

# Barb Lacey-Clarkston's Own Soap Star

Like former Clarkston resident and now famous movie actress Valerie Bertinelli. Clarkston's Barbara Lacey will soon be a familiar face on television.

Ms. Bertinelli has become well known for her lead role on the hit TV series."One Day at

Ms. Lacey is beginning her television acting career with a lead role on the soap opera. "Generations" which will be telecast on Channel 20 (WXON) September 23-28.

Ms. Lacey has been acting at this and that all her life, but hasn't really taken it serious until lately.

She was plucked from Royal Oak's Fourth Street Playhouse for the "Generations" role.

I was auditioning for the Fourth Street Playhouse," recalled Ms. Lacey, "It was a very emotional scene, As I started reading the lines I became emotional with my voice breaking and lots of tears flowing.

"After that a lady came running up to me named Lorrie Johnson from WXON," continued Ms. Lacey. "She said she had a part in a soap opera that she felt I would be interested in. She asked me to audition, I agreed, and got the part."

Her acting talent came from her father who had a country band in Arkansas and New Mexico. She remembers starring in serveral Shakespeare Classics while attending high school in Detroit.

Eventually, Ms. Lacey got married and became mother to four children. While caring for her children she engaged in writing. When the family moved to Clarkston she became involved first with Brandon Stage and then with the Clarkston Village Players.

With the Clarkston Village Players she acted in "Deadwood Dick", Treasure Island" and "Fall River"

In the meantime, Ms. Lacey was going through a divorce. Friends offered her words of encouragement and often suggested that she should pursue an acting career.

"But I felt my age was a deterrent," she

"I felt that if you were going to make acting a career that you should start when you are 18 or 19;" she said.

She added, "My friends urged me to contact an agent. When I did I was thrilled when they told me that I was the perfect age. That was all I needed. I knew I had a chance."

On her way to the Fourth Street Playhouse, Ms. Lacey obtained a job with WMZK as a deejay. Simultaneously she was also selling advertising for a Renaissance Center

"I made many flub ups and I inserted my foot in my mouth many times, but I also bit hard," she sald. "It was a fantastic learning experience."

WXON's "Generations" centers around the fictional Dewitt family, who live in fic-tional Arbor Hills. Most of the scenes are shot in and around Detroit.

Carl Dewitt, the family patriarc is a business tycoon with his fingers in all sorts of things. He comes back to Arbor Hills to prevent a business partner from selling a company to the Japanese. All the while he must deal with an alcoholic wife and two fiesty daughters.

Ms. Lacey plays Dr. Helen Gunther. To develop the role she has sought out several doctors, interviewed them and watched actual surgery so she could get the feel of how



Will your homeowner's insurance cover the replacement cost if some or all of the house's contents are lost to fire or theft? It probably will, if you've got a replacement cost policy or rider to your regular policy.

Under most homeowners' policies, you would collect the current cash value of what was lost, or cost minus depreciation. Replacement cost insurance would usually pay you whatever you needed to get a new item at current prices.

Your dwelling itself must be insured for at least 80 percent of its replacement value for you to get full payment, up to the limits of the policy. If you're only insured for 50 percent of actual value, for instance, you're considered a "co-insurer" and will only receive 50 percent of your loss.

Replacement cost insurance for contents is a new concept; only about 20 percent of all policies have it now. It's especially important when your belongings are no longer new and there is a great discrepancy between their cash value and replacement cost.

This extra protection costs a little more, but the difference in payoff can be impressive. Some insurance companies require extra coverage on contents and set limits on what they'll pay for certain valuables.

Family reunions are an American phenomenon, I think, born out of the frenetic mobilization of our twentieth century families.

Like everybody else, I made the annual trek to mine this summer, just a little grudgingly, but with some curiosity too.

The first few hours of any reunion is a redundant echoing of vague phrases, like, "Gads! you've changed!" and "Look at the size of that kid!", phrases meant to buy time until you stumble onto the real meat of a person's life, or heaven forbid, actually find something in common with those strangers. cálled relatives.

When I was a kid, I remember the canvaswrapped tubs of vanilla ice cream that came after a deluge of jello, potato salad and ham. Free ice cream. It seemed almost mystical.

I had an aunt who was the matriarchal figure of the reunions back then. At 101, she became, in her home of Pleasant Valley, the nation's oldest justice of the peace. She had been a school teacher, but retired, and then, consummately dissatisfied with her nonworking life, set out to do other things. She wrote for the local newspaper for years.

Old Aunt Clarey, we called her: Frail, so small, I couldn't imagine such a frail fineboned woman could be so alive.

But she was very much alive, presiding over the reunions - in later years from a wheelchair - like a tiny queen, that silkwhite hair tufting every which way from her fragile head. She seemed to me she would break every time she opened her mouth to speak in those caw-like tones.

But she didn't. Her chatter and her presence carried on for a long time, until I became a teenager, and no longer attended the reunions:

This year's reunion was much like the others, the small talk, the exclamations. The food.. But there are no tubs of ice cream anymore. And no Aunt Clarey. It isn't quite the same.

As members of the Sheriff's Jail Consent Judgment Ad Hoc Coordinating Committee composed of four Captains and the Undersheriff, four of whom have served as Commander of the Jail at some time over the past ten years, we feel we must respond to some of the inaccurate and irresponsible statements made by William Spinelli, a subordinate of the County Executive.

1. First of all, we, the undersigned, have never, we repeat never had any knowledge of, or reason to suspect there has been, a deliberate misstatement of the Jall Count. Human mistakes are made, a poorly designed computer program has further added⊬to our problems. These problems are being addressed by an increased staff at the Jall and by a reprogramming of our computer computer by Oakland County Computer Services.

2. As to the claim that we are not accepting the recommendations of the Jail Study Subcommittee, this is simply not true. We have followed most of the recommendations with the exception of a concept which would remove sentenced prisoners from our Jail to be mixed with our Work Release residents. This solution was deemed not feasible by the Sheriff and Undersheriff.

3. The proposed use of credit cards for posting bond was actually researched and suggested to the Jail Study Subcommittee by Sheriff's personnel, but it was ruled illegal by the Prosecutor's Office. We are, therefore, awaiting direction from a higher authority before any further moves on this concept will

4. We have installed phones in nearly every prisoner area of the Jail, contrary to Mr. Spineili's statements.

5. We are prepared to house overflow prisoners in the Circuit Court Detention area as the new staff becomes available.

6. We must accept certain prearraigned prisoners from various police departments. Sheriff Spreen is in Circuit Court at the present time because we refused one such arrest. We are refusing most prearraigned new arrests as a means of controlling our

population. ,7,-/The courts determine who 'is Work Release eligible, not the Sheriff. However, we notice Mr. Spinelli is not taking the judges to task.

8. Our Trusty Camp, contrary to Mr. Spinelli's charges, is operating as close to its designed capacity as the number of eligible low-risk prisoners allows:

Ĭn summary, Mr. Spinelli is either; (a) woefully uninformed as to what is really happening in the Jail, (b) embarking on a political mission to embarrass Sheriff Spreen by his attacks on the credibility of our Corrective Services Division officers, with little concern for truth or accuracy, or (c) both



Another part of our Contract called for the grading of 800,000 square feet for the placement of colored concrete which connects the Future World Pavilions, and yet another to excavate for over five miles of electrical conduit and control







# Living in Africa

### Jim Bleau Tells What it is Like

Jim Bleau, a Clarkston resident, recently returned home from a 2 year stint with the Peace Corps in the African nation of Senegal. He told us what it was like in a recent interview with Reminder reporter Al Wieling

What is the Peace Corps?

Bleau: The Peace Corps was started in 1961 by the Kennedy Administration. The main goal was to get young people into different countries doing services and originating projects. The particular area i was involved in was called World Development.

What was your particular objective?

Bleau: I was placed in a village, told to learn the languages of that village and to help the village leaders and groups in finding their needs and then matching resources with what they had.

How did you get involved in the Peace

Bleau: When I was in college I thought it would be interesting to get out and travel and see the other countries. Somebody told me to look into the Peace Corps. I found out what programs they had going and what countries were involved. They had 63 countries involved and I was assigned to the Senegal, which is the farthest western point

What was Senegal like?

Bleau: It's more or less a desolate area with

a very small rainfall. There is always a problem with water. I applied for a grant and got the money to administer some projects. We dug something like 3-5 new wells.

French is the official language of Senegal. The national language is called Wolof. The people I lived with were called Sereeren-Dut. and that was another language I had to deal with. That was a local language for about 1500 peòple.

Was the language hard for you to pick up? Bleau: Yes. However if you wanted water or

food you soon learned it very fast. If you didn't learn you didn't eat and didn't know where you were going to sleep the night. If took a good 6-7 months with hair pulling at times because you really didn't know what was going on.

Would you consider the culture primitive?
Bleau: It depends. You will have one guy.

What kind of transportation is used in Senegal?

Bleau: People do have cars, but for the most part I guess you would call it public transportation. Peugot pick-up trucks with benches in back to ride on are often used. When you go out farther in the bush you find

that people use horse and buggles or carts. I myself had a moped to get around in.

What do the people do for a living? Bleau: In the villages and the rural areas their main source of income is agriculture. In Senegal the main crop is peanuts which they sell to the French government. The food crop they grow is millet. Millet is not very tasty but it does have protein. It is nutritious and does seem to fill you up.

What was life like in the city? Bleau: The city has running water and the

**PAGE THIRTY TWO** villages have wells. The house in the city had electricity. My house in the village was made of cement with a grass roof.

What religion do they follow?

Bleau: This is a Moslem society and they are Polygamists. A man can have as many as four wives. As Americans we look at that as bad but they look at it as a way to share the work/in Sengalesse society the women do a great deal of the work, take care of the kids, make the meals, and go get the water. Getting the water may take an hour or two because you are getting it by hand and bring it up by ropes and then transporting it back to the hut areas.

What is family life like? Bleau: One of the big problems is

water the old

education isn't mandatory and you have a lot... of children that come from broken homes that live out in the streets. In Senegal you have what is called an extended family where you have brothers, being taken care of by brothers, the old people being taken care of by younger people, etc., etc.

What was the food like?

Bleau: The food was usually a millet pourage in the morning. Fish and rice at noon with vegetables on top. Everyone would go around the big bowl and get a portion. It is an unwritten agreement that we all shared our food with as many as ten people eating from the same bowl. In the villages they eat with their right hand, not with forks and spoons.

What do you think of your experience?
Bleau: It was good because when you are away from the USA you learn to appreciate the things we have. I was the only American
