## Rattlesnake found in compost

Michelle Zielinski of Independence Township was turning the compost pile in her yard Sunday when she heard the rattle of a snake.

"My first instinct was to run," said Zielinski, who said she has a phobia of snakes.

Instead, she tried to overcome her fear by stepping back a few feet and watching the snake. That's when she noticed its black-brown color with diamonds on its back — a massasauga rattlesnake.

The massasauga is the only poisonous snake native to Michigan. Two children have been bitten by them this year in the Clarkston area. Usually, they are found in swampy areas. The closest swamp to the Zielinski house is 5-10 acres away.

After identifying the snake, Zielinski went in the house and waited until her husband came home a few hours later. He found that the snake was still in the pile.

The couple called the Oakland County Sheriff's Department, who came out and shot the snake — about 9 p.m. Aug. 1.

Zielinski said people with compost piles should be aware that the warm piles are an ideal environment for snakes, so they should take caution when near them.

## Undercover police nab six thieves

Six teens were arrested Tuesday while allegedly stealing from cars in the Lancaster Lakes Apartment Complex, Independence Township.

Four of the teens, ages 16 and 17, are from the Clarkston area. One is from Waterford, and the sixth is from Grand Blanc. The names of the teens will not be released until after their arraignment in 52nd District Court, Independence Township, Aug. 3 or 4.

According to Lt. John Taylor of the Oakland County Sheriff's Department, the teens stole everything from car phones to radios to golf clubs out of 15 to 20 cars at the complex off Dixie Highway, behind the Kroger shopping center.

The Auto Theft Unit of the OCSD had been requested in the area by detectives at the Independence Township sub-station due to numerous thefts.

While working undercover, the deputies watched as the teens broke into the cars around 3 a.m. Tuesday. Uniformed police officers were called to make the arrests.

The teens are in Oakland County Jail awaiting arraignment.

# Building permits keep pace with 1992 construction

Permits for new construction in Independence and Springfield Townships are keeping up with 1992 permits — in value and numbers.

As of July 1 this year, permits for 108 new homes, four attached units (apartments) and one commercial building have been issued in Independence Township. The value for this new construction is \$12,810,900.

Last year, permits for 197 new homes, nine commercial, 44 apartments and four condominiums were issued in the township with a value of about \$26 million.

In Springfield Township, 50 new construction permits were issued in the first six months. Of those, 49 are for single-family homes, and one is for a commercial building. The value of construction in Springfield is \$5,965,920. At this time last year, 53 permits worth \$7,215,600 had been issued.

Officials in both building departments said the year is going well, and the outlook for new construction is bright.

Statewide, the construction outlook also looks good. "The June figures reflect a steady pace of construction activity in Michigan," says Clarkston-area resident Mike Hofer, president of the Michigan Association of Home Builders.

According to Hofer, even though the 1993 numbers are behind 1992 statewide, each month reflects better increases. The year-to-date value of new housing starts for the state is up by 1.7 percent, and the number of projects increased by 0.3 percent as compared to May.

## Grassroots group plans to work with DNR

The Friends of Pontiac Lakes Recreation Area plans to work with the Department of Natural Resources to preserve and protect the state park in White Lake Township.

The group also plans to continue its opposition to Oakland County's attempts to acquire the state park land for development.

The group opposed a takeover plan for the park proposed by the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority, which would have combined the park with its Springfield Township park called Indian Springs Metropark.

Joining in the opposition to that plan were the Michigan Horse Council, the Michigan United Conservation Clubs and other groups.

The DNR announced recently that it would retain jurisdiction of the natural area, which includes hiking, biking and horseback trails, fishing and swimming lakes and wildlife habitat.

While the Friends of Pontiac Lakes applauds the decision of the DNR, it opposes the county plans to develop the area.

The Oakland County Road Commission passed a resolution June 16 to approve a minimum of 60 to 100 acres of current park property for expansion of the Oakland-Pontiac Airport and realignment of Williams Lake Road. Friends of Pontiac Lake believe the plan poses a serious threat to existing wetlands and will have a detrimental effect on the area.

The Friends of Pontiac Lake includes sportsmen, horsemen, bicyclists, hikers, environmentalists and local property owners. For more information about the Friends of Pontiac Lake Recreation Area, contact Ron Gerchow at 681-8276.

## Merchants to help Midwest flood victims

A couple of area merchants have volunteered their businesses as drop-off points for victims of the Great Midwestern Floods.

For the past month, floods and torrential rains have vacated several towns and resulted in billions of dollars in damage to parts of Missouri, Illinois and Iowa.

In the Clarkston area, two businesses have designated themselves as official drop-off points. They include: The Wee Sale Shop at 5910 Ortonville Road and Clarkston Muffler and Brake, 148 N. Main Street.

The Wee Sale Shop is owned by Carl and Bonnie Solden of Waterford. Bonnie is a native of Hull, Ill., which had to be evacuated because of rising flood waters. So the family is attempting to collect as many cleaning supplies, non-perishable food items and baby products as possible for their friends in Hull.

Dave McGrath, owner of Clarkston Muffler and Brake, also is collecting any items that could benefit the flood victims. Money also can be dropped off. Checks should be made out to The American Red Cross. This drop-off point is scheduled to run from July 30 to Aug. 6.

# Hospice volunteer finds that her work helps others - and herself

When Katie Zoss began volunteering with hospice patients, she had no idea that the things she learned in the program would help her in her own life.

Zoss' own mother died somewhat suddenly this year, and the training and knowledge she has gleaned from

None of us (gets) out of here alive. I would hope I could be as not angry (as he is) when I die," she said about the patient.

But she does more than help the patient himself — she also tries to be there for his wife and children. She takes the 16-year-old daughter out to the movies.

"At an age when kids should be out playing, they're caring for a dying father," said Zoss.

She hopes that the time she spends with the daughter helps relieve some of the stress associated with living and caring for a sick person.

There's a perk in it for Zoss too. "I really enjoy her company," she said.

Before matching a volunteer with a patient, Hospice trains each volunteer. They learn about the dying process, the grieving process and, most importantly, about being good listeners. Some hospice patients have AIDS, and those volunteers get added training about dealing with the disease.

Zoss praises the support system offered by Hospice. She said that whenever she has a question, there is always someone to answer it and give her encouragement.

"(They) never act like it's a bother," she said.

Knowing that Hospice care is for dying people, Zoss has a realistic outlook on what she does.

"I can't make anything better, but I can be there with support," she said.

her volunteering experience helped her with her own grieving, she said.

"It helped me to be there for her (while she was sick)," said Zoss.

This 45-year-old Clarkston resident cares for and helps people at every turn in her life. A probation officer at the 52nd District Court in Rochester Hills, she also takes graduate courses at Oakland University, Rochester. She has volunteered at Common Ground and has been a member of the ski patrol at Pine Knob Ski Resort for 15 years.

Zoss began volunteering for Hospice of Southeastern Michigan in January.

"People think it's morbid. I wish I had done it sooner," Zoss said.

She chose the organization because of the local emphasis.

"It gives back to the community, and I believe in the premise of Hospice," she said.

Hospice is a way of caring for people who are nearing the end of their lives. Its services keep patients comfortable and meets their needs in their homes, rather than in a hospital, for instance.

The 42-year-old man to whom Zoss is assigned lives four miles from her house. She goes to his home once a week and talks to him and brings him treats.

"He's the kindest person. I'd like to do more," said Zoss.

She's found that not only is she helping him a little, but she also is learning from him.

"I think people can learn a lot from death. We all die.

Death is inevitable. Sometimes it comes silently in the night, sometimes after a heroic struggle — but it comes.

Once in a while the person and the family get a warning. Then they must decide what to do and how to care for the patient.

The Hospice of Southeastern Michigan was organized in 1980 to provide care for terminally ill people in their homes.

The patients must choose to have care aimed at providing comfort, rather than curing the disease. And they must live in the tri-county area while receiving Hospice care.

Every Hospice patient is cared for by a team of professionals, assisted by volunteers. The team can include physicians, nurses, social workers and clergy.

In the Clarkston area six people volunteer for Hospice, with others helping in Springfield Township and the Waterford area. According to Mary Kay Galvin

of the Hospice of Southeast Michigan, there's a great need for volunteers during the daytime. Galvin added that the organization always has opportunities for volunteers at any time.

Patients in the Hospice program have an illness causing a limited life expectancy. Hospice helps patients with cancer, AIDS, heart disease, Lou Gehrig's disease, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease and other problems. The patients range in age from newborns to 102 and beyond.

After the death of the patient, Hospice helps the family through the grieving process with at least 13 months of bereavement support services. A five-week grief recovery program is offered, as well as ongoing support groups.

The pamphlet "On Dignity" by Hospice of Southeastern Michigan explains why people choose Hospice care.

"To choose the care of Hospice over more traditional options is to choose keeping family and friends close by at all times, and not merely restricting their presence to visiting hours.

"To be surrounded by all that is soothing and familiar, instead of that which is cold and clinical. To have physical pain controlled, constantly. To be assured of equal attention to those things non-physical — thoughts, emotions, spiritual concerns."

## 'Sexual delinquent' waives pre-exam

A 20-year-old Independence Township man charged with exposing himself waived his right to a preliminary exam Friday and now faces arraignment in Oakland County Circuit Court.

Joseph Alan Lunsford had already pleaded guilty to three counts of indecent exposure when he was arrested for the fourth charge in April. Indecent exposure is a one-year misdemeanor.

Based on the previous misdemeanor charges, the courts classified him as a "sexually delinquent" person.

Indecent exposure by a sexually delinquent person is a felony punishable by life in prison.

According to Oakland County Sheriff's Department reports, Lunsford allegedly approached women in his car, usually when they were alone in a shopping strip parking lot, and fondled himself in front of them.

Lunsford's arraignment is set for Thursday, Aug. 12, before Circuit Court Judge Gene Schnelz.

He remains in Oakland County Jail unable to post bond.


No one was arrested or charged with a crime. The case remains under investigation.

# Keep your eyes on Lansing

The Michigan Legislature, with its surprise move two weeks ago to eliminate property taxes as a way to fund schools, may have embarked upon its most important period in history.

Now our representatives have the opportunity to prove they have the stuff of leadership. And they'll be doing it in an election year.

The move, approved by both parties July 21, effectively wiped out 90 percent of Clarkston Community Schools' operating budget — and similar amounts throughout the state. How to replace that money will be the subject of much discussion between now and the end of the year, the deadline Gov. John Engler has said he favors.

We hope the Legislature will seize this opportunity to, at long last, come up with a funding mechanism that guarantees equal access to education for all the state's children, rich or poor, black or white, urban or rural.

We also hope they will resist the temptation to try to incorporate all kinds of private agendas that have nothing to do with funding.

Though quality issues are of concern to many citizens, they cannot be resolved when money is a crisis each and every year. Once the funding mechanism is stabilized, we can begin to talk about signifi-

cant school improvement.

We hope voters will watch Lansing and their individual representatives to see what they do and say during the coming months. Then we hope voters will remember what was said and done (or not done) in November 1994 and vote accordingly.

## Jim's Jottings

*New Almanac with some old ideas*

Another birthday is close at hand, and another Old Farmer's Almanac publication has arrived.

The Old Farmer's Almanac publishers now have editions: *Hearth & Home Companion* and *Gardener's Companion*. They sent us *Hearth* etc.

The lead-in letter starts: "Why do egg whites whip up best in a copper bowl? How does a bread box work? What's the secret for sweet-smelling sheets?" That's certainly exciting, thought-provoking stuff . . . stuff that makes me want to read it to see why they really came out with this edition.

On the cover are grabbing headlines like: "Bountiful Beans", "The Truth About Dirt," and "Recipes from the Ranch." Recipes make it big time in *Hearth &*.

One bean tip: "Soft-cooked beans make a great finger food." What? The editors aren't bashful. They cover the flatuation factor, too.

Dust comes from just about everything including the cosmic. Recipes from the Ranch come from cattlemen.

I thought they really had something when I saw the article, "How to crack hard-shelled nuts." I'm big on hard-shelled nuts . . . hickory, black walnut and butternut.

*Hearth &* suggests, for the latter two, "Set pointed end in depression. Tap many times on blunt end until nut cracks. Don't be hasty. It should not crack before at least four or five taps. A hard bash and you end up with crushed nutmeats."

My method: hold the nut in my gloved, left hand on a piece of railroad track. Raise hammer head high and bring it down with controlled force. One, maybe two thumps will lay open the meat.

Here's a potato baking idea that's not new: DON'T wrap them in foil, which steams them instead of baking them. Rub them lightly with butter or oil and sprinkle with salt. To speed baking, impale each potato on an aluminum nail, which you can purchase at a hardware store. (The same nails sold in kitchen stores cost more.)

*Hearth &* offers 20 uses for lemon other than cooking. Here's one for kicking the smoking habit: Carry a lemon with a hole in its top, wrapped in wax paper. When you have the urge to smoke or chew, suck a mouthful of lemon juice. You may need several lemons to kick the habit.

Another: Add lemon juice to a few teaspoons of hot clover or alfalfa tea to relieve headaches from hangovers or other causes. And, mulch rose bushes with used lemon peel and pulp.

After reviewing this almanac I think I know why the publishers decided to print it . . . they sold enough advertising to make it profitable and the \$2.95 price tag should help. It's at your favorite book store.

Still curious about why egg whites whip best in a copper bowl? It's because a copper bowl emits an electrostatic force that reduces the time and energy needed to mix egg whites to maximum volume.

Don't panic, I told myself. When this crisis is over, you're going to laugh about it. Run fast, I urged myself.

*Run fast?* Me, who firmly believes even the slowest jogging is dangerous to my precious lethargy?

Yes, me.

Adam, my 2 1/2-year-old grandson, and I were hanging out in a park near his home. It was the middle of a hot weekday afternoon, and no one else was around. No one playing tennis, or baseball, or swinging on the swings, or sliding on the slide, or picnicking in the picnic area.

Just Adam and me, in our usual single-file formation, with him going wherever he pleased, and me staying only a few steps behind, ever ready to grab him before he went where he shouldn't. The main danger to fearless little kids is the swampy pond at the north end of the park.

When we walked onto the baseball diamond, I was able to relax my guard a little, because it's completely fenced in, with the only gate near home plate. While Adam ran the bases, if I stayed between him and the gate I knew he couldn't hurt himself any worse than a skinned knee.

When Adam toddled deep into the left-field corner, I wasn't concerned. Until he decided to lie down on the grass. I wondered why, and began strolling in that direction. I arrived at the answer too late.

Adam had somehow burrowed under the fence. Suddenly he was only a few feet from the pond. The pond into which he'd regularly tried to jump on previous park visits. The pond that was well over his head. The pond that was the big reason I always stayed close behind him.

Almost always.

There was no way I could get under the fence, or over it. There was no question that Adam could get into the water much quicker than I could run the full length of the field to the only exit and then run back the same distance.

That's when I told myself not to panic. I also told Adam to stay right where he was until I got to him. I tried to remember the last time Adam did what he was told. I couldn't.

And that's when I began to run. Which is what prevented a tragedy that I can't even think about without getting sick. But it wasn't the speed, it was the novelty.

Like most of the rest of the world, Adam had never before seen me run. He was transfixed by the unusual, intriguing sight of a suddenly physically energetic Grandpa. Adam didn't unfreeze and head for the pond until I was only a few steps away, and able to stop him from getting very wet. Although he did get very muddy.

Whew. A few minutes later when, still gasping for breath, I returned Adam to his mother, I made jokes about our experience. I didn't admit I'd been terrified, only embarrassed by my child-care ineptness.

Not much different than a few days earlier when I'd poured Adam some apple juice into a nipples bottle with no damn bottom. I can never remember that unless you put a stupid plastic bag inside a modern baby bottle, it holds liquid the same way a funnel does.


But I know Adam's mother understood what I didn't say. I didn't say the truth, which is that little children need constant, alert protection against all sorts of dangers they're too young to comprehend. Love is important, but not always enough. I should have been more careful.

For 72 hours before that, Edin and more than 200 other children in the hospital had been abandoned, without doctors, nurses or other staff members, and with nobody to turn to..."

We should all be more careful.

# Township author, publisher releases new books

Author Jim DuFresne not only has three new books in print, his own publishing company also has published new titles.

The Independence Township outdoors writer recently released his "Porcupine Mountains Wilderness State Park Guidebook" (\$10.95). A detailed guide, the 160-page softcover book examines the wilderness park's 60,000 acres, 90 miles of foot trails, 25 spectacular miles of Lake Superior shoreline, waterfalls, rental cabins, camping area, entire rivers, fishing, day trips, back coun-

try treks, and much more.

He also co-authored "What's Cheap and Free in Michigan" (with Bill Bailey, \$12.95). The book includes zany roadside attractions, cheap but fun family attractions, hundreds of off-the-beaten path low-cost and free vacation destinations, loony world records in Michigan, strange museums, and lots of high-quality under-published and inexpensive places to visit throughout the Great lakes state.

It includes the Hot Dog Hall of Fame, the world's

largest weather vane, low-cost art galleries and educational museums, the Bottle House (a house built using glass bottles), ghost towns, tours of a casket factory and other slightly weird factory-business tours.

He and Bailey also wrote "Ohio State Park's Guidebook" (with Art Weber, \$14.95), which covers 72 state parks, complete with 65 maps and nearly 100 photographs.

The 384-page comprehensive guidebook gives directions, phone numbers, tips and advice. For example, it features a working farm, working canal locks, wildlife, unbroken wilderness and backpacking trails. Weber, with Bailey and DuFresne, wrote the book in cooperation with the Ohio Department of Natural Resources.

DuFresne and Bailey's publishing company, Glovebox Guidebooks, also published "Cycling Michigan: West Michigan's 25 Best Cycling Routes" by Karen Gentry (\$12.95). Michigan's first cycling guidebook features 25 detailed maps with route mileage, bike repair shops, side-trips, scenic rest stops, historical information and the degree of difficulty for each leg of the tour.

DuFresne, author of "Michigan State Parks," "Lower Michigan's 75 Best Campgrounds," and 10 other well known guidebooks, writes a widely published column called Kidventures and Travel in Michigan, both carried by newspapers throughout the state.

Glovebox Guidebooks are a new series of travel guides that cover Michigan and the Midwest in a brand new way.

Other recently released books include "Michigan's Only Antique and Flea Market Guidebook" (\$11.95) and "Michigan Zoos and Animals Parks" (\$10.95).

Usually our mail brings requests for help in locating missing relatives; however, this unusual query would hope to find the information on the "Brush School," attended in 1930 by L. Heisler.

She states that her uncle had gone to school in this same one, in 1915. Today the site is a gravel pit. In our experience, locating the exact place on a plat map in the deeds department (Recorder of Deeds office) would lead one to the buyer of the property, once it was no longer used as a school.

It would appear, however, that this is Macomb County researching. Meanwhile, we thank her for sending the pedigree chart for her BUTLER, PARKER, ROBERTS, METZELBURG families and is seeking to find additional information on all of these families in the Rochester-Avon Township area, into Macomb County and adds that her

grandparents were in Macomb County as well.

Other lines are GENO and HAASE, that may be helpful to others working those surnames.

Ever mindful of the high cost of obtaining birth, death and marriage records, it behooves all of us to call our local representatives in the Senate and House for our state and inquire how they are voting on keeping these records open to the public, in committee NOW in housebill #378.

Hopefully, the records can remain open to the public regardless of the reason one has need to require copies, because they are OUR records to begin with and go back to 1867 when it became mandatory to publicly register them.

For what the coffers have filled up with you'd think the urgency of continuing to use all means possible to continue making money from this source would be a priority from the powers that dictate budgets and their requirements.

If you have not inquired into the ways to do armchair genealogy, please let us be of help in offering ways to tap resources at hand.

More mail is arriving at our home address, and helping to expedite the help we can offer. Its great to hear from all of you and the more the merrier.



## Business Briefs

### U-M forecast: County job growth to continue

After losing more than 11,000 private sector jobs in 1991 — the first annual decline since 1982 — Oakland County gained more than 17,000 jobs last year and is expected to add another 38,000 over the next two years, according to a University of Michigan study.

George A. Fulton and Donald R. Grimes, economists at the U-M Institute of Labor and Industrial Relations, presented their 1993-94 forecast of the Oakland County economy on April 16.

"Recent developments have allayed fears that Oakland County's robust economy would be derailed," the U-M economists say. "The county's economy got back on track in 1992, after its weak performance of the two previous years."

According to the report, a majority of the new jobs

in Oakland County over the next two years — 20,000 out of 38,000 — will be in service industries. More than half of this projected gain is due to a resurgence in business and professional services, with health services and social services accounting for the most of the remaining job gains.

## Tips help when choosing day care

One of the most important decisions in new parents' lives is who will care for their child while they are working.

The American Academy of Pediatrics' offer advice and guidelines on the health of children in day care. Your child's day care program should:

■ **Be licensed or registered with the state.** Although every state requires day care licensing, many centers and home care facilities are not monitored.

■ **Allow you to visit at any time.**

■ **Require medical evaluation of staff and children to prevent infections in the program.** All personnel should have a complete health assessment, including a tuberculosis test, before beginning work. Children also should be medically evaluated and immunized according to the AAP's recommended schedule.

■ **Have an adequate staff/child ratio.** Caregivers should have special training or experience in recognizing children's changing needs. There must be enough staff to give individual attention to every child, supervise all children, feed infants individually, wash or supervise handwashing, promote child development, and evacuate all children from the facility in an emergency.

■ **Have a written plan for emergencies.** Your child's day care facility should have an exit plan in case of fire, smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, safety caps on electrical outlets, a first aid kit, and posted instructions on how to treat an injured, poisoned or choking child.

■ **Provide enough space indoors and outdoors.** Crowding can have a negative effect on children and can make contagious diseases more difficult to control. Proper heat, light and ventilation also should be maintained.

■ **Designate specific areas for children who need rest and quiet.**

■ **Provide a variety of activities and materials.** Every child care facility should have age-appropriate books and safe, sanitized toys for all children. Time should be allotted for play, rest, meals and other activities.

■ **Promote good health habits.** Self-care and cleanliness can be introduced as soon as a child is able to learn. Your child should be taught regular routines for washing his hands, using the toilet, brushing his teeth and blowing his nose. Staff also should wash their hands before feeding, after diapering, and after helping children go to the bathroom.

■ **Provide adequate nutrition.** Meals and snacks should be nutritious. If your child is in day care for nine or more hours, he should have at least two meals and two snacks a day. If your child is under 18 months of age, you can give the day care staff instructions regarding formula, foods and a feeding schedule.

■ **Have a written policy for the management of sick children.** Very few illnesses should exclude children from day care. Diarrhea, vomiting, high fever and other highly contagious diseases should be mentioned in the policy.



## Hunter races, wins on stock car circuit

When Saturday finally rolls around, most guys find themselves either doing yardwork or catching a game on the tube.

Mike Hunter isn't most guys, however. He'd prefer to spend his weekends tearing up the track at the Flat Rock Speedway in his stock car.

For the past six years, the 31-year-old Independence Township resident has been traveling to Flat Rock to pit his vehicles against other competitors in the Automobile Racing Club of America (ARCA).

During the past three years, Hunter has been racing in ARCA's street stock feature division, which includes 67 registered vehicles. He began in the hobby stock division in 1987.

Since joining the street stock feature division in 1990, Hunter has won nearly 25 races during the regular season, which runs from mid-April to mid-September.

Last year, he ranked second in total number of racing points in his division, falling just short of the overall point leader title.

"With three races to go in the season, I was in first place by five points," he said. "However, I cut a tire and sustained some suspension damage in a crash, which knocked me out of the race.

"That mishap dropped me 80 points behind the leader with two races to go," Hunter added, "and I just couldn't catch him, especially after the last meet was rained out and never re-scheduled."

This season, Hunter finds himself in contention for the title again. He's in third place just a few points out of first. His point total has been sparked by four victories so far this season.

"If I win this weekend, I could very

well be in first place again," he said. "That's how quickly the point standings can change week to week."

When he's not racing in Flat Rock, he'll take his car to meets in Sandusky, Toledo and Flint. These "money meets" usually consist of 50-lap races.

At Flat Rock, however, his weekly races are mostly limited to 20 laps around a quarter-mile track.

Hunter said his love for racing stems from visits to the race track as a youngster.

"My father took me to the track near Sault Ste. Marie when I was 10 years old," he said. "My fascination for the sport all started there."

As a teen-ager, Hunter said he also helped a neighboring race car driver work on his vehicle from time to time. After graduating from high school, Hunter joined the Navy, but his passion for race cars didn't diminish.

Upon his discharge, he decided to follow his dream and become a part-time stock car driver.

Hunter is employed as a technician at Hank Graff Chevrolet, Davison, but he and three friends put in about 80 hours of work on his Chevrolet Lumina each week.

"Most of the time put into racing is actually maintenance-oriented," Hunter said. "We work three to four nights a week, so the car will be ready by the weekend."

Hunter said the continual upkeep of a stock car is costly, when you consider the vehicle goes through a set of tires and a slew of engine parts each week. Luckily, he has four major sponsors who either donate parts or pay for most of his maintenance costs.

Despite the long hours and big bills, Hunter said all the hard work is worth it, especially when his 355-horsepower engine is performing at maximum capacity.

"I love it when the car is set up good, allowing you to pass a lot of people," he said. "Because of the weather, the track changes week to week, so we've got to be ready for anything — and most of the time we are."

Each weekend, Hunter is assured of having a good following at the track to see him race. His wife, Cheryl, and 7-year-old daughter Jennifer are always on hand to cheer him on.

"They're my number one fans," Hunter said.

Recently, the racing world has been

plagued by a rash of deaths. However, the thought of sustaining a paralyzing injury or dying rarely enters Hunter's mind when he's racing.

"The danger aspect really doesn't bother me," he said. "If you do some research behind the past few accidents, you'll find that they're mostly the result of equipment failures or off-the-track incidents."

"The cars we drive are really safe. ... There's a ton of safety equipment in each one to protect the driver," Hunter added.

Besides his street stock car, Hunter is on the verge of building a car for the ARCA Late Model Feature class. Closely resembling his present car, the vehicles are much faster and more expensive to race, he said.

Hunter said he turned a small profit racing last year and eventually would like to make a living from the sport.

"I intend to keep racing a long time," he said. "I'd like to be successful enough to one day make a living out of it."

"I told my family that I'd retire when I win the Winston Cup," Hunter added, laughing.


## Moscovic wrestles at U.S. Olympic Festival

Bell, Russell and Wallace have grown up around animals. For example, Russell has two cats, a dog, a bird, a rabbit and a hamper.


In addition, the three have participated in many 4-H shows. Each is raising a rabbit for this year's show. They

## Board approves bids for new elementary

The Clarkston School Board approved five bids related to construction of the new elementary school July 26.

The board approved all bids 4-0, with President Joe Helpem and trustees Janet Thomas and Kurt Karlstrom absent from the meeting. Karlstrom arrived later in the evening.

Each approved contractor represented the lowest bid offered in each case.

The new school will be built at the intersection of Holcomb and Bridge Lake roads, Springfield Township. This building will be paid for with money from the \$16.1

million bond issue approved by voters last February.

The selected bids included: Earthwork, Inc., for site clearing and grading, \$82,000, chosen over two other bidders; Earthwork, Inc., for installing site utilities, \$74,874, selected over four other bidders; Metal Fabrications for 41 miscellaneous work items, \$28,500, chosen over one other bidder; Koerts for aluminum framing, glass and glazing, \$127,775, over two other bidders; and Oakland Plumbing for plumbing installations, \$437,395, over five other bidders.

The school board will consider bids for items such as concrete, asphalt, landscaping and masonry on Aug. 9.





## Springfield boy, family battle tumor

After being diagnosed with a brain tumor three months ago, progress has been made to rid 4-year-old Steven Mellado of his cancer.

He's been treated with doses of radiation, chemotherapy and smiles. A lot of smiles.

"Since finding out, we've tried to shelter him from any negativity," said Sandy Mellado, his mother. "That's why we've hung that 'Smiles Only' sign outside his door. With everything he's gone through, we want him to be surrounded by positive people only."

Steven Sr. concurred.

"Sure, it's sad and all, but we feel if everyone keeps a positive attitude we'll get positive results," he said.

On May 26, little Steven was diagnosed with pontine glioma, after his parents had him checked out over a bout

of disorientation. The disease is a tumor that attaches itself to the inner brain stem. Because of its location, this rare form of cancer is inoperable.

The initial prognosis for a prolonged life didn't favor Steven, unless some radical treatments were attempted.

Almost immediately, he underwent a combination of a radiation and chemotherapy treatments at the Michigan Institute for Radiation Oncology (MIRO) and St. Joseph's Mercy Hospital.

Steven recently stopped getting his twice-a-day radiation treatments at the MIRO clinic, but he'll continue undergoing once-a-week chemotherapy sessions at St. Joseph's until Dec. 21.

These double doses of radiation and chemotherapy proved to be a first for a patient at the MIRO clinic, and the results have proven optimistic.

"Our radiologist, Dr. (Donald) Bronn is very confident and positive because Steven has responded so well to

the treatments," Sandy Mellado said. "With both radiation and chemo together, they've been able to reduce the tumor by nearly 90 percent, according to his last MRI (magnetic resonance imaging).

have received thousands of dollars to help defray medical costs. His family includes Steven Sr., mother, Sandy, and sister, Sarah, 16 months.

"Dr. Bronn's goal is to totally demolish it," she added.

The Mellados said their son has only a vague idea of what the treatments are doing for him.

"He doesn't know the full extent of everything that's been done so far, except that 'there's good guys inside of him fighting the bad guys,'" Sandy said.

So far, a majority of Steven's medical costs have been covered by his father's medical insurance, which he receives as a deputy with the Oakland County Sheriff's Department. However, in the past two weeks, some of the bills that Blue Cross has not agreed to pay have been coming in the mail.

Some of these bills will be paid by thousands of dollars already donated by community members and Steven Sr.'s co-workers. For example, a pair of Sandy's friends, Cyndy Rodriguez and Stacey Banaszak, surprised the Mellados in early July by holding a communitywide garage sale in their honor.

The event raised nearly \$1,700.

A July 16 bowl-a-thon also garnered nearly \$10,000 for the family.

"Everyone's been great in the way they've chipped in to help Steven," Sandy said. "There's a great sense of community around here."

According to his parents, Steven has responded well to the treatments and media attention. They, on the other hand, have occasionally had to depend on each other for strength.

"We're our own therapists," Steven Sr. said. "We've had to lean on each other a lot. We both have our bad days, so we take turns bringing each other up."

The Mellado family has had some uplifting moments, however, like when they visited Barney the purple dinosaur in Allen, Tex., in mid-July. The trip was made possible by the Make-a-Wish Foundation, which grants wishes to children diagnosed with terminal diseases.

"Steven just loves Barney, so they had a birthday party at the studio," Steven Sr. said. "They got a chance to meet Barney as well as the kids on his program. It made for a nice day."

To increase morale, Steven Sr. and his son engage in a weekly ritual called "Dude Night," where Sandy and sister Sarah, 16 months, leave the house to the guys. Then,

the two "Stevens" rent a couple of kids' videos and share a bowlful of snacks.

With fall quickly approaching, the Mellados said Steven's already looking forward to attending Cross Hill Community Pre-School.

"He's eager to go to school and make new friends," Sandy said. "Hopefully, it'll help him put some of the summer's events behind him."



### Computerized service for latch-key, elderly

It's 8 a.m. — do you know where your parents are? A new computerized service in the area calls the homebound, elderly, disabled and latch-key children everyday to find out if they are OK. If there are any problems, help will be on the way immediately.

The program is offered in this area by Community Service Systems.

Dean Hixson, a five-year Clarkston resident, began the business in this area because he lives here and be-

cause, "There's a market for it. It's a service that is needed," he said.

With the service, the latch-key child or homebound person will receive one to three calls a day with a customized message for each. If they need help, they push "0" on their touch-tone phone and those selected to help will be summoned. If everything is fine, they just push "1" and the call is over.

Other added features include a reminder to take medicine in the message. And if the person doesn't answer the phone after nine rings, help will be summoned.

A companion to this service is the "help alert" — a

small transmitter worn by either the homebound or the latch-key child. It works anywhere in or near the home, and a fire alarm can be connected to it.

To activate, the person presses a button on the device and the signal is passed through a control unit connected to the phone to a 24-hour emergency response center providing quick assistance at any hour.

These two programs are not meant to replace a responsible adult presence, but they do provide a measure of safety and assurance, said Hixson. Even if there's nothing wrong, there's peace of mind when the child or the homebound answers.







Everyday, people in our community dedicate their lives to other people but aren't recognized for it.

I'm sure everyone's heard the nursery rhyme, "There was an old lady who lived in a shoe; she had so many children she didn't know what to do."

Well, this is Clarkston's own version of that rhyme. This is a story about a lady who has opened, not her shoe, but her home to so many children — and she *does* know what to do.

Her name is Sandy Morris. Sandy has provided child day care for the past 20 years. It all started when she babysat for her neighbor's three children, and, she says, "it just grew from there."

Sandy's Day Care is more than just 9 to 5. She gets up about 6 a.m. and awaits her first arrival. By 7:30 a.m., breakfast starts, and between this time, about 15 children arrive. At 8:10 a.m., the students leave for school. The remaining children ranging from ages 4 months to 6 years, love to do puzzles, color and do special projects. But it doesn't stop there ...

Sandy also has a preschool in her lower level, for children 3 and up on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, from 9:30 a.m. to 11 a.m. One of her helpers, Laura Surre, teaches the children songs. They read stories, learn about the weather and go over the calendar, to name a few activities.

Sandy picks kindergartners up from school at 11 a.m. and lunch is served at 11:30, where the children are served a balanced diet that Sandy OK'd with the Association for Child Development Food Program from the state. Each meal consists of a protein, bread, vegetable, fruit and milk (the kids get chocolate milk once a week).

After lunch, there is outside recess — depending on the weather. The kids enjoy playing on the various outdoor equipment, as well as favorite games, such as Duck-Duck-Goose and Red Rover.

Nap time, or quiet time, is 1-3 p.m. About 3:30 p.m., the children arrive home from school, and everyone is served a healthy snack. About 4 p.m., children start to leave, with the last one departing around 6 p.m.

It still doesn't stop there! Sandy does various field trips with her day-kids — trips such as the Independence Township Fire Station and the cider mill, where Sandy takes the apples from her apple trees and gets them pressed.

"The kids help gather the apples from the ground," says Sandy.

Then she and a few children and adults go to the mill, where the apples become cider.

"I let the kids help pick all the apples. We put them on a conveyor belt, where they go into the press, and then I let them help jug," she says.

From Sandy's three apple trees in her back yard, she usually produces about 105 gallons of cider, and that doesn't include the apple sauce and pies she makes with the extras.

This past year, guest speaker Detective Dave Hernandez of the Oakland County Sheriff's Department visited her home and spoke with the children.

"He made them all get in a circle and talked to them about calling 9-1-1," Sandy says.

He named different reasons why children would call 9-1-1. "Now, what would you do if Sandy were stuck in a tree?" the detective asked. A lot of the children responded with the answer, "Call 9-1-1!"

"Jokingly, Mr. Hernandez said, 'Yeah, either that, or shake the tree.' The children laughed and really enjoyed it, and they even got to sit in his patrol car and listen to the sirens," Sandy says.

Even though Sandy loves her job, she has one complaint.

"More child care is needed," she says. "All child care is overloaded, and there isn't any room for children after school."

Sandy puts in so much work and dedicates so much time into what she does that I would like to commend her for her past 20 years of child care. She certainly deserves it.




