody perennials differ from shrubs? It's a fine line, but, nevertheless, shrubs retain their entire structure through the winter, whereas woody perennials

usually die back somewhat. In addition to providing beauty to your property, perennials can solve practically any landscape problem. They come in an amazing range of foliage forms and flowers as well as all the colors of the rainbow!

Some have extremely ornamental foliage; with or without blooms, they can grow up to 8 inches, or creep along the ground, poking up a few inches in height. Arranging perennials according to their different heights can give a garden dramatic highlights.

Many gardeners with highmaintenance gardens are replanting with perennials because, once established, they need little care and can be left alone for many years.

If you are tired of mowing your lawn, you can replace

such as pachysandra, creeping buttercup, ivy, thyme, varrow or gypsophila. Gardeners are also replacing lupine and day lily. their lawns with drought-tolerant perennials because of dry conditions in various areas of the country. Perennials can also prevent soil erosion and runoff.

For the apartment dweller, or if your garden is confined to a patio or porch, perennials make the perfect container plants. Columbine, dianthus, day lilies and windflower are just a few that grow well in containers. Choose plants of low to medium height with upright or trailing habits that bloom all summer long.

Harsh weather conditions do not exclude perennials. If your garden has poor drainage, plant perennials that tolerate boggy or extramoist soils, for exam-

Caller ID essentially defeated the purpose of having a non-published phone number.

Caller ID will transfer phone numbers whether the number is published or not. A non-published telephone number only means the number is not listed in the phone book, Marszalek said.

"As soon as I heard about Caller ID, I thought of this," Marszalek said. "If people get a hold of unlisted numbers, they will bug the heck out of

Marszalek is not opposed to the concept of Caller Identification; he just believes many people now have a false sense of security when they request an unpublished number:

"I'm not slamming Caller ID," Marszalek said. "I think it's a good idea, but it is not for some people. Some people are private and they want a private number.

"Even if people don't want the Stealth, they should know about the #67. If you ever called a bill collector and he got your number, you would never hear the end of it."

Marszalek runs Innovative Electronics out of his South Lyon residence. He sells various électronic components, computer parts and microprocessors. He has also installed video systems in several area



You must have touch-tone service and have Caller ID available in your area to use the Stealth-1. The device will protect all extensions hooked to the same telephone line.
