sponsoring the over-all study which includes a detailed personal interview survey, the public mail survey being conducted by the Michigan Health Council in cooperation with MSMS and a separate survey of doctor opinion.

"The doctors of medicine of Michigan feel that the people should be consulted regarding any extension of benefits in existing medical protection plans. They should be able to say what they want and how much they are willing to budget for the extra-cost items", the president of the local medical society said.

"The public and the doctors are partners in any system of insurance or prepayment plan", he continued, "but thus far, the public has been a silent partner. We are attempting to change

that by means of this survey". So a vote can't be counted unless the "ballot" is sent to the Michigan Health Council by July 31, the medical society urges everyone receiving a survey form to return them promptly.

**HEALTH INSURANCE TO BE REVISED**

There is no question that Michigan presently will have a revision of health insurance coverage to give greater protection of the average family's medical costs on a prepaid basis.

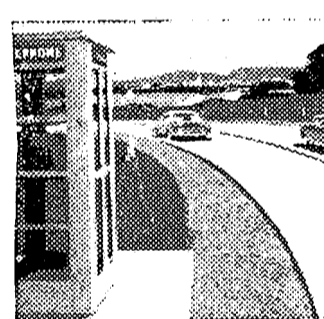
Just what form the extended benefits will take and how much they will cost will be influenced by what the public wants as expressed through the Michigan State Medical Society statewide study of medical-surgical coverage.

Hazen L. Miller, M. D., president of the Oakland County Medical Society, said today that the survey questionnaires must be returned to the Michigan Health Council by July 31 in order to be considered.

The mail survey is being sent to a cross-section of the state's population and 60,000 people are being given an opportunity to express their views.

Dr. Miller said that the monumental task of tabulating the survey answers must begin on August first in order for the total analysis to be completed for presentation to the Michigan State Medical Society House of Delegates and the public on September 23.

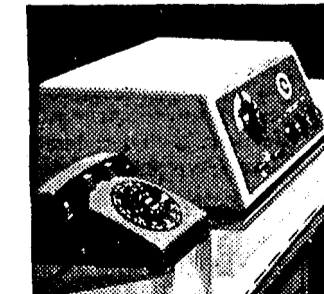

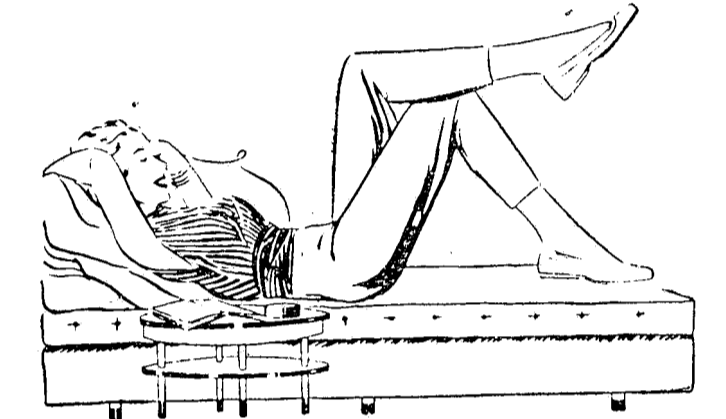

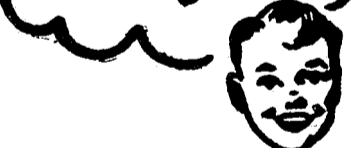

**BOMBS BLAMELESS IN BAD WEATHER, SCIENTIST SAYS**

Nuclear bomb explosions are not responsible for recent bad weather, and fallout from tests at the present rate is not a serious danger, a noted nuclear scientist has reported at Michigan State University.

Scientists "are not even in the same ballpark" when it comes to matching nature in energy production, said Dr. Ralph T. Overman, chairman of the special training division of the Oak Ridge Institute of Nuclear Studies.

Hurricanes in one second use up energy equal to five hydrogen bombs, and the only weather effect from a bomb test is strictly "local", or confined to the general test area, he stated.

Dr. Overman said atomic tests could continue at the present rate until the year 2011 and the increased hazard would be "insignificant".

The average person, the scientist explained, has been exposed to about four roentgens of natural radiation by the time he is 30 years old and receives about three additional roentgens from such things as dental and medical x-rays.

Additional radiation from all bombs exploded so far amounts to only one-tenth of a roentgen, according to Dr. Overman. Continued bomb testing at the present rate would increase radiation from fallout to four times the present level by 1986 and to six times the present amount by the year 2011. "But the increased hazard still would be negligible", he declared.



In reference to the so-called "clean bomb", Dr. Overman said the fallout is due not to hydrogen type material but to surrounding materials such as the casing of the bomb tower.

**BE ALERT FOR WILDLIFE CROSSING ROADS**

Michigan motorists are reminded to be on the alert for wildlife crossing roads.

Rabbits, pheasants and other game species are raising their young at this time of year and fast-moving automobiles on highways make life increasingly uncertain for wildlife parents and youngsters.

When it can be done safely, a touch of the brake will allow

the moment needed for a bird or animal to clear the road. At night, changing the light beam and sounding the horn usually does the trick.
