The school bus fleet is now comprised of twenty-one units, and will be increased as the population increases. The Division of Transportation of the State Department of Public Instruction advocates that schools own and operate their own garages when the bus fleet exceeds fifteen units. This policy is based upon state figures which reveal that it is more economical to operate school owned garages for large transportation fleets than it is to contract the work in commercial garages.
