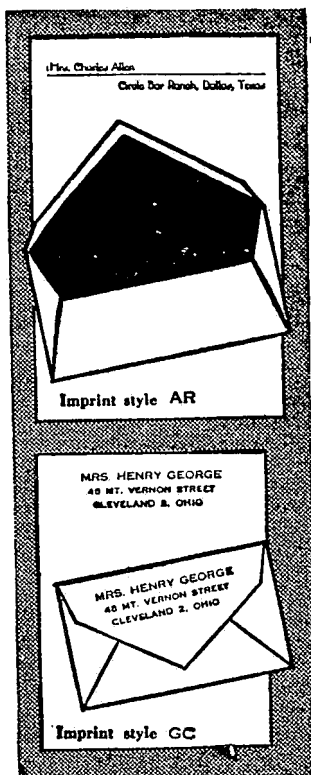

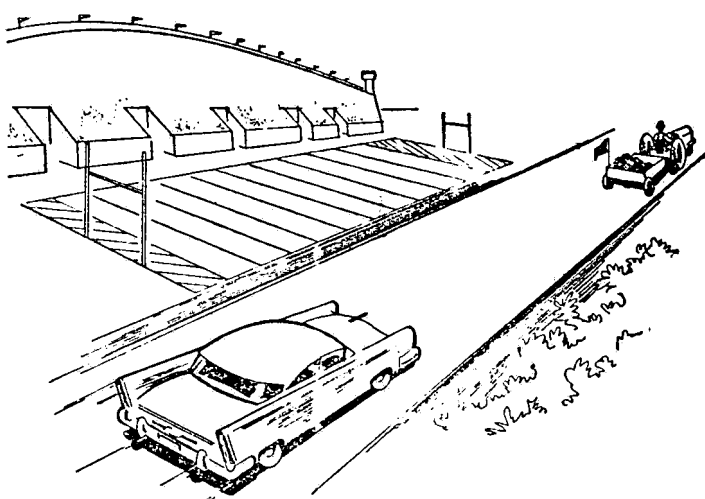

**Can You Stop In Time?**



It takes more than the distance between goal posts on a football field (100 yards) to stop a car traveling at 60 miles per hour under the best driving conditions, 4-H Club members point out. At 60 m.p.h. a car travels 88 feet per second. That's not much "time" to come to a dead stop upon approaching a tractor or other slow-moving farm machinery.  
 "Farmway safety is everyone's responsibility," 4-H leaders declare, and during the summer when traffic is at its peak the obligation becomes greater. The devastating fact that three out of four traffic fatalities occur in rural areas makes the 4-H Safety program the "number one crop" for nearly a million conscientious club members.

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**

The Zoning Board of Independence Township, Oakland County, Michigan, will hold a Public Hearing on August 12, 1959, 7:30 p. m., at the Township Hall, Clarkston, Michigan, to consider the following changes in Township Zoning Districts:

- To rezone from Suburban Farms to Residence - 1: SE 1/4 of Section 5, T4N R9E.
