on Monday the 6th day of April A. D. 1835
William Terry was Chosen Moderator and Isaac
- J. Boorheis was Chosen Clerk. Present Harvey Seely
Justice of the Peace - After the Moderator and
Clerk were Chosen, Proclamation was made
by the board that the Polls for the Township
Election for the Township of Waterford were open
and the board ready to receive votes, for Treasurer
Coroner and register of Deeds for the County of
Orkland, and also for Township officers

for the Township

for the Township of Waterford

the township of Waterford County of Oakland
and Territory of Michigan on the first Monday
of October and the succeeding day, A. D. 1835.
for the purpose of electing one Governour, one
Lieutenant Governour and one representative
in the Congress of the United States for the
State of Michigan, Four Senators for the fifth sen-
atorial district of said state, Six Representatives
for the County of Oakland, in the state Legislature
and to adopt or reject the Constitution of said State
of Michigan
