Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Fritz of Pontiac moved over the weekend to their recently completed home at Huntoon Lake.

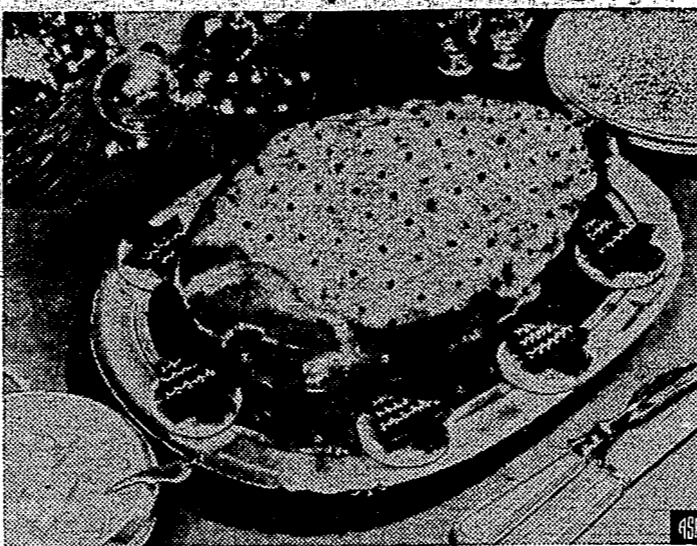
Mr. and Mrs. Robert Snyder and son, Wayne are leaving Friday evening for Hillsboro, Ohio, to spend Christmas with his parents.

Ham Is Hearty and Festive For Holiday Entertaining



Christmas is the time to take advantage of ham for easy entertaining. Even the most amateur cook can produce a masterpiece with these simple directions.

Baked Ham

Place ham fat side up on rack in open roasting pan. Do not add water. Do not cover. Do not baste. Bake in slow oven (325°F.). (If you have a meat thermometer, insert it through outside fat into center of thickest part of ham so that bulb does not rest on bone or fat.)

Roasting Timetable
Oven Temperature—(300°F. to 325°F.)

	Thermometer Reading	Minutes Per Pound
HAM, whole Uncooked, 10-12 lbs.	160°F.	18-20
Ready-to-eat, 10-12 lbs.	130°F.	10
HAM, half Uncooked, 6-8 lbs.	160°F.	22-25
Ready-to-eat, 6-8 lbs.	130°F.	10
Picnic (shoulder)	170°F.	30-35
Boneless Butt (Cottage roll)	170°F.	40-45

Times given are for ham at room temperatures when started. Since heat penetrates a thick piece of meat like ham very slowly, additional time should be allowed when meat has been taken from refrigerator a short time before roasting. (Many hams on the market carry cooking directions which should be used for that particular kind.) Half an hour before ham is done (meat thermometer will register 150°F.) remove ham from oven and peel off rind with a sharp knife. Score the surface of the fat and, if desired, insert a whole clove in the center of each scored section, glaze it to your taste with brown sugar, molasses.

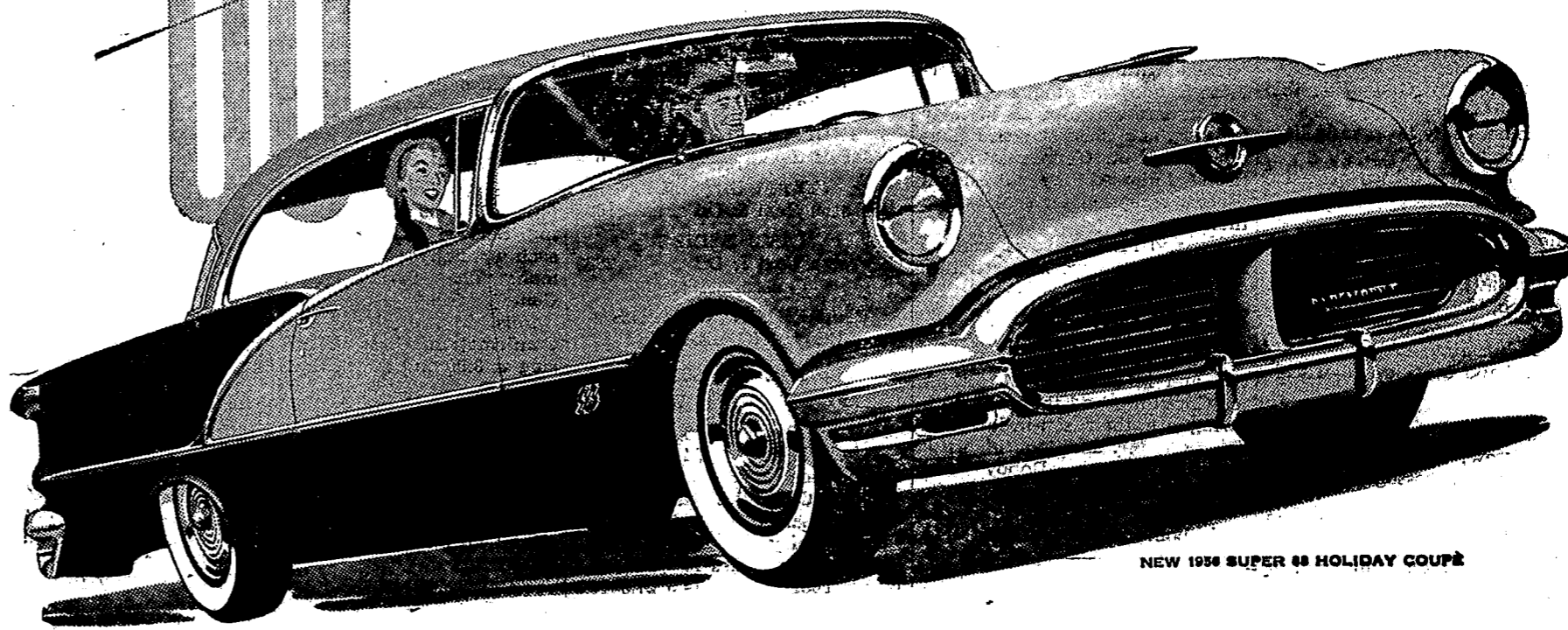

CHRISTMAS DECORATIONS

In recent years costs of Christmas decorations have skyrocketed. Wreaths and ready-made centerpieces are available, but expensive. Yet, spreading the spirit of Christmas by attractive decorations throughout the house is being done more and more

each year. There is one way to solve the problem of decorating inexpensively. Do it yourself. Make your own wreaths, centerpieces, and table decorations. The whole family can take part in the fun. Parents may have to do most of the work on the welcoming front door wreath, but the younger generation can take over place cards, favors, and other simple decorations. Don't over-

look your own lot when collecting greenery. Perhaps some of your garden and lawn evergreens need trimming. Proper trimming can improve a tree's appearance and stimulate growth. Trimming in December appears to do no harm to forest and garden evergreens.

Fruits, berries and nuts growing in your yard provide a good source of color that many decorations require. Cones, acorns, hazelnuts, milkweed pods can be silvered or gilded to give additional color. You may obtain

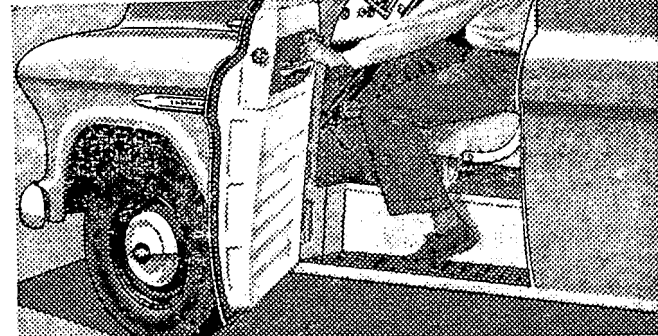

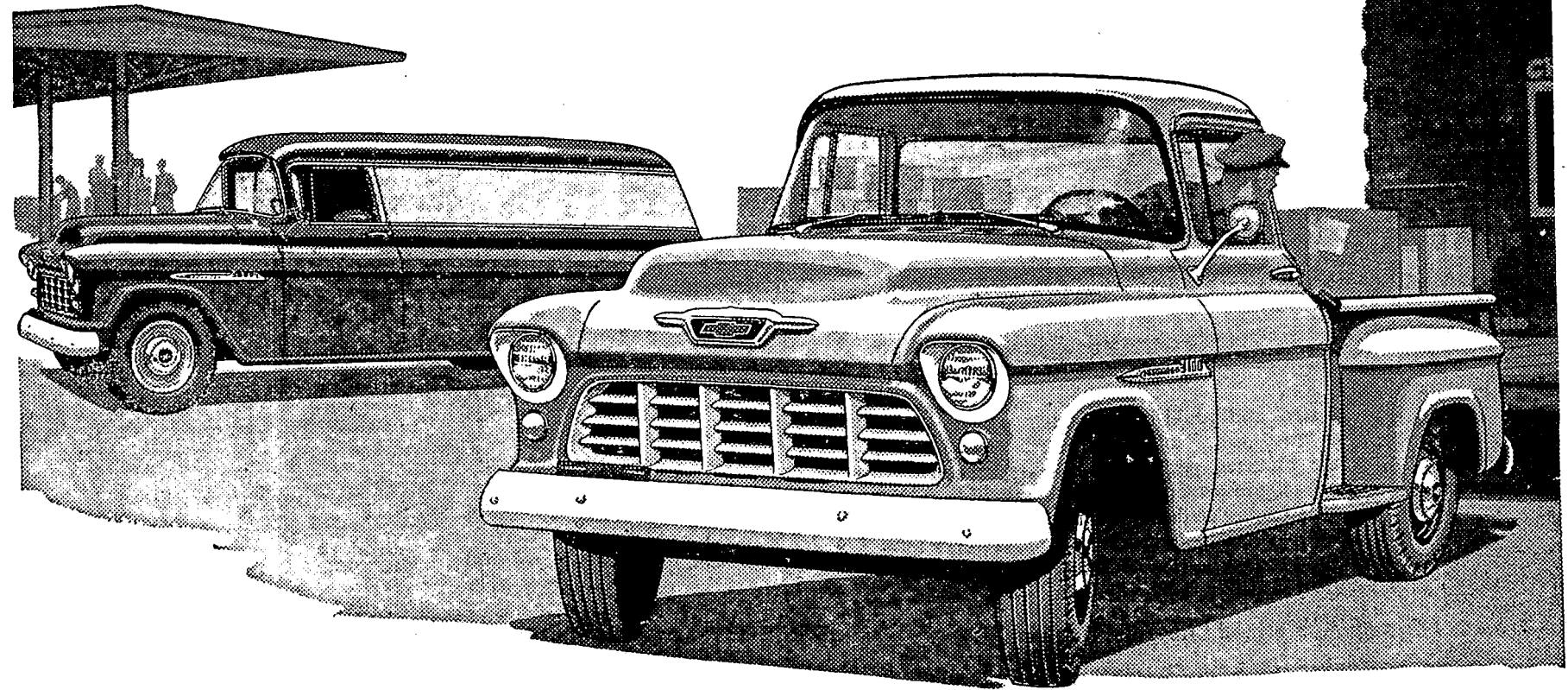

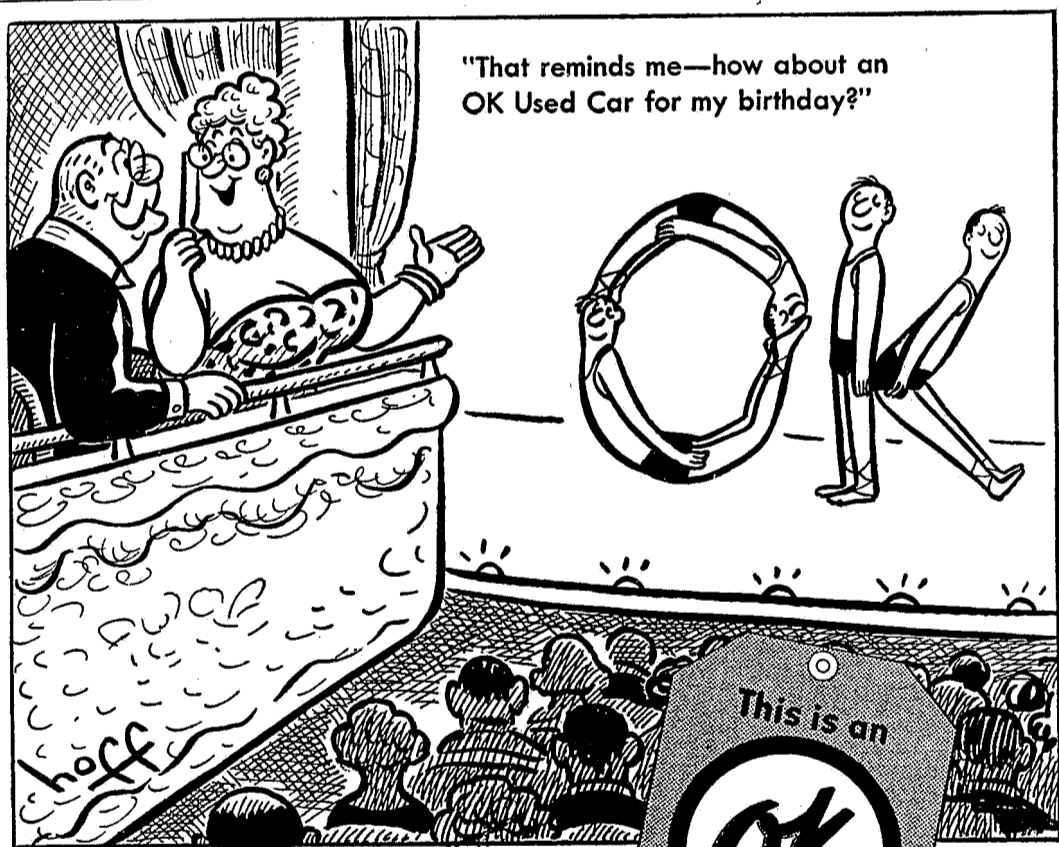
