Fuerst fate discussed; board may vote soon By RANDY COBLE Staff Writer


Just what the Novi Community School District will do with the homestead of Iva and Ruby Fuerst isn't nailed down yet. But if the Aug. 19 meeting of the

Board of Education is any indication, the odds seem good it will become a restored, preserved "community education center."

The district owns the homestead land and buildings which sit on the corner of Taft and Ten Mile roads. The board in December formed a committee to study potential uses for the site. In May that committee gave its report to the board, recommending that the Fuerst estate be preserved for school and public use.

The committee detailed a threephase plan to achieve that, the first step being to "stabilize" the buildings to prevent damage from further deterioration. At their Aug. 5 meeting, board members discussed restoration architect Michael Kirk's report on the property. Kirk said that the structures there were in generally good condition and not in imminent danger of collapse. The board asked administration

officials to estimate how much the stabilization would cost but did not



Mussels are weak in lake

Will the shores of Walled Lake become mussel beach? Maybe yes. Maybe, no.

But a sampling of the lake water taken as part of a summer survey of 32 inland Michigan lakes has found the pesky bivalves here and in one other Oakland County location, Cass Lake.

The project's coordinator, Paul Marangelo told The Novi News in June that the chances of finding zebra mussels or their larvae in Walled Lake seemed slim, because the lake lacks a public access site for boats. Then 17 microscopic zebra mussel larvae showed up in the 600 gallons of Walled Lake water drawn by local volunteers. "I expected to find none," he said

Tuesday.

That was one of the biggest surprises of the summer for us. It's hard to say with any certainty how they were brought in."

"The density is very, very low." Six larvae were found in Cass Lake. The highest number of larvae found in a Michigan inland lake was 23 in Wayne County's Belleville Lake.

Unlike in Monroe, where the zebra mussel infestation threatened to clog pipelines bringing the water supply from Lake Erie, Walled Lake water is not used for public consumption.

volumes of microscopic algae, could decrease the food supply for fish, leading to a possible decline in the lake's game fish population.

In addition, a large wash up of zebra mussel shells, which are sharp, could wreak havoc with barefooters on formerly sandy beaches, Marangelo said.

"They would be a nuisance, that's for sure," he added.

The Lakes Area Residents Association was expected to address the issue in their meeting Tuesday night (past press-time.)

The theory is that the mussels, which originate in the former Soviet Union, are brought in on the hulls of boats which have cruised in the infected waters of Lake Erie, Lake St. Clair and the Detroit River.

LARA president Harry Avagian said the group will request Novi and City of Walled Lake boaters to carefully scrub down their vessels before launching them in Walled Lake.

However, Marangelo doesn't see Walled Lake becoming a major breeding ground for the zebra mussels. The larvae have low survival rates.

But where there's larvae, there's most likely breeding adult zebra mussels, who are about a finger nail's length, he said. One female of the species can deliver one million eggs per vear.

After hiding, a mother loses child

Monday, Jake Ross Swanner, almost three years old, left his mother, maybe forever, with little more than a change of clothes, a blanket and a teddy bear.

The boy and his parent, Susan Swanner --- both former Novi residents --- had been in hiding for over a year when she was apprehended by police last week at her brother's Taylor home.

'Before, we had some hope we could see him, she could see him. I seriously think I'll never see my grandson again."


Swanner, 44, is wanted on kidnapping charges in Albemarle, North Carolina, where her estranged husband, Robert Donald

(Don) Swanner has been granted custody of their child. On Sept. 17, a Wayne County court is scheduled to decide if the

Michigan woman will be extradited to North Carolina to stand trial there.

Since Jake's parents' marriage reached the breaking point in the summer of 1992, the toddler has been the focus of an unusually bitter custody battle carried out in two states. It has pitted North Carolina courts against Michigan courts and Oakland County courts against those of Wayne County.

Man claims cops violated his rights

A Novi man says he's fighting mad about the way police treated him July 30 when they arrested him for disturbing the peace.

David James, who lives on Duana Street in Novi's north end, said he plans to file a civil suit against the department because he believes his rights were violated when five officers allegedly "jumped" him from behind and hauled him off to jail. He said officers failed to tell him why he was being arrested, failed to read him his miranda rights, and never allowed him to make a phone call.

But police officers say that James was intoxicated and combative, and continued to disturb the peace after he was asked to quiet down. Further, according to Novi Police Officer Matt Conquest,

James refused to give officers ID when it was requested and actually told them to "go ahead and arrest me, but you'll have to use force." Novi Police Chief Doug Shaeffer said that officers are required to read the miranda rights only before beginning to question a suspect about a crime.

in addition, he pointed out, it is not necessary to charge someone with a crime at the time of arrest, if officers can show just cause for the arrest.

The jail cells in the Novi police department are equipped with telephones that automatically reverse the charges so, Shaeffer added, James would have had access to a telephone.

James said he was kept in a room rather than a cell. However, police records indicate he was lodged in



Coordinate approach on seniors housing

Seniors housing is back on the council table, and that is the good news. If it moves the City of Novi toward the goal of constructing a rent-subsidized residential complex for senior citizens, then that is to the credit of council members Nancy Cassis and Tim Pope.

But we see a real danger here, a potentially divisive fight between two factions who want to be the proponents of senior housing in Novi, each wanting credit for the idea and bringing it to fruition.

When seniors housing is constructed here, there will be plenty of credit to go around to all who contributed and participated. But if infighting and election-year posturing get in the way and slow this project down, no one will benefit. Clearly, the best way for the city to proceed would be in a coordinated fashion, with the cooperation of all proponents of the project.

Readers may remember that back in June Kathy Crawford, the Parks and Recreation Department's Seniors Coordinator, brought a request to City Council asking for immediate approval to apply for a \$5 million federal grant to build the 80-unit complex just south of Novi High School. And readers may recall that Pope and Cassis were among the four council members that voted to turn it down.

Their reasons were clear enough; it was a sudden request. They said there had not been time to get public input on the idea of building a complex on that on getting just such answers. site. But I also wonder if the tendency to ask questions without listening to the answers is exacerbated these days by the pace the electronic media sets. In the age of the 15- and 30-second sound bite, many of us have come to see short, simple answers as "direct" answers and long answers as "evasive." regardless of their content. Many of us seem to have forgotten that long answers can also sometimes be "thoughtful" answers.

Other times, the issues are either too unpleasant or too complex, so we just apply some nifty little label to a school or mode of thought - liberal vs. conservative, gun control vs. the NRA, pro-life vs. pro-choice - and it saves us the time and trouble of having to listen.

I digress. My point here is that there are also some notable exceptions. Novi News Staff Writer Jan Jeffres is one. She's not your "typical" reporter, if there is such a thing. She's not the overconfident, abrasive type that seems to be the stereotype of today's journalist. Instead, she's rather mild-mannered. Mostly, she really tries to hear what her sources have to say.

through their confusion and pain, they turned to various bereavement support groups but still felt that people didn't understand how they felt.

understand how they felt. "We would say we lost our children and the room would just go silent." Pat recalls. Even today, most people seem uncomfortable if the Loders speak of Stephanie or Stephen.

"People always flinch or get really quiet if I mention the children," she said. It's hard, because they need to be able to talk about them. In their hearts, their children remain alive.

"You know, a child who loses his parents is called an orphan," Wayne said. "Someone who loses a spouse is a widow or widower. But there is no name for people who lose their children."

Finally, they learned about The Compassionate Friends, a support group strictly for bereaved parents. they cope with their loss. "The group does not espouse any religion," Wayne explained. "We are very lenient of other people's beliefs. We don't condemn anyone for their beliefs, and we don't push any beliefs on anyone."

The important thing about The Compassionate Friends is that, within this group, members find others who truly understand their pain.

"We're never going to feel good about a lot of things," he added. "But this gives you a chance to relate to other people who understand."

Pat agreed. "They really do understand," she said. "They do know what you're going through."

Through hard work and dedication they have developed the Lakes Area Chapter, which meets from 7 to 9 p.m. the third Tuesday of each month, in the Richardson Center across from Walled Lake Central High School (1485 Oakley Park Road, Commerce Township). Anyone whose child has died is welcome to attend the meetings.

ayne and Pat Loder will always remember that day in 1991 as the day their

lives fell apart. It was 6 p.m. on Wednesday, March 20 when Pat — a former Novi deputy clerk tried to make the left turn she'd made so many times before into her family's subdivision in Commerce Township.

There, just yards away from their home, her vehicle collided with a motorcycle that was heading toward her. She'd thought there was room to make the turn safely. Witnesses at the scene told police that the motorcyclist, who was killed on impact, was going an estimated 80 mph in the 45 mph zone. Pat and the Loders' two children — Stephanie, 8, and

Stephen, 5 — were rushed to nearby Huron Valley Hospital. Pat survived the accident. But Stephen died that even-

ing. Stephanie died the next morning.

"A lot of people didn't know what to say," Wayne said. "They tried to help — they'd say 'l know how you feel, I remember when I lost my grandmother, or my father." One person actually tried to compare their loss to the loss of a

"But they cannot possibly know how you feel unless they have gone through it themselves," he said. "No pain in the whole world can equal losing a child."

As the Loders tried to sort

The second half is devoted to guest speakers or activities, such as a recent balloon release where members wrote messages to their children and released the balloons into the air.

The Compassionate Friends is not a religious group, although people are more than welcome to talk of their religious beliefs if that is how

"We decided to start the Lakes Area group because there is no group that's close to us here," Wayne explained. "There are chapters in Brighton, Flint, Livonia, Ann Arbor, Birmingham, Troy nothing closer than a 45 minute drive."

And after the deaths of their own children, they noticed every newspaper article or obituary that involved the death of a child.

"We became acutely aware of other people in this area who lost their children." Pat said. "We knew there was a need."

Wayne, who is a former editor of *The Novi News*, now publishes the Lakes Area chapter

Board member finds that she's never bored

"Northville is an old town that grew up," commented Connie Cronin, the only woman on the Zoning Board of Appeals, and it grew both in residential and business property without the zoning ordinances that are in effect now.

As a result, Cronin said, there are many "non-conforming structures," and if the owners want to expand or change, they have to ask the appeals board for a variance or change their plans.

Envelopes detailing these cases are mailed to board members a week ahead of each monthly meeting, she said, "sometimes with one case and sometimes five or stx," most of them residential. It can be, for example, a matter

of how close to the lot line a new building may be set, or a question of whether a sign for a subdivision is a traffic problem, maybe even an eyesore.


Board members are encour-

aged to look at the site, and then at the meeting they will listen to the reasoning of the owners, the developers, and even the neighbors who have been sent notices regarding the problem.

"We give the persons who make the appeal," Cronin said, "all the time they need, and sometimes after having talked to the builder about altering the original plans, they may come back again and again."

At present there is an opening for an alternate. If you're interested, you may apply at the City Clerk's office for it.

home on Pontiac Trail Road. While the setting --- to us --- seems far from exotic, the destinations offered by the travel firm are the stuff of National Geographic articles.

These are not the mass-market aunts in tourist-packed buses, breezing through 15 European cities in ten days.

Instead, their brochure details dogsledding in the Canadian Rockies, whalewatching by kayak near Vancouver, and swimming with pink dolphins in the Yarapa River, a tributory of the Amazon. Or journeying into the Stone Age.

Obrecht spent much of July leading a group of four travelers in Irian Jaya, the Indonesia's share of the island of New Guinea.

The government there had been keeping travelers out of the region ever since an incident in the 1960s when Nelson Rockefeller's adult son disappeared and was believed to have been consumed by cannibals.





The 'Super 18' fantasy golf course

News picks best holes from local courses to create the most challenging

By SCOTT DANIEL Staff Writer

What if you could take your favorite and most feared golf holes in the area and combine them into one monster course. What would it look like, how would it play and

how long would it be? Those were questions the Novt News recently mulled. What we came up with is 18 of the most challenging and scenic holes in the area.

Our Super 18, some 6,392 yards, is short by professional standards but long enough to make the average player feel more than tested. Accurate tee shots, spectacular approach shots and careful putting would all be needed to hit our par of 71. Here's our selections which are sure to put a scare in even the best golfers in Novi:

NO. 1 Brooklane No. 2, 317 yards, par 4 A dog-leg left, the hole presents a problem in choosing what club to hit off the tee.

For those who hit medium or long distance with the driver, better leave it in the bag. A long straight shot or slice will put you in the third fairway.

A safer bet is to hit a 5-wood or even a low iron off the tee. The fairway slopes downhill which will add length to a tee shot with such a club and leave an easier second shot. Once on the green, putting out shouldn't be a problem on the flat, smooth surface.

Brooklane No. 5, 129 yardis, par 3 Easily the prettiest hole on the front nine at the Northville course. golfers must contend with a creek off the tee. The small stream runs in front of the green and heavy woods protect the back of the putting surface.

Pebble Creek No. 1, 501 yards, par

A couple of options off the first tee are available at the South Lyon course. One is to lay up in front of the creek, which cuts through the fairway about 240 yards out, or go for it.

With any kind of wind, the choice becomes an easy one. Second shots must be accurate. Any kind of slice will put your ball in the drink. Keep it in play at No. 1, even with heavy wind, and it becomes a very birdie-able hole.

Pebble Creek No. 5, 198 yards, par

Easily the most difficult par-3 on our Super 18, the hole has a pond instead of a fairway. The blue stuff stretches from the tees to 10-yards away from the green. If that isn't enough, woods run along the left side and in back of the hole leaving only the right side to bail out on. One suggestion: if you put your tee shot in the pond.

Fishing for a little family fun?

Why fish? There are any number of reasons. Dealing with the unknown, the slippery thrill of the hunt, trying to outpsych a fish all hold endless fascina-

tion for many anglers. You hook it, fight it as an enemy, then part with it on friendly terms when you release it - or part not at all by devouring it. Whatever the intellectual or cos-

mological basis, the solid fact is this: Studies show that fishing is the No. 1 leisure sport for fostering good relationships within families.

For many, fishing is more than a recreational experience. It's a lifestyle. According to Nebraskaland maga-

zine, fishers are "going to seminars, joining clubs, entering competitions, lobbying legislators, helping conservation causes, encouraging water development projects and other things their grandfrathers would never have dreamed of."

Fishing tackle

For stream, pond and lake fishing. you will need an open-faced or closed-faced spinning reel equipped with a 6- or 8-pound test monofilament line, bait box, sinkers, hooks (No. 4-6), rubber boots, fishnet, spinning lures, a creel in which to carry your fish, and a small knife to clean your catch.

A good bait-casting rod-and-reel is a medium-sized one, 5 feet, that takes about 80 yards of line. You will find it suitable for nabbing crapple, bluegill, trout and catfish.

Fishing for bass requires a strong rod-and-reel combination, as does fishing for salmon and steelhead trout

Warranty coverage plans gain in popularity

After digging up enough cash to handle the down payment and numerous closing costs, the least favorite thing for a home-buying family to face is unexpected repair costs for a zapped water heater or built-in appliances.

That's one of the key motivators for buying a home protection (warranty) plan for previously owned homes being offered for sale. The coverage benefits the home seller, buyer and broker. Thus the sale of these protection plans continues to grow throughout the country.

"At least 80 percent of our listed resale homes are now covered by a warranty plan," said Bob Harrison, manager of an office of Coldwell Banker Residential Real Estate Services. "It's really a great type of protection and most home buyers and sellers are now aware of its importance."

In some cases where the seller or buyer does not purchase the warranty coverage, Harrison will buy a one-year plan and give it to the buyer as a housewarming gift, he said.

Typically, a home protection plan covers the mechanical systems in a home for a one-year period after a sale. Items covered typically include the central heating, air conditioning, plumbing, electrical, water heater and ventilation ducts and major appliances like the built-in stove, microwave oven, dishwasher, garbage disposal, trash compactor and electric garage door opener.


When these items need repair or replacement, due to normal wear and tear, the new owner calls the home warranty company. They dispatch an appropriate technician to correct the problem. A minimal service fee is charged per service call—usually from \$25 to \$50.

The warranty plan is not an insurance policy. It doesn't cover known pre-existing conditions or damage caused by fire, theft or vandalism. It's designed to repair or replace items that become defective after the sale of a home. The one-time fee for a basic oneyear warranty plan varies from region to region and company to company, but generally it ranges from about \$200 to \$350, payable when the home is sold.


Home buyers like the coverage because it minimizes their risk of encountering large and unexpected expenses after moving into a home. Sellers like it because it protects them from after-sale hassles and possible lawsuits instigated by an unhappy buyer. Brokers like it for the same reasons.

"In past years, home protection plan firms tended to be pretty flimsy operations," Realtor Harrison said. "But today these firms have a much better and stronger structure, and brokers as well as con-

The time has come to build your dream house. You've thought about it for years, and now the time is right.

You know enxactly what you want. While your dream home will incorporate a number of design features you've seen in other houses over the years, the floorplan you have in mind is completely unique, yours alone, one of a kind.

Town Center, explained that for \$30 to \$90, home design programs are available that can produce professional-looking blueprints on everything from dot-matrix to laser printers. Some programs are available for even less, as little as \$12. But as Haveck said, "you get what you pay for." He explained that the inexpensive home design software packages often have limited capabilities, are not as flexible as the more extensive programs, and have small "symbol libraries." Of course, even the better amateur home design programs von't give you finished blueprints, from which a carpenter could start building or which a city inspector would give approval on the home's structural integrity. To get something that fancy, you'd have to move to a "computeraided drawing" or CAD program that could run \$300 or more. These are also much more difficult to learn to use, Haveck said.

The Crystal sparkles with light for active family living

Naturally illuminated by skylights in three separate living areas, the Crystal is a bright ranch-style home designed for active family living.

A wide, arched multipaned window with a planter shelf adds street appeal to the exterior and elegance to the spacious vaulted living room. Flames in the fireplace "can be enjoyed from both the living room and the dining room.

The sun porch, to the right of the family room, is the brightest of these bright spaces. It has five skylights and could be either screened or glassed. Potted plants can't help but thrive here. Add a couple of white wicker chairs and you can pretend you're in the tropics.

A spacious kitchen is at the heart of the home. Two more skylights bathe the area in natural light while its open design provides teasy access from all directions. Plenty of cabinets and counters line the room on three sides. If desired, a built-in desk could be included in the plan, either next to the sunny nook or by the freezer.

The kitchen sink faces across the family room to a view of the deck and the outdoors beyond.

Face framing on one wall of shelves in the large walk-in pantry allows direct access from the kitchen.

Basement stairs, a small bathroom, and a utility room with a counter and fold-down ironing board are to the right. The utility room can also be entered from the two-car garage, which has windows and space for a small shop.

Bathrooms are clustered together on the left. The master bathroom and walk-in closet serve as sound buffers between adults' and children's bedrooms.

Luxury features in the master bath include skylights, an oversize. shower and twin basins.

The other two bedrooms share a bathroom. One of the bedrooms has a walk-in closet. This situation is sure to stir up sibling rivalry, especially if there are only two children.

A large linen closet in the hallway is convenient to both of the bathrooms in the sleeping wing.

Best tools for the soil

While there is a wide array of landscaping tools now available that will do most any yard job, from rough groundbreaking and trenching to fine finished landscaping and gardening, the trick is determining which tools are best for you and for each job

and for each job. The new, state-of-the-art tools have unique shapes and tool-head configurations to make them function in most any yard or garden situation. Many of these tools come with dual-striking head combinations for even greater versatility

They also come in both longand short-handle models to add to their range of jobs.

Here's a rundown on the different striking points and tool heads to look for on these landscaping jobs they will perform best.

• Trencher mattock — for breaking ground, accurate trenching, burying cable and piping.

• Planter scoop---a wide spadelike blade for groundbreaking, clearing, trenching and digging plant holes for trees.

• Tiller—has three fork times for cultivating, weed removal, aerating soil and compost turning. • Pick end—a sharp point for penetrating compacted soil, prying rocks, breaking up concrete and blacktop, thin

prying rocks, breaking up concrete and blacktop, thin trenching and furrowing for seeding.

• Ax end—for chopping roots, stubborn weed clumps and firewood.

• Chisel pick—long, sharpedge blade for deep digging, prying and penetrating tough soil.

Look for tools with points or tool heads made of ductile iron, which is corrosion resistant and withstands tough impact.

PROTECTING PLANTS

Put some cornneal around cabbage family plants and no insecticide will be needed. Sparrows come in for a free meal of cornneal and add pest worms to their diet.

Turkeys make a perfect dewormer for the tomato "hornworms." They have sharp eyesight, can spot these pests and eat them without harming the plants.

However, don't make a mistake and turn them loose on a patch of new-sprouting seedlings!

the interior and on the exterior. Some programs refer to this as a "virtual reality" option, although the 3-D programs now available only provide snapshot views and don't allow the user to move through the building as true "virtual reality" programs would


According to Haveck, home design versions are available in all computer formats, for MacIntosh as well as IBM and compatibles. DOS-based versions are available. Still, Haveck said, most of these design programs are based on Windows 3.1. Windows, Haveck explained, is a "graphic environment" and therefore particularly well suited to these programs.

The home design programs are equally popular among all kinds of homeowners and homebuyers. Haveck said he believes those who purchase such software are about split among home buyers and home renovators. They are also popular among those who are redecorating, who want the

programs for their interior designs. And some, Haveck said, use the program simply to rearrange the furniture. "It beats moving the couch five time," Haveck said.

One of the most extensive programs out now is a new program called "Your Deck," from Books That Work, Sunset publishers. Demonstrating the program, Haveek had an extensive deck design worked up In about 15 minutes. He then could convert the blueprints to eye-level and 3-D views. The program also would allow cross-sectional views, or could strip the



Service industries are growing in Oakland County, and the Novi Mini Maid cleaning service of Dave and Gilma Truesdell is no exception. The your quality up." biggest problem they have is hiring enough people to fill their growing workload.

"Iguess the recession's over," Dave said. "Our volume's been incredible. July is usually our slowest month because of vacations, and we were scrambling to get done."

Mini Maid is a national franchise organization based out of Marletta, Ga. The company has been around for 20 years. The Truesdells, a husband and wife team, came on board in 1984

"I was in the fast food industry for 20 years at the corporate level," said Dave. Gilma got this started. Then when we could afford to replace my income, I quit and joined her. I always say I traded in my briefcase for a tollet brush.

"When we started, Molly Maid (a competing national house-cleaning franchise) had just come in. Now, there are just so many dual-income families. The growth is incredible if you can keep your people and keep

The Truesdells must be doing something right because, Dave added, "We've got the best client retention of all the franchises." Dave was also named to Mini Maid's first national advisory council.

Keeping employees has been a big plus for the Truesdells. Some of their team leaders have been with them for six years or more.

"We're strictly a residential cleaning service, with four-person cleaning teams," said Gilma.

Where some companies will send one or two people to clean a home. and take four hours, Mini Maid sends a crew of four to do the job in one hour. It's less intrusion for the homeowner, Gilma said, and allows Mini Maid to fit more jobs into a day. Mini Maid's specialty is its water-

"It's really so simple," said Dave. "All we need is a glass cleaner, our own disinfectant/degreaser, and an abrasive that's kind of like a homemade Softscrub. All water does for you is dilute the chemicals."

Some old habits die hard, though. Sometimes employees will come along who have experience in housecleaning, and they're difficult to convince on the waterless method. The Mini Maid training process

also includes increasing a maid's efficiency.

We go left to right and top to bottom around a room," said Gilma. That way you miss lewer things around the room. One person does the bathroom, one does the kitchen, one dusts and one vacuums. Then the

Mini Maid doesn't do any deep cleaning, for the simple reason that tasks like cleaning garages and basements, or ovens and refrigerators are too labor intensive. The cost, Dave said, would scare customers away.

"Our theory is that we do specific chores, a specific way, for a specific price," he said. "Ours is really a maintenance system, and we vary from the system very little."

And, said Gilma, "The more you get away from a routine, the more quality suffers."

The Truesdell's four housecleaning teams can do five to eight houses a day. But just because the cleaning is broken down into a routine doesn't mean there aren't any

surprises.

"When you get into people's houses, anything can happen." Dave said. "One of our clients was moving from his old house to his new one. We were cleaning the old house while the movers were packing. When our team was done, they couldn't find their vacuum. The movers had packed our vacuum into the moving van. They weren't moving far, so the team went over to the new place, but for some reason the movers didn't show up for two hours."

The maids meet a lot of police officers, too, when clients forget to turn off burglar alarm systems. There have

also been instances where a client's dog has jumped in the open tailgate of the Mini Maid car and eaten a maid's lunch.

"We really stress to our employees, though, that what they see in the home stays in the home," said Dave. Confidentiality is important since the Novi service's coverage area extends to Birmingham, Bloomfield Hills and West Bloomfield, and the homes of some Detroit area movers and shakers.

"We do some really huge houses." said Gilma. "It used to be that a big house was three bedrooms and oneand-a-half baths. Now we do houses


with pools and saunas and live-in help to do the laundry." But the bulk of the Mini Maid

clients have simple cottages and condos.

"I'd say they're mostly the yupple type, where both people work, and both have a good income," said Dave. We find apartment dwellers are very poor customers. We do mostly condos, but few apartments."

The company has older customers as well. While Mini Maids can't meet all the needs of older people, like moving furniture and turning mat-
