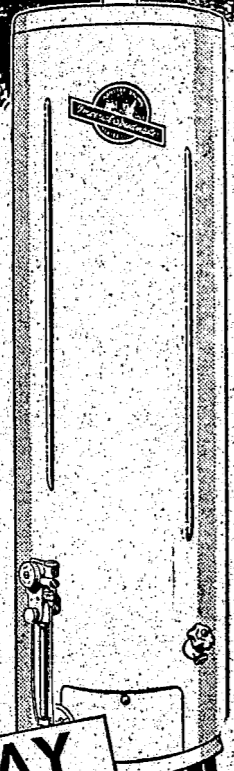

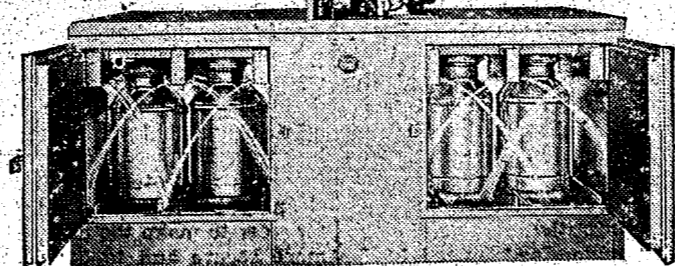

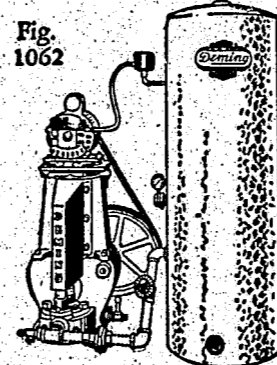

Michigan is prosperous and a wonderful state in which to live largely because of her excellent dairy herds and unsurpassed abundant supply of milk.
