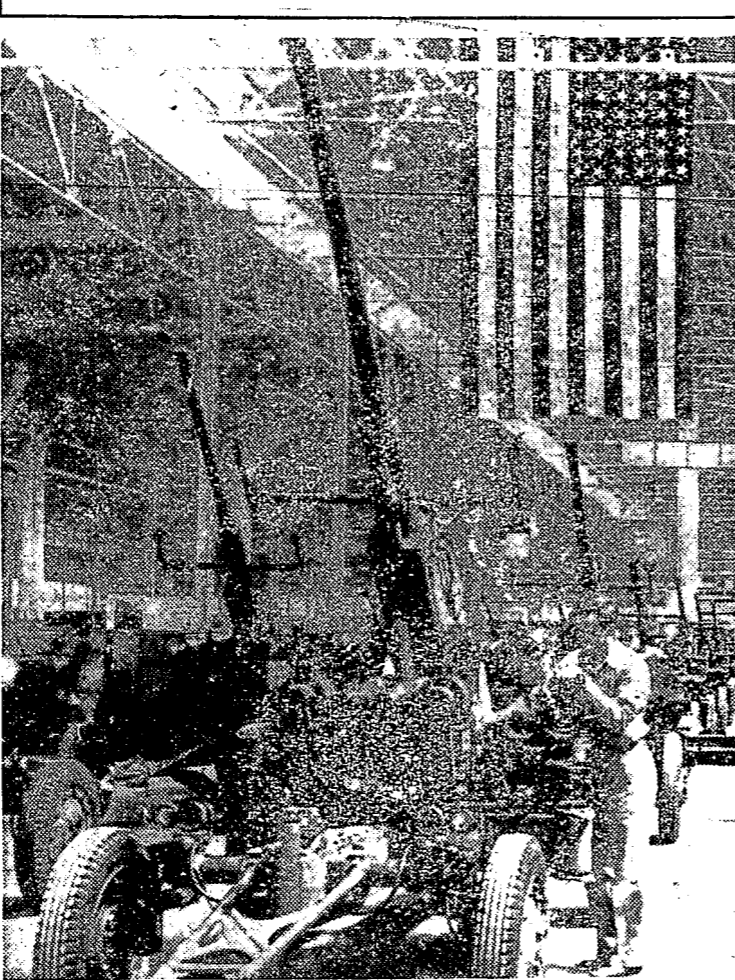

After touring New England in a stock company he broke into big time vaudeville, and from here it was only a short jump to the Broadway stage.

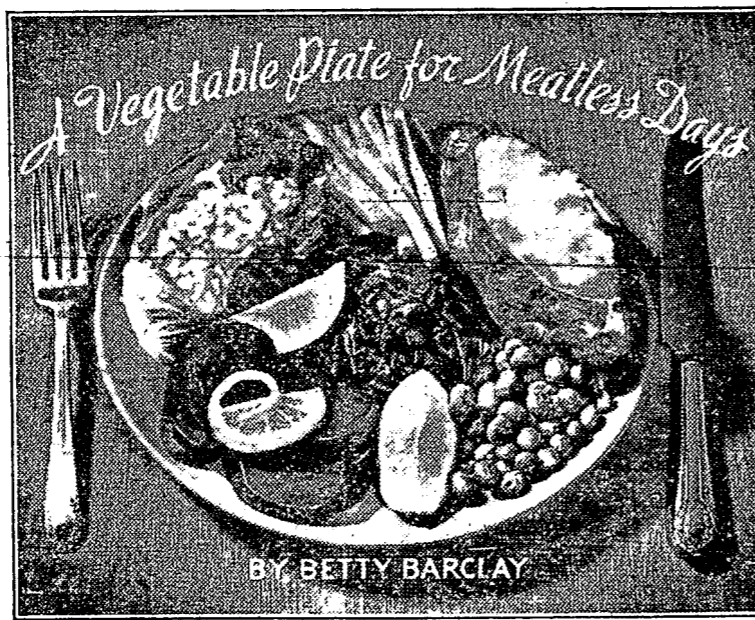
