



In Pony Jumping she received a 5th place.


Lisa was Grand Champion at the County Fair in hunt Seat, Fitting and Showing, Equatation, and reserve in Dressage.

stirred this district governor back to life and the Davisburg Rotary is on track for another (its 12th) busy year.

As Harrawood examples, and emphasized in his address, the Rotary exists to "serve, serve, serve". Sleep is a secondary, though necessary, consideration.

Founded in 1905 by Chicago attorney, Paul Harris, the Rotary is based on the principle of "unselfish service".

This principle is advanced in the daily lives of the business and professional men who make up the local chapters, in continuing projects of community service and in the promotion of international peace, understanding and goodwill.

In Davisburg, the Rotary is engaged in projects from the collection of contributions to buy shoes and food for needy children, to a weekly raffle, the proceeds of which go to the fund to purchase a "Jaws of Life" for the Fire Department.

Every Christmas the Rotary and their female counterparts, the Rotary Anns, get together to distribute food and fruit baskets in homes where holidays only emphasize

everyday privation. As Harrawood said, "Each member must ask, 'Am I really contributing or am I just wearing the pin?'

'Rotary," he said, "is not just something we do once a week for a few hours, it is a part of our own self-identity.'

In his speech, "Why Am I a Rotarian?", Harrawood told of his early years, "working in the field of Indiana alongside my father; we had long discussions about life.'

"And he told me, 'We must do the best we can with what we have in the time we have to

"He taught me to trust in God, to put first things first and to know that I'd never get something for nothing."

"All those lessons are for the Rotarian as well as the farmboy," he said.



Many of them admitted, a little shamfacedly, that they had recently married their attendance records with summer vacations.

The Rotary sponsors a scholarship fund, the Paul Harris Fellowship, which sends journalism, international students of handicapped specialists and studies, technicians to graduate and under-graduate schools here and abroad.

Kirk Beattie, a 1969 graduate of Clarkston High School, is one of the present recipients.

He is in Cairo pursuing his Phd. in international relations.

The Davisburg club contributed to the fund by collecting \$100 from every member to honor Charlie Going, Rotarian of 42 years and a founder, in 1968, of the Davisburg
