"State of the Township"

Following thirteen months in office, Independence Township Supervisor James B. Smith reviewed the "State of the Township" much as the Governor and the President deliver annual messages on the state of their respective governments.

When asked to describe the state of the township when he took office in November of 1980, Smith replied, "...about as I expected...There had been good effort put forth but a vacuum existed in terms of long range administrative planning and a number of procedures that evolved without much structural documentation."

"There was also the challenge," he continued, "of maintaining services in the face of a constricting budgetary situation. The management team very rapidly set about the development of new budgeting on a basis of cash management. This has resulted...in operation on a deficit-free basis and with the discharge of existing overruns so that we're now preparing the 1982-83 budget without some of the problems which confronted us when the new board took office."

"The cooperation of the departmental managers has been splendid in achieving it. Each now has a monthly operating base of revenues and expenditures for his department and realizes deviations in either one requires action to keep that department in within the budgetary limits," Smith concluded.

Smith emphasized employee morale was good. The township has developed a "policy of forthright handling of problems in regard to the unions...we have eliminated wide areas of misunderstanding and questionable interpretations. There is now an aura of trust and cooperation throughout the township staff."

The supervisor also felt it was important to note another aspect of that good morale: communication. "We have established communications between management and employees, management and elected officials, department heads and the board. There is a team concept," he said. "We have monthly meetings helping to understand each other's problems and the total

problems."

As a related item, Smith added the work of one of his many appointed task forces has resulted in a manual of written policies and procedures. Smith hopes this will set standards that will continue to function even if changes in administration occur. This manual has just been submitted to the supervisor and will be discussed by the entire township board at its December 15 meeting or the first one in January.

Another task force report submitted recently was compiled by the group looking into business practices. They have suggested texts for both a budgeting ordinance and a purchasing ordinance tailored to the needs of the township, plus a number of

"significant recommendations for controlling cash flow, budgeting philosophy, and guidelines for evaluation of future computer needs," Smith revealed.

When asked to assess the results of significant changes in professional services, those for which the township contracts, Smith smiled and said, "it is generally agreed we have improved our lot."

The first change occurred when long time township engineers Johnson and Anderson were replaced by Bloomfield-based Hubbell, Roth and Clark, Inc. Reasons for the change were cited as "quality of work and question

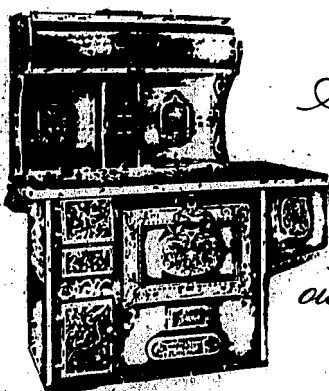

WHAT FINANCIAL HELP IS AVAILABLE?

of performance of the previous engineers...it appears we are receiving greater value for our dollar (with the present firm)." Smith said.

The second significant change came when township planner Tod Kilroy was

replaced by Anyers, Lewis, Norris & May of Ann Arbor, a firm with a strong engineering and planning background, according to Smith. Richard Carlisle is the firm's representative in Independence Township. Reasons for the change were cited as "partially a matter of costs and charges and partially a matter of thoroughness."

Yet another personnel change occurred in the past year when Timothy Palulian, head of the township building department, resigned to take a position in the private sector. "Palulian had put great effort into his job," Smith explained, "but he had another inviting job opportunity." It was fortunate for the township, Smith added, that Ken Delbridge was in a position to come back. "He is highly competent with great past experience with the township."

One of Smith's "campaign promises" was the establishment of task forces to better involve citizens in their government and to utilize the talents of those citizens. Thirteen months later, some are still at work, others are winding down their efforts, while still others are seeing their labors realized.

The Safety Path Committee, established by the Planning Commission when Smith was a member of that body, has seen phase I of the master plan completed. In the summer of 1980, township citizens voted .50 of a mill for ten years to create a network of paths for an energy-conscious community. Although commonplace in Europe, this concept is still somewhat unique in this country, Smith said. His is certain their value will be greater appreciated in the years to come.

The task force looking into public, arterial and private roads recommended the township authorize a professional study of M-15 traffic problems. That study is now being conducted by a private concern "free of pressures and sometimes alleged predeterminations of the state highway people," Smith said. It is jointly funded by the township and the village with a final report possible by the end of the first quarter of 1982. This task force has also brought together the two governmental bodies in matters of mutual and individual concern, he added. It continues to study having shifted

Smith Says Independence in Fine Shape

of performance of the previous engineers...it appears we are receiving greater value for our dollar (with the present firm)." Smith said.

The second significant change came when township planner Tod Kilroy was

replaced by Anyers, Lewis, Norris & May of Ann Arbor, a firm with a strong engineering and planning background, according to Smith. Richard Carlisle is the firm's representative in Independence Township. Reasons for the change were cited as "partially a matter of costs and charges and partially a matter of thoroughness."

Yet another personnel change occurred in the past year when Timothy Palulian, head of the township building department, resigned to take a position in the private sector. "Palulian had put great effort into his job," Smith explained, "but he had another inviting job opportunity." It was fortunate for the township, Smith added, that Ken Delbridge was in a position to come back. "He is highly competent with great past experience with the township."

One of Smith's "campaign promises" was the establishment of task forces to better involve citizens in their government and to utilize the talents of those citizens. Thirteen months later, some are still at work, others are winding down their efforts, while still others are seeing their labors realized.

The Safety Path Committee, established by the Planning Commission when Smith was a member of that body, has seen phase I of the master plan completed. In the summer of 1980, township citizens voted .50 of a mill for ten years to create a network of paths for an energy-conscious community. Although commonplace in Europe, this concept is still somewhat unique in this country, Smith said. His is certain their value will be greater appreciated in the years to come.

The task force looking into public, arterial and private roads recommended the township authorize a professional study of M-15 traffic problems. That study is now being conducted by a private concern "free of pressures and sometimes alleged predeterminations of the state highway people," Smith said. It is jointly funded by the township and the village with a final report possible by the end of the first quarter of 1982. This task force has also brought together the two governmental bodies in matters of mutual and individual concern, he added. It continues to study having shifted

its focus to private roads.

The Solid Waste Task Force apparently established itself early with the county as a group to be reckoned with and continues to closely monitor the development of the Oakland County master plan for its possible impact on Independence Township. While continuing to protect the township's interests, task force members are addressing the question of contract pickup and disposal services. This plan, according to Smith, has saved other townships as much as 30-40 percent and curtailed the problem of back road dumping.

The Community Center Committee, formed to serve the joint needs of the community and the school district, progressed to the physical planning stage with its work placed "temporarily in abeyance because of the present economic conditions."

The Public Safety Task Force has completed its work studying police, fire and emergency medical service and will likely present its report at the December 15 meeting. Their recommendations, Smith said, will be based on a great many meetings, interviews and studies of programs in similar townships.

A report from the Senior Citizen Task Force is anticipated in January. Smith said they have identified the needs of the township and recommendations will be made based on a great many meetings and site visitations. A survey by the committee is included in the latest edition of the township newsletter along with one compiled by the Cable Television Task Force. Smith hopes all citizens will read and respond to the surveys.

The Cable Television Task Force is in the process of drafting a letter to prospective vendors for approval by the township board within the next 30 days. The group will meet again once responses to that letter have been received.

Other township activities this past year include the purchase of property on Maybee Road for a proposed park. Despite initial problems with the question of property ownership, final purchase is due shortly. Despite concerns of Deer Lake residents earlier this summer, the new boat launch has been installed and Smith considers the matter laid to rest.

In the area of litigation, Independence continues to have its days in court, some cases inherited by Smith, some added during his first year in office. The Supervisor attributes the number of legal battles "to the township's reputation as a tough, quality township...We insist on government by law."

The township will continue court challenges on group adult foster care homes, he said, until the State Supreme Court makes a decision one way or the other. It is the township's contention these commercially operated homes belong in areas zoned multiple and not single family residential. They are not single families, they are caretaker facilities. There is no township objection to families who care of handicapped foster children or adults in their own homes.

Arcades, or electronic games establishments, have been hot items and hot issues lately in many areas; Independence Town-

ship is no exception. Local ordinance allows them in enclosed malls only as a principle use and in entertainment centers such as Howe's Lanes and the Deer Lake Racquet Club as an accessory use. Smith had no answer for the one found in a local grocery store. Presently, the ordinance is being studied "intensively" and the township is trying to work out a plan with the one proposed for a building on M-15, he said.

The condemnation suit continues with the Levy Company on 80 acres of land on Clarkston Road adjacent to Clintonwood Park. The development of the case has taken a great deal of time for both sides; delays have been encountered. A mid-march deadline is in effect for providing the necessary data with a pre-trial hearing likely in April, Smith reported.

The second dispute with the Levy Company over its plans for gravel mining near Independence Oaks County Park is virtually at a standstill, Smith revealed. The township is pressing the Department of Natural Resources for action, he continued, a decision should have followed last January's public hearing but attorneys for Levy continue to request delays for "alleged conferences with the township in pursuit of compromise." Smith said there has been no contact by the company or its attorneys. They have, however, "sought vigorously to influence concerned conservation groups, the Oakland County Parks and Recreation Commission among others, to modify their positions against the proposed gravel operation."

Smith was critical of what he termed the

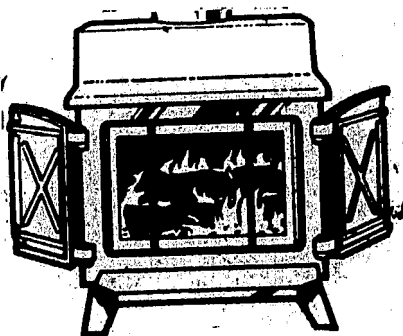

James Smith paints a rosy picture of life in the fast lane, or as some would call it, at the helm of Independence Township government. His government by action, not reaction and appointment of numerous task forces are certainly noble endeavors.

His new government has accomplished a lot in its first year of operation -- a lot more than many of their predecessors had done in two years.

But, now, is not the time to set on laurels. There's a lot more to accomplish.

Some of the task forces have performed brilliantly -- while others have been lackadaisical in accomplishing their duties. Two areas that ought to deserve more attention are efforts to build a community center and a stepped-up program to provide more senior citizen activities.

Spending the kind of money Independence did, for an out-of-state firm to study M-15 traffic problems seemed frivolous to us at the time. But we shall await, anxiously, their recommendations, before we decided to cast stones. At the very least, we do applaud the Board for taking action on what could someday amount to a monumental traffic bottleneck.

And taking Robert Warrington to court over the establishment of an arcade seems a bit dubious.

The Salem and Levy gravel pits, however, do belong in court. Particularly Salem, with a reclamation project that was promised but never delivered, should be challenged until something is done with the Dartmouth Road destruction.

One thing for sure, you may dispute Independence Township's methods, but you can't accuse them of inaction. That, in itself, is a noticeable change from previous administrations.

We thought you should know that the Davisburg Scotties Crafts Fest was a huge success. The Reminder has followed the Scotties in their effort to recreate a historical Davisburg in a Christmas setting since they began last Spring.

Well the culmination of the effort, which

involved the entire community, was brought to life last Saturday when hundreds of people packed the Springfield-Oaks Activities Center for the festivities.

Never have we seen a better example of community pride and spirit. We were proud to be a part of it all.

DNR's "history of compromise, rather, that decisive action." At this point, they have not granted Levy's request for a mining permit, but on the other hand, they have not denied it.

The township's problems with Salem Sand and Gravel, operators of a gravel mining operation in the Indianwood Road area, have progressed to the point where "people and engineers on both sides, at Salem's expense, are drafting a new reclamation plan and timetable since nothing mandated by the courts has been done in the past four years." As far as additional mining time is concerned, Smith termed the "dubious at best based on past record of blatant disregard for existing court orders."

On the supervisor's list of continuing problems to be addressed are noise controls for both Pine Knob Music Theatre and Waterford Hills Race Track and annexation.

Discussions are going on with both Pine Knob and Waterford Hills with the ultimate goal of "more acceptable control of sound for the 1982 season." The advisability of modifying the existing ordinance "as necessary" is also being reviewed by the township board. Smith feels the new posture of the township closely monitoring the two activities has made them more "cooperative."

Waterford Hill has hired a consultant to advise methods and means of controlling noise, but the testing, in Smith's opinion, may not be completed before the opening of the season, but a representative of citizens living in the area is working with them at township request.

A meeting with representatives of the Nederlander organization has been arranged to "clarify the township's position

and to provide ample time for such modifications of amplification and the program schedule as may be required for the 1982 summer season," Smith said. The Oakland County Sheriff's Department has also expressed an interest in providing input concerning "patron control".

The annexation issue is one Smith would like to see addressed long before it becomes a potential problem as it has in Avon, Commerce and Lyon charter townships. They are losing some of their territory to adjacent cities attempting to expand their tax bases. Under certain conditions this can be done without a vote of the people due to passage of legislation in 1978 thought to be a cleanup of a previous act but in reality eliminating protection of the townships.
