Award Is Secured from Federal Government

When the bids for bonds for paving the streets in Clarkston were op-ened, it was found that the Community National Bank of Pontiac and the Clarkston State Bank were low bidders. The bid of the Clarkston Bank was accepted at 3% interest.

This bond issue amounting to \$10,-000 represents 55% of the cost of the project and now the Federal government awards 45% or \$9,000.00. As a result, more work can be done on the streets.
