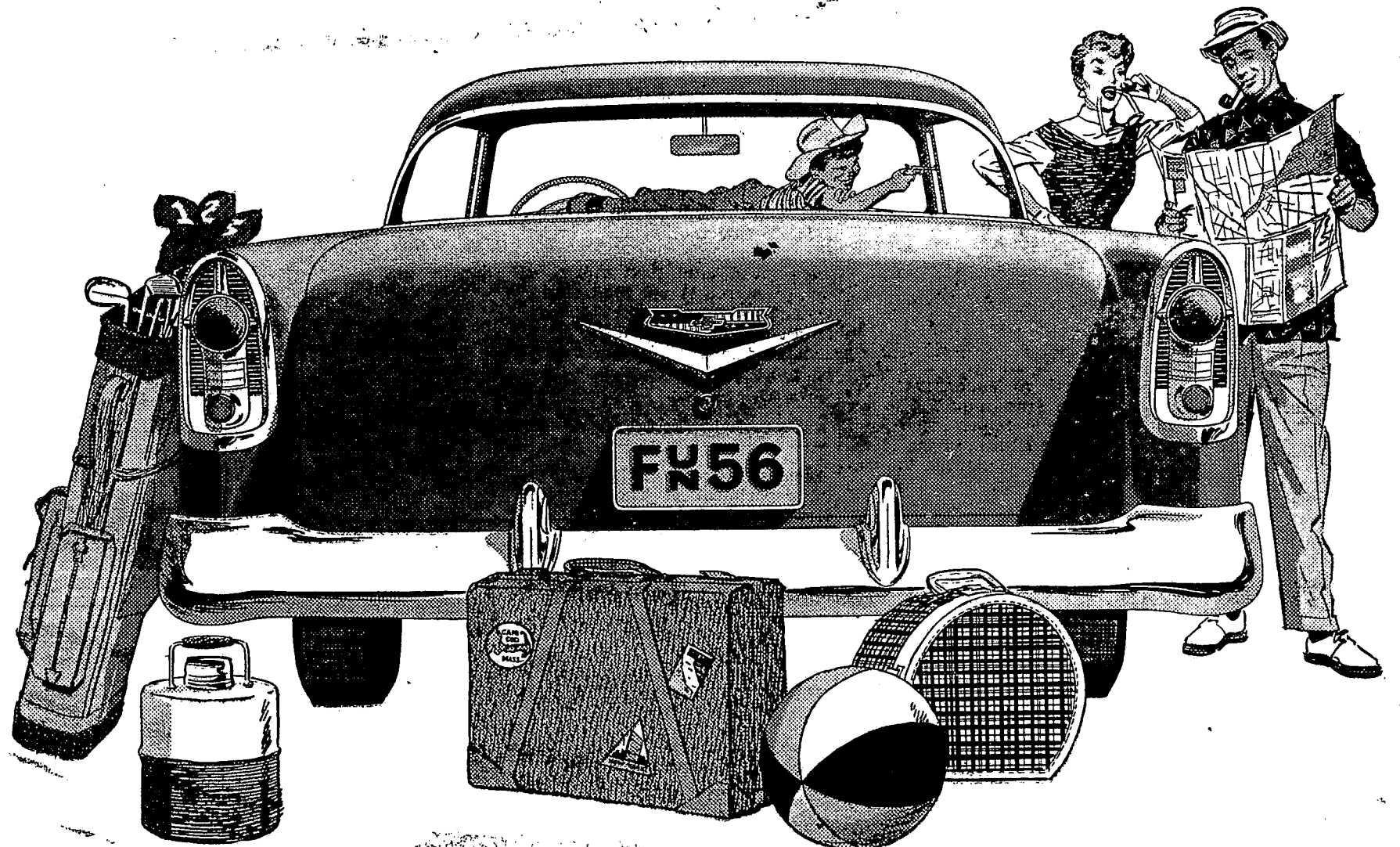

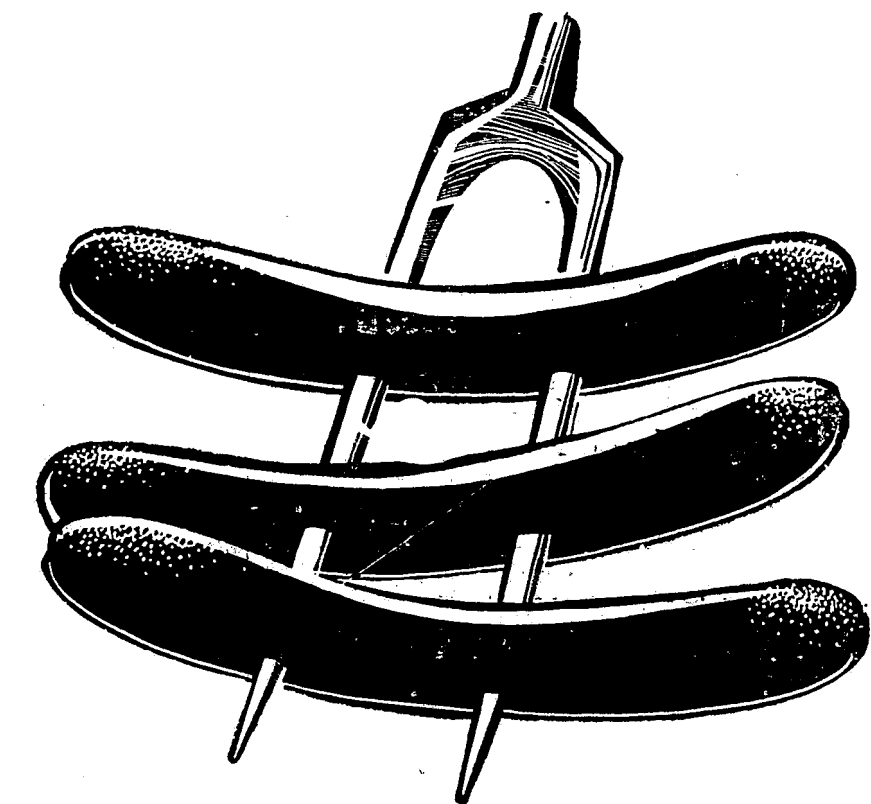

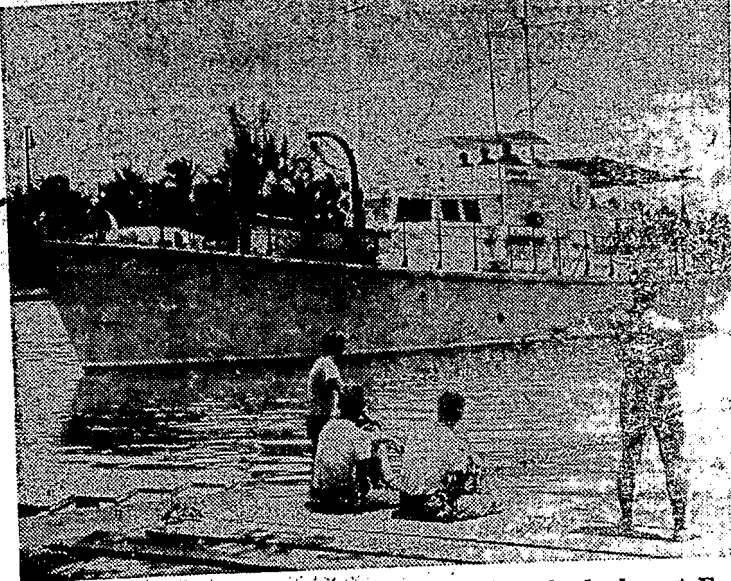

Navy Ship Sails for Michigan to Join Chain-O-Lakes Cruises at Elk Rapids



A 72-foot ex-Navy patrol ship pulls out of the harbor at Fort Lauderdale, Florida, as she begins the long cruise up the Atlantic coast and through the Great Lakes to Elk Rapids, Michigan. There she'll join the Chain-O-Lakes Cruise fleet, showing state tourists beautiful Elk River, Elk Lake, Round Lake, Torch River, Torch Lake, Clam River and Clam Lake—all in Antrim County. She'll go into service at 2 p.m. June 15 when the first cruise of the 1956 season leaves from the public dock at Elk Rapids, which will accommodate 150 passengers for the four-hour cruise through 40 miles of forest-laced Michigan lakes and rivers. Her sister ship will be the Jedge, Jr., which has carried cruise passengers in this area for nine seasons. The Chain-O-Lakes is being piloted north by Morris F. Booth of Alden, who operates the cruise with his son, Morris A. Booth.

in many ways. The old slow hammer and nails method of putting on heels is a thing of the past with us. We simply slip the shoe under the Auto-Soler and press a pedal. To those accustomed to the picture of a shoe repairer with a mouth full of nails, driving each nail painfully with a hammer, the sight of the lightening operation of the Auto-Soler is a revolution, indeed.
