

The meeting was called to order by the Supervisor. Roll: Hursfall, Altman, Johnson, Bennett, present. Bauer, absent.

The minutes of the last board meeting of June 5th were approved as read.

Communications from Cloise Nelson, Michigan Townships Association and the Brandon Township Supervisor were read and placed on file.

Motion by Hursfall, supported by Altman, that Dr. Fred Tucker be properly cited for his outstanding service to the township as a member and past chairman of the Township Zoning Board. Motion carried.

Motion by Altman, supported by Johnson, that the salary of superintendent of the Township dump be raised from \$25.00 to \$30.00 per month and as per previous agreement, payment of said salary shall be shared by Brandon, Groveland and Independence Townships. Motion carried.

Motion by Altman, supported by Johnson, that a private phone, separate from the Township office; be installed in the Township Library building at 88 N. Main Street. Motion carried.

Motion by Altman, supported by Hursfall that the bid of Anderson Plumbing and Heating to remove and install a new boiler at the Community Center, according to specifications, at a price of \$3,040.00 be accepted. Roll: Hursfall, ya; Altman, ya; Johnson, ya; Bennett, ya. Motion carried.

Motion by Johnson supported by Bennett, that the recommendation of the Township Zoning Board be approved and that the land here described be rezoned from agricultural district to recreational district. Motion carried.

Title:

An Ordinance, to amend the Zoning District Map of Ordinance No. 2, as amended, of the Township of Independence.

The Board of Independence Township of the County of Oakland, State of Michigan, Ordains: Section 1. The Zoning District Map of Ordinance No. 2, The Independence Township Zoning Ordinance, as amended, is hereby amended as follows:

The East 1/2 of Sec. 22, North 1/2 of SW 1/4 of Sec. 23, and all of West 1/2 of NW 1/4 of Sec. 23 lying Southerly of Pine Knob Road, T4N, R9E, Independence Township, Oakland County, Michigan, except that part of the East 1/2 of Sec. 22, T4N, R9E, Independence Township taken by the Michigan State Highway Department, is hereby rezoned from Agricultural District to Recreational District.

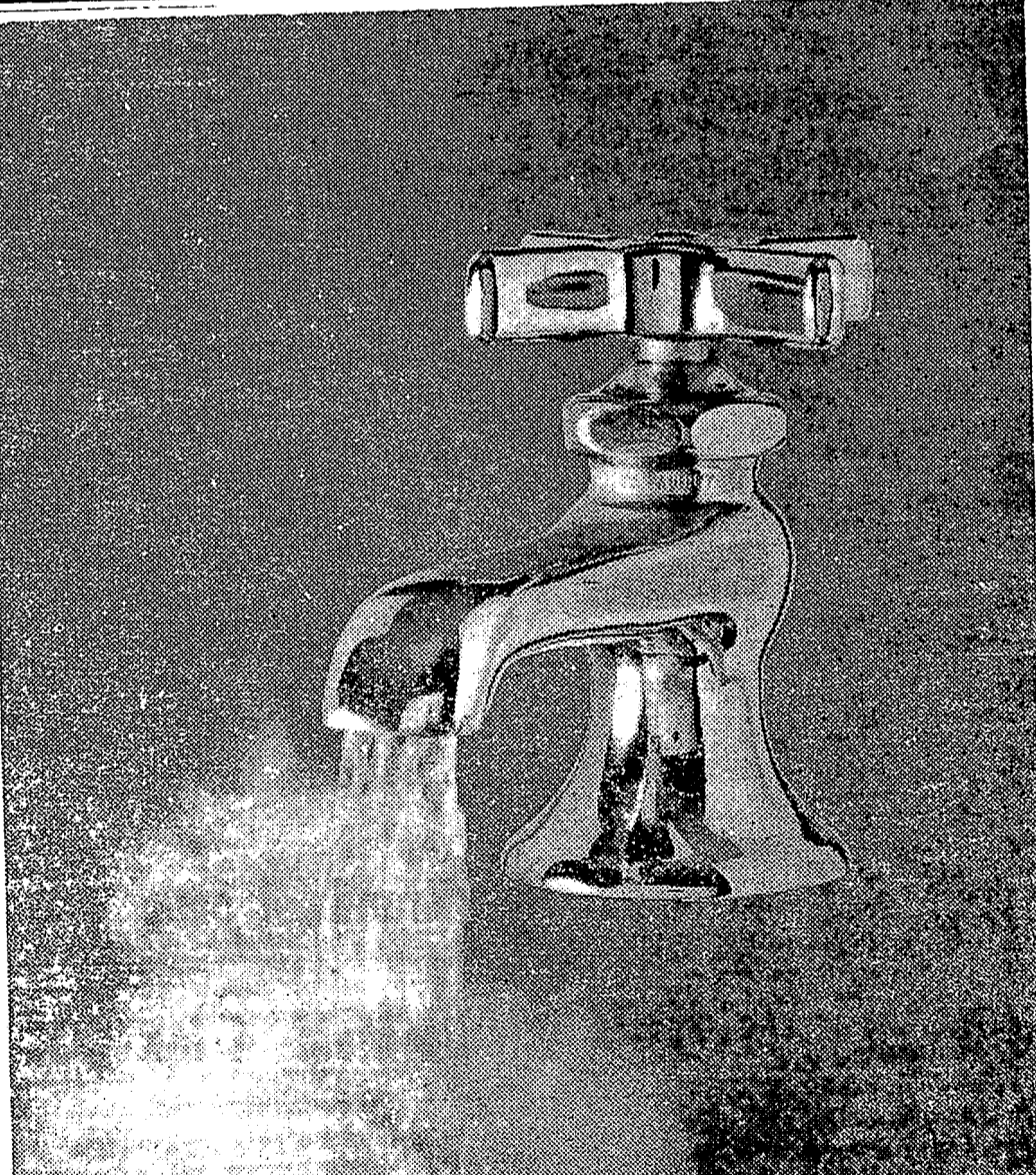
