'OPERATION ARMOR' STRESSED BY DOCTORS

Arch Walls, M. D., President of the Michigan State Medical Society, today signalled the start of an intensive campaign by Michigan Doctors of Medicine to urge that all parents have their children immunized against polio and diphtheria during the Christmas school recess.

"Operation Armor" is the keynote for the doctors' two weeks' drive to overcome public apathy towards protection from these two dread diseases", Dr. Walls said.

"Only if every Michigan family will avail itself of the ready supply of vaccine during this school recess time will any progress be made against the crippling and killing effects of these two visuses. Although school children constitute the most susceptible age group, immunization of every citizen regardless of age is the ultimate goal if these diseases are to be completely stamped out—and they can be", he added.

Dr. Walls urged every M. D. in Michigan to emphasize "Operation Armor" to his patients and added that vaccine supplies are plentiful.

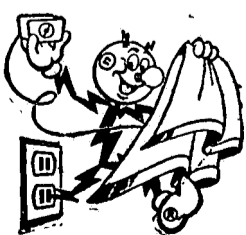
