NARROW TOP, WIDE BASE—BEST HEDGE

The best shape for formal hedges is a wide base and narrow top. But Michigan State University landscape specialists claim that most folks prune their hedges just the opposite. Or, they trim the sides straight down—which is also wrong.

Reason for the narrow top is to let the sunlight reach bottom leaves of the hedge and have thick foliage from the ground up. If the sun doesn't strike them, lower leaves die out leaving bare spots.

If your hedge already has the wrong shape, Harold Davidson, M. S. U., horticulturist, says you can correct it by letting the low-

er branches grow and trim it right next year.

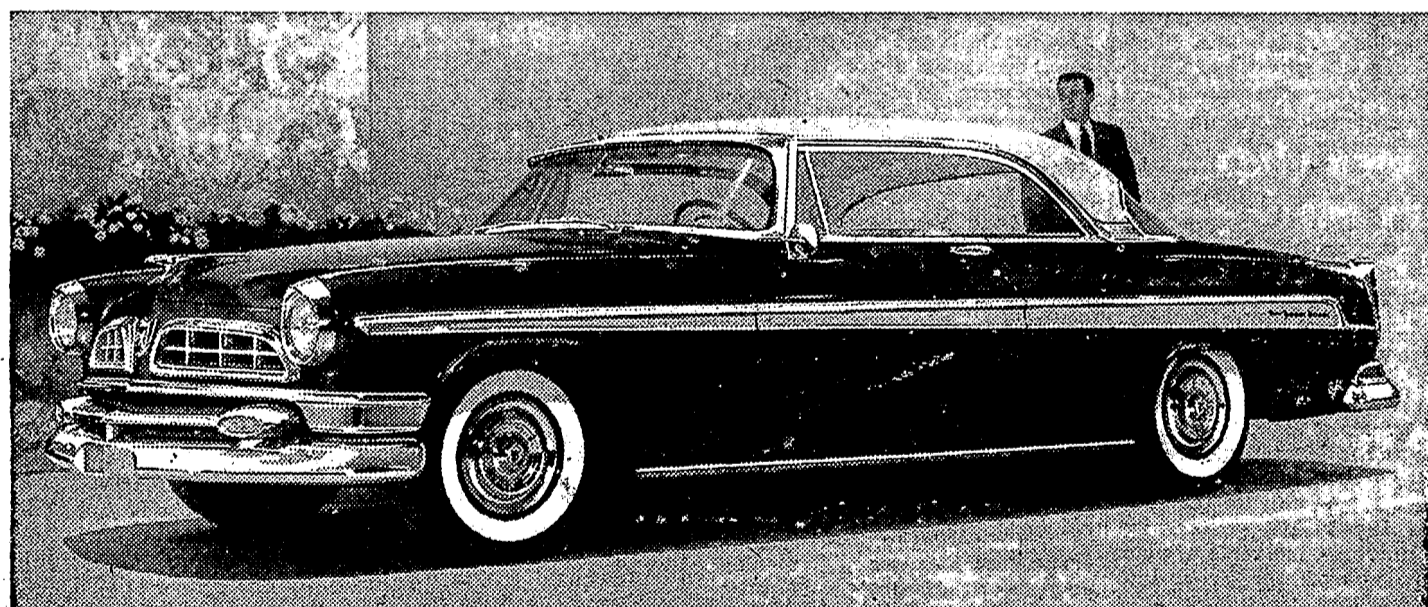

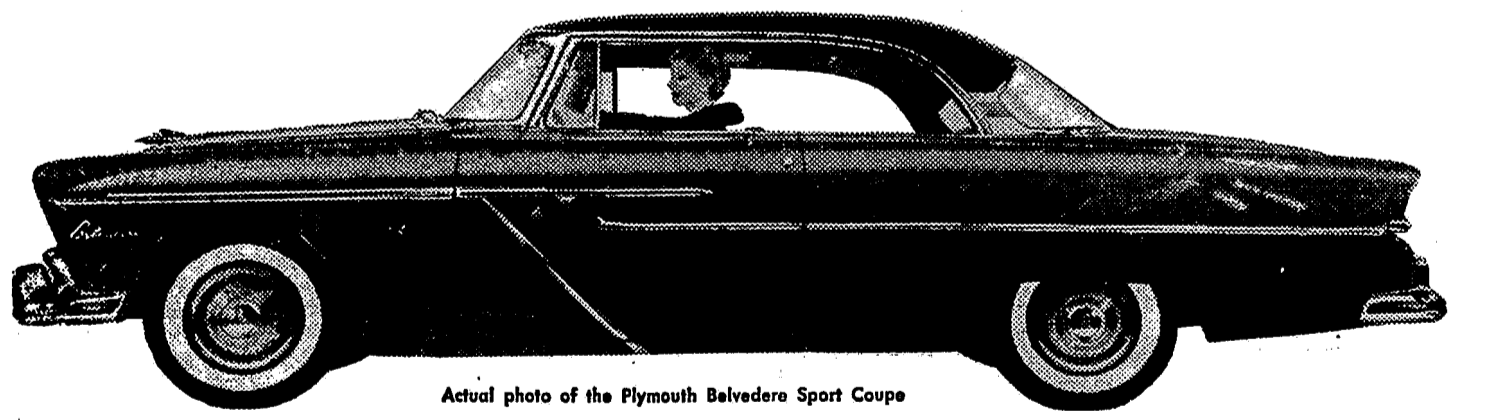

USAF OFFERS UNUSUAL CELEBRATION

The United States Air Force is offering a most unusual 4th of July celebration to local youths. Sgt. Haines, Air Force Recruiter, announced today that a special group of only 500 enlistees will be sworn into the Air Force in a mass ceremony at the 8th International Air Exposition at Detroit's Wayne-Major Airport, July 2, 3 and 4.

These enlistees will be known officially as the Wolverine Independence Group and will be flown directly from the Air Show to their basic training base at Geneva, New York.

All those who join the Wolverine Independence Group together will have an opportunity to complete their entire basic training as a group. Many of the young Airmen who enlisted at the Air Show last year are still enjoying their Air Force careers together.

As another special feature of the ceremony, the enlistees will be sworn into the Air Force by a high government official. In

1954, General Nathan Twining, Chief of Staff of the United States Air Force, officiated at this ceremony.

PLAY IT SAFE WHEN SWIMMING, OR FISHING.

Water enthusiasts in a water wonderland were today urged to "play it safe when swimming, fishing or boating". The Michigan Department of Health says, "to guard your life, be your own life-guard—it's the best way to hold down accidental drownings which claimed 312 Michigan lives last year."

Among the health department recommendations: fishermen should stay ashore rather than accept a seat in an overcrowded boat; swimmers should check the depth of water before diving; parties "just out for a ride" should agree that no-one stands up in a boat.

"Even if you swim like a fish", the health department counseled, "respect your limitations. Even the best swimmers get cramps."

Swimmers were advised to "come out of the water before you're all in, to swim only in daylight hours, if possible at guarded beaches, and always with a companion."

If you are a swimming, boating or sailing enthusiast, the health department warns, "Keep your feet on the ground when storm warnings are out."

"And whenever children are around water make sure they are constantly in sight, and within easy reach by a person to whom you would entrust your own life in an emergency."

While water sports are good medicine for both your mind and your body, the health department said: "Even the best medicine should be taken in proper doses. And safety is part of the prescription."
