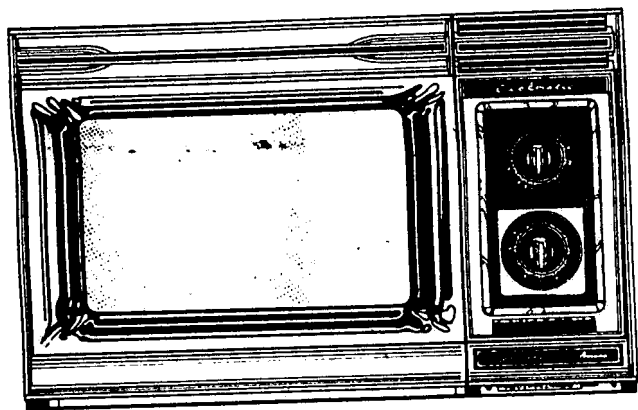

editor's note

This week The Reminder pays tribute to little league baseball and softball, and all the kids and parents that participate in the program.

It's not easy to be a little leaguer. A great deal of pressure and competition surrounds the sport. A strike out might lose the game for your teammates or an error could prove costly in your quest for the coveted championship.

It means sacrifices for the parent, also. Every other day of the week, you must cart your kid or kids to the ball diamond. It may interrupt your weekly schedule and it's likely to be a deciding factor as to when your family will take their vacation.

But little league has more than its share of rewards. There's nothing like seeing the pride on a young ballplayers face after he's hit a critical home run to win the game. Nothing can beat the camaraderie and team spirit that is built up during the course of the season. And many lasting friendships are cultivated as kids group together to attain

one common goal--win the championship.

Our tribute, which begins on Page 17, includes photos of most of the teams participating in the Independence Township Parks and Recreation summer ball program. We regret that we could not include a photo of all the teams in this special section. Photos for some teams were not readily available.

Last week's election results included a number of upsets. Most surprising was Maggie Cavanaugh's nomination as the Democratic candidate for County Commissioner in District Two. She had to overcome Donald Rogers, well-known as former supervisor in Springfield Township, and Ardath Regan, Holly Village councilwoman, who received the endorsements of many newspapers.

Ms. Cavanaugh did it without any campaign funds to speak of. Her major thrust was an intensive door-to-door campaign and it apparently paid off.

In Independence Township two firmly entrenched trustees were defeated on the Republican slate. Jerry Powell and Mike Thayer were beaten by four candidates supported by a well-organized group called Independence Residents for Responsible Government.

The group put on a massive campaign effort for their four trustee candidates, spending thousands of dollars.

Unlike Springfield Township where both millage proposals were soundly defeated, Independence voters approved three out of four millage requests. The only millage proposal not to receive approval was an extra mill for police protection.

WHAT IS THE HOSPICE MOVEMENT?

In the United States most Hospices are specialized departments or units in a hospital which provide emotional and spiritual support as well as medical services to the terminally ill. These units are staffed by a team of doctors, nurses, psychiatrists and other professionals specially trained and experienced in the matters of death-and-dying. The services provided are not only for the patient but are also available to the families in order to help them learn to cope with their difficult situation.

Sandol Stoddard, author of "The Hospice Movement", states "Dying is a perfectly natural thing. There is nothing wrong with it. But dying, like birthing, requires some assistance."

The emphasis on hospice care is in encouraging families to care for a dying person at home in their familiar surroundings rather than in a hospital where the emphasis has to be on cure.

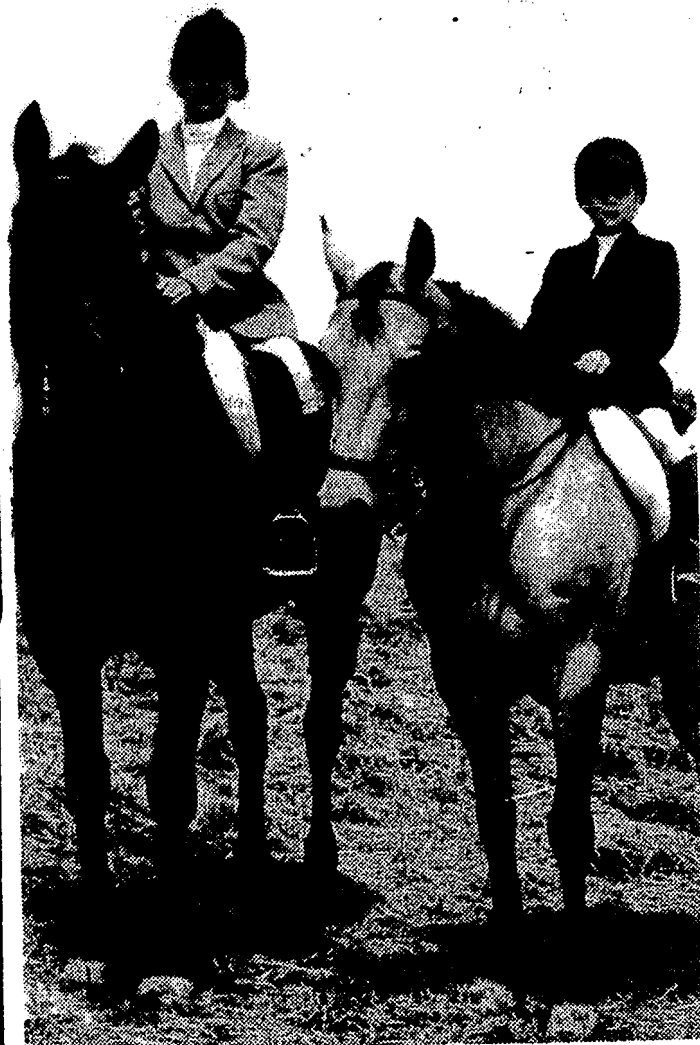



Springfield Sets Meeting for Condo Sewage Controversy

Great controversy arose at the Springfield Township Board meeting Wednesday night over the ownership of the Bavarian Village Sewage Treatment Plant. The plant is part of the project of converting the Bavarian Village Apartments into condominiums. According

to state law, with a conversion of this type the plant must be owned and maintained by the township or county.

Springfield Township Supervisor Collin Walls stated that his personal recommendation was to keep an "active involvement" in the project. He presented Community

National Bank (CNB) with a list of recommendations for the development of the plant to qualify for strict Department of Public Health regulations.

The recommendations also included proposal for \$15,000 from CNB to be deposited into an account along with \$15,000 from Springfield. The funds will be used to evaluate the sewage treatment plants present adequacy and future expenses. The engineering firm of Mosher-Kapelczak Inc. has been hired by Springfield Township to conduct the study.

A few concerned residents were at the meeting, expressing their views.

Dave Latta, presently living in the Blue Water Bavarian Village condominiums, stated that he was very frustrated with the standstill of the plant and would like to know who's going to be responsible for it.

Harold Findman, also living in the Blue Water Bavarian Village condos, felt that the township "should pursue this to the end and own the system if we are to survive."

Robert Gibbins, a renter in the complex, said, "I love the area and would like to be an owner. I would like to see the township own it soon."

Robert Field of Blue Water Bavarian Village apartments, felt that the township was "...whistling Dixie if you think the county is going to take over ownership. Why not take the bullet in your teeth and get the problem solved."

Don Ringler and Milton Handorf of the Oakland County Department of Public Works were at the meeting with their views. According to Ringler, the only department which can legally own the system is the Drain Commission and "they don't have the ability or facilities to maintain it."

His recommendation was for Springfield

Ward Carpenter

Real Cowboy Gets Kick Out of Ranch Life

Needless to say, horse ranching is an arduous, time-consuming occupation requiring much dedication, determination and skill. It necessitates a lifestyle filled with such devotion to one's work that the need for a vacation becomes secondary to the requirements of the job -- since the animals must have attention every single day.

A man with such qualities is Ward Carpenter. Ward and his wife Louella reside on a ranch in the wooded section of Bridge Lake Road in Springfield Township. They purchased their home and twenty-five acres in 1940 for the now unbelievable price of \$8300.

They moved from Pontiac and "do not intend to ever move again. We consider ourselves very lucky to live here," said the robust Carpenter.

In the late 50's, as an employee for Fisher Body Division of General Motors, he was transferred to Indiana for eight years. It was from there that he retired in 1965 after thirty years with the company.

During those years in Indiana he held onto his ranch in Davisburg. "I always knew we'd move back -- we love it here."

"We have always had horses around," said the rancher -- currently he has twelve. Half a dozen he calls his own and the other six are boarded for local residents.

At one time though, the Carpenters owned

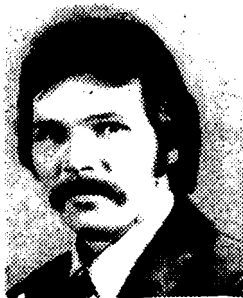

thirty-five horses. That was during the time they were operating the Circle C Riding Stable which they started in 1965 and maintained for several years, until the five Carpenter children grew up and left home. Then, the upkeep and expense of the riding stable became too much for the Carpenters so they gave it up. Presently, Carpenter is in the business of buying and selling horses and also deals in feed and bedding for the animals.

Carpenter is a man who holds fast to the philosophy, 'I'd rather do it myself'. Such as the barn he built himself, thereby saving an estimated \$2,000 by doing so. "It's not the best barn in the world but it serves the purpose," said Carpenter.

Of his avocation Carpenter said, "I feel better when I'm working than I do just sitting around. You have to work off your frustrations some way and this way I'm doing something that I enjoy, plus I make a little profit too."

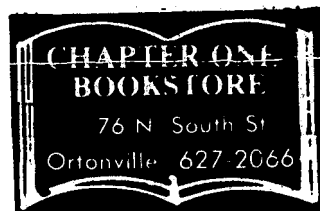
