I-75 construction could end soon

If Mother Nature cooperates, I-75 construction should be completed by the end of November this year, said John Baxter, resident engineer for the Michigan Department of Transportation.

"If it quits raining, we'll get it finished this year," he

If rain continues to pour, the \$12.98 million job may have to be completed in the winter or spring, Baxter said, adding that six lanes should be open before winter this year -- regardless of the weather.

A third lane has already been added in both directions of I-75 to the 8.5-mile stretch between M-15, Independence Township, and Joslyn Road, Orion Township.

Now, black top must be added to part of the original two lanes in both directions. Plus, the median needs to be shaped and seeded, and workers must modify the guard rails, said Baxter.

"We're pushing hard to get it done this year," he said. "The contractor is working hard, too. You notice he's working Saturdays and Sundays."

The original completion date was Nov. 1, 1989, so the job is running about 30 days behind schedule, said

If necessary, however, the guard rail work may be handled in the winter. But landscaping the medians must wait until spring -- if the wet weather continues this year.

The 6.8-mile segment of I-75 from Square Lake Road north to Joslyn Road in Auburn Hills was completed in October last year -- eight months ahead of schedule.

Suspected arsonist competent for trial

An Independence Township man charged with setting a fire that caused \$500,000 in damages at Pontiac Osteopathic Hospital was found competent to stand trial

But during the pre-trial hearing Sept. 12 before Judge Jessica Cooper in Oakland County Circuit Court, the Center for Forensic Psychiatry couldn't come to a solid conclusion on whether Johnny Austin Stewart, 37, was criminally responsible for his actions at the time of the fire.

Stewart's attorney, Brad Stout, said he planned to plead insanity for Stewart's defense.

Stout also plans to request a reduction in bond, now set at \$50,000 or 10 percent cash, he said.

Greg Townsend, assistant prosecutor in Oakland County, said he opposes the bond reduction.


A trial date could be set for October or November.

24-hour store wins first approval

A filling station, which has been abandoned at the corner of Maybee and Sashabaw roads for several years, may be on its way out.

On Sept. 14, representatives of the Mobil Oil company proposed replacing the building with a new 24-hour Mobil station and convenience store at the Independence Township Planning Commission meeting.

Following a public hearing, at which two residents spoke, the commission approved a special land use and conceptual site plans for the facility. Service stations in the township require special land use permits.

The property, previously owned by Boron, is governed by a consent judgment and cannot be used for a carwash or the sale of alcoholic beverages, said Mobil

representative Joe Galvin.

In response to previous comments about traffic congestion made by the commissioners and township planner Richard Carlisle, Mobil agreed to eliminate one of two driveways connecting to Maybee Road, he added.

During the public hearing, township resident Michael Clark requested that one of the driveways facing Sashabaw also be eliminated to further eliminate traffic problems.

When the commission agreed with this proposal, Galvin said Mobil would consider making the second change.

Saying they viewed the station as an improvement to the Maybee-Sashabaw intersection, the commission voted unanimously to approve the proposal in concept.

Final site plan approval must be obtained before construction can begin.

Man charged with marijuana possession

A 23-year-old Goodrich man was charged with possession of marijuana Sept. 11, after a clerk in an Independence Township convenience store reported unusual behavior to the Oakland County Sheriff's Department (OCSD) Sept. 9.

Andrew J. Boyle was arraigned in 52nd District Court before Magistrate Lawrence Johnson on charges of possession of marijuana, which carries a one-year misdemeanor sentence or a \$1,000 fine.

Boyle entered a not guilty plea. A bench trial is set for Thursday, Oct. 19, at the 52nd District Court, Independence Township.

About 2 a.m. Saturday, Sept. 9, Boyle was in Quik Pik, M-15, Independence Township, and the clerk reported him to the police for loitering in his car and in the store, according to an OCSD report.

When the deputies arrived, Boyle ran around the counter toward the cashier. Police stopped him and searched him and found a knife under his watch band and a bag of marijuana in his shirt pocket.

Boyle was not charged with carrying a concealed weapon because the knife was not concealed by clothing, said OCSD Detective Steve Parker.

Police suspect that it was an attempted robbery, said Parker, who added that Boyle did not try to buy anything, and he had no money.

Boyle was released on a \$2,500 personal bond.

In response, Department of Public Works Director George Anderson and township engineer Tom Biehl did their best to explain.

"Excess taxes" are really taxes meant for use within the Downtown Development Authority (DDA) -- a district established in 1986 for water, sewer, landscaping and lighting improvements for parts of Dixie Highway and M-15 in the township.

Whenever the property values increase above the level of 1986, the "excess taxes" from that increase are captured for improvements to the DDA area. School money is not used for the DDA, and taxes from other parts of the township are not used within the DDA.

Specifically, some \$400,000 is being considered for new sewers in subdivisions and land along the north side of Deer Lake.

The plans are for the area bounded by I-75, Dixie Highway, north of White Lake Road and Springfield Township as included in the DDA boundaries.

No funding would be obtained by special assessments levied against the residents, Biehl said. "The cost of the project would be deferred by DDA funds."

The public information meeting was held Sept. 11 so officials could get citizen reactions to the proposal.

"This is not something we're going to force down your throats," Anderson told the crowd of about 40 people.

Both the DDA and the township board must approve the sewer plan before work can begin.

Many of those in attendance expressed concerns that trees, would be lost and that construction would result in the contamination of Deer Lake.

Biehl reassured the crowd that any landscaping, sod, trees or streets damaged by construction would be replaced or paid for upon completion.

Individual easements would be agreed upon and, for restoration purposes, photographs would be taken and dollar amounts placed on any trees that could not be replaced in kind, he said.

If and when the sewers are completed, residents would have the choice of tapping into them at their own expense, he added.

Biehl and Anderson estimated that, if everything goes "perfectly," construction could begin in the spring

A show of hands among the audience indicated that 11 residents were in favor of the new sewers, and 15 wanted to be shown alternate routes for their placement at a future, yet-to-be scheduled meeting.

Planners OK M-15 rezonings, now up to board

After listening to the comments of several Independence Township residents and developers, members of the planning commission voted 5-1 Sept. 14 to recommend the rezoning of three parcels of land along M-15 between I-75 and Cranberry Lake Road.

The parcels, which total over 60 acres, are currently zoned for heavy commercial use and would allow, for example, the construction of hotels, motels, offices and retail buildings, said township planner Richard Carlisle.

The proposed local commercial zoning of two of the parcels, if approved by the township board, would decrease that use to neighborhood-type retail permitting small food stores or pharmacies, Carlisle said, in response to a resident's questions.

Those two parcels are 40 acres at the northwest

corner and 1.8 acres at the south corner of Cranberry Lake Road and M-15.

The commission voted to recommend that the third parcel, 20.11 acres south of Cranberry Lake Road and west of M-15, be rezoned for offices.

Prior to the vote, Ann Arbor environmentalist Mike Prochaska, representing an unnamed developer, requested that the commission table the decision to allow the owner at least six months to prepare a Planned Unit Development (PUD) proposal for the site.

He did not specify what type of development is in the works but said a delay would make things easier for all concerned.

The commission members rejected his request, saying that conventional zonings had no affect on a PUD anyway and, because the township board must also hold a public hearing as well as two readings on the rezonings, did not want to postpone their decision.

Before the vote, commission member Bruce Mercado said he opposed the rezonings because they make long-term planning difficult for the property owners.

He voted against the motion to recommend the three rezonings.

The other commissioners said, however, that they wanted the sites to be more in line with nearby residential

Voting for the rezonings were Chairperson Brent Bair and members Jo Fussman, Daniel Travis, Steve Secatch and Joseph Figa. Richard Oppmann was absent.

Taxes increase a little in Springfield

Three people voiced disapproval of taxes during the Springfield Township Truth in Taxation hearing Sept. 14.

Robert Fournier of Dixie Highway, Springfield Township, said all he could see township citizens getting for their money was possibly one stop light and politicians who raise their own pay.

Board members did not respond to residents' state-

"We have a meeting Oct. 12, and at that time copies of the budget will be available -- that is the easiest time to explain what you get for your money," said Supervisor Collin Walls.

By state law, all taxing jurisdictions -- except the

state legislature -- must hold a Truth in Taxation hearing on the millage rate each year.

The board voted unanimously to set the 1989 millage rate at 3.9075 mills. The rates include .8693 mills for fire, 1.5872 mills for police and 41.2257 mills for the general fund.

In 1989, the rate was 4.0355 mills. One mill is \$1 for every \$1,000 in assessed property values.

The rate is lower for 1989 because of the Headlee Amendment to the state constitution, which automatically rolls back the millage rate whenever property values increase at a rate higher than the rate of inflation.

This year, Springfield Township will collect \$34,000 more in taxes than last year -- almost half the increase allowable by law. The increase also includes taxes on new construction.

New tests for MEAP

Students will receive the Michigan Education Assessment Program (MEAP) test again this fall, but the test will be different from those given previously.

The MEAP test is given to pupils in grades 4, 7 and 10 each fall to determine reading skills of students enrolled in Michigan schools.

The new MEAP Essential Skills Reading Test will be longer. Don Bemis, state superintendent of public instruction, said students will read two long reading selections -- a story and an informational passage like those found in their social studies and science textbooks.

The new test will measure not only whether students understand but also whether they can apply what they have learned by reading those passages.

Bemis said the previous MEAP reading test tested separate skills such as finding root words and identifying prefixes and suffixes.

"We now know that mastering these separate reading skills does not guarantee a child will become a good reader," said Bemis.

Judith Backes, director of staff development and curriculum in Clarkston schools, said testing would begin Sept. 25 and continue over a two-week period.



Sewer would kill hundreds of trees

These governmental bodies -- the Downtown Development Authority, the Independence Township Board and the Independence Department of Public Works -- have chosen to route a sewer project through a private neighborhood, not within Downtown Development Authority boundaries. Telephone answering machines have evolved from being simply appalling to appallingly mundane. Remember the first time you left a message? It was a little frightening -- you didn't know exactly what to say, and you didn't want to sound like a fool.

Now, it's second nature. We're just as comfortable (and maybe more so) talking to a machine as we are talking to people. Except for the beep, machines don't talk back.

What are we Americans turning into? Everything Europeans say about us is true.

We are obsessed with time. We don't want to waste a second. We hurry here and scurry there; we take careful notice of our digital clock radios in the morning, our beeping electronic wristwatches during the day, our car clocks on the way to and from work, the office clock at noon ...

The thought of missing a phone call turns us into high-strung, stressed-out people. The answering machine was the answer to all of our problems. It would allow us to be in two or more

places at once.

At first, the answering machine was used for businesses. Patients who call their physicians with

critical questions would know exactly where to reach their doctors. Customers with crucial plumbing or electri-cal problems would know the second the stores would open, so they could be in the parking lot waiting for the manager to unlock the door.

Eventually, the machines spread to the home. Business people working out of their houses would no longer be afraid to leave the room for a quick trip to the post office. They would not miss an important sale.

Then, the uses at home began to spread. Teen-agers didn't have to wait by the phone for that ever-meaningful call. Girls could go out with the girls and still line up a date for Friday.

Boys could call a dozen times anonymously before working up the courage -- and a steady enough voice -- to leave a message on the machine.

Mothers and mothers-in-law could call anytime, day or night, and still talk, regardless of whether or not anyone was home.

In the beginning of the answering machine revolution, you would sometimes call, and, before you started to talk, someone would answer the phone and then fumble around trying to turn off the message.

Citie & White Now, people sometimes wait until they hear your entire message before they pick up the phone -- seconds before you hang up. A few are discreet.

"I was out watering the lawn and just managed to get to the phone before you hung up," they might say.

Some -- like my brother -- don't bother to hide the truth.





"I was just waiting to see who it was before I picked up the phone," he says with a yawn. He is also the sort to mercilessly poke fun at your message -- the message where you suddenly blank out when the beep goes off, and you stutter and mispronounce words and barely say what you want before your 30 seconds is up.

I guess I should feel privileged that he picks up my call before I hang up, but I am offended.

I'm more offended, though, when people don't return those calls we leave on their machines. We've become dependent on those tape recorders. They save us dozens of dialings and have created a new game called phone tag.

Some people say their machine goofed up, and they never received the messages. Others admit they forgot to look for the flashing red light.

A character in Martin Scorcese's film -- one of three short films grouped together as "New York Stories" -- said it best.

"Why don't you listen to your machine?" a young artist screams at the character played by Nick Nolte, when he missed her phone message that would have told him she was breaking up with

Listen to our machines indeed. Why don't we just listen? Pull out the plugs to those recorders. Pull up a chair. Talk face to face. Listen to each other. Might be the beginnings of a new revolu-

Nope. Listening takes time, and people talk

Are you sure you're insured?

On June 26, 1989, a storm came through the Clarkston area. My house was hit by lightning, and fire resulted. Due to the efficiency of the Independence Township Fire Department, it was quickly and well taken care of. (Thanks to you all.)

I believe that almost all homeowners have insurance on their dwelling as I have. That is that they believe they are insured for the full replacement value.

I urge all of you to read your policy. (How many of you have not?) To you and me, full replacement value means that the problem will be fixed; we pay the deductible, and that is it. WRONG!

Look for a clause in the policy that reads: "Covered

property losses are settled at actual cash value at the time of loss but not exceeding the amount necessary to repair or replace the damaged property."

You will find that the interpretation of "Full Replacement Value" by the insurance companies is to depreciate to the value when new and not the cost of replacing to new to new condition.

My policy states "Full replacement VALUE" and the word "VALUE" is the key, because they do not use the word "COST."

Six years ago, we had the roof reshingled. After the fire, the front half of the roof had to be repaired and reshingled. Since the burned shingles were six years old they (the company) are only going to pay for 2/3 of the COST of the shingles and other roofing material. This will restore it to its original "VALUE."

This, along with other problems, makes me wonder why we pay a premium for "FULL REPLACEMENT VALUE" when I still have to pay for repairs in addition to my deductible.

If anyone has any questions regarding this type of problem please call me (no collect calls) here in Dayton, OH at 513-274-7775. Then I can give you the names of the insurance company, the agent and the adjuster I am dealing with.


I said I'd never smoke big, black cigars, drink straight gin or chew tobacco. Expecially I'd never chew tobacco in bed.

Radiology office sues area hospital for coverage rights

BY CAROLYN WALKER Clarkston News Staff Writer

A civil suit to prevent St. Joseph Mercy Hospital of Pontiac from opening a radiology clinic in the township has been filed by North Oakland Radiology, P.C., of M-15, Independence Township.

Attorney Thomas Rabette, who represents North Oakland Radiology, said the suit was filed in Oakland County Circuit Court in August because St. Joseph Mercy Hospital did not have a state-required license

called a Certificate Of Need (CON). According to Rabette, a facility that offers diagnostic services, such as X-ray or ultra sound, and which does not have a physician who sees regular patients, as a doctor's office does, needs a CON.

They must also demonstrate to the licensing board that there is a community need for the services, he said.

"It's really a very simple matter. The state requires a license," he said, adding that North Oakland Radiology currently holds a CON for the area.

Attorney Robert Maxwell, representing St. Joseph Mercy Hospital, would offer no comment except to say, "I don't think any of the allegations are meritorious."

He declined to say whether or not a CON had been applied for or approved. He intends to ask the court to dismiss the case, he said.

No court date has been set.



Car care special section

Car care checks can avoid common problems

Put down the book. Forego the walk. Put the VCR on pause. Instead, spend that 30 minutes preparing your car for winter.

A half-hour is all it takes to perform a winter car care check-up, according to AAA Michigan.

The tests are easy and could detect minor problems that could turn into major hassles when your car won't start on a cold winter morning.

The only items required are the owner's manual, tire pressure gauge, screwdriver, antifreeze hydrometer, baking soda and wire brush.

To perform the check-up, follow these 12 steps: Battery: Use a wire brush dipped in a baking soda-

water solution to clean battery terminals and cable ends, but don't splash on painted surfaces. If the battery is not maintenance-free, make sure water is at the correct level.

Tires: With a gauge, check the pressure for correct inflation, and inspect tread wear, including the spare. For accuracy, check inflation pressures when the tires are cold. A "cold" reading can be taken when a car has not been driven more than one mile or after sitting for three hours or more.

Antifreeze: Use a hydrometer to check the antifreeze strength in the radiator. The recommended level is 36 degrees below zero. Also check the level in the overflow tank.

Oil: Use the dipstick to check oil level. Add oil as needed. Check owner's manual for exact intervals between changes and for SAE viscosity grade. Some car manufacturers suggest lower viscosity during winter.

Brake fluid: Keep the level within one-quarter inch from the top of the reservoir. Use a screwdriver to pry off the chamber's cover clips. Some vehicles may have screw-off caps. New models have translucent reservoirs and can be checked visually.

Power steering fluid: Follow directions in owner's manual when checking the indicator stick. If fluid is needed, add slowly to avoid overfill.

Automatic transmission fluid: Check indicator

stick, usually located behind engine on passenger side. The car should be on level ground and placed in "park" position with the engine running.

Belts and hoses: Test tension by pressing on the middle of each belt. If a belt gives more than 1 to 1 1/2 inches, tighten or replace. Check for cracks and fraying, and be sure hoses are firmly in place. Replace as needed.

Lights, signals: Activate to make sure they work. Air filter: Hold the filter up to a light. If you can't see light through it, replace it.

Washer fluid: Keep the reservoir filled with sol-

Wipers: Be sure wipers work well, and replace if they leave streaks or skip spots.

Tips to steer clear of winter skidding

Skids on icy roads can be easily corrected if drivers don't hit the brakes and remember a few simple steps, according to AAA Michigan.

Hard acceleration or braking, speed to fast for conditions, and quick, jerky movements of the steering wheel are the primary causes of skids.

The best way to avoid skidding is to reduce speed in advance of curves, turns or when changing lanes; and make smooth, precise movements of the steering wheel.

But if you do experience a skid, don't panic, hit the brakes or jerk the steering wheel. Instead, use gentle movements to regain control.

For a rear-wheel skid:

● De-clutch on a car with manual transmission. On a car with automatic transmission, take your foot off the gas pedal and shift to neutral (should be practiced). This will equally distribute the power to all four wheels.

Steer in the direction you want the front of the car

 Just before the rear wheels stop skidding, counter-steer until you are going in the desired direction. (Drivers of rear-wheel drive cars should be prepared for a possible rear-wheel skid in the opposite direction if they over-correct for the initial skid.)

Release the clutch or shift to "drive," and gently accelerate to a safe speed.

For a front-wheel skid:

• De-clutch with a manual; take your foot off the accelerator (and shift to neutral) with an automatic.


Don't move the steering wheel. Wait for the front wheels to grip the road again; then steer in the desired direction of travel.

● Release the clutch or shift to "drive," and gently accelerate to a safe speed.







GTO group helps keep the muscle car era alive

Muscle cars of the 1960s no longer roll off the assembly line. Right or wrong, progress replaced them with high-economy, low-performance cars.

Only in the imagination of little boys and the storage garages of collectors do cars such as the 1968 Pontiac GTO still exist.

"That made me feel good," he said. "It's the first time I won a trophy."

Some day, Cangemi may purchase a run-down vintage car and restore it.


"I've always had older cars," he said. "I'd like to restore (a car) one of these years, but I don't know if I will."


Davis, Jason Kinzler and John King all had big runs for Clarkston in the drive. The kick for the extra point failed, leaving Clarkston ahead 6-0.

Mark Leineke ran a career-best race in the reserve race and finished third. Freshman Brad Patterson, in his first meet, also ran well, the coach said.


The Wolves then opened the home season with a rousing win over Northern, 16-47.

Gone: 330 dozen doughnuts, 3,000 cups of cider

Weekend shoppers ate 330 dozen doughnuts and drank 3,000 cups of apple cider last weekend in downtown Clarkston, despite heavy rain on Saturday, Sept. 16.

If you figure that one of three or four shoppers purchased cider, then about 10,000 to 12,000 people showed up at the festival -- about the same number as last year, said Larry Gilleland, president of the Clarkston Community Historical Society, which organizes the festival each year.

"The vendors were extremely pleased -- even Saturday," said Gilleland. "It started raining about 3:30, but

they did tremendous business in the morning."

The historical society, which sells cider and doughnuts at the festival to raise funds for a local history room at the Independence Township Library, ran out of cider around 4 p.m. Sunday, said Gilleland.

The historical society also sold out of this year's mug, which depicted three historical homes drawn by Clarkston artist Jim Russell. As of Sept. 18, the amount of funds raised was not known.

On Sunday, historical society members surveyed the vendors and received excellent evaluations of the show, said Gilleland, attributing much of the success to the jurors, who choose which vendors to allow in the 70booth festival.

"The jury has been trying to find out why people go to the festival," he said. "They finally hit gold this time. ... Everything was quality, and they had a good variety."

Tasty 'good-for-you' muffins

Many of us have switched to munching fruit and bran muffins for a quick treat, congratulating ourselves that we are snacking nutritionally smart.

However, Tufts University "Diet & Nutritional Letter," May 1989 states, "There's a reason many of these 'good-for-you' muffins taste just as sweet and are just as satisfying as the 'bad-for-you' donuts they replace. They often contain the same ingredients -- plenty of fat and loads of sugar.'

The Tufts article also reports that a bran muffin from one popular doughnut shop contains 122 more calories than that same company's Bavarian creme filled donut covered with chocolate frosting. And it has between 35 to 40 percent more fat.

So what does a muffin lover do? Ask for nutritional information when buying muffins. Some bake shops provide it; some don't.

Thanks to the following recipes from Dan Foley, part-owner of Friar Tucks Restaurant, you can make your own muffins and know what you are eating. Or Friar Tucks Restaurant on Dixie Highway has wonderful muffins packaged and ready to eat with nutritional information included. Grab some and freeze them for breakfast or snacks.

BLUEBERRY-YOGURT MUFFINS

- 2 cups plus 1 tablespoon all purpose flour
- 1/3 cup nonfat dry milk powder
- 1 tablespoon wheat germ
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- 3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon, divided use
- 1 cup nonfat plain yogurt
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 1/4 cup reduced calorie, soft margarine (not stick),

melted and cooled

- 1 large egg, room temperature
- 2 tablespoons water
- 11/2 teaspoons honey
- 1 teaspoon hot water
- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Spray 12-cup nonstick muffin pan with non-stick cooking spray.
- 2. In a large bowl, stir together flour, dry milk, wheat germ and baking powder and cinnamon.
- 3. In a medium bowl, beat yogurt, sugar, cooled margarine, egg and 2 tablespoons water until blended. Fold in blueberries.
- 4. Fold wet ingredients into dry just until blended. (Frozen blueberries may make batter stiff and hard to mix; if so, add another Tablespoon water.)
- 5. Spoon batter evenly into prepared muffin pan. Bake for 25-30 minutes until springy to the touch and
- 6. In a small bowl, blend honey with hot water and remaining 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon. While still in the pan, brush muffin tops evenly with honey mixture. Let cool 1/ 2 hour. Lift muffins from pan and continue cooling on







look too good."

Second grade -- My face was a mottled face of red. I remember we had a substitute teacher who yelled at me just before we went down to have our pictures taken. Never cry on picture day.

Third grade -- Comb your hair!

Fourth grade -- Don't wear light colors, or they won't show up in a black and white yearbook. Your head will be floating.

Fifth grade -- Make sure your collar isn't crooked. Sixth grade -- Don't tuck your hair behind your ears. It looks painful.

Seventh grade -- Red shows up nicely. Eighth grade -- Lots of blank space to my left. Hold

your head up straight. Ninth grade -- Glasses plus braces equals blinding

Tenth grade -- Bloodshot eyes. Don't make picture

"That dark red just isn't your color."

"Something's wrong with your collar."

"I'm not sure I like the pose." "That's a beautiful smile."

These comments bothered me (well, except for the last one). How could they say those things? These were supposed to be my very best school pictures! I decided to examine these to see where I went wrong.

I looked at one sheet, feeling uneasy at the sight of eight static-looking pairs of my eyes staring up at me. I held a hand mirror in the center of one print to test the symmetry. My face wasn't centered perfectly! The mirror held at one side made my face look wide and blubbery, while it was narrow and pointy on the other.

I picked out every stray hair. I discovered a mole I never knew I had, even though it was present even in my kindergarten picture.

I'm beginning to believe school pictures will never be perfect, and the only things we'll have to really remember our classmates by are memories of their personality and the times we spent with them.

Ain't that a shame.




New name, same address

Marilyn Allyn, director of community education, said the name was changed to let people know that the education is for the community -- the Learning Center name had a private-school connotation to






