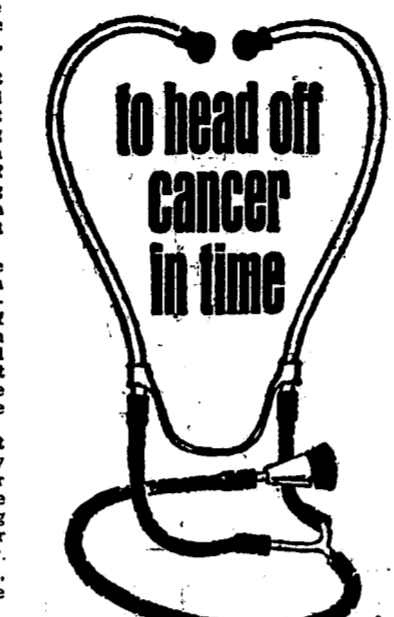

Statue of Peter Pan
Home Town Honors Mary Martin



Peter Pan hovers over the shoulders of Mary Martin's daughter, Heller, and Ralph H. Maulin in Weatherford, Texas, where a statue of the mythical character was dedicated in tribute to the famous actress who was born and raised in the community. Heller addressed a crowd estimated at more than 1,000 persons on behalf of her mother who is appearing on Broadway in a new musical, "Jennie." Maulin, president of the Peter Pan Peanut Butter Co., Chicago, presented the 10-foot statue to the town, located 25 miles west of Fort Worth, as part of the firm's 75th anniversary celebration. The figure is mounted on a six-foot stone pedestal adorned with a bronze plaque hailing "the genius of Weatherford's Mary Martin who brought a myth to life for America's millions."
