





OAKLAND COUNTY GOVERNMENT ORGANIZATION CHART





HISTORY

The coroner's office originated in the 10th century because of the need for a new method to protect and collect the Crown revenue. Over the years the coroner's office changed in many ways and the sheriff took over many functions of the coroner until finally the coroner's duties were largely confined to the determination of causes and manner of deaths under certain circumstances. Coroner's jury and inquest procedure were retained and the procedure incorporated both legal and medical determination. The Medical Examiner's system originated in the 13th-16th centuries in Italy. Qualified physicians were considered expert in legal medicine.

As permitted by 1945 Legislative Act 143, the Oakland County Board of Supervisors in 1946 abolished the **elected** office of coroner and transferred the duties to the County Health Officer who became Chief Medical Examiner. The Medical Examiner Division was established within the Health Department. The Medical Examiner Law, Act 181, was passed in 1953. This law allowed each county to establish and **appoint** a Medical Examiner. On November 5, 1968 the Oakland County Health Officer was appointed as Medical Examiner.

Most Medical Examiner cases were taken to local hospital where service space and facilities were limited due to regular hospital cases. Many doctors were reluctant to perform Medical Examiner autopsies. The establishment of a central County Morgue Facility was essential. Provisions were made in the new Law Enforcement Complex, which was under construction, for a central County Morgue. On July 1, 1970, an interim office was established at the Pontiac State Hospital on Elizabeth Lake Road in Pontiac. In July 1972 the move was made to the new facility at the Oakland County Service Center, Law Enforcement Complex.

In December 1978 a reorganization of the Medical Examiner's office was undertaken. Since the Chief Pathologist was performing all of the duties of the Medical Examiner, a resolution was passed which discharged the Public Health Director and appointed the Chief Pathologist as Medical Examiner for Oakland County. This appointment took effect January 1, 1979.

DIVISION FUNCTION

The Medical Examiner operates under the mandates of the Medical Examiner Law, Act 181, P.A. of 1953, as amended.

The Medical Examiner is charged with the responsibility of determining the manner and cause of death of all sudden, unexpected, accidental or violent deaths. In addition, the Medical Examiner must determine the manner and cause of death of all police prisoners, abortions, suspicious circumstances, administration of drugs, therapeutic procedures, anesthesia, etc. Also deaths without medical attention within 48 hours preceeding death.

The results of these investigations provide evidence relating to injuries for prosecutions and settlement of estates. It also provides public health authorities with information relating to communicable disease and other causes of mortality, for program direction purposes.

The Medical Examiner and staff must appear in court to give testimony in both criminal and civil proceedings.

The Medical Examiner must approve all cremations for death occurring in Oakland County.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The investigation of death as mandated by Michigan Statute Act 181, P.A. 1953 shall include an examination of the scene, a thorough postmortem examination including, when indicated, a complete autopsy and certification of the cause and manner of death. The results of these investigations provide evidence for criminal prosecution and settlement of estates. It also provides public health authorities with information relating to communicable disease and other causes of mortality.

The combined efforts of the Medical Examiner's staff are all essential to the final determination of the cause and manner of death and are therefore impossible to prioritize. Staff training and development is an on-going process involving courses in homicide investigation, attendance at medico-legal seminars, and annual participation in several national organizations.

To meet the changing patterns of substance abuse, we have significantly increased drug testing, especially for cocaine and marijuana, in homicide and accident cases. Increased death scene and autopsy photographic documentation and the introduction of mannequins to demonstrate the location and direction of wounds during court presentations have been favorably received by the Prosecutor's office.

We are consciously attempting to improve both the quality and the timeliness of the services we provide to the families of the deceased and to the law enforcement community.

PROCEDURE

Act 181, P.A. 1953, as amended, provides for the Medical Examiner to investigate and determine "the cause and manner of death in all cases of persons who have come to their death" under any of the following circumstances:

VIOLENCE - Asphyxiation, shooting, stabbing, poisoning, etc.

ACCIDENT - Traffic, falls, drownings, industrial, drugs.

WHILE IN CUSTODY - Prisoners.

ABORTION - Under any circumstances.

<u>SUDDEN AND UNEXPECTED</u> - Where deceased was in apparent good health.

WITHOUT MEDICAL ATTENDANCE WITHIN 48 HOURS PRIOR

THERETO - In cases of chronic illness the attending physician may sign
the death certificate if he can be reasonably certain of the cause of
death. However, he should examine the body to satisfactorily determine
that no foul play is involved.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCES - Including unidentified bodies.

ADMINISTRATION OF DRUGS, THERAPEUTIC PROCEDURES, ANESTHESIA, ETC.

Immediate reporting of any Medical Examiner case is required by the statute.

Evaluation and disposition will be made by the Medical Examiner. The need for autopsy examination in certain cases will be determined by the Medical Examiner.

Transfer, removal and release of the body will be made by the Medical Examiner.

MEDICAL EXAMINER CASES DEFINED

According to Act No. 92, of the Public Acts of 1969, any physician, any person in charge of any hospital or institution (jail, convalescent home, etc.) or any person who has first knowledge of a reportable death will immediately notify the Medical Examiner's Office by phone (858-5097).

Reportable Medical Examiner's cases are:

- 1. Deaths by violence (shooting, stabbing, beating, drowning, poisoning, etc.).
- 2. Accidental deaths (auto, burns, falls, etc.).
- 3. Sudden and unexpected deaths from causes unknown (where deceased was in apparent good health).
- 4. Death occurring without medical attendance by a physician within 48 hours prior thereto unless a reasonable natural cause of death can be certified.

A person, however, who has been seen by a physician within 48 hours of death is not a Medical Examiner's case, unless the death falls within other categories enumerated.

- 5. Prisoners (dying while in custody).
- 6. Deaths under suspicious or unusual circumstances. All individuals who are admitted to a hospital unconscious and remain unconscious until death are also considered Medical Examiner's cases.
- 7. Deaths resulting from or associated with any therapeutic procedures. Deaths during anesthesia shall also be reported.

In any cases described under No. 7, a body may not be removed until <u>after</u> notice of death is given to and removal of the body approved by the Medical Examiner. Failure to give proper notice may have serious consequences.

In doubtful cases, report to the Medical Examiner for his determination and advice.

Any retained portions of blood or urine samples collected during the subject's hospital or instituion stay should accompany the body to the Medical Examiner's Office (for toxicological analyses) whenever possible. All pills and pill containers are required.

Medical Records of individuals who come under the jurisdiction of the Medical Examiner's Office should be available when the body is transferred from the hospital.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Participated in the Oakland County recycling program.

Requested and received a fax machine which has greatly improved the efficiency and productivity of the office.

Investigators Robert Rossi and Michael Dowd coordinated the "Oakland County Police Academy Investigation of Violent Death" seminar. Dr. Dragovic and Dr. Kurtzman lectured at this seminar which took place in December.

The "Michigan Association of Medical Examiners" seminar was coordinated by Dr. Biedrzycki, Acting Medical Examiner, who was assisted by Michele Conrad of the Oakland County Medical Examiner's office. Dr. Dragovic and Dr. Kurtzman both lectured at this function.

GOALS

Reconstitute the professional image and recruit the appropriate professionals that will be available and accountable to the public and their representatives.

Apply for certification by the "National Association of Medical Examiners".

Organize forensic services for other counties.

LONG TERM GOAL

Establish the Oakland County Medical Examiner's Office as a Regional Forensic Center.


