The Grist Mill

GRASS SILAGE

With all the current emphasis on grass silage, I'd like to point out the differences between grass silage and corn silage. There are some points to keep in mind when changing over to the silo with legume or legume-grass mixture in it. In short, hay crop silage is lower in total digestible nutrients and especially in net energy than well-cared corn silage on a dry matter basis. That's because corn silage contains a large amount of grain. This difference may be largely offset by the fact that most hay crop silage has higher protein content than corn silage does. Less protein supplement therefore is needed when legume silage is fed. Often no protein supplement is required when hay silage is fed. Because grass or legume silage is lower than corn silage in TDN and net energy on a dry matter basis, than well-cared corn silage, it may be necessary to feed higher producing cows a little more grain with grass or legume silage.

FRUIT AND GARDEN NOTES

To conclude our discussion on pruning I would like to touch a little on cherries. Sour Cherry — The sour cherry seldom needs much pruning other than the removal of weak, dead and broken branches. The annual or biennial thinning out in which no large cuts are made. Trees that grow too tall may need heading back occasionally to good lateral branches. Sweet Cherry — The sweet cherry has a tendency to produce pole-like branches that reach too great a height. These should be cut back to more or less horizontal branches that are about 3/4 inch in diameter. Otherwise, little pruning is necessary except an occasional very light thinning out and possibly the re-

moval of some of the lower branches that bend too close to the ground.

Wound Treatment — Pruning wounds over two inches in diameter should be covered with a white lead paint containing no turpen-

tine, or preferably some water-soluble asphalt grafting compound. Old wounds that have not completely healed should be repainted.

Remember, don't cut out too much in one year, but trim lightly every year or two years.

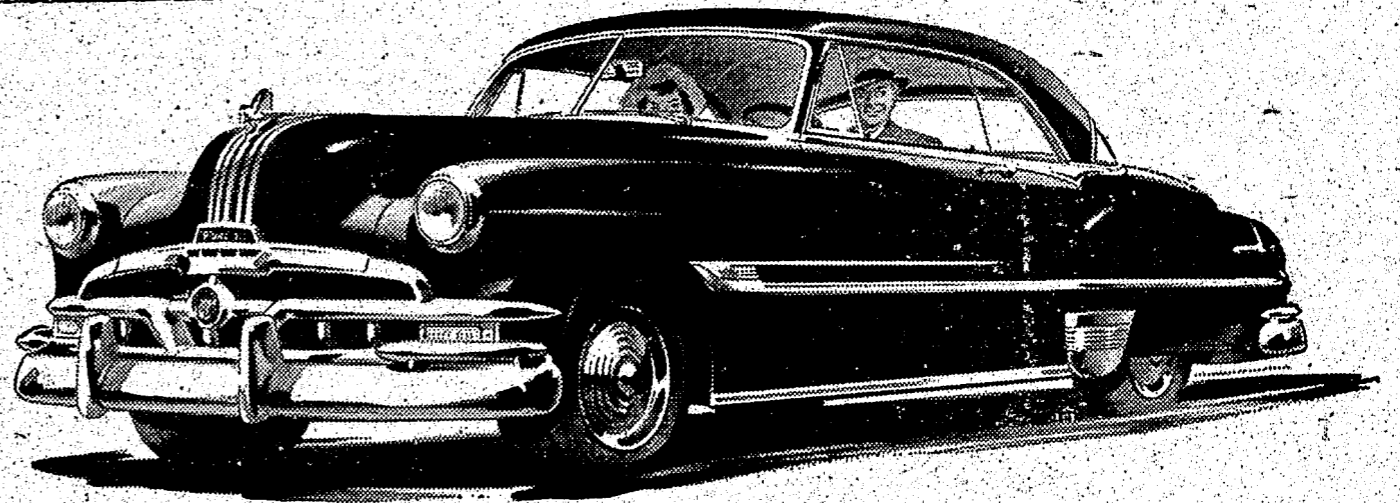

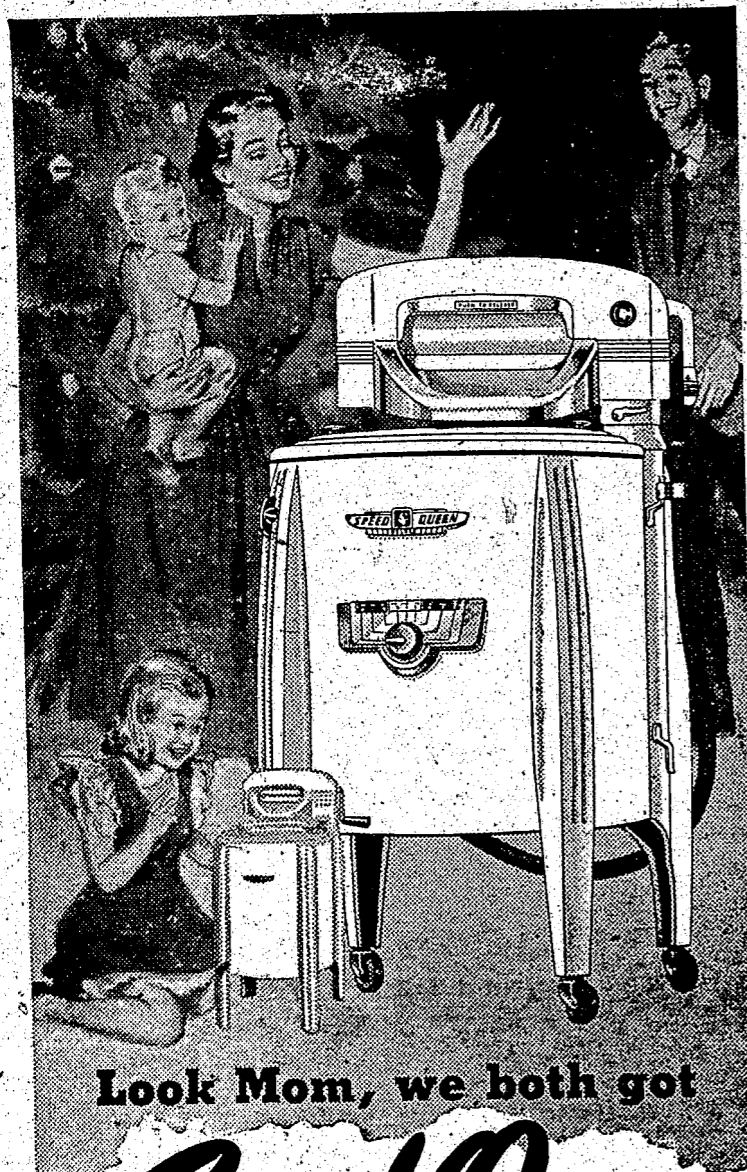

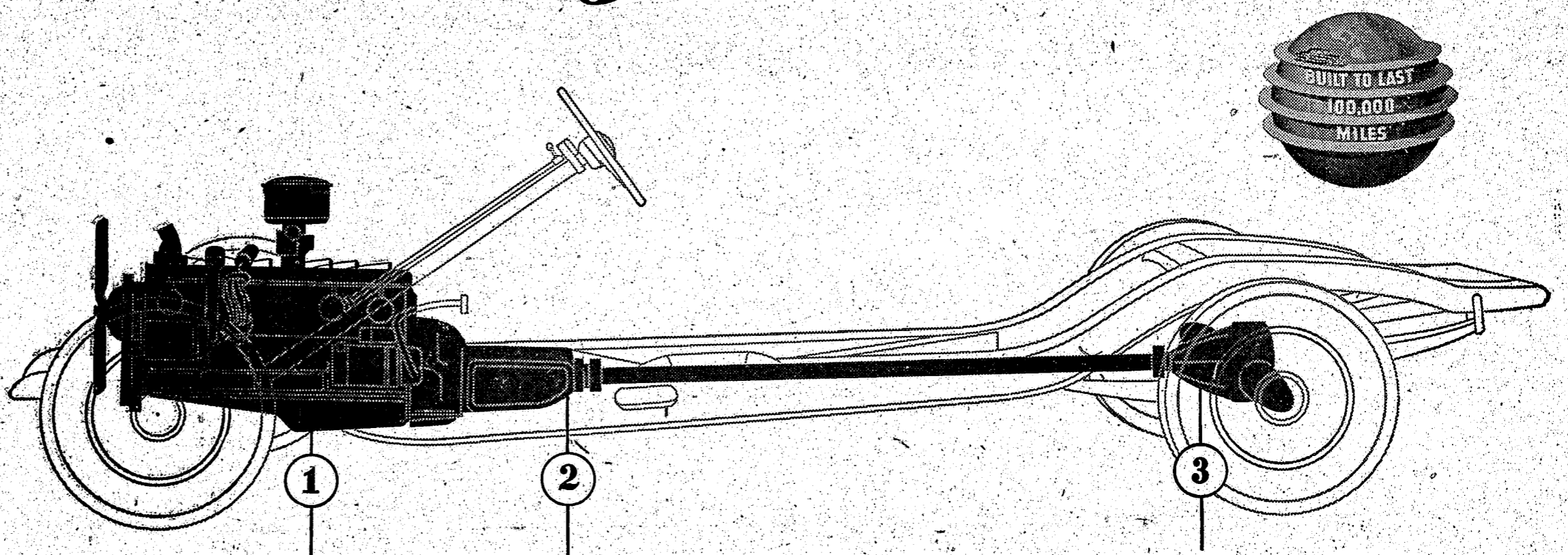

TELEPHONE COMPANY ASKS FOR REHEARING
 The Michigan Bell Telephone Company has petitioned the Public Service Commission for a rehearing on its rejected application for a rate increase.

Filed by the company "in an urgent effort to secure the rate relief it needs to continue a good service job for the public," the petition alleged 10 fundamental errors in the order of November 20 which denied the company's rate application in its entirety. Chief among the errors cited by the company were the Commission's failure to consider the retroactive increase in the Federal corporation income tax and its numerous adjustments to achieve disallowances of expenses actually incurred and capital actually invested by the company.

The petition asked that the Commission reopen the record to allow additional evidence on company operations for the past 10 months of 1951 which, the company said, "are not as profitable as predicted by the Commission in its order."

The Commission's order, said the petition, "makes it evident that the Commission has misunderstood the full purpose of the testimony already presented to it. Somehow, despite the best efforts of witnesses and counsel, the company has failed to secure a full appreciation of its present situation."

Michigan Bell expressed particular surprise that the Commission failed to make allowance

for the new 52 per cent income tax which was made retroactive to last April 1. "Confiscation caused by that tax increase extends back to its effective date," the petition pointed out. Additional revenues of \$3,300,000 a year are needed to offset the effect of the 52 per cent tax increase, the petition said.

RED FLASHERS ON WRECKERS IN MOTION ILLEGAL

State Police Commissioner Donald S. Leonard warns that the use of red flasher signals on wrecker trucks while enroute to or from a call is a violation of the law.

"Use of the red flasher is permissible while a wrecker is at the scene of a call because the vehicle is standing still on the highway and the blinker lights are a warning to other traffic," Leonard said. "However, the red flashers are illegal when the wrecker is going to or from the call, even though it may be hauling a car."

The commissioner stated, his warning resulted from a number of complaints over use of red flashers on wreckers.

"Other drivers are confused by these lights when in motion, believing the wrecker is a police car, a fire truck or an ambulance which must be given right-of-way. The latter vehicles, of course, are entitled to use the lights on emergency runs. But becoming accustomed to seeing wreckers with the red flashers many drivers then wrongly identify an emergency car as a wrecker and fail to take heed accordingly."

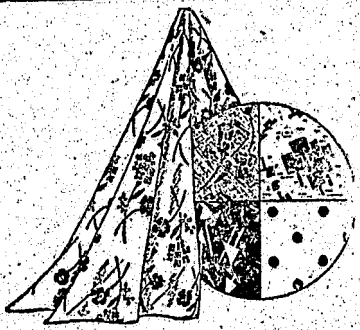
