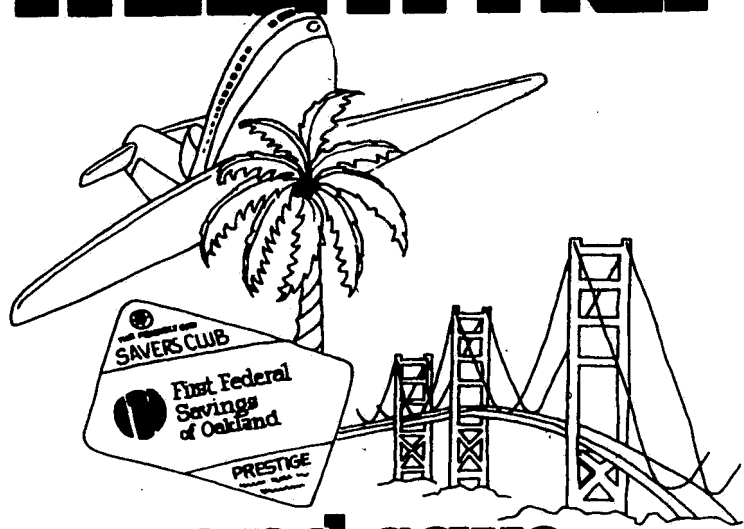
In Pony Jumping she received a 5th place.

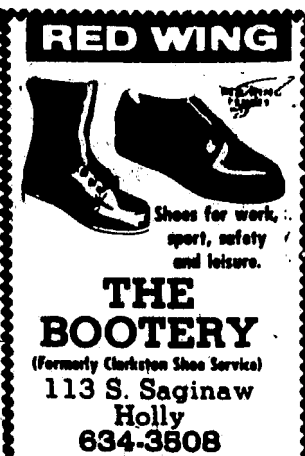

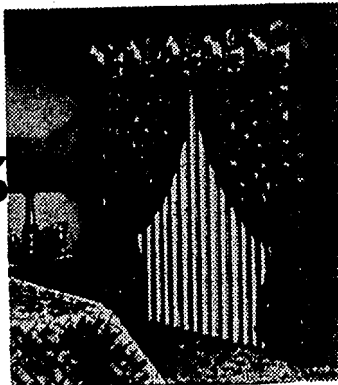

Two Independence Ball Teams Vye for State Titles

Slow Pitch Softball has been in full swing the entire summer in Independence Township, both in men and women leagues.

Two teams in the township have played like houses afire and yet, at the close of the sultry weather, refuse to extinguish their flames.

These two blazing teams are the Clarkston Fuel Pumpers, a men's team sponsored by Clarkston Fuel and Supply, and Deer Lake Inn, a women's team sponsored by Bob Beasley, owner of the Deer Lake Inn.

This past weekend the Clarkston Fuel

Pumpers finished second in the Metro Detroit American Softball Association (ASA) Class C Tournament at Clintonwood Park off Clarkston Road. The Fuel Pumpers were undefeated entering the finals but lost two games to Click Club of Wyandotte.

During this particular tournament, four players hit over .600 for the Fuel Pumpers, led by Larry Jackson's .633 and Timmy Thompson's .625 achievements. Six additional players averaged over .500 at the plate for the team.

Placing second in the tournament, now qualifies the Clarkston Fuel Pumpers to

compete with the top two teams in their class from the upper part of Michigan to vie for the Class C championship title in the Michigan ASA Tournament on September 6th and 7th, also to be played at Clintonwood Park.

Ken Smith, coach and manager for the Fuel Pumpers says, "this team has improved greatly." After four consecutive years of play with nearly the original line-up of players, the first year's win/loss record was 10-23 compared to the 33-15 record they currently hold, which includes regular league play in Independence Township plus various additional tournaments they have participated in this year.

Leonard Smith, sponsor for the team and, who, incidentally has never missed a game is, "appreciative of what a good job the Pumpers have done--they've played their heads off!"

The Fuel Pumpers are represented by Tom Bosquez, Mike Coulter, Bob Golding, Ron Heatherington, Larry Jackson, Scott Jones, Jack McGowan, Brian Powell, Don Powell, Russ Reekwald, Gary Rhodes, Don Stevens, Dwain Swindellhurst and Timmy Thompson.

Pouring it on in the final game of the Metro Detroit ASA Class C Tournament were the women who represent the Deer Lake Inn. Ending the battle by a score of 16-4, they swept the tourney with four wins and no losses.



District Governor Pays Davisburg Rotarians a Visit

Leo E. Harrawood comes from the only branch of a family that carries his surname north of the Mason-Dixon line. But he is distinguished in other ways too.

Acting in his capacity as District Governor of Rotary District 638, Harrawood addressed last Wednesday's weekly meeting of the Davisburg Rotary.

His appearance there was the last in a day that began at 5:30 a.m. in Troy where he met with district officers on Rotary business, took him to the Moslem Shrine Temple in Detroit (where he holds forth as Illustrious Potentate to Michigan's 20,000 Shriners) and included a stop in Novi, where he donned his realtor's cap for a few hours.

By the time he reached Davisburg for a pre-dinner meeting with that club's board he admitted, with a little chagrin, "I was so tired, I pulled up under a shade tree to rest for a few minutes, put my head back and fell sound asleep."

Fortunately, the sound of a passing truck

stirred this district governor back to life and the Davisburg Rotary is on track for another (its 12th) busy year.

As Harrawood examples, and emphasized in his address, the Rotary exists to "serve, serve, serve". Sleep is a secondary, though necessary, consideration.

Founded in 1905 by Chicago attorney, Paul Harris, the Rotary is based on the principle of "unselfish service".

This principle is advanced in the daily lives of the business and professional men who make up the local chapters, in continuing projects of community service and in the promotion of international peace, understanding and goodwill.

In Davisburg, the Rotary is engaged in projects from the collection of contributions to buy shoes and food for needy children, to a weekly raffle, the proceeds of which go to the fund to purchase a "Jaws of Life" for the Fire Department.

Every Christmas the Rotary and their female counterparts, the Rotary Anns, get together to distribute food and fruit baskets in homes where holidays only emphasize everyday privation.

As Harrawood said, "Each member must ask, 'Am I really contributing or am I just wearing the pin?'"

"Rotary," he said, "is not just something we do once a week for a few hours, it is a part of our own self-identity."

In his speech, "Why Am I a Rotarian?", Harrawood told of his early years, "working in the field of Indiana alongside my father; we had long discussions about life."

"And he told me, 'We must do the best we can with what we have in the time we have to do it.'"

"He taught me to trust in God, to put first things first and to know that I'd never get something for nothing."

"All those lessons are for the Rotarian as well as the farmboy," he said.

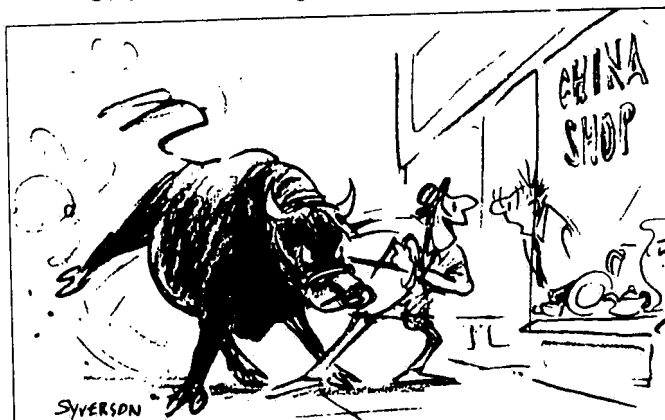

sober-faced group of do-gooders, toiling silently away for the betterment of mankind, however. The Rotarians are usually the regular guys who live next door.

Many of them admitted, a little shamefacedly, that they had recently married their attendance records with summer vacations.

Not forgetting for a moment their commitment to service, much of the conversation at the meeting was devoted to telling fishing stories and talking about gas-mileage.

Leo Harrawood calls that just another plus for Rotary.

"I bet I've met a thousand or so swell guys in my travels across the district so far," he said.

There is plenty of cameraderie involved. The Rotarians enjoy getting together, not least of all because the meetings at Davisburg Town Hall include a genuine home cooked meal, prepared by Mrs. Bonnie

Donofrio.

They need to be fortified; the Rotarian year is really getting underway now. September 20th, in co-sponsorship with other service clubs in the area, the "Farewell to Summer" festival will be held in downtown Davisburg. Scheduled for the event are a parade and pancake breakfast, craft and bake sales and, with luck, some hot-air balloons. The Rotary is responsible for providing a whole, roast hog.

Another project, the "Jaws of Life", continues. But, as Gordon Rigoulot, current president of the Davisburg chapter says, "We're definitely not there yet (contrary to published reports elsewhere)."

As an international service club, with world peace an expressed goal, the Rotary sponsors foreign exchange visits. This past winter a group from District 638 (five businessmen accompanied by one Rotarian) traveled to Pakistan to view life and culture there. This followed a visit the previous year by five Pakistanis to Michigan and Ontario.

Several members took, together, more than a thousand photos during their visit and will be giving slide shows to various chapters in the coming year.

The Rotary sponsors a scholarship fund, the Paul Harris Fellowship, which sends students of journalism, international studies, handicapped specialists and technicians to graduate and under-graduate schools here and abroad.

Kirk Beattie, a 1969 graduate of Clarkston High School, is one of the present recipients.

He also received a post-graduate certificate in 1971 from the National College of State Trial Judges at the University of Nevada. He was elected Prosecuting Attorney of Oakland County in 1964.
