HOW MANY OF US are familiar with the gallant history of our Elementary School Library? Our children's access to the many fine books on the shelves of the school library, is another of the many privileges we are inclined to take so much for granted. During the war years, when most people were expending their energies elsewhere, a group of mothers, headed by Mrs. Leslie Shanks and Mrs. H. W. Huttenlocher, began with a vivid dream and much enthusiasm, to create a library. They wanted the best reading material made available to their children as well as to the many others who would follow them. For this reason, donations of books were, not solicited. Through the efforts of these mothers and with the help of the Boy Scouts, the children, and other local clubs, waste paper sales were held periodically for the purpose of raising money with which to purchase reading material of the highest type for the library. In 1944, with 50 books on the shelves, the Clarkston Elementary School Library was born. Since that time, with the assistance of the Board of Education, donations, Silver Teas, and other fund-raising projects, the number of books in the library has climbed to 1123 volumes.

Until this year, when Miss Rae Huffman was employed as librarian, the library was run entirely by volunteer help. Miss Huffman spends about one day each week in each of the libraries in the Clarkston School District. In addition to this, the library is still manned on a volunteer basis. Many willing mothers are still needed for this worthy purpose.

In place of the Silver Tea this year, the April 11th P. T. A. meeting will be devoted to getting us further acquainted with our school library. The Book Review Contest winners will be presented; Miss Huffman will speak and there will be book exhibits. Anyone donating the price of a book, will have one placed on the shelves in his or her honor. The judges for the contest will be Miss Rae Huffman, Mrs. Philip Smith, Mrs. William Johnston, Mrs. Glenn Davison and Mrs. Amy Hammond. The P. T. A. has donated \$50 this year toward the purchase of new books and is also purchasing the books to be given as prizes for the contest. We must all realize that our library must be expanded further if it is to be capable of serving our ever growing student population. Let's turn out in force at the next P. T. A. meeting and show these boys and girls we are proud of their efforts.
