School Enrollment at 4323

A new high in enrollment was reached this year with 4323 students registered before the 4th Friday of September.

441 Kindergarten children enrolled in school this year in the Clarkston School System, 469 1st graders, 400 2nd, 417 3rd, 397 4th, 329 5th, 331 6th, 322 7th, 285 8th, 302 9th, 257 10th, 165 11th, 160 12th and 48 in the area of Special Education.

The total elementary school enrollment (including Junior High 6th grade) is 2798 students with a regular teaching staff of 85.5 teachers or an average teacher per capita load of 32.6 pupils per teacher. The Junior High 7th and 8th grades with 23 teachers has an enrollment of 623 pupils & a per capita teaching load of 27.1 pupils per teachers while the Senior High with 38 teachers and 902 students has a load of 23.7 pupils per teacher. In addition to the 146.5 teachers employed as regular class room teachers there are 14 teachers that work in special areas such as speech correction, psychological testing, student counseling, substituting, parent counseling, music, etc. and there are 10 people serving as administrators, principals, and assistants making the total teaching staff 170 in number. In addition to the teaching staff there are 80 people employed as clerks, cooks, custodians, mechanics and bus drivers.

Debate teams in 241 Michigan high schools began their competitive interscholastic debate season this week. Clarkston High School will compete with Donna Childers acting as coach.
