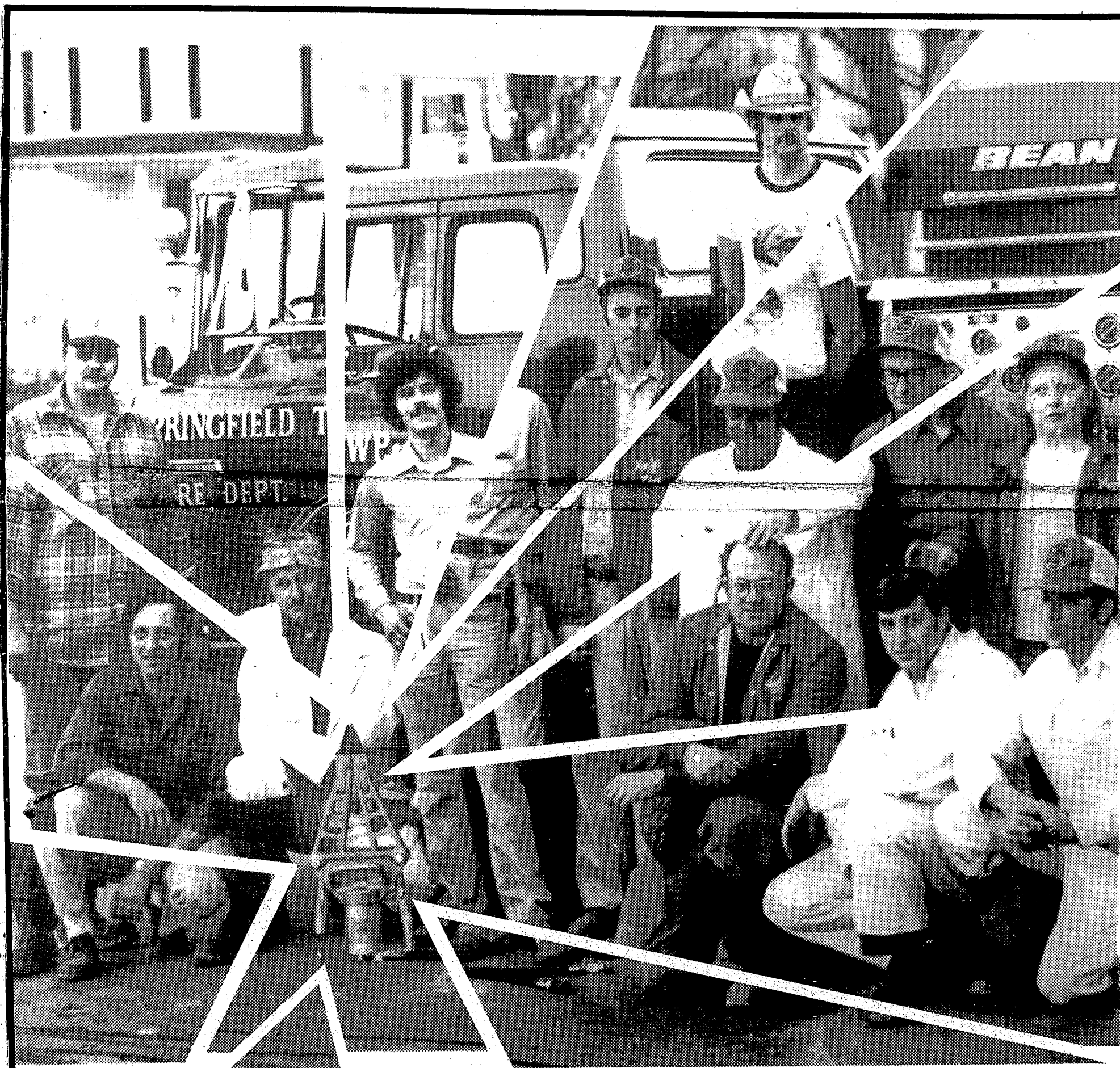

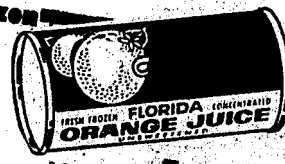

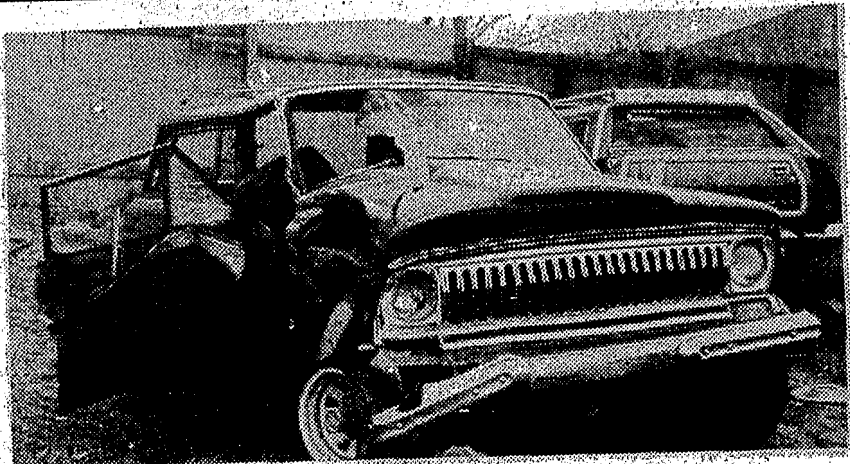
The accident magnifies in our minds the seriousness of drunken drivers. They are involved in a good share of the accidents that take place after 9 p.m. on weekends.

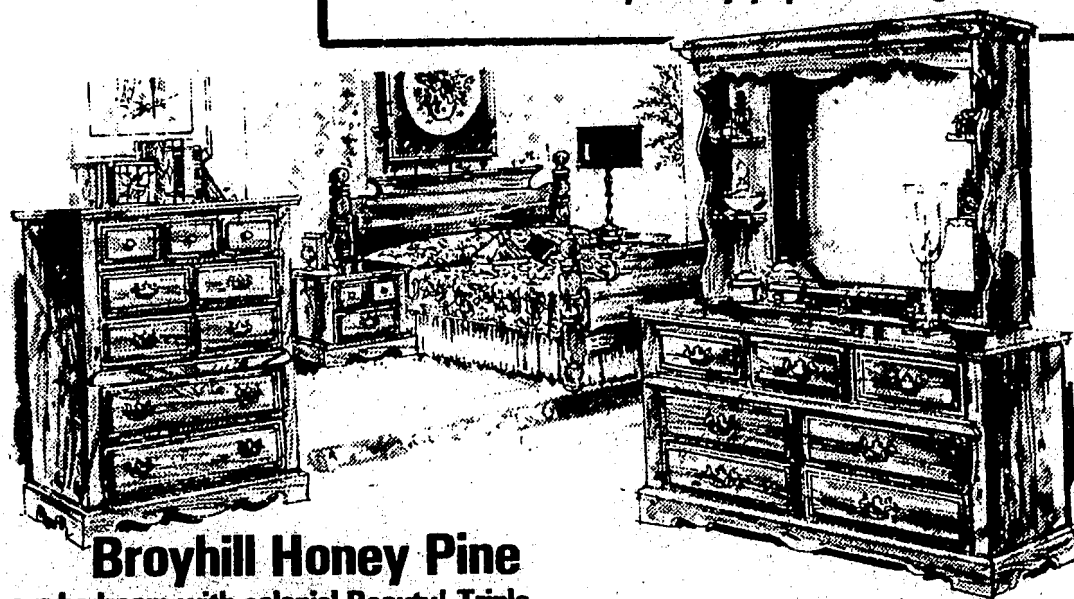

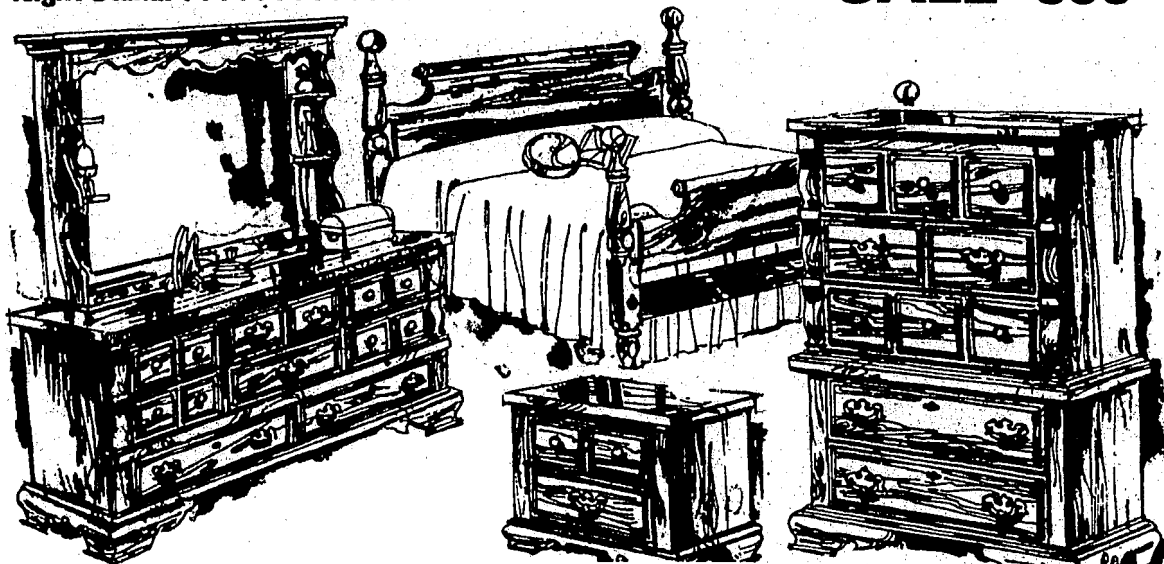

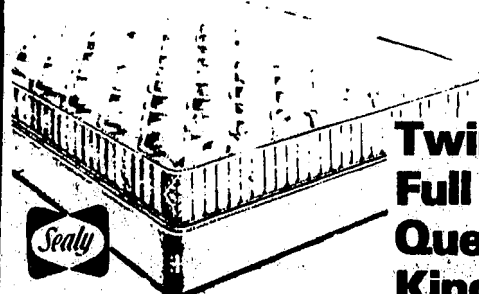

DEATH OVERSEAS -- WHAT TO DO?

If you should receive a telegram from the State Department in Washington, indicating a member of your family has died overseas, you may have only a few hours in which to wire cash to the State Department and to make arrangements to recover the body of the deceased. You will have to act quickly.

This is due, in part, to the fact that, aside from the United States, England and a few other developed countries, the body is seldom embalmed but simply allowed to deteriorate. Burial, therefore, must take place within 24 hours of death.

After contacting the State Department (Phone: 202-632-1423) and after notifying us of a death overseas in your family, you need only await our call to let you know what needs to be done and that all is well in hand.

why not ask Carolyn?

Dear Carolyn,

For a long time I thought I could just forget about this but I can't. Lately it's been getting worse and I don't know just where to turn at this point. About a year ago I was raped. I don't remember the exact date, but I was at a company retirement party and I remember it was warm out. This one guy kept bugging me. He would not leave me alone. Some of my friends I was with said they recognized him from work. Since it was getting late, I decided I would just leave. Just as I was get-

ting into my car, I felt his hand on my arm, he then forced me into his car. He threw me down on the seat, and when he was through, I somehow managed to get back to my car and home. I must have been in a state of shock for awhile. A couple days later, I told my best friend and she got me to see her doctor. That was really bad. He did not believe me and accused me of encouraging the guy. I was so upset when I left, I vowed I'd never tell anyone else.

Well, I did. I told my boyfriend, who is now my husband. We'd been going together for about a year. We were supposed to go out that night, but I wanted to go to this company party. His reaction was really strange. First he wanted to kill the guy and then he got really mad at me and then he just clammed up about it and would not talk. The worst thing about telling him was that he thought I should have fought him off and that I just let it happen. To this day I don't think he really believes me. Inside, I am really angry at him and it has hurt our marriage.

Today, we never talk about it. But, it's like this huge thing between us. I would like him to understand my feelings and how tough this has been on me and I'd like to know what's going on with him. Where could we go for some help on this?

The second article will discuss some facts about rape, the 1975 Criminal Sexual Conduct Act, which is the new rape law, and resources available for rape victims.
