Looking over the window sill.

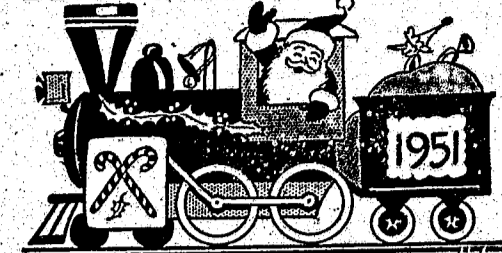

Cox, extension landscape specialist at Michigan State College.

"You can combine pruning operations on your lawn plantings with your search for holiday greens," he explains. This is an ideal time for pruning ornamental evergreens, since the needled and broad-leaved types are dormant at this time.

Arborvitae or Cedar, Pfitzer Juniper, Japanese Spreading Yew, Canadian Hemlock, Silver Red Cedar, Canebrake Red Cedar and Common Juniper are among plants that may be pruned now. Spruce, pines and firs should not be pruned unless you want to remove branches or correct the shape of the plant.

Cox makes several suggestions for successfully pruning your ornamental evergreens. He advises removing any damaged or broken branches to the nearest normal part of the plant. Cut back branches that are giving the plant a lop-sided appearance.

Tall, pointed evergreens can be headed back to lower their height. This will reduce the snow and ice-holding capacity and will bring the trees down to the right proportions for best landscape effect.

Among other suggestions, Cox says to prune, making several cuts at different heights. This will be easier and will result in a pruning job that won't be noticed by the casual observer. And don't try to do the whole job in one pruning. Leave some for next year's holiday season.



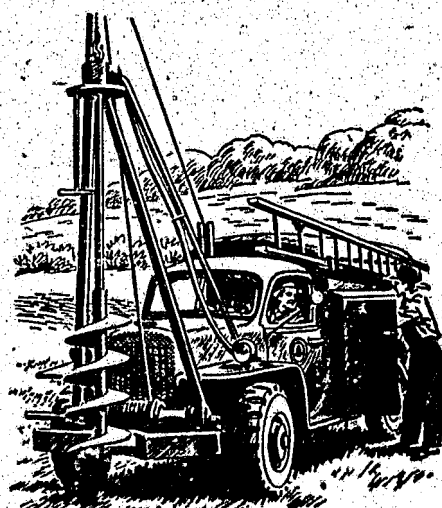
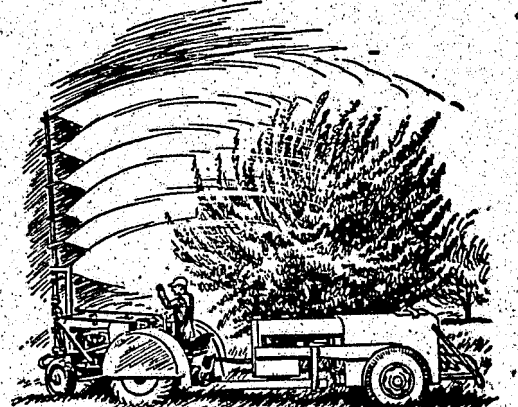

Concentrate spraying gaining favor with Michigan farmers

Using a stronger spray solution and applying correspondingly less of it per tree shows advantages in spraying fruit crops. According to the Michigan State College Agricultural Experiment Station, end results are as effective as when more of ordinary mixtures are used. Concentrate spraying reduces spray injury to fruit and foliage, cuts amount of spray chemicals lost by run-off, reduces the water needed and time required for refilling. On vegetable crops, concentrate spraying has been limited to control of insects when complete coverage is not required. over and the tree is shedding its needles, why not encourage the children to carry it out to the back yard and decorate it with food for the birds? They will enjoy the pure fun of passing on their Christmas riches to the birds at a time when it is especially hard for the birds to procure food.

Of course, you may prefer to stage the birds' Christmas simultaneously with your own. A tree purchased for the birds at the same time you buy the family tree will last throughout the Christmas season. Or you may prefer simply to decorate a small fir tree or bush already planted in your yard.

For ring-necked pheasants and bobwhites a complete corn cob can be placed on the ground or on the lower branches. Cracked nuts, crumbs and peanuts can be placed on small trays and suspended from strings or wires. Wiring however, should be solid as many birds are easily frightened by objects that tremble.

And when you choose the position of the gift tree, be sure it is not recessed in shrubbery from which marauding cats might creep, Professor Sutton reminds.
