# Businesses, residents could soon get a break

BY DEBORAH DZIEWIT Clarkston News Special Writer

Many area businesses and homeowners could pay less for insurance as early as April because of a lowered fire protection class rating.

Independence Township is under a re-evaluation which began last fall by an organization responsible for assessing townships and municipalities of their fire protection methods, water systems and equipment, said fire chief Gar Wilson.

"We asked for it this year," Wilson said. "People are supposed to have a good fire department and we are. It's time to get the benefits from the department."

The Insurance Service Organization (ISO) rates townships and municipalities from one to 10, with 10 being the highest and costliest because it means that municipality has little or no fire protection.

Insurance companies use the ISO rating system

#### **Crime Capers**

#### Assualt with a phone

Randy Wolfe, 31, of Independence Township has been bound over to Oakland County Circuit Court in connection to an alleged assault on his ex-wife.

He will be arraigned on charges of felonious assault in front of Judge Edward Sosnick on Jan. 20 at 1:30 p.m. If convicted he faces a maximum of four years in prison and/ or a \$2,000 fine.

Wolfe allegedly threw a portable phone at his ex-wife after they argued on Dec. 23, 1993. She was hit in the face and required medical attention. The attending physician contacted the police.

#### Arrest in jacket thefts

A 19-year-old Pontiac man was arrested Saturday for allegedly stealing \$1,100 worth of jackets from an area Foot Locker store.

Eugene F. Pickard was arraigned in 52nd District Court, Clarkston on Jan. 10 on charges of breaking and entering with intent to commit a larceny. His preliminary exam is scheduled in front of Judge Gerald McNally on Jan. 21 at 10 a.m. If found guilty, he could face up to 10 years in prison.

According to Det. Chuck Young of the Oakland County Sheriff's Department the Foot Locker store on Dixie Highway, Independence Township, was broken into on Sept. 24, 1993. He said 10 Starter brand jackets with the Detroit Lions and Dallas Cowboys logos on them were stolen.

Young said Pickard supposedly sold the jackets to a girl in Pontiac who was going to return them to area Foot Locker stores for money. Young is still looking for two other men allegedly involved in the theft.

#### One week, three crashes

Alcohol was a factor in three area accidents, according to reports by the Oakland County Sheriff's Department.

The first accident occurred at 4:26 a.m. on Jan. 1 on White Lake Road, north of Andersonville Road. According to the report, Matthew Bert, 20, of Waterford was driving his 1988 Pontiac too fast, lost control of his car, hit an embankment and rolled over. Bert was not injured, but his three passengers—Matthew Rentschler, 20, of Union Lake, Erika Graham and Sarah Basinger, both 18 and from Clarkston, were treated for minor injuries at area hospitals.

The report said Bert had been drinking. All four were wearing seatbelts. Bert was ticketed in the incident.

Two days later at 4 a.m., Rhonda Runyan, 37, of Waterford lost control of her 1987 GMC on Sashabaw Road west of Pine Knob Road, ran over a fence and into a swamp.

The police report said that she had been drinking. She was treated for minor injuries at North Oakland Medical Center and was ticketed. She was not wearing a seat belt.

On Jan. 4 Joey Ender, 24, of Independence Township was arrested for allegedly driving under the influence after he rear-ended a car on Maybee Road at 5:25 p.m.

According to the OCSD report, Ender hit a car stopped for traffic which was driven by Gale Kauthen, 31, of Clarkston.

# Helping the county plan

Robert Olsen of Independence Township has been appointed to Oakland County's Business Leaders Roundtable by County Executive L. Brooks Patterson.

Olsen is the president of Planned Financial Services, Inc. of Clarkston which he formed with the late L. Mack Oakley in 1974. He is currently the president of the Clarkston Foundation and served as recent chairman and trustee for the Oakland County Local Development Corporation.

The Business Leader's Roundtable combines the expertise of 125 business and education leaders to develop a strategic plan to help the county government lead its citizens into the next century.

"I'm delighted to be associated with this," said Olsen.


The appointees are divided into 12 committees including transportation, financing and venture capital, quality of life and higher education collaboration. It is co-chaired by Robert Stemple, formerly of General Motors, and Patsy Fulton, president of Oakland Community College.

Olsen is co-chairman of the Small Business Incentive Committee. He said each of the 12 committees will develop five ideas in the next year. All of the ideas will be gathered and then combined, polished or discarded before the final ideas are presented to Patterson and the county.

"One of our (committee's) ideas — one of the best so far — is to develop a physical place where people can come to get information about starting and running a small business," said Olsen.

He said that the committee found out that such a place was in operation at the Executive Building in the county complex on Telegraph Road. Now, the committee can publicize the existence of this office to the public.

Olsen said people in this area may not benefit from committees such as foreign trade, but other committees can enhance life in the township.

One committee idea is to time lights to make traffic flow smoother throughout the county. There could be lower interest loans to encourage small businesses. Also, the quality of life in more rural areas may remain the same when cities already equipped with water and sewer can court factories and big businesses with incentives.

Olsen said that he is excited about the group and his part in it.

"When I'm sitting here 20 years from now, I'll know I had a hand in the development (of our county). It's exciting," said Olsen.





When I was young, a spelling error could have ended my public writing career.

Passmore

I misspelled "bomb" when I was nine, changing the whole meaning of a story. I was crushed when the reader laughed at what was suppose to be scary.

For the next eight years I was a closet story writer. I loved to research the scenes and work out the endings in my mind, but I didn't allow anyone to read my work. I wasn't sure if anyone would like what I wrote and I didn't want to chance it.

I've since found out that most writers are the same way — the story is their baby and it is frightening to allow someone to critique it.

When I was 17, I finished a story I had worked on for a year and decided to finally let someone read

it.

I didn't want my parents to read it — they of course would tell me it was wonderful. I didn't want my friend Laura to read it — she was so deep I was afraid my story would seem childish. I needed to find an intelligent person with a good heart I could trust, who would tell me the truth if it was good and soften the blow if it wasn't.

I decided to let my friend Doreen read it. We'd been friends since elementary school — I knew she'd be honest if she liked it and compassionate if she hated it.

After I handed it over on Sunday morning I panicked. I was terrified that I had exposed my "baby" to criticism too early. I was afraid she would laugh. I was afraid I wasn't a good writer and she would point it out — destroying any hope I clung to about my "talent."

She (thankfully) gave it a good review.

I don't know where that story is today — probably buried in a box in my closet. But a letter Doreen wrote to me about my story, my talent and what it meant to her that I shared it with her that has been in my wallet since 1986.

I have read and re-read that letter many times over the past seven years. Whenever I am tempted not to allow a story to be published, when I have writer's block or when someone complains about what I wrote I take the letter out and, encouraged by her words, I go on or I take the chance.

I thought about that note a couple weeks ago when her younger sister, Danette (see I told you I'd mention you one day in a column), told me how much she enjoyed reading what I wrote. Her two sentences of praise turned my dreary little spirit around that day just as her sister's letter urged me to share what I have to say with others through my writing.

'If It Fitz ...'

Life of pain deserves dignity of choice

It was exactly one year ago that I first wrote about the sixtysomething suburban Detroit grandmother who has the same unbearably painful pelvic ailment that forced one of Jack Kevorkian's patients to seek assisted suicide. Time for an update.

She asked that I withhold her name, which would be widely recognized because she is publicly active in several social causes unrelated to her illness. Last week, she described her physical condition:

"I have lived with pain for over 16 years. My condition is chronic, incurable and devastating. But I love my family and do not want to leave them yet. I am hoping for a miracle, although I have undergone 10 surgeries with poor results. I don't know how much longer I can go on.

"I would like to know that, if the time comes when I can stand no more, I could have help in leaving this life... I would never ask anyone in my family or any of my good friends to help me. It would be too painful for them and I would not want to put them in legal jeopardy. For now, I am holding on as hard as I can and praying.

Praying?

So how does she respond to such pray-to-God proponents as syndicated columnist Cal Thomas, who recently wrote: "When government begins deciding who is fit to live and who deserves to die, we are all potential victims. But this is the inevitable outcome when society moves from a view that all human life is sacred to one that considers the right to life a privilege granted by government, and not something endowed by life's Creator."

The pain-wracked grandmother answered Thomas: "In no proposed law is it left to 'government' to make the decision. Those of us in favor of assisted suicide would not support such a law. A properly written law would involve choices and decisions made by the patient, at least two

doctors, and a psychiatrist.

"While we do not want 'big brother' making life and death decisions for us, neither do we want people who use the name of God to tell us we must suffer in agony when we would choose death... The God I pray to is loving and caring. I believe He gave me life, but I also believe He

gave me the choice of what to do with that life."

Another syndicated columnist, Debra Saunders, wrote about Kevorkian: "Maybe his so-called patients would change their minds, given a few extra days."

The woman who may someday choose assisted suicide responded: "None of his patients got up one morning and, on the spur of the moment, decided to give Dr. Kevorkian a call. All of them fought the good fight and reluctantly, but with determination, chose to end their own suffering, with Dr. Kevorkian's help. All of them would have preferred life, if that life had not been one of constant pain. A few extra days would not have changed anything."

A year ago, the suburban grandmother wasn't sure how she felt about "Dr. Death." How about now? "My feelings are more ambivalent than ever. I went

"My feelings are more ambivalent than ever. I went from thinking he was great to despair about his attitude and methods. I just wish people could hear him speak when he is not being manipulated by his lawyers or badgered by the media. He is so articulate and compelling on the subject. Even his ideas on medical experimentation on cadavers and prison inmates come across as logical and not, as has been reported, ghoulish... There is more to the man than rusty vans, needles and gas canisters."

Finally, it should be noted that the suburban grandmother speaks not only from her own unending pain, but from having watched people she loved die in agony:

"I watched my mother and mother-in-law die that way. Both of them begged for help. My husband and I had to stand by and just let it happen. If I had had the opportunity and the means, I would have given them the release they begged for, and I would not have considered it

"It would have been the last loving thing I could have done for them."

#### Seller's now must let buyers know

A Michigan law known as the seller's disclosure law went into effect Jan. 8, and requires home sellers to furnish potential buyers with property condition disclosures that cover everything from the insulation to the kitchen sink.

Officially Act 92 of the Public Acts of 1993, the law requires disclosure from all sellers, whether they are working through a licensed real estate agent or selling their house on their own.

This mandatory disclosure is beneficial to both buyer and seller. By preparing for property condition disclosure, sellers are less likely to overlook a defect for which they may later be held liable. This procedure also serves as a guide for buyers who can immediately address any concerns about the condition of the property.

# Medicare reminder: you have until March

"If you don't have Part B of Medicare and you want it, you have from now until the end of March to sign up." That reminder comes from Robert Clevenger, Social Security manager in Pontiac.

Every year, the government offers a threemonth enrollment period - from January 1 to March 31 - during which people who turned down or previously dropped the Part B coverage can sign up for it.

"If you enroll during this period, your coverage will begin July 1, 1994," Clevenger said, "and you'll probably pay a slightly higher monthly premium."

The current cost for Part B coverage is \$41.10 per month, but most delayed enrollees pay a 10 percent surcharge for each year they could have been


enrolled but weren't.

Part B coverage, also called "medical insurance," helps pay for doctors care, outpatient hospital visits, and other medical services.

People are offered the option of signing up for Part B at the same time they are automatically enrolled in Medicare's Part A program. Part A helps pay for inpatient hospital care and certain other services.

Clevenger said people who want to sign up for Part B should call the Pontiac Social Security office or call Social Security's toll-free number: 1-800-772-1213.





Hoping to spread the wealth, the Clarkston wrestling team split its roster last weekend so it could participate in two tournaments.

The result was a second-place trophy at the South Lyon Invitational and a sixth-place finish at the Wildcat Invitational, Oxford.

In South Lyon, the Wolves amassed 179 1/2 teampoints, but fell just short of tournament champ Fowlerville, who finished with 187 1/2 points. Fowlerville is presently the second ranked squad in Class B.

The host Lions took third with 174 points at the 14-team tournament.

CHS Coach Mike DeGain said he was proud of his team's effort.

"I thought everyone wrestled pretty well," he said. "It was one of our best showings of the season."

In all, nine wrestlers brought home medals from this meet. # Insurance costs boosted by poor rating

to help determine premium rates for homeowners and businesses, said Hal Bannasch, owner of Total Insurance Services.

Independence Township currently holds an eight or a nine fire class rating. ISO made that designation in the early 1980s.

When ISO publishes the new report, which is expected by the end of March, it should show an improvement in the rating, Wilson said.

"Those in Independence where their property is within 1,000 feet of a fire hydrant and within five road miles of a fire station is an eight," said ISO assistant manager Harry Westhaus. "Those that are over 1,000 feet from a fire hydrant and over five road miles from a fire station is a nine."

However, the city of Clarkston will not receive a change in its rating, Westhaus said.

"Clarkston has not changed its water supply," he said. "Its class will stay the same unless something changes."

For some Main Street residents, that could change once the township completes the water main. Once it is completed, Westhaus said thesection of Clarkston could be reviewed. The fire chief said the township's improved water supply is the key to a reduced number.

"Water is number one. It will be the factor that will move you up or down the scale," Wilson said.

ISO scrutinizes a township's whole water system, including its method of delivery and storage system. It evaluates the fire department's equipment, its use of manpower and training of firefighters.

It reviews methods of alarm systems. ISO alsochecks how long it takes the department to respond to a fire. Frequency of evaluations are determined by population.

Communities with a population of under 25,000 can request such a review once every 25 years," Westhaus said. "Those communities that exceed 25,000 can have a review every 10 years."

But that doesn't mean if a community improves its water system it has to wait for years to be reviewed. "If in the interim, the community can indicate and demonstrate sufficient improvement, we can make adjustments," Westhaus said.

Wilson said he intends to call ISO back once the Sashabaw and Main Street water mains are completed.

He also plans to have it come back to prove pumping capabilities."

"We must show that we can pump 250 gallons of water per minute for 2 hours with out losing water," Wilson said.

The fire chief is optimistic about seeing a drop in the fire class numbers.

"I'm hoping that those with fire hydrants within a 1,000 feet will see their class go from eight or nines to four or fives. I wish there were more hydrants," Wilson said.

"If we had hydrants at the North end, the South end and the East and West end of town, and we reach a 1,000 feet with our hoses, those rating ideally would go down."

He also hopes for more changes within the city limits.

"I wish the village would continue the water main to the stop light in town, he said. "It would be a huge savings for the commercial district."

The 'dry' hydrants on the Mill Pond offer some credit to some but not all insurance companies, according to Wilson.

Poolmart owner Pete Gannon said he hopes his rates go down. As a businessman in the Clarkston area for 15 years, Gannon said something should have been done sooner.

"My rate is the highest it can get now. My insurance bill is in the thousands." he said. "Why should I pay so much when my building is brick, I installed sprinkler systems and I have fire hydrants near by and I'm rated a nine."

Areas such as Clarkston Gardens, Chapleview View, Wood Glen, Hill View, Chestnut Hill Farms and other "territories" have carried an eight for years because they are within 1,000 feet of a Waterford Township hydrant, while the majority of the township carries a nine, according to Bannasch.

"As soon as we have the new numbers, our subscribers will benefit and see a reduction," Bannasch said.

However, he doesn't expect the numbers to drop that much, but some could see a big difference in premium rates.



# Retired priest wins maritime award


When young priests come to the Rev. Edward Dowling, S.J. for advice he tells them "Have a hobby, it will be a blessing."

Father Dowling's hobby of Great Lake shipping has spanned nearly 80 years and gamered him the American Merchant Marine Museum's 1993 Nathaniel Bowditch Maritime Scholar Award.


The Bowditch Award is given to an individual judged to have made a major contribution to the field of maritime scholarship. Father Dowling is the first scholar of the Great Lakes to receive this award.

"I knew nothing about it (the award). It was suppose to be a surprise. It is very gratifying," he said. Father Dowling, 87, began his love affair shipping when he was about seven-years-old. He said he was given a toy boat on wheels and then asked to see the big boats in Lake Michigan. He and his family lived in Chicago and his father, who also liked boats, was happy to take his son.

Father Dowling is suppose to have the largest personal collection of Great Lakes shipping memorabilia. It is now housed in a room in the University of Detroit library. He owns between 35 and 50 research books — most of them rare, has 120 custom made

albums filled with 8-by-10 photos, numerous charts, navigation routes and record sheets for between 2,00 and 3,000 ships.

He has also utilized his artistic ability and has

painted about 1,000 ships, usually pre-1900 models, which are shown in Chicago and Detroit. Some of his art work is displayed at Colombiere Center in Springfield Township where he now lives.

Father Dowling entered the priesthood in 1930 and became a Jesuit. He said he studied to teach classical languages, but just before completing his studies World War II began and he was assigned to teach engineering at the University of Detroit.

He said he was told he would teach the subject

only through the war years, but was there for 51 years. From 1942 to 1973 he taught full-time and for the past 20 years he was an archivist and a substitute at the school. He moved to Colombiere in July 1993.

Father Dowling has written numerous articles on shippings and is an honorary member of many maritime history organization. He was one of the original organizers of the Maritime History Society of Detroit which began in 1945.

He accepted the Bowditch Award at Colombi-



(2) Has been convicted within the past 10 years of a felony offense under state law or any criminal offense under federal law and/or remains on probation or parole with respect to any such

(3) Has ever had a Certificate of Registration revoked, following issuance under this Chapter of the Ordinance Code. Section 2 of Ordinance

All other regulations in the Ordinance Code shall remain in effect, amended only as provided above. Section 3 of Ordinance

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect immediately upon publication.


The men did their homework before opening their store. They attended shows and visited similar stores around the country to get ideas on what merchandise is available for trucks, jeeps and vans.


