#### Gentlemen:

It seems appropriate to make some comparison between the report for 1965 with the report of 1955, inasmuch as the Reimbursement Division has now been in operation for ten years.

Originally, the primary duty of the Reimbursement Division was to assist the Probate Judge in making a more equitable evaluation of ability of responsible relatives to pay for the cost of care of patients being committed to state institutions. Since 1955, like investigations covering Juvenile placement at the Children's Village, Camp Oakland, boarding homes and private schools and other reimbursement duties have been added to the scope of the division's activities.

The reimbursements received during the five months the division was in operation in 1955 totaled \$42,088, whereas the total reimbursed during 1965 was \$437,529. After perusing the enclosed report, you will note a tremendous growth and an important increase in revenue.

Reimbursement legislation that would benefit Oakland County is followed closely with the Legislative Committee of the Board of Supervisors and close liaison is maintained with the State Departments of Revenue and Mental Health, as well as with the Social Security Administration and Veteran's Administration, divisions of the Federal Government.

The above report was compiled from the "Support of Patients"—the form used by the Deptment of Revenue, State of Michigan, to bill counties for the first 365 days of hospitalization in state institutions. Oakland County is charged for the first 365 days an Oakland County resident is hospitalized and care after this initial period is as a State at Large patient. Therefore, a percentage of those patients listed as discharged in 1964 might still be hospitalized as State at Large.

It is the responsibility of the Reimbursement Division to collect monies due the County of Oakland as ordered by the Probate Judge on all active and past due mental hospital accounts.

All responsible relatives are interviewed by the Reimbursement Division and a detailed financial statement is compiled and submitted to the Probate Judge to assist him in making his determination as to ability to pay. Through this interview, the need for verification of settlement and residence is often indicated and the matter is then referred to the Department of Social Welfare for investigation. Many hundreds of dollars each year is saved by the County as a result of these investigations as the charge is billed to the county of residence of the patient or assumed by the state-at-large rather than by the committing county.

#### CONCERNING EMERGENCY MENTAL HOSPITALIZATION:

The Reimbursement Division not only follows collection on these accounts but is responsible for all operations in connection with this program not handled by the Probate Court.

By Mental Health Statute the county of residence pays the State Department of Revenue per diem cost for all patients hospitalized in state institutions for the first year of care. As of 8-15-60 the county of residence receives day credit for this emergency hospitalization on the first year. Prior to this date no credit was given the County for supplying this care when the patient was later admitted to a state institution. We received 12,743 days credit for the year 1964 and 11,016 days credit for the year 1965. This will accrue as part of the first year of care in a state institution.

The Reimbursement Division is responsible for collection of all charges ordered by the Probate Judge for care supplied by the County through the Juvenile Court. Whenever a child receives this care, a financial statement is taken and an order is entered commensurate with the parents ability to pay.

In addition to the usual accounts; we handle the collection of benefits such as social security, veterans' benefits, and insurance. In a few circumstances, we accumulate part of these funds in a trust for the child to be used at a later date.

<sup>\*</sup>Probate Support accounts represent monies collected and paid out as received to the person caring for the child. This is as decreed by the Probate Court Order.
