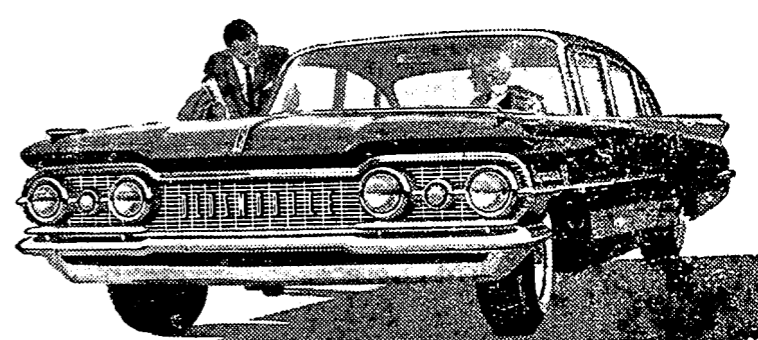

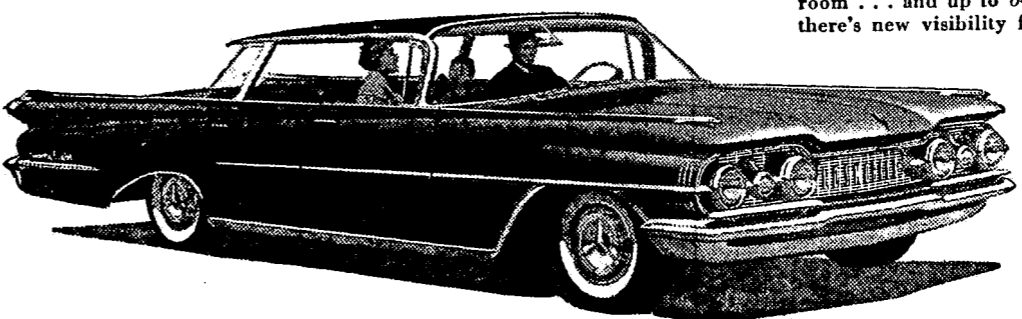

SAFETY HINTS

From Independence Twp Building Department

February issue of Readers Digest by Paul W. Kearney entitled "Is Your Home Safe from Electrical Fire?" This article dramatized two important facts: 1. a growing number of the home fires in the United States are today electrical in origin; 2. wiring in four out of five U. S. homes is today inadequate to carry the load being put on it. Approximately 195 electrical fires per day are occurring in residences; one every seven minutes. Electrical fires now destroy more property than fires of any other origin—109 billion dollars worth per year and some 250 human lives per year are being extinguished. The

hazards of overloaded household circuits are due to this basic problem: We have quadrupled our home consumption of electricity in the last 25 years largely on wiring designed to handle 1933's loads.

GRASSROOTS GAIN

The Society for Crippled Children, one of the great servants of Oakland County, recently reported its accomplishments for 1958. It is indeed an inspiring and heartening score achieved. One of the 1,700 affiliated units of the National Society for Crippled Children and adults, our Easter Seal organization has reached out to serve between 500 to 600 persons crippled by various conditions in our county. On a national scale, the Easter Seal Societies directly provided or co-sponsored care for almost 250,000 crippled children and adults.

The great impact of the Easter Seal program is achieved by the mobilization of leadership and the dispensing of direct care at the grass roots of our society. In every community an Easter Seal organization stands ready to provide the services it knows its neighbors need. It is this element of first-hand knowledge that has made the work of the Society for Crippled Children in Oakland County so successful.

The band of Easter Seal Societies have magnificently proved that crippling can be conquered. It is one of the most inspiring forces at work in the nation today.

Support to its current Easter Seal campaign is the responsibility of all.

SPECIAL ADULT PROGRAM

Spring is just around the corner and in keeping with the season a special adult education program in gardening will commence at Michigan State University-Oakland on Saturday, April 4th.

A series of 10 Saturday morning classes convening between the hours of 9 and 11 will be launched on that date at the Continuing Education Center on the MSUO campus.

Dr. Lowell Ekelund, Director of the Center, announced that the instructor for the course will be Mr. Richard Nuttall from the Department of Horticulture of MSU in East Lansing and will

emphasize the practical aspects of scientifically proven practices in modern day home gardening. Among the principal topics to be studied by the class are tree pruning, fertilizers, spraying, transplanting, plant and tree identification, flower gardening, shrubberies and flowering trees, types and uses of gardening equipment, etc.

"This course is being provided for the University community in response to popular demand," Dr. Ekelund states. "We chose Saturday mornings because some of the ladies hoped it would thereby be possible to interest their husbands in taking the course with them in the forenoon and then to spend the afternoons doing their 'homework.'" We shall certainly welcome husband and wife combinations in the course, as gardening is usually a family affair and an organized learning

experience such as this should serve to increase the pleasure as well as improve the results of their joint efforts." The course will be limited to 25, and those interested are asked to enroll in advance. The fee is \$18.00.

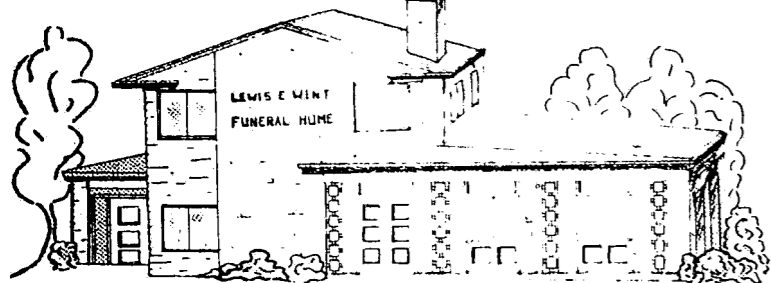

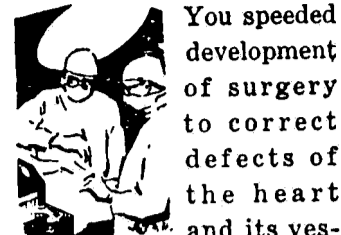

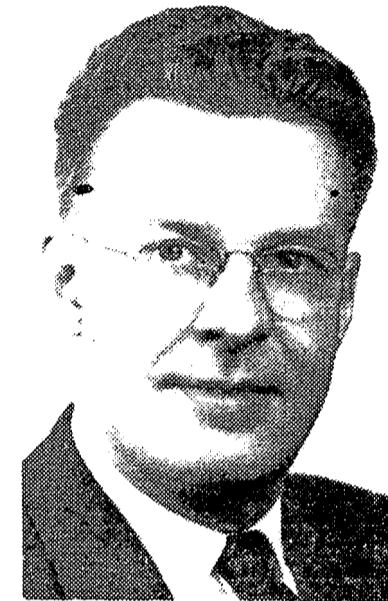
