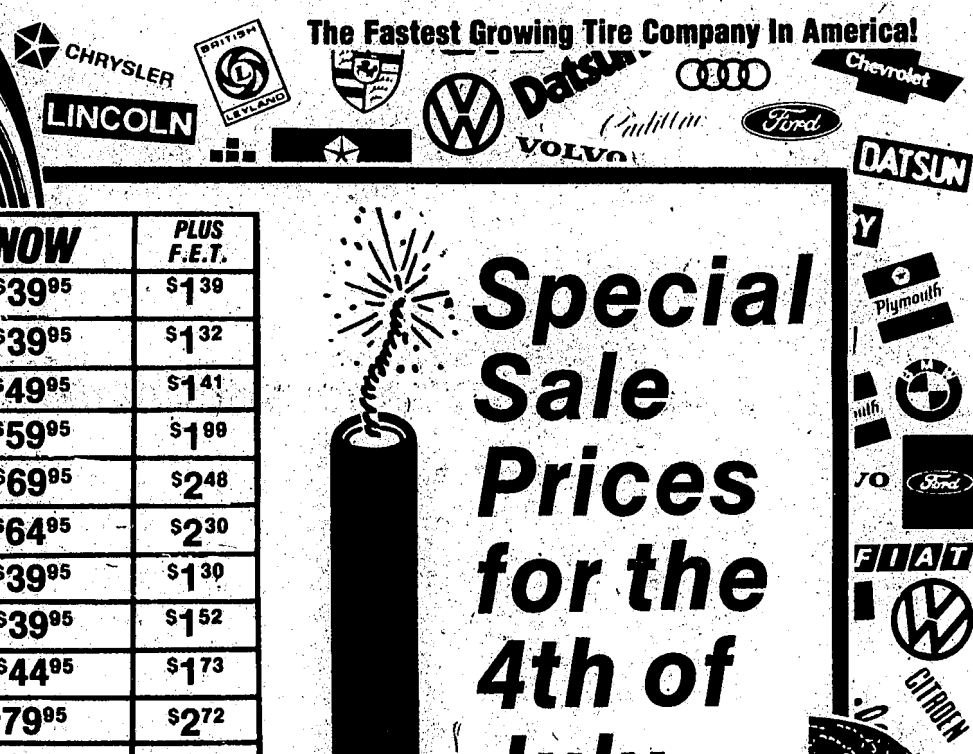

editor's note

At a public forum last week, Oakland County Prosecutor L. Brooks Patterson presented some very persuasive arguments for reinstating capital punishment.

I personally am not ready "to jump on that bandwagon" but it's easy to see how anyone in the Clarkston area could.

Patterson retold the brutal murders of Elizabeth Mojica, store clerk, and Monica Hockey. Both happened right here in Independence Township.

Two other grisly shootings have taken place here in the last couple of years, also. Remember Barbara Lunsford. She was gunned down while leaving her job at Howe's Lanes. Her only crime was that she was going to testify against Conte and Wolfe, who had been charged with a previous murder.

And then just a couple of months ago a store clerk at a Richardson's Dairy at Clarkston/Eston Roads was shot in an armed robbery.

That's a lot of fireworks in a town of Clarkston's size.

In a related subject, Geraldo Rivera had an investigative report on television last week

concerning the abuse of "the not guilty by reason of insanity plea".

Time after time the report showed murderers and others evading jail in exchange for 4 or 5 years in the mental institution, then getting out and committing another murder. One guy, the report showed, had

used the insanity plea seven or eight times to evade a prison term.

Closer to home, we have a case currently being tried in court where a young man held his mother hostage for over 24 hours, then viciously killed her and buried her near Dixie Highway in Groveland Township.

It was one of those cases where his family couldn't believe he had been released from the mental institution. He was in because he had shown violent tendencies to his mother on several occasions. He said he killed her because she wouldn't help him become unhypnotized.

It seems every time we pick up a daily newspaper we read about this kind of senseless murder. Our system is much too liberal in the release of criminals who pled not guilty for reasons of insanity. No way should they be set free after only 1-10 years in prison.

On the lighter side, this week's **Reminder** reports on an Indonesian woman who came to Clarkston to get a new eye. It's a heart warming story and unlike the murders we previously mentioned one that has a happy ending.

Springfield Supervisor Explains Library Millage

Dear Editor:

On June 4th at our regular Springfield Township Board meeting there was a decision made to place on the August Primary ballot a millage question for our

Township Library. That decision was made, although not unanimously, by the Township Board. The Library Board did not specifically request that this question be placed before the voters.

As Township Supervisor I must make this public apology to the members of the Library Board and The Township Board. Obviously, I should have requested more direct input from the Library Board prior to the discussion at our Township Board meeting. This error on my part may have caused some confusion and embarrassment to members of the Library Board, and for this I apologize.

The decision to place the millage question on the ballot was certainly not done with the intent of "jamming" more taxes down the throats of Township residents. The decision was made so that the residents of the community would have the opportunity to vote on this issue. My support for placing this question on the ballot was based on my firm belief that the Tisch Amendment will appear on our ballot in November and that it will pass. Although we will not feel the effects of that Amendment immediately, we must begin to prepare for the budgetary constraints that the Tisch Amendment will bring. Prior to the August Primary a more detailed explanation of why the question was placed on the ballot and why we feel it should be passed will be made available to the Town-

ship residents.

The Library Board has worked very hard to provide a beautiful facility that has become a real asset to our community. Our library and Library Board needs your continued support. If you feel that you cannot support the millage request, please do not allow this to limit your use and support of our library.

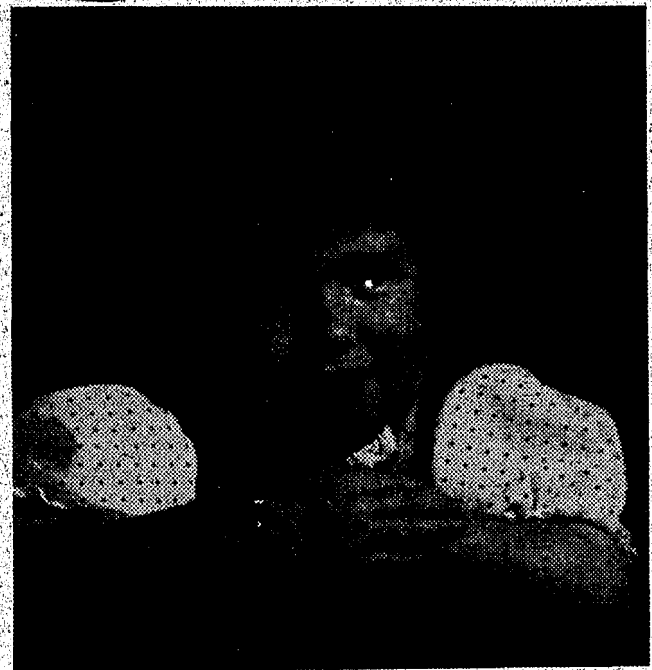

The CountryFest has many other activities during the three day celebration that do not require anything other than a little self-indulgence such as a beer tent, chicken and ribs barbeque and other food booths offered by local organizations. Friends Gather to Roast NWOVEC Teacher

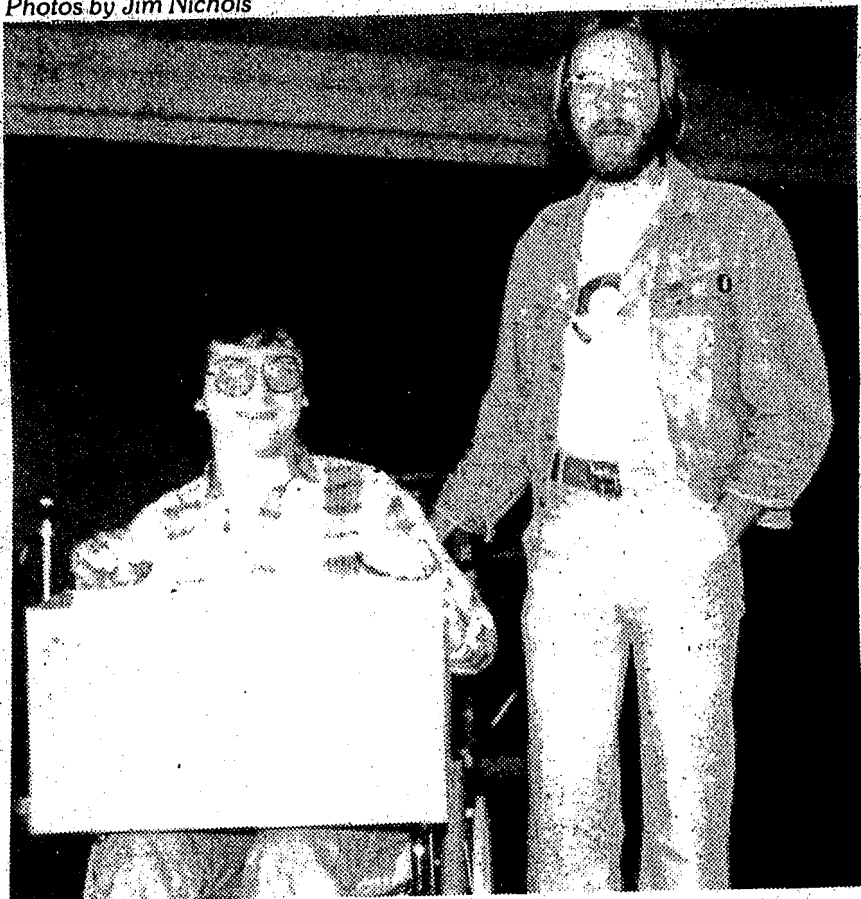

States, has much more meaning than a vacation taken by average tourists.

Mrs. Weku came to the States and Clarkston for one purpose—to get a plastic eye.

Her eye was the victim of a terrible accident that occurred in her native Indonesia five years ago. Since then, she has constantly worn sunglasses to shield her eye impairment from the public.

By happenstance, she became friends with Beverly Soriton, a Christian missionary in Indonesia.

Mrs. Soriton, daughter of Delores Priebe of Amy Drive, Clarkston, informed Mrs. Weku of the plastic eye she had placed by Dr. Fritz

Jardon, in her son's eye several year's back.

As they talked more and more, Mrs. Weku and her husband became interested in the possibility of getting a new eye. They offered to pay Mrs. Soriton's way back to the States if she would get Mrs. Weku an appointment with Jardon.

This past week they met with Jardon, creator of the plastic eye, in his Southfield offices. Within three days the new eye was in place and feeling and looking great.

"It really feels good. She's really adjusted well," said Mrs. Soriton.

Getting a plastic eye is rather simple, said Mrs. Soriton. "You make a mold just like you would for teeth. It hardens in a minute and they pull it out."

An artist then uses watercolors and other paints to make the eye resemble your real eye as much as possible. Tiny yarns and



Mrs. Soriton claims the plastic eye is very similar to a contact lens. It's larger but it can be taken in and out like the contact.

Despite spending most of her time in the doctor's office, Mrs. Weku did have some distinct impressions of America.

Speaking through Mrs. Soriton, as an interpreter, Mrs. Weku said, "I wasn't really startled by America at first because I live in a very modern city. Although I did notice

whether you are poor or rich doesn't show from the outside, because your standard of living is so high."

She also observed, "If I were to open a restaurant here it would go really good because none of the women have time to cook."

For Mrs. Soriton, the trip back to Clarkston, was her first visit to the States in 4½ years.

"Her paying my way has been a real special thing. I really needed the furlough," she said.

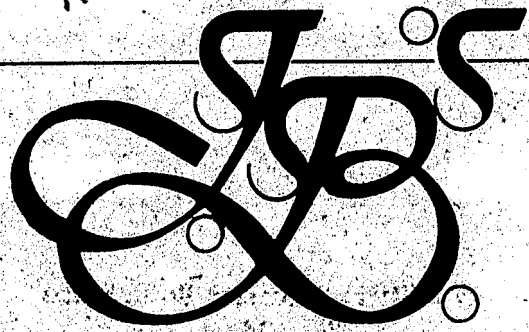

EDC Subject of Numerous Complaints at Independence Meeting

The Independence Township Economic Development Corporation (EDC) took it on the chin last week from both township board members and citizens.

At the regularly scheduled board meeting representatives for the EDC and their first project, a dental clinic now being built on Ortonville Road just north of the A&P Shopping Center, came to seek approval for their efforts to date.

They got their approval, but before the night was out, they also heard a variety of complaints.

The EDC was formed by the township board to help stimulate industry, business and employment in the area. Through EDC's efforts approved business construction projects can receive low interest loans.

Members of the Independence EDC are June McGowan, Jim Brennan, John Steckling, George Trapp, Fred Ritter, Jim Gardner, Martha Wheeler, Al Watson, and Tim Palullian. Pat Beach and Rudy Lozano were added for terms that expire when the EDC's first project is completed.

The dental clinic was chosen to be the EDC's first benefactor. The EDC's work and plans received unanimous approval at last week's Planning Commission meeting.

But it wasn't so easy at the township board level.

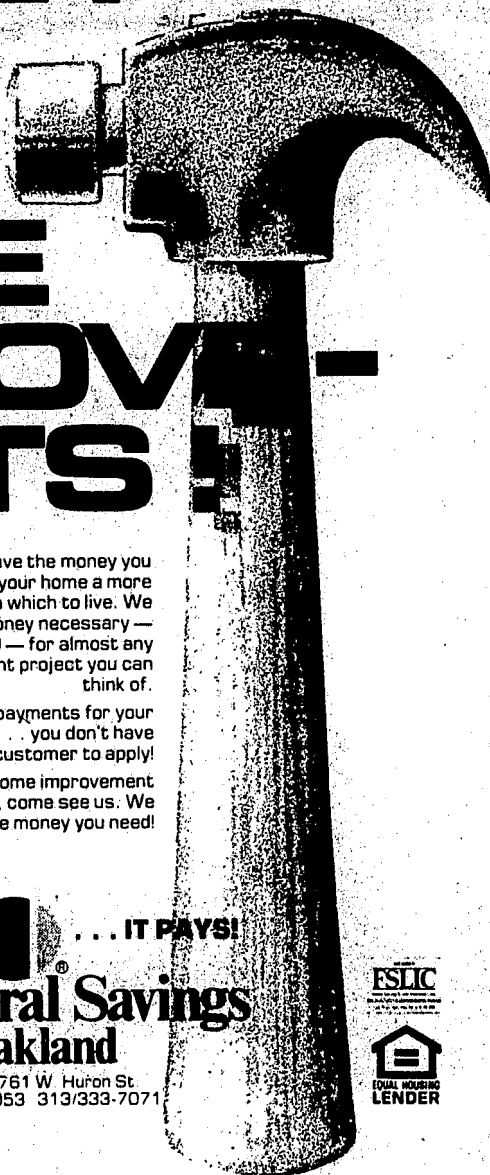

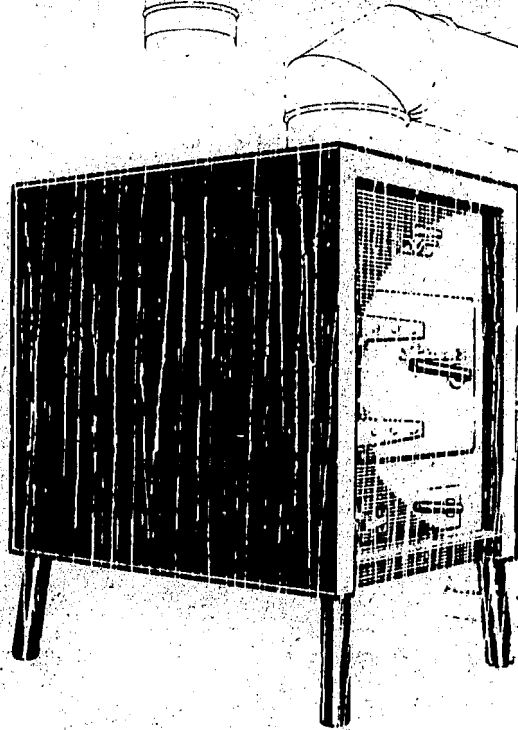

Clerk Chris Rose, who eventually was the only board member to vote against the proposal, was the first to question its merits. He voiced concern about the heavy traffic already congesting that stretch of M-15.

Rose had another concern, also. "My concern is that we will have a hard time saying 'no' to the next guy. I think we should say no now so we don't have to say no to a 22-story hotel."

Trustee William Vandermark said the EDC encourages rapid growth and competes with our own money market-two situations we obviously don't need. But he also said it was important to support our own EDC, because if we didn't have one the county would, and we would have no control over it.

Supervisor Whitey Tower lamented about the lack of control. He felt the EDC had done a poor job in informing the township board on their proceedings.

"When we set it up, we expected to have ultimate control. The only way we have ultimate control is in paperwork," said Tower.

From the audience Jennifer Radcliff voiced a number of concerns. For one, she was displeased that the EDC did not have a representative of environmental and conservation issues on its board.

Mrs. Radcliff also thought the EDC should have taken the Village of Clarkston's historical preservation district designation into consideration. Because of that designation, federal funds are strictly limited to their uses in the Village.

"There would be no way EDC could use federal funds for the Village," she said. "I think this township owes the historic structures of this community more consideration."

Dr. Charles Munk, owner of the dental clinic, said his clinic would bring many special dental services to Clarkston that weren't readily available.

"I have an ear, nose and throat man who is very serious about coming in, said Munk." He also expects to have a gum disease specialist. Right now the closest are in Flint, and there you have a year's wait, said Munk.

Munk, although he will benefit from the EDC, said, "I'm very concerned myself (about EDC). But we are better off to have our own EDC in this town (rather than the county)."

He added, "I feel that EDC's will in fact be a controlling mechanism. We will be able to pick and choose who we want (to build businesses in the community)."

Felito intends to make Jacob Petty's an example of what can happen when that 3-pronged philosophy is applied to its fullest.

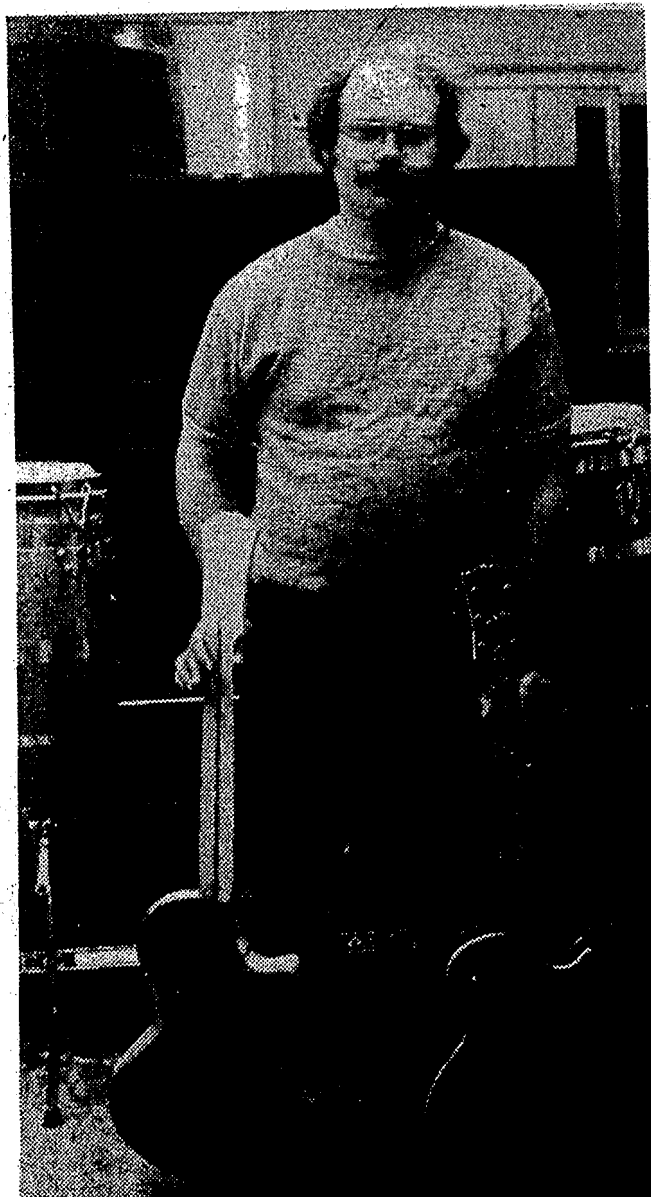
The restaurant is open seven days a week from 7a.m.-11p.m.

Ruppel said his store will be well stocked with Pro Audio equipment, string instruments, amplifiers, imported hand tools, drums and sheet music as well as other accessories.

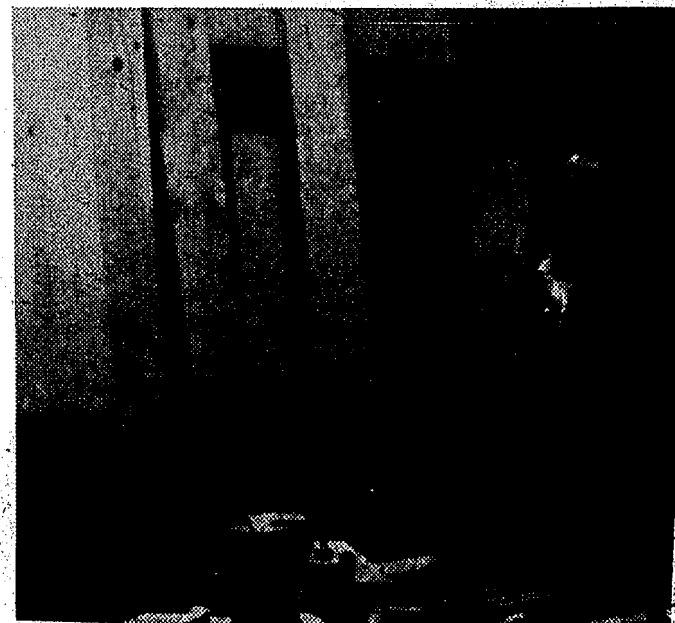

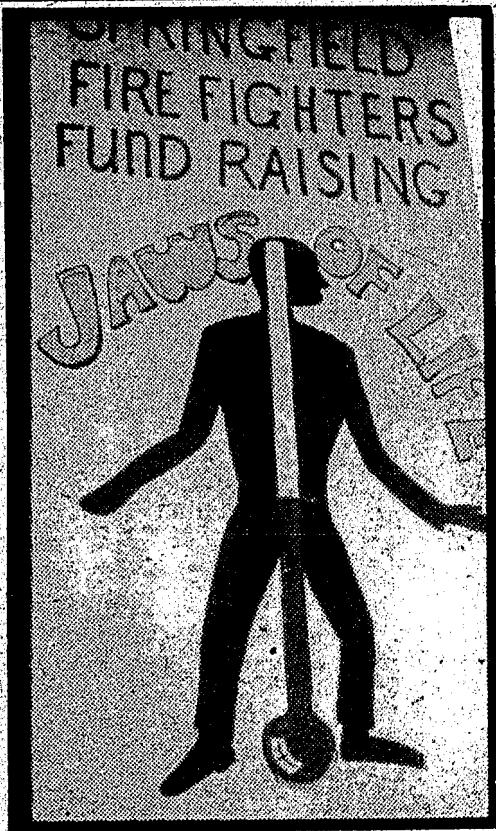

Patterson Brings His Pitch for Capital Punishment to Clarkston

Oakland County Prosecutor and Clarkston resident L. Brooks Patterson told an audience of approximately fifty people, his campaign to reinstate capital punishment for first degree murders, would be a real deterrent for crimes of murder.

"It will stop some murders," said Patterson. He then cited claims from several experts to back up his statement. Isaac Ehrlich, according to Patterson, found, "For every execution in America, eight lives will be spared."

The Supreme Court, said Patterson, issued a majority opinion in 1976 that stated, "For many the death penalty is an undoubtedly significant deterrent."

Patterson told his audience at the Thursday night public forum at Spring Lake Country Club sponsored by the Independence Township Republican Club, his attitude had hardened significantly over the years he has served as prosecutor. He has had to prosecute a number of murderers who were

unbelievably ruthless in carrying out the act of murder.

The first brutal killing "that opened my eyes," said Patterson, occurred in May of 1973. Oak Park Police Officer Henry Wolfe made a routine traffic check of a car with two passengers in broad daylight. The two, Reuben Herrera and Charles Meadows, on parole for murder and armed robbery respectively, gunned down Wolfe for no apparent reason.

A year later, continued Patterson, two men walked away from Marquette Prison, picking up a woman and 17 year old hitchhiker as hostages. They stopped in Wisconsin where "the woman dropped to her knees and literally begged for her life." It didn't work. One of the escapees put a gun to her forehead and without hesitation blew her brains out. They then came back to Troy, where they killed another person, before being caught in Flint.

In 1975, said Patterson, we had the child murders that remain unsolved. One unrelated child killing that was solved, however, involved George Onifer, on parole for child rape. Onifer grabbed a small girl off her front yard and killed her. She was found floating in a pond on 14 Mile Road.

Patterson next told the gory details of the Elizabeth Mojica murder. Mojica, a clerk at a convenience store in Waterford was taken hostage by two men in 1976. Jarvis and Siebert took her to an empty field on Clintonville Road, near the I-75 overpass, raped her repeatedly and then stabbed her sixty times.

"The crime that broke the camel's back happened right here in Clarkston," said Patterson. That's when teenager Monica Hockey was found beaten to death with a hammer in the same vicinity as Mojica, in 1979.

After being charged, Kyle Johnson told police, "I'd never seen anybody die before and I wanted to see what it felt like." His partner Jeff Coyle stated, "I want to kill as many people as I am old." He was 19 at the time.

"We should definitely have the penalty of death for that type of crime," emphasized Patterson.

Thus he makes about five speeches a week around the state in an effort to gather the 350,000 signatures needed to get the proposal on the 1982 ballot.

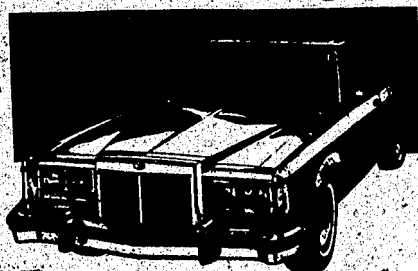
Although he has gathered only about 50,000 to date, Patterson insisted, "I'm absolutely convinced I can get the necessary petitions."

The Youth Assistance Committee, for the last fifteen years, has been sponsoring a Summer Camp Program for children who attend the Clarkston Schools.

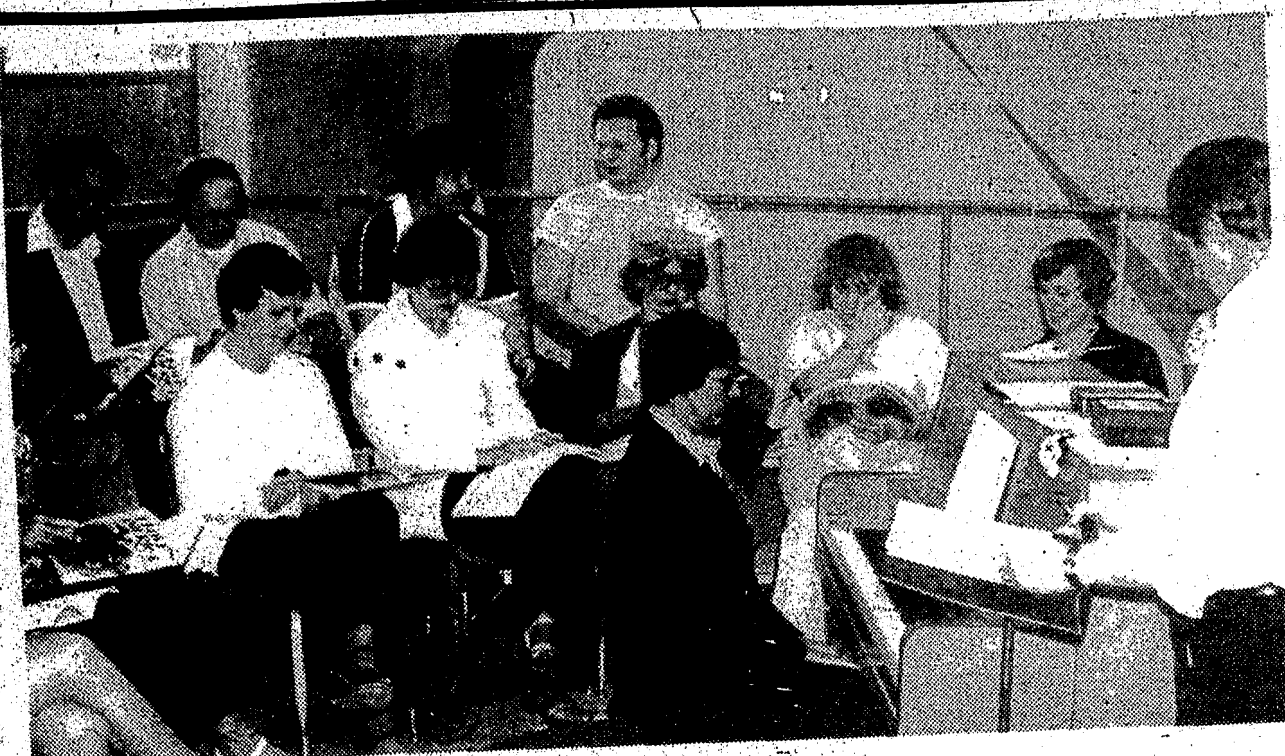
