EMPLOYERS REMINDED TO HIRE HANDICAPPED

National Employ the Physically Handicapped Week, October 3-9, is designed to remind private employers of the advantages of hiring the handicapped.

The public as individuals cannot do much to help in this campaign, but everyone does have the opportunity to help handicapped people keep steady employment at Goodwill Industries.

Goodwill workers renovate discards which would otherwise be thrown away and sell them in the Goodwill Stores at moderate prices. Thus, everyone can help insure a job for some handicapped worker with no cost in either time or money.

Goodwill accepts clothes, furniture, appliances, toys and almost any item that is repairable. At this time of year, clothing in particular is needed with emphasis on shoes, rubbers and galoshes.

Last year, Goodwill Industries received a Distinguished Service Citation from the President's

Committee for the Employment of the Physically Handicapped for outstanding work in the employment of handicapped workers and a personal commendation from President Eisenhower.

Figures released by the Federal Government in conjunction with National Employ the Physically Handicapped Week confirm Goodwill's work experience that those handicapped make excellent employees. They have high records in punctuality and conscientiousness with a minimum of absenteeism.

SOCIAL SECURITY CHECKS INCREASED THIS MONTH

When monthly social security checks were delivered on Monday, Oct. 4, all retired persons and all families on social security rolls found their payments increased. According to Rex A. C. Atwood, District Manager of the Pontiac Social Security office, these increases will range from modest amounts to individual members of some families up to as much as \$31.50 to some widows with several children.

The present minimum payment of \$25 to a retired worker will go up to \$30. Retired workers

whose benefit was \$85 will be receiving \$98.50. Comparable increases will be made to other retired workers.

Dependents and survivors now receiving monthly payments will get proportionate increases, Atwood said. The largest total payment per month to a family will be raised from \$168.90 to \$200. As before, however, the total monthly benefits to a family cannot exceed 80% of the worker's average monthly earnings upon which the benefits are based. All families will receive an increase of at least \$5.00 in their total benefit payments.

POPULATION SURVEY WEEK OF OCT. 11

Questions on school enrollment will be asked in addition to the regular inquiries on employment and unemployment in the October Current Population Survey, according to Supervisor Gillespie of the U. S. Census Bureau's district office at Detroit.

Similar questions last October revealed that about 34.5 million persons in the United States between the ages of 5 and 34 years of age were enrolled in school, including kindergarten, in 1953 compared with about 32.5 million in 1952. The expansion of the school population is taking place at all grades and age levels.

There were approximately 2.0 million more pupils in the fall of 1953 than in the fall of 1952. Of this increase, 1.7 million took place among those in regular school and 300,000 among those in kindergarten. Since 1947, kindergarten enrollment has doubled, elementary school enrollment has grown by one-fifth, and high school enrollment by one-sixth.

The Current Population Survey will be taken locally and in 229 other areas of the country during the week of October 11.

NATIONAL ELECTRICAL WEEK, OCTOBER 18-24

The electrical industry's first observance of National Electrical Week will be held this year during the third week of October in conjunction with the celebration of Light's Diamond Jubilee.

The program will be sponsored by the International Association of Electrical Inspectors and their aim is to promote the safe use of electricity by adequate wiring designed to give the public maximum service.

Local inspector groups will join with other segments of the

electric industry in school programs, all-electric homes, shows and exhibits.

**University of Michigan.**

A great boon for hunters because of its plentiful light, the moon will reach its full phase on October 11. Popularly called the Hunter's Moon, it strongly resembles September's Harvest Moon.

The sun's competition, she continues, comes from the star Capella, third brightest one visible from the northern latitudes. If the Earth, she explains, were placed between Capella and the Sun, the former would send us more than 100 times as much light as the Sun.

According to Miss Losh, "The early Arabs knew Capella as 'the Driver', referring to its bright appearance in the evening twilight before the other stars, apparently guiding and guarding them in their nightly journeys."

The star, called "The Goat" rises in the northeast at sunset and is followed by the rest of the constellation Auriga, a five-sided figure with Capella at one of its corners. Close and to the right of the Goat is a small triangle of three fainter stars, represented on old star maps as the "kids" carried in the goatherd's lap, while the "Goat" is on his shoulder.

Miss Losh points out that the Milky Way will be an attraction across the sky from the northeast to southwest, with the Northern Cross almost directly overhead.

The professor adds that there are two meteor showers scheduled for October, the Draconids around October 9 and the Orionids around October 22. She says they will be "scanty showers" with just a few stragglers visible here and there.

Among other astronomical attractions will be the Pleiades,

coming up in the east an hour after Capella. Six of these stars appear in the form of a tiny dipper, Professor Losh explains, and they should be readily seen with an unaided eye. "Tradition has it that one of the earlier naked-eye stars has been lost or grown dim, hence the reference to the 'lost Pleiad'."

The Pleiades are found in the constellation Taurus, she continues, in which there is also another well-known figure, the Hyades, arranged in the form of a rather large letter "V". Rising on its side, this constellation has the bright orange star, Aldebaran, at the lower end of the "V", called the "eye of Taurus."

Other appearances in the October skies will include Mercury rising in the southwest around evening twilight. On October 9, according to Professor Losh, it will be located about six degrees below Saturn, the fainter of the two.

Venus will be in the southwest-ern sky but several degrees to the left of these two planets. It will reach its greatest brilliancy on October 11. "Mars continues in the southwest sky", she adds, "and Jupiter will be rising in the northeast."

**WANT CLOTHES DRIER? SOME TIPS OFFERED**

What should you look for in an automatic clothes drier? That is what women wonder when they think of the sunless winter washdays ahead.

Lucille Ketchum, extension home management specialist at Michigan State College, has three suggestions:

Moisture is the biggest problem in a drier and is solved in several ways. Sometimes the water is vented outdoors. Because

this will be included in the installation cost, you will want to consider this feature, when you make your choice.

If not vented, explains Miss Ketchum, the moisture that is in the laundered clothes is thrown out into the room. This is harmful to paint and wooden surfaces. However some driers avoid this by using a stream of cold water to condense the moisture and carry it to the drain. This requires a plumbing installation.

Still another drier condenses the moisture by a cold air draft. The water is collected in a pan at the bottom of the drier. It must be emptied after each use. Or the water may be piped to the drain.

You may choose between a gas and an electric drier. Cost of operation will depend on the type of power you use most in your home and the power rates of the locality in which you live. Usually, Miss Ketchum says, a gas drier is less expensive to operate than an electric one.

You may obtain information on how to estimate cost per month of the two types of driers

by checking with your local utility.

**NOTE HARVEST LOSS BEFORE PROFIT TAKE**

Before you can count your profits from your 1954 corn crop you better stop to count your losses.

The wise farmer will stop his cornpicker once in a while to check his corn loss and make adjustments for it, advises Clarence M. Hansen, MSC agricultural engineer.

The losses, he adds, may not mean so much to a farmer who has hogs or lambs to do the cleanup job.

One way to estimate your shelling and ear loss, Hansen says, is this: If you have 40 inch rows, count the kernels in a 40 by 40 inch square. Twenty kernels on the ground in that area mean a loss of one bushel per acre.

Finding one ear in 133 feet—or 43 paces—also means a bushel lost per acre. Hansen tabs the losses excessive if they exceed 5 per cent. That's 2½ bushels on a 50-bushel crop.



The quickest, easiest, and least expensive of all breakfasts is the cereal breakfast, which is as effective nutritionally as other breakfasts. Using the nationally accepted basic breakfast pattern of fruit, cereal, milk, bread and butter, ¼ to ½ of the day's total food requirements is provided. When you eat this basic cereal breakfast, you will work better, think better, and be calmer and steadier. Boys and girls get better grades with a cereal breakfast, and you can reduce safely with a basic cereal breakfast.

### NEW TRAFFIC TICKET CUTS PAPER WORK

A new traffic violation notice just put into use by the Michigan State Police is expected to shave off 11,000 man hours each year from the desk work of officers returning from patrol duty.

The ticket which was designed by the State Police, eliminates the four typewritten copies of the arrest report previously a part of the patrol officer's desk work. It also increases administrative efficiency in processing and using traffic arrest records and provides more adequate information for the courts.

In addition to notifying the violator how, when and where to settle a violation, the ticket supplies information for the courts as to the exact offense committed. Conditions at the time having to do with the degree of seriousness are indicated by check marks opposite printed descriptive terms.

This ticket consists of the original and three carbon copies. After making it out at the time of the violation, the trooper has no other paper work to do.
