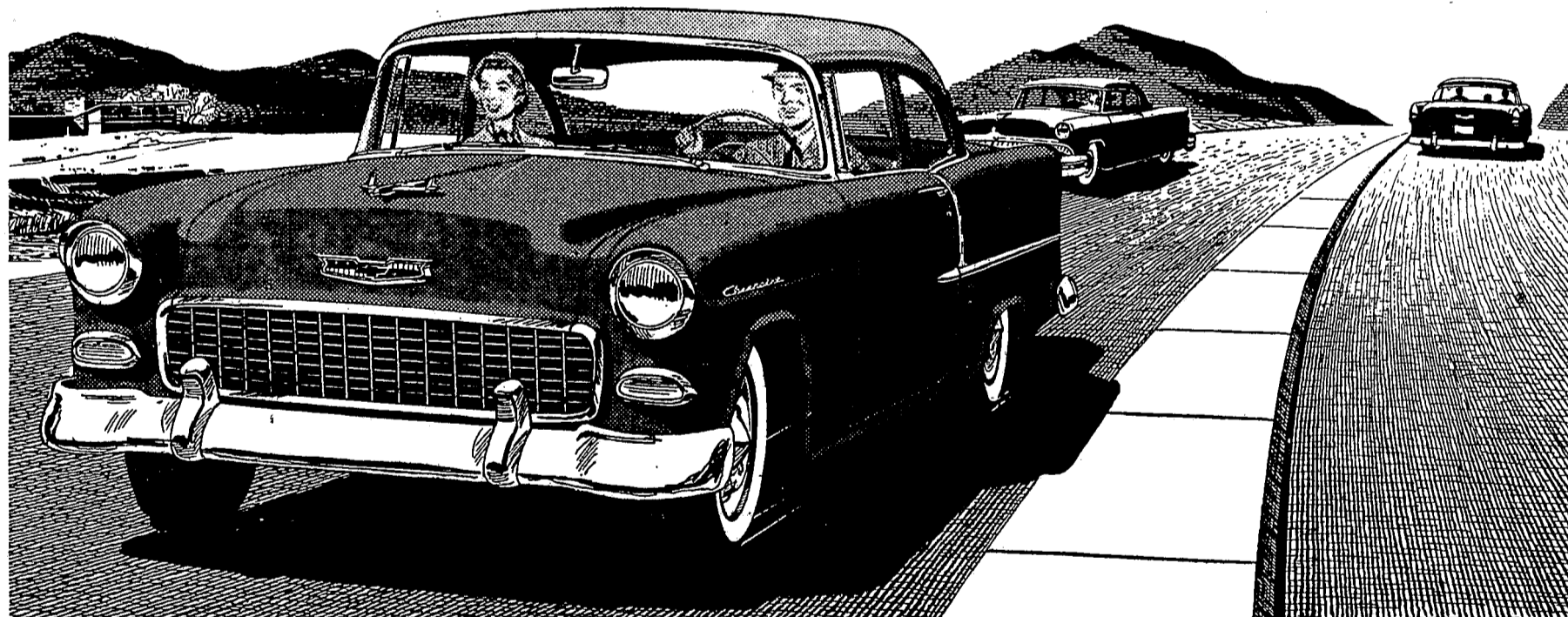

School News

The following story about the seniors trip to Washington was written by the students, but was received too late for last week's paper.

TRAIN TRIP

On Wednesday afternoon we left Clarkston on a Greyhound at 2:30 for the depot in Detroit. We boarded our train at 5:20 and pulled out of the Michigan Central Station at 5:50.

For supper we were served ham, potatoes, string beans, bread, butter, ice cream and milk. We were allowed to sit where we pleased until 11:00 when the girls went to one end of the train and the boys to the other. We were all awake by 6:00 when the porter called us for breakfast. It was served at 7:00 and consisted of juice, eggs, bacon, toast and coffee or milk. The train arrived in Union Station at 8:45 Thursday morning. From the station we took our sight-seeing bus and began our tour. Our first stop was at the capitol where we had our pictures taken.

Saturday afternoon at 5:30 our train left Union Station for our trip home. We were served a wonderful dinner of turkey, mashed potatoes, cranberry sauce, peas, muffins and butter, ice cream and our choice of coffee, milk or iced tea.

Many other schools rode the same train as we did and it was fun meeting new boys and girls and talking to some we already knew.

THE F. B. I. TOUR

Most of the students of our school thought the tour of the F. B. I. Building to be more interesting than any of the others. The man who took us through the building was very courteous. He was to become an F. B. I. man himself in a few months. He showed us many of the different criminals, all famous for their life in crime. He showed us many ways which they have of catching criminals.

During the tour he showed us pictures of the ten most wanted men in the United States today. At the conclusion of our tour we went into a sound-proof room and a man showed us the use of the revolver and the "Thompson" sub-machine gun.

The most interesting thing to me was when he told us about the man who grafted his fingers to his chest to destroy his finger prints with the skin from his chest.

Another thing that amazed me was an 80 word letter reduced down to the size of a period so that criminals could smuggle letters. When they received these little pieces of paper they would take pictures of it and blow it up until it was readable.

BUREAU OF PRINTING AND ENGRAVING
The first tour that was taken

on the second day was to the Bureau of Printing and Engraving. Every day the Bureau prints about thirty-two million dollars.

We saw the money being printed on large sheets, then the bills were cut and put into piles. The money is counted four times by machine and 8 times by hand. The Bureau employs many people who do nothing but count money all day long. At the end of the day the workers are not searched or checked in any way. The Bureau also prints postage stamps and saving bonds.

If it was one of our most interesting tours, which everybody enjoyed very much, although we didn't receive any free samples.

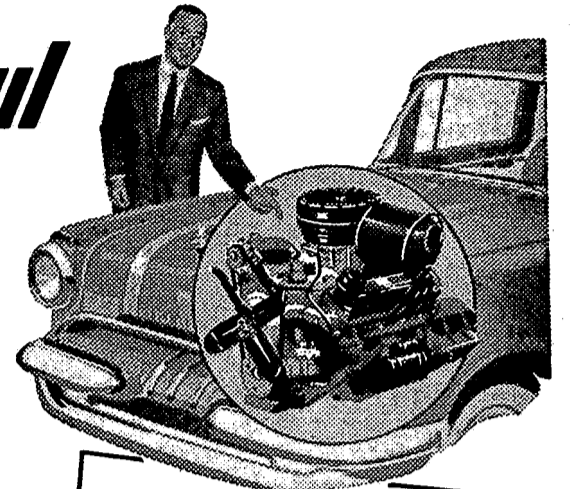

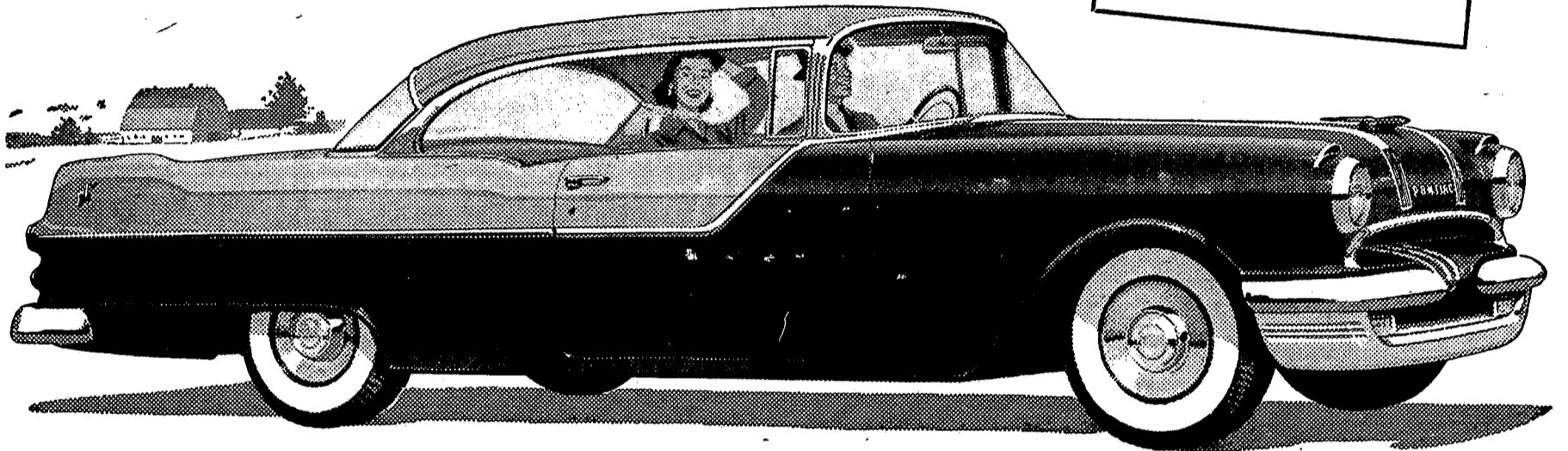

on Memorial Day, 1922. Chief Justice William Howard Taft presented the memorial to President Harding, who accepted it for the United States.

The memorial is of white Colorado-Yule marble. Thirty-six columns, representing the 36 states in the union at the time of Lincoln's death, surround the walls of the Memorial Building. A frieze above the colonnade names these States. On the attic walls above the frieze are the names of the 48 states comprising the union at the time the memorial was built.

The first thing you see after you go up the steps is the statue of Lincoln. This statue is 19 feet high and 19 feet wide.

The Second Inaugural Address is inscribed on the north wall of the Memorial and the Gettysburg Address is on the south wall.
