Thirteen members of the Ladies Auxiliary of the Waterford Community Church were entertained

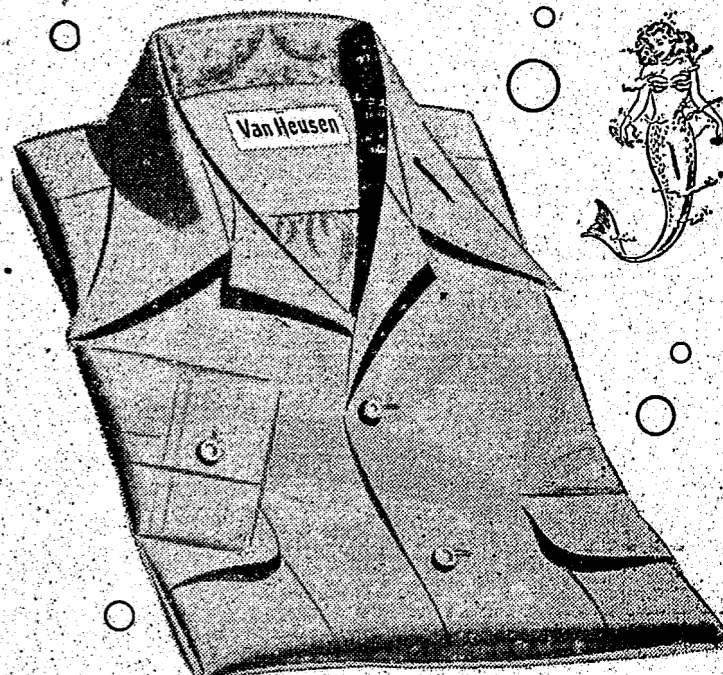
