







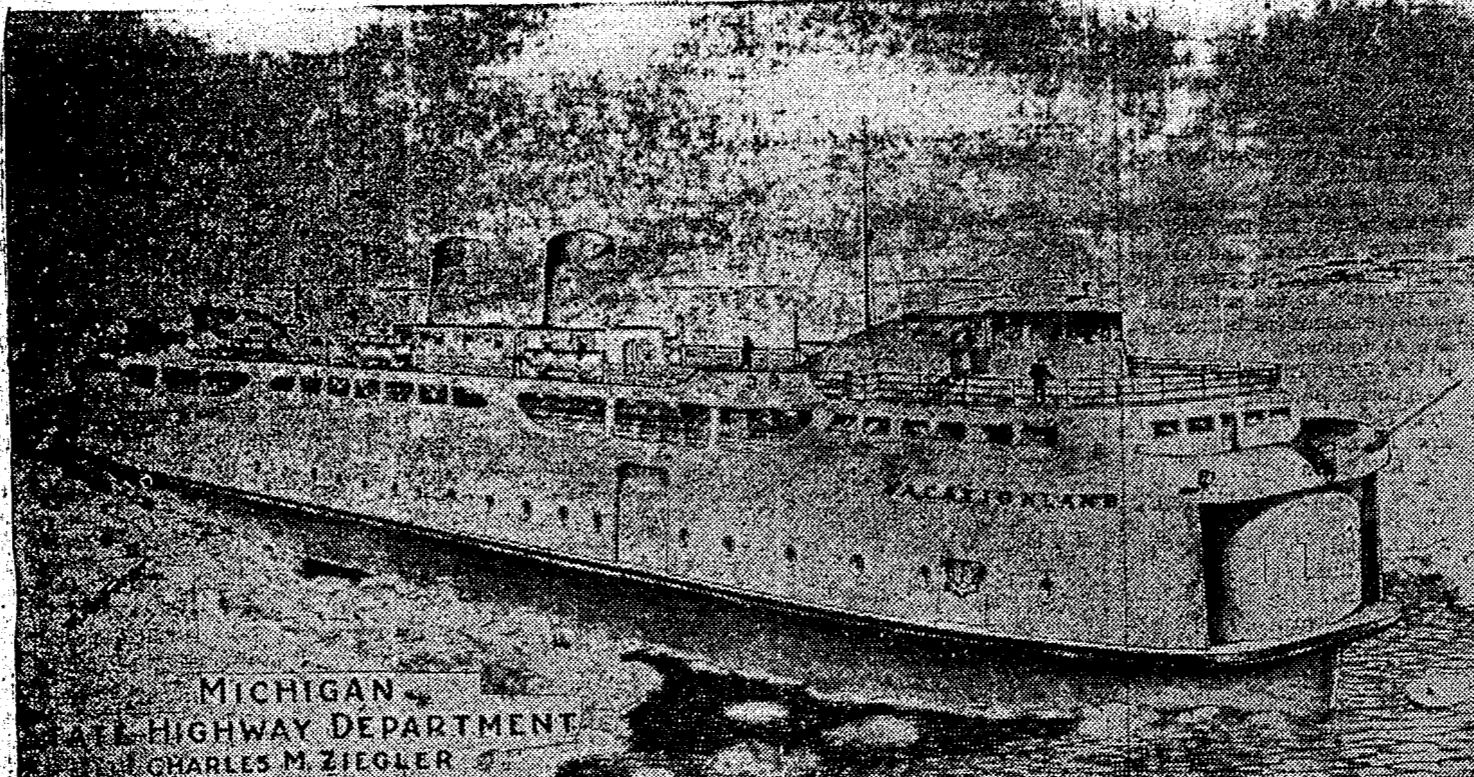

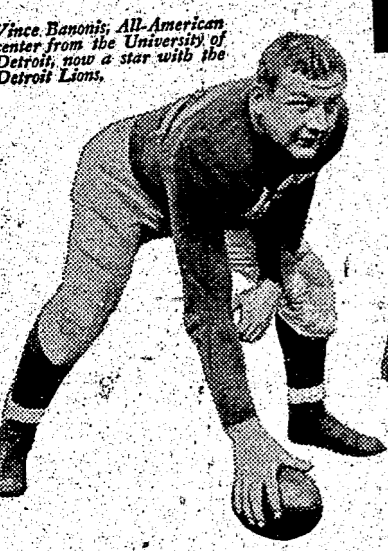

**New Notes in Cooking**

If you're looking for a new slant on that old favorite apple pie, why don't you omit the butter with which you usually dot the fruit, and pour in one cup thick sour cream before adjusting the top crust . . . or use part brown or maple sugar in place of granulated sugar.

Add 1/2 teaspoon Ac'cent (pure monosodium glutamate) to your favorite recipe for meat loaf (about 1 1/2 to 2 pounds uncooked meat) and get the full value of natural flavors. Use all or part tomato juice for moistening.

The "seconds" call will be for cauliflower if you serve it with toasted buttered (margarine) crumbs. One half cup bread crumbs (no crust) with 3 tablespoons butter (margarine) will do the trick.

For a gourmet touch to your meat loaf or meat balls serve them with creamed fried Bermuda onions. Fry onions as usual, sprinkle with flour and mix; add rich milk; heat until thick and smooth; season—and don't forget the pure monosodium glutamate if you want flavor perfection!

Cottage cheese added to the filling for deviled eggs makes for fluffiness. Allow 1 tablespoon cheese per egg.

Hot cooked rice, seasoned with salt, pepper and Ac'cent, buttered, and tossed with a few raisins and a good sprinkling of curry powder becomes "Rice Orientale." It goes nicely with lamb, veal, or chicken. Omit the raisins and the same idea serves for fish or seafood.

So, you think you'll get a cleaner wash when you pour extra soap flakes into the washing machine. Well, you're mistaken. Too many suds keep the clothes from being tossed about and thoroughly rinsed. Follow the amount recommended on the package or by the washer manufacturer.

Only a few simple remedies need to be kept on hand. Mrs. Thorpe suggests a salve for burns, an antiseptic for cuts, alcohol for cleansing purposes, compresses, bandages and absorbent cotton. Aluminum foil also is handy in the medicine cabinet in case of burns. Spread with salve and wrap it around the burn. It serves to cut off the air completely and does not stick as an ordinary bandage does.

She suggests tannic acid paste as one of the best salves for burns. If iodine is used as an antiseptic it should be replaced every 3 months for it becomes stronger with age and will sear the edges of a wound and prevent rapid healing.

Although pain-killers such as aspirin are usually found in medicine cabinets, their use often is abused. Killing a pain is merely covering up the real source of trouble, Mrs. Thorpe explains.

**Medicine Cabinet SHOULD BE CHECKED.**

"Your family medicine cabinet should be checked often and many of the medicines discarded," says Alice Thorpe, Michigan State College home management specialist.

She explains that medicines tend to deteriorate with age. Many become stronger and may be harmful to take after awhile. And even if the medicine is still all right, no inexperienced person can tell whether or not a second illness is the same as a former one, even if the symptoms may seem the same.

A medicine correct for one might be entirely wrong for another. That's why she recommends throwing away all leftover medicine when the sickness is over and getting new if it becomes necessary.
