



Taking to the waterways: Remember boat safety

Summer is the perfect time Summer is the perfect time for boat lovers to get out on the lake, feel the sun on their face and enjoy the water. But often, neglect of the basic responsibilities of proper boating etiquette enters the warm-weather mix.



Homes built in the 1940's, 50's and early 60's generally had 60 Amp of electrical service installed to the home. This trical service installed to the home. This in itself does not mean that the electrical service is unsafe. 60 amp service is typically fine for a small house with two pele living in the home. 
