MICHIGAN VEGETABLE GROWERS' COUNCIL

Oakland County's vegetable growers will be interested in attending the conference to be held at Michigan State College December 11 and 12 of the Michigan Vegetable Growers' council, a statewide growers' organization. Produce dealers and representatives of large retailers from Chicago, Grand Rapids and Detroit will tell growers what the buyer likes and does not like about

Michigan vegetables. Discussions will be held on the problems and advantages of selling through public wholesale markets; possibilities and difficulties involved in marketing through a local dealer; and the difficulties and advantages of cooperative produce marketing.

J. W. Rose, Michigan State College vegetable specialist, recently stated that marketing was the number one problem of the state's 50 million dollar vegetable industry, and he urges all Michigan growers to attend the conference to learn more about marketing problems and practices. Representatives of the produce industry

will give suggestions as to what changes could be made by Michigan vegetable growers. This conference is held in cooperation with the Michigan Cooperative Extension Service.

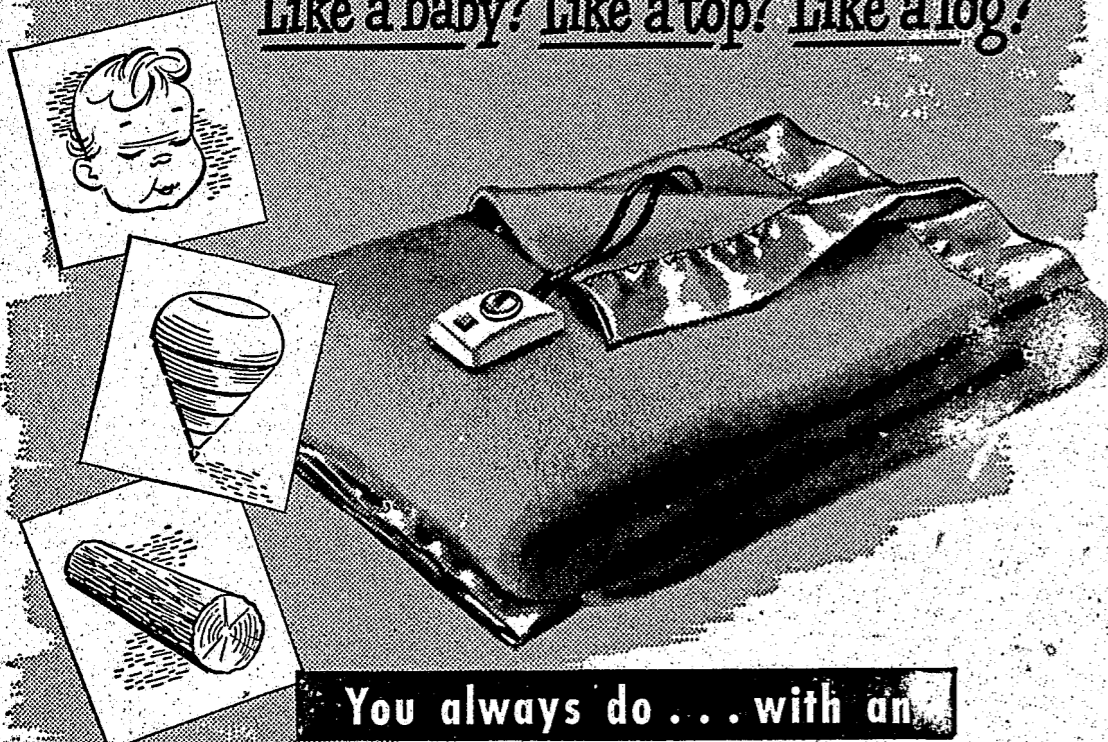

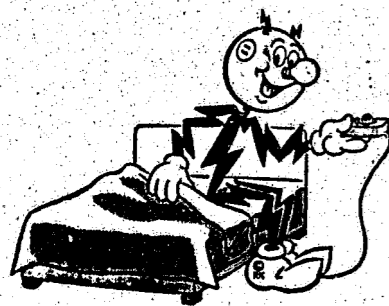

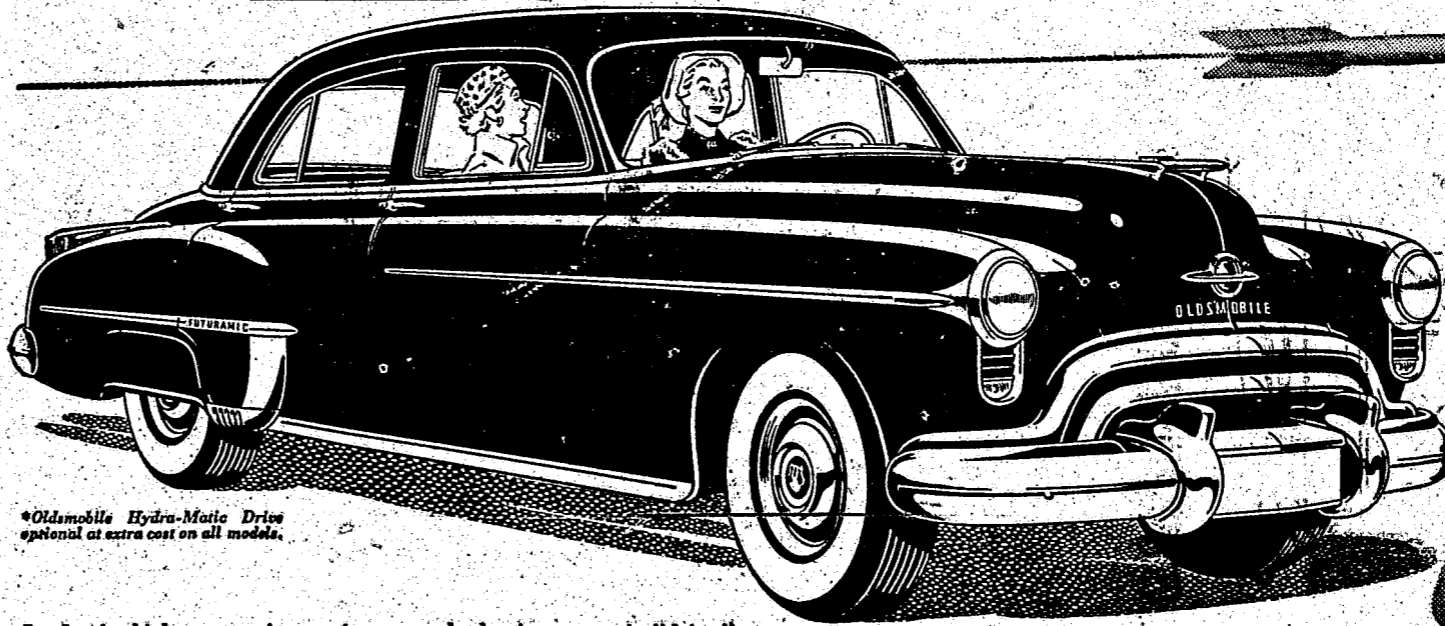

Conservation News

Michigan's game animals are doing quite well, thank you. Heavy surge of snow and cold weather has started shunting deer toward the yarding and bears have heat at least a temporary retreat to their dens.

Usually it takes a foot or more of snow to force the deer into winter quarters. Any resemblance to a thaw in December could bring the bears out again before they hibernate for the duration.

Bulk of the migrating ducks have left the state, however some of the other migrants will keep the local ducks company this winter. Observers will be able to see a few canvasbacks, red-heads, goldeneyes and scaups particularly along the Detroit river.

In spite of early snows, pheasants still have access to weed seeds, waste grain and shrub fruits. The ringnecks may be bunched together a little more and consequently a little easier to spot.

Grouse rarely are bothered by winter since they feed well above the snow line.

And the rabbits? Their main problem is to keep a few steps ahead of the hunters now pursuing them with renewed vigor.

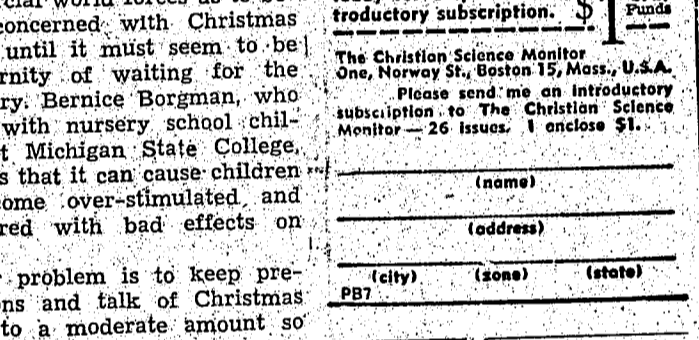
