## Building Facts

---

### **Ground Floor**

Mech/elect. rooms, receiving area, Circuit Court's research atty's, and future growth space.

### **First Floor**

Main lobby, LBPH Library, Research Library & conference room.

### **Second Floor**

Law Library, Corporation Counsel, library director, and conference & meeting rooms.

### **Third Floor**

Prosecuting Atty's, warrants, Family Support, Criminal Investigations & Victim/Witness Divisions.

### **Fourth Floor**

Prosecuting Atty's, District Court, Circuit Court, & Case Records Divisions.

### **Fifth Floor**

Prosecuting Atty's Administration, training, and Juvenile & Appellate Court Divisions.

### **Construction**

Soft gray reflectant energy efficient glass.  
Structural steel frame with architectural precast brick and concrete panels.  
Full sprinkler and fire alarm systems.  
Electronic card access security system.  
Computer controlled HVAC for optimum occupant comfort and energy efficiency.  
Voice/data communication system connected to campus fiber optic network.

## RESEARCH LIBRARY

---

The Oakland County Research Library's collection includes information on planning, census, transportation, business & finance, management and public administration. This library is a depository for county, state, and federal government documents.

---

## LIBRARY FOR BLIND AND PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED

---

The Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped provides library services to Oakland County residents who have difficulty reading normally printed materials. This operation receives funding from federal, state, and county levels and provides all necessary equipment for its clientele.

---

## THE LAW LIBRARY

---

Oakland's was the first county law library established in Michigan. The library has Michigan laws and administrative codes as well as laws from other states. It also has federal laws and court decisions at all levels. The Law Library subscribes to several on-line data bases and provides public access to the law.

---

## CORPORATION COUNSEL

---

Corporation Counsel represents the County and advises its officers, official appointees, board, commissioners, and departments in civil matters.

---

## PROSECUTING ATTORNEY

---

The Prosecuting Attorney is the chief law enforcement officer of the County, charged with the duty to see that the laws are faithfully executed and enforced and is responsible for the authorization of criminal warrants and the prosecution of criminal cases on behalf of the people of the State of Michigan.
