TITLE: AN ORDINANCE, to amend the Zoning District Map of Ordinance No. 2, as amended, of the Township of Independence.

THE BOARD OF INDEPENDENCE TOWNSHIP OF THE COUNTY OF OAKLAND, STATE OF MICHIGAN, ORDAINS:

Section 1. The Zoning District Map of Ordinance No. 2, The Independence Township Zoning Ordinance, as amended, is hereby amended as follows:

Beginning at a point, said point being N 0 degrees 08' 45" W, 1206.81 ft, and N 16 degrees 55' 30" E, 692.67 ft from the SW cor of Sec. 29, T4N, R9E; th S 60 degrees 15' E 842.90 ft, th N 29 degrees 45' E 510.0 ft; th N 60 degrees 15' W, 959 ft; th S 16 degrees 55' 30" W, 523.05 ft to the point of beginning, the same is hereby rezoned from Commercial and Residence 1 to Manufacturing 1.

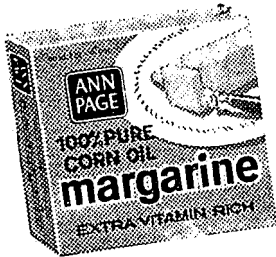

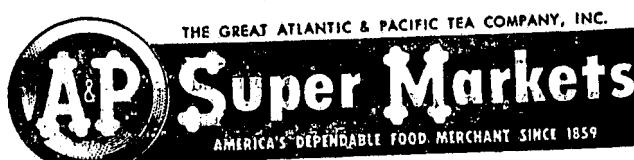

**CENSUS BUREAU TO COLLECT EMPLOYMENT INFORMATION**

Information to be used in compiling national figure on employment and unemployment will be collected locally during the week of June 19 in the Current Population Survey, it was announced today by Director John E. Tharaldson of the U.S. Census Bureau's regional office at Detroit, Michigan.

The information collected from local families will be combined with that collected in 332 other areas of the country to provide the national estimates. Approximately 35,000 households are included each month in the Current Population Survey. These households are selected at random under the Census Bureau's

scientific sampling program to provide a representative cross-section of all classes of areas in the country — large cities, small towns, rural areas, and so forth. Facts on employment and unemployment collected locally are forwarded to Census Bureau headquarters in Washington to be processed by the Bureau's

electronic computer, known as Univac, to provide the national estimates. The national report covering the information collected during the week of June 19 will be issued in Washington early in July.

Current Population Survey information will be collected from a number of local families by duly accredited interviewers.

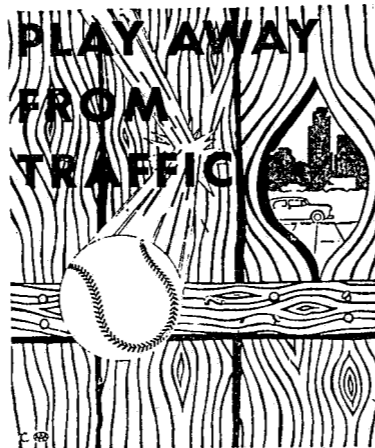

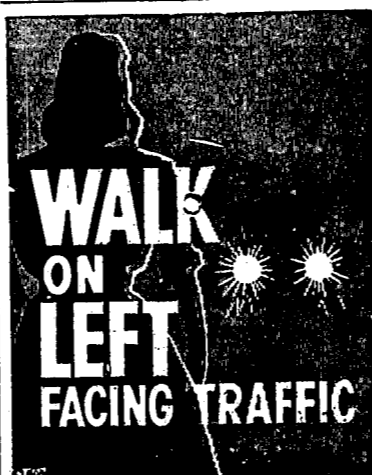
