MICHIGAN 4-H CLUB PROJECT EXPANDED TO NATIONAL BASIS

The Michigan 4-H Club talent search program of "Share the Fun" which attracted more than 2,000 youth in 46 counties last year has mushroomed into a national 4-H Club project.

Michigan was used as a proving ground for an idea of developing and proving outstanding 4-H Club entertainment talent. Success of the venture in Michigan has resulted in the sponsorship of a similar program in ten additional states.

Arden Peterson, assistant state 4-H Club leader at Michigan State College, was in charge of the program.

George Taylor, director of agricultural development for the U. S. Rubber company and former Michigan State College staff member, recently announced expansion of the project at a meeting in East Lansing.

Indiana, Illinois, Nebraska, Oklahoma, Texas, Tennessee and Georgia state 4-H Club organizations have accepted the program and will conduct it in 1952. The Michigan program will be expanded to reach more counties and more individuals.

Entertainment talent is developed on a community basis and winners in county contests will compete in regional contests. Regional winners will compete at the State 4-H Club Show at East Lansing in late August for state honors. From state winners, the sponsor will select a number of acts for presentation at Chicago during the National 4-H Club Congress. Three of the twelve acts used in the 1951 "Share the Fun Breakfast" were from Michigan's contestants.

Carol Leybourn, 18, Petersburg 4-H Club girl, has been invited to New York to appear on a program on March 9 over a television network which will help commemorate National 4-H Club Week. The talented pianist was one of the state winners last fall.

HOUSECLEANING TIPS FOR HOUSEWIVES

Sparkling windows and clean blinds can give you a new lease on life. Since windows come in for special attention during these spring housecleaning days, Marjorie Knoll of the Michigan State College home management department has some tips.

Miss Knoll suggests washing the windows with an effective solution such as two tablespoons of vinegar or ammonia in two quarts of warm water. For the polishing be sure the cloth is lint free; or, try using paper toweling or tissue paper.

The home economist suggests a soft-bristled hand brush for dusting window shades as part of routine cleaning. In the spring, however, a more thorough job can be done if you spread the shade out on a flat surface and dust it carefully. Stains can be removed with art gum if they are not too large. Wallpaper cleaner will work on non-washable shades while thick, mild suds are excellent for washable shades. After applying the suds be sure to rinse with warm water, but do not soak the shade. Best way to dry the shade is to rehang it and pull it down, Miss Knoll says.

Venetian blind care can be simplified if the homemaker will coat each slat with wax to prevent dust collection, she advised. But be sure to let the wax harden for half an hour before moving the slats. The tapes on venetian blinds can be cleaned with cleaning fluid or a thick lather if you use a minimum of water and allow the tapes to dry completely. For day-to-day care, the tapes can be dusted with a stiff brush. Vacuum cleaner attachments are excellent for cleaning the slats, Miss Knoll pointed out.

SOME SEED PRICES PREDICTED TO RISE

As seeding time approaches, it appears likely that seed prices will advance for red clover, alsike clover, bromegrass and alfalfa, predicts Karl A. Vary, Michigan State College agricultural economist.

Although estimated seed supplies in the United States are somewhat larger than a year ago, due to record carry-over stocks, red clover, sweet clover, bromegrass and Cheving's rescue are in short supply.

The 1951 crop season was unfavorable for the production of Michigan and Canadian-grown alfalfa seed. This short supply is offset by this year's large crop in the Northwest and a record U. S. carryover two times that of last year. Michigan-adapted alfalfa seed is expected to retail at about 75 cents a pound.

NEW MACHINE CUTS SUGAR BEET LABOR

Reductions in the amount of hand labor needed for thinning and weeding sugar beets and elimination of one machine operation are two of the advantages of a new mechanical thinner-weeder developed by agricultural engineers of the U. S. Department of Agriculture and the Michigan Agricultural Experiment Station.

In tests thus far, the experimental thinner-weeder has reduced hand labor needed for these jobs from 30 to 50 percent. Developed in the research laboratories of Michigan State College, the machine is a "down-the-row" type which takes out weeds and beets at random.
