





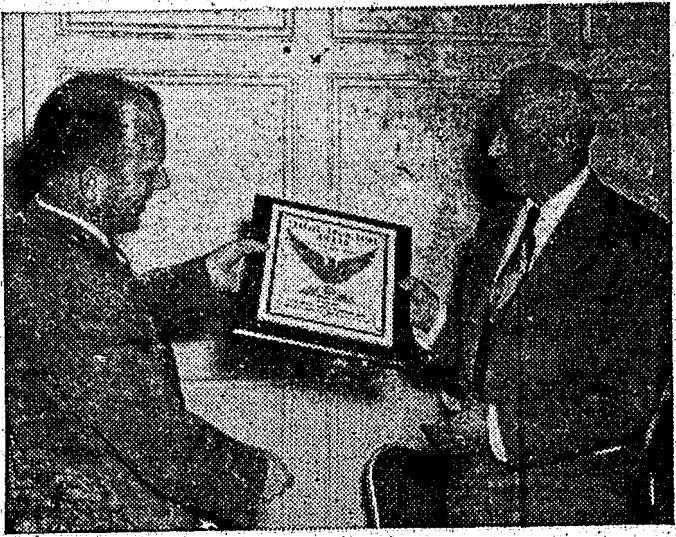

orated milk. Cream of tomato soup and cheese sauces can be stirred up with the undiluted product. For ordinary cream sauce, use the evaporated milk diluted with an equal amount of water.

You can include more milk in diet by cooking cereal in milk. Use two cups of water and two cups of evaporated milk plus one teaspoon of salt for two cups of flaked cereal such as rolled oats, or for one cup of granular cereals. Prepare the same way as for any cooked cereal.

Many people like evaporated milk in coffee. Also, evaporated milk can be whipped if it is first thoroughly chilled. A good idea is to chill the beater and bowl, too. This whipped milk can be used in frozen foods and fruit whips, or for topping for desserts.

Cans of evaporated milk are convenient for anyone who has to travel and carry a supply of milk for children. It is also a handy item for an emergency shelf.

**SHORTEN TESTS FOR RENEWAL OF DRIVER PERMITS**

Licensed drivers in Michigan will hereafter not be required to submit to written and oral examinations when renewing their operator or chauffeur permits, under a change in procedure authorized by State Police Commissioner Donald S. Leonard.

The change will enable driver license examiners to devote more time to beginner drivers as well as eliminate the provision under which licensed drivers repeated tests which they had once passed successfully. Drivers renewing licenses, however, will still have to pass vision, color and hearing tests.

Persons seeking their first license will, of course, have to pass all of the tests as in the past.

When initiated the purpose of the present system was to make certain that no driver was licensed who did not have the necessary

knowledge and skill to drive properly.

"We feel now that the benefits from that procedure have been accomplished to the point where we can simplify renewals", Leonard said. "This will also permit giving more time to beginners to see that they get off to a good start as safe drivers."

Of the 847,886 persons who took driver license examinations in Michigan last year more than 90 per cent were renewing their applications. The total also represents an average of more than 4,000 examinations for each driver license examiner. There is an equivalent of 187 full time examiners in the state.

Only six of 48 states reporting to the National Safety Council in a special poll have any form of examination for renewing driver licenses. In addition, with the exception of Michigan the six states have required only partial examinations.

The abbreviation of renewal tests in Michigan will not affect the suspension, revocation or re-

striction of licenses of drivers who accumulate bad driving records. This will follow the same procedure as in the past.

MICHIGAN IS READY ON THE HOME FRONT
If war comes, Michigan is ready on the home front. Thousands of citizens will soon be organized to scan the skies con-

tinuously for Russian bombers aiming at Michigan's industrial cities and such basic necessities as the Soo locks.
The organization work is going on under the leadership of the Civil Defense Council appointed by Governor Williams. A committee consisting of State Police Commissioner Donald S. Leonard, Colonel Lester J. Maitland of the Aer-

onautics Department, Lawrence J. LaLone of the Veterans Trust Fund, and Lawrence L. Farrell, executive secretary to Governor Williams, selected a Ground Observers Corps liaison officer in each county.
In appointing the state committee, Governor Williams specified that persons were picked for civic leadership, with experience, in order, in the armed forces air corps, armed services other than air personnel, or connected with civil defense in World War II.

The liaison officer in Oakland County, is Fred S. Galloway of Royal Oak.
County Liaison officers are now selecting supervisors to man the observation posts picked by the Air Corps in their counties. Observers will be responsible for watching the skies for about eight miles in every direction from each post. Ground observers will have a simpler task than in World War II civil defense, being responsible only for detecting planes flying too low for radar detection. The Air Force already has radar equipment spotted to detect high flying planes.
Supervisors will secure citizen volunteers for four hours of watching duty weekly. At present post crews will be limited to about 20 persons and watching to training periods; but in the event of war crews will be expanded to more than 40 persons at once.
The Ground Observer Corps is the third major civil defense development. Cities of 10,000 or more already have complete local defense programs under way, with a director in each city appointed by the mayor. State police already are prepared to give immediate notice of an air raid to every community of 1,000 or more population; and the sheriff in each county will reach smaller communities.

The state program was started last February, when Governor Williams, anticipating trouble because of the continued difficult relations with Russia, appointed an Advisory Council for Disaster Relief and Civil Defense. When the Korean war broke out the Council had completed basic plans and was ready to go into action.

Breathing by Electricity



The newest weapon in the battle against infantile paralysis is demonstrated by Dr. Ethel T. Calhoun, medical director of the Sister Kenny Polio Center near Pontiac. It is an electro-phrenic respirator, which can be used in place of an iron lung in certain bulbar polio cases. When the pen-shaped conductor the doctor is holding is touched to the phrenic nerve, electric current forces the patient to breathe. The Kenny Center, which is supported by the United Fund, is the only hospital in Michigan where the famed technique of Sister Kenny is employed and patients are accepted from any part of the state. 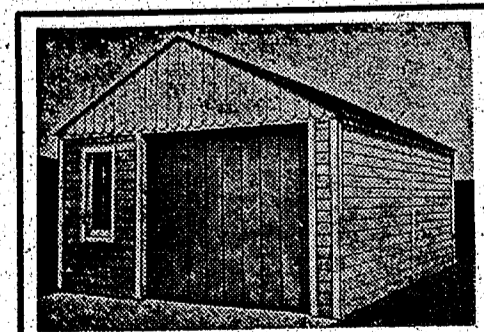

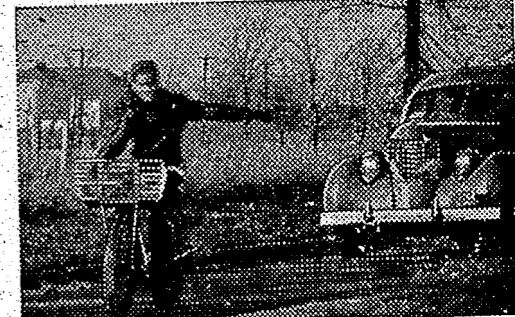

METEOR SHOWER IS SCHEDULED AS SKY FEATURE IN AUGUST

August's skies will bring a shower of meteors to highlight the astronomical display for the month.

Watch the northeastern sky around 10:00 p. m. from August 9 to 13 and you should see plenty

of shooting stars, according to Dr. Hazel M. Losh, assistant professor of astronomy at the University of Michigan. The shower should be at its best on August 11.

This will be the annual Perseid meteor shower, she reports, which is considered the most conspicuous and dependable of this year's dis-

plays. Last year, a full moon dimmed the view but Dr. Losh says that won't happen this time since the moon reaches a new phase on August 13.

"Around this date, the Earth in its annual circuit around the Sun crosses the path of this swarm of meteors," she explains. "Con-

sequently, many of the meteors find their way into the Earth's atmosphere. The resulting friction sets them on fire and they become visible."

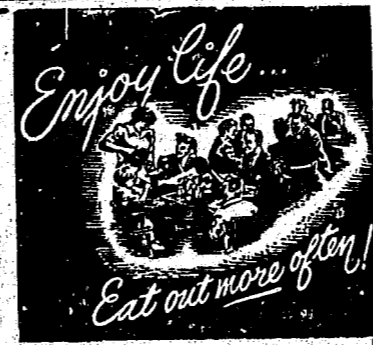

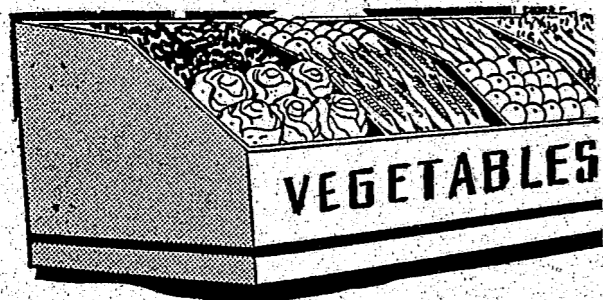
