And in case any person named in said Tax Roll shall neglect or refuse to pay his said tax you are hereby authorized to levy the same by distress and sale of the goods and chattles of such person, with the costs and charges of such distress and sale as provided by law; and for so doing this shall be your sufficient warrant.

No more than one tract or parcel is to be valued or taxed on the same line. Two descriptions must not be joined in one valuation or tax unless contiguous and owned and occupied as one parcel. A parcel of land described in the government survey by lot number must be so assessed. The description of all lands in each town and range should be carefully written. In the case of platted land, the name of the plat must be given in full at the head of all. If the name of the owner of non-resident land is not known it should be assessed as "Owner Unknown." Enter the amount of any Reassessment with red ink, in the column of taxes to which it belongs, above the tax for the year for which this Roll is used, and in the column for the valuation of Personal Property must be made in a different column and the assessment thereon entered on a different line from that on Real Property. The name of each special tax must be entered at the head of the column in which it is placed. Supervisors will make no entry in column 10. The attention of assessing officers is especially called to Sections 1 to 8, 9 (as amended by Act 25 of 1895), 10, 11 (as amended by Act 229 of 1895), 12, 13, 14 (as amended by Act 1899), 42 (as amended by Act 261 of 1897), and 43, of the Tax Law of 1893. They should be carefully studied and the directions therein contained should be strictly followed. See also
