SPI Tri-District Football Team

Statistics are difficult to judge a player by, except when it comes to a few Clarkston football players who made the first-ever SPI Tri-District football 1st team.

With the numbers some Wolves posted, their inclusion on the first team is warranted. That fact, coupled with the team's 9-2 record, helped Clarkston land 10 of the 22 spots.

Oxford had nine players on the first team and Lake Orion ended up with five.

The entire Tri-District first team offensive and defensive selections are:

OFFENSE

Mike Hendrix, Oxford, Sr., quarterback: In his first year as a varsity starter behind center, this 5-foot-8, 165-pound senior led the Wildcats to their sixth straight Flint Metro League championship.

In an offense geared around the option, Hendrix's passing game was more than enough to keep opposing defenses honest, opening up the running game.

He also proved to be an elusive runner, gaining 4.5 yards per rush over the season. A starting defensive back a year ago, Hendrix also had to fill in late this season on defense.

Stats: 60-of-94 passing, 63.8 percent completion rate, for 759 yards and four touchdowns. He rushed for 264 yards on 59 carries and scored five rushing touchdowns.

Jason Graves, Clarkston, Sr., running back: Each. game Graves played he always seemed to do something more spectacular. Whether it was running, kicking field goals, returning kickoffs, and punts, kicking extra points or making a key defensive play, Graves was the weapon of choice for the Wolves.

He never left the field, but what made him great was running the ball. After a slow start in the opener against Troy, Graves broke out. With the ability to burst through holes with speed or make his own with strength, Graves accepted the role of workhorse and always came through.

Eastern Michigan and Central Michigan universities have shown an interest in Graves, but he's not sure where he will finally decide to play football after high school.

Dennis Mahan, Lake Orion, Jr., running back: talented junior showed promise as a sophomore and really hit the limelight this season, gaining over 1,400

HOOPS: Tri-District squad features good balance between offensive, defensive players

Athletic, hard nosed and tough could best describe the five selections to SPI's Tri-District Girls Basketball First Team.

The team also has some scorers (Lake Orion's Melanie Garrard, Oxford's Megan Burns) and defensive players (Oxford's Beth Wolochevitz Clarkston's Kerry Kelly and Lake Orion's Angie Sights). One quality they all have in common is giving 110 percent on the court.

Kerry Kelly, Clarkston sr. forward. Clarkston senior forward/center Kerry Kelly doesn't have the statistics to make SPI's Tri-District First Team, but she sure has the heart.

Kelly was selected to the girls basketball first team with averages of 5.6 points and 5.7 rebounds in the Wolves' 9-13 season. But what can't be measured or recorded is the determination and heart she showed through-

Coach Larry Mahrle said she played in pain the entire season because of a knee injury. But rather than sit out, she endured each game, providing leadership and setting an example for her teammates.

She was our best defender down low and is just a tremendously likeable person," said Mahrle. "She is well respected in school and amongst the team."

And, despite being at a height disadvantage against opposing centers, Kelly could play with the best and hold

In addition to the efforts she puts out on the floor, Kelly also excels in the classroom where she carries a 3.96 grade point average.

Melanie Garrard, Lake Orion, Sr., forward: A tenacious player on the court, Garrard led the team in scoring and assists. She started playing basketball in the ninth grade and has rapidly excelled into a standout player, overcoming an ankle injury that caused her to miss part of

Garrard's offensive bag of tricks never failed to amaze coach Gary Kibby. "Melanie manufactured some shots that even surprised me," he said.

The take-no-prisoners attitude often displayed by Garrard is one of the keys to her success, according to

"She's fearless and not afraid to get hammered," Kibby said. "She's not afraid to go against anybody. She dares you to stop her, which is rare to find in a female."

Season stats: (19 games) 195 points, 10.1 per game average; 130 rebounds; 43 steals; 25 assists.

Angie Sights, Lake Orion, Sr., guard: The unquestioned leader of the Dragons this year, Sights was able to make things happen at both ends of the floor.

By jump-starting the offense or making a great defensive play, Sights always had a big impact on the game's

"Angie got us going offensively a couple times by hitting some 3-pointers," coach Gary Kibby said. "She also gets a kick out of throwing a good pass."

Sights also received the top defensive player award at $a\,University\,of\,Michigan\,basketball\,camp\,this\,past\,summer.$

"She loves the game of defense," Kibby said. "She's improved a lot at it. She had to guard a lot of smaller, quicker kids this year."

Kibby was also impressed by Sights' ability to set the tone for the squad.

"I told her she needed to be mentally tough this year, that the other kids need to see her do that," Kibby said. "She did a real good job of that this year "

Seth Crawley, Oxford, Sr., wide receiver: Crawley combined with teammate Mike Peak to give the Wildcats a potent outside threat.

He came up with numerous big catches, ran excellent patterns and was Hendrix's favorite target. He perfected the sideline route as the season progressed, showing the ability to go down low for the tough catches.

GPA: 4.0

Stats: 27 catches for 271 yards and a touchdown. Averaged 10 yards per catch and 30 yards receiving per

Jeremy Fife, Clarkston, Sr., wide receiver: Fife was valuable on both sides of the ball for the Wolves and played an important leadership role for his team.

Coach Kurt Richardson said Fife and second team pick Pat Mulligan are "the best receivers we've had together since I've been here."

Fife used his great athletic ability to get to many balls other receiver couldn't. He also had a knack for making the big catch when his team needed it the most. Of his 23 receptions, 17 were for first downs.

In addition to his skills on offense, Fife also called

the defensive signals from his defensive backfield spot. Besides being a tough hitter he also matched up one-onone against the opposing team's best receiver.

rating centers.

'I look at how many times, when an opponent puts a noseguard over our center, do we have to make an adjustment to give him help," Burrell said. "We only had to do it once all season with Jim. He could handle other kids all by himself. He was pretty consistent all year."

GPA: 3.03 Dion White and Brett Rebb, Clarkston, Srs., offensive linemen. White and Rebb anchored a solid line — nicknamed the "Hogs" — that helped open holes for Graves all season. Though undersized for their positions at 175 and 185 pounds, respectively, they used positioning and fundamentals to control their opponents. Lake Orion Football

Coach Rich Burrell put Lake Orion back on the map, at least in football terms, by leading the team to a 7-3 record and the team's first playoff berth since 1990.

The Dragons also captured the OAA Division II championship with a 5-0 record and reeled off seven consecutive victories to start the season.

Tough losses to Troy and Clarskton to end the regular season, and a 31-0 loss to Midland in the playoffs, brought an unwanted end to a memorable season.

The team was rated as high as #4 in the state in Class A during the 1994 campaign, and reeled off some impressive road victories at Southfield, Birmingham Seaholm and Waterford Mott.

Clarkston Football

Clarkston's 1994 football team finished its season at 9-2, advancing to the regional finals in Class AA where the Wolves lost 14-0 to Troy, the eventual state champion.

The Wolves were over-achievers, according to their coach, Kurt Richardson (49-25 in eight seasons).

They not only ended with a loss to Troy, but began that way also. They battled back from that opening-game loss with a determined senior-led team and won nine straight games, advancing to the playoffs for the first time since 1977.

The Wolves also finished 4-1 in the new Oakland Activities Association Division I, second to Troy's 5-0

Oxford Football

The 1994 Oxford Wildcat football team finished its regular season in a customary spot: the regional finals.

The Wildcats lost in the regional final to Marine City, after posting an 8-1 regular season and a firstround win over Mt Clemens.

The Wildcats struggled at times, but hung for wins against Mt Morris, LakeVille and Lapeer West and won their sixth straight Flint Metro League championship.

They lost their regular season finale to Farmington Hills Harrison, their first regular season loss since 1989. Harrison went on to win the Class A state title.

Clarkston seniors showed all season.

GPAs: White, 2.5; Rebb, 2.7.

Dave Kukla and Scott Johnson, Oxford, Srs., offensive line: The Wildcats gained nearly 210 yards rushing per game over the regular season, and these guys were big reasons why.

Kukla, the biggest offensive lineman (6-foot-2, 210 pounds) on the squad, played every down for Oxford this year. "And we ran right off his butt," Oxford coach Bud Rowley said.

Kukla also starred on defense for the Wildcats, meaning he was on the field for virtually every down for 11 games. Johnson played offense only, but was probably Oxford's best lineman at the end of the season. Both were first-team all Flint Metro League selections.

GPAs: Kukla, 2.3; Johnson, 2.6

Matt Green, Oxford, Soph., kicker: The youngster, in his first varsity season, produced a kicking game the Wildcats hadn't had in several years.

Green's field goal in the season opener at Mt Morris provided the winning margin, and he kicked three against LakeVille in a 16-7 Homecoming win.

A two-sport star, Green was also all-state as a soccer player.

GPA: 3.0

Stats: Made 6-of-8 field goals (75 percent) and 23 of 25 extra-point attempts.

DEFENSE

Charles Nolen, Clarkston, Sr., defensive line: The biggest lineman among a tough, gritty Wolves defensive line isn't so big at 215 pounds.

But just like his teammates, Nolen wreaked havoc everywhere on the field with a fierce determination. His eight tackles for losses tied with three others for top honors

In addition, Nolen was third on the team in tackles. **GPA: 2.7**

Stats: 32 solo tackles, 19 assists, 8 tackles for losses, 1 fumble recovery.

Mark Davis and Erik McKay, Lake Orion, Srs., defensive line: Davis' home was in the trenches this season, dominating both sides of the line of scrimmage. He is also a second-team selection on the offensive line.

Davis had the key position in coach Rich Burrell's defense, covering the strong side gap. Opponents had little success against the senior, as measured by his 101 tackle points this year.

'His size definitely helped him, but he moves real well for a big guy," Burrell said. "His agility has helped him be very successful. He also played both ways, which is tough. Mark's conditioning allowed him to do it."

Another two-way star for the Dragons, McKay was

also an outstanding tight end. His 10 sacks were a teamhigh for the season.

"He worked real hard in the off season to get a lot stronger," coach Rich Burrell said. "He was very well conditioned, so he could play both ways. His quickness was definitely a big factor in his effectiveness at defensive

McKay also showed great hands for a big guy by hauling in 14 catches for the year, most of them when the game was on the line.

GPA: Davis, 3.08; McKay, 3.3

Stats: Davis: 40 solo tackles, 21 assists, three tackles for loss, six sacks; one blocked kick; McKay: 28 solo tackles, 13 assists, one tackle for loss, 10 sacks; one fumble recovery; 14 receptions, 203 yards, one TD; one two-point conversion.

Mike Dwyer, Oxford, Sr., defensive lineman: At 5-foot-10 and 210 pounds, Dwyer manned the nose guard position for Oxford's defense with a vengeance.

The Wildcats allowed just 993 yards rushing in nine games, and more than 300 of that came in the season finale against Farmington Hills Harrison. That's less than 100 yards per game during league play.

Dwyer was a big part of that. He was second on the team in tackle points with 105 (Oxford awards two for a solo, one for an assist), despite missing the last several games with an ankle injury.

GPA: 2.5

Stats: 10 solo tackles, 85 assists, 3 tackles for loss and two fumble recoveries.

Tim Luebbert, Lake Orion, Sr., linebacker: It was a quick climb up the ladder for Luebbert, who has only played football for two seasons. He had the highest amount of tackle points on the team this season.

A good attitude helped make Luebbert into a dominating player. Coach Rich Burrell credits Luebbert's

teamwork philosophy.

"Tim is very coachable and very team-oriented," Burrell said, "He's done outstanding for only playing football for two years. He's quick, aggressive and smart. He also had a good work ethic and did whatever we said."

GPA: 3.77

Stats: 47 solo tackles, 31 assists, one tackle for loss; one interception; one reception, 25 yards.

Jason Bailey, Oxford, Jr., linebacker: Despite a mid-season mini-slump, Bailey had one of Oxford's standout seasons.

He stepped in when starting linebacker Dan Leach went down with an injury and had a solid season. Bailey had a key interception in an overtime win over Lapeer West that clinched the Flint Metro League title for the Wildcats.

GPA: 3.8

Stats: 12 solo tackles, 64 assists for 88 tackle points, plus the interception.

Chad Chandler, Clarkston, Sr., linebacker: "A tough kid. Not big, but real intense," said coach Kurt Richardson.

At 170 pounds, Chandler played outside linebacker for the Wolves, but his fundamentals, hard hitting and desire made up for any size disadvantage. Richardson said Chandler always expected to make the play and demanded the best from himself.

GPA: 3.1.

Stats: 28 solo tackles, 9 assists, 3 tackles for losses, 2 fumbles recovered.

Dennis Wisser, Clarkston, Sr., defensive back: Wisser played the "Monster" position on defense for the Wolves, meaning he was expected to be in just about every



Heritage Hunt II

Two new books that will be of interest to those with Connecticut ancestry have come to our attention and may help solve some problems unique to those needing "D.A.R." proof of family connections.

"Apprentices of Connecticut 1637-1900" provides reference to hundreds of surnames of those "bound" to service to Connecticut families. The second book, "Connecticut Loyalists," features lists of those deposed of land they were holding in Connecticut at the time of the Revolutionary War.

Here again, with alphabetized indices, one can quickly check for your choice of missing kin.

Pick a fresh-cut tree and keep it fresh

Want a fresh tree for Christmas? Be prepared to bend a few needles.

Bending an evergreen's needles is one way to check for freshness, says Mel Koelling, Extension forestry specialist at Michigan State University. If the needles on an already-cut tree spring back to their original shape, the tree is fresh. If needles snap or stay bent out of shape, the tree is probably dry.

Another way to check for a fresh tree is to bump the base of the tree on the ground. A shower of green needles around your feet means the tree is dry.

When you get your cut tree home, remove a 1/2-inch slice off the base of the trunk and immediately place the tree in a tree stand with a container for water.

"Making a fresh cut across the bottom removes old sap and dirt that are blocking the tree's ability to take up water," Koelling explains. "Evergreens kept indoors will lose a lot of water through their foliage. If they can't take up water to replace it, they dry out quickly and soon pose a fire hazard."

Placing your tree in the coolest possible place, away from radiators, hot air registers, hot lights, south-facing windows and appliances that give off heat will help slow the drying process and keep it

fresh longer.

It is nearly impossible to ignite a fresh tree, Koelling notes, but a dry evergreen will flash into flame in an instant. Buying a fresh tree and keeping it fresh is critical to preventing a holiday tragedy.

Oakland Audubon schedules Christmas bird count

The Oakland Audubon Society Christmas Bird Count (CBC) will take place this year on Saturday, Dec. 17. This will be one of more than 1,600 similar counts across the Western Hemisphere designed to help survey wintering birds. Bird counts will be taken from Hawaii to Labrador, and from Alaska to Brazil, during the period from Dec. 17 to Jan. 2.

This year marks the 95th anniversary of the original CBC, which was held on Christmas Day in 1900 by groups in 25 locations, mostly around major northwestern U.S. cities. Since then, this annual

event has grown from its original 25 counts to over 1,600 and the total participants from 27 to well over 42,000. It will be the 37th anniversary for the Oakland Audubon count and participation for the club is excellent. In 1992 Oakland Audubon had 111 participants which ranked it 23rd among the 1,600 counts.

This year every Canadian province, every U.S. state, many tropical countries and numerous West Indian islands will submit their results to the National Aububon Society, the sponsor and coordinator,

which publishes the compilation reports.

The count itself is one of the biggest birding events of the year, and for Oakland Audubon, it means weeks of planning that will yield, in a single calendar day, the most complete census of birds possible in the designated area. By tradition the count area is a circle with a unique center and a 15-mile diameter which covers roughly 177 square miles. Oakland Audubon's count area is centered at

Lapeer and Indianwood Roads in northern Oakland County.

Bird counters are organized into parties, each with a leader familiar with the section of the circle assigned to the group. Within this circle, all birds sighted are identified and counted beginning at 7 a.m. and ending at 5 p.m. After the count, all parties gather for supper and a tally. Last year Oakland Audubon counted 21,537 individual birds representing 65 different species, including a first-time sighting of a Pileated Woodpecker.

New participants are welcome regardless of birding skill level. A CBC workshop is scheduled for

Saturday, Dec. 3, at the Troy Outdoor Education Center, 6685 Coolidge (north of Square Lake Road). The workshop will be held from 9 to 11 a.m. and this year includes information on topographic map use, a summary of early winter bird movements and team bird identification skills. Registration for count day is held at the workshop.







Have you seen this spud?

Tuber's tall tale continues

In the midst of the holiday season a cloud of gloom hangs over Sashabaw Middle School.

Assistant principal Mike Krystyniak says he is distraught after not being able to locate his beloved mascot — a battered Mr. Potato Head who has been his friend for years. The spud was a birthday present from his two children.

"I'm in denial," said Krystyniak last Wednesday. He is presently seeing Dr. Jibba-Jabba, a stuffed psychiatrist who doesn't do much for him except spew psycho babble when shaken. However, Krystyniak says the doctor may soon write him a prescription for his depression.

Head's disappearance from Krystyniak's desk Oct. 6 during parent-teacher conferences threw the school into an uproar.

"It was a day of infamy," SMS principal Jean Lang said Wednesday.

Soon after, Krystyniak received "a traditional kidnap note" compiled from newsprint. It was signed with the sole name of "Clinton." The note said not to contact police, but the school has acquired the services of Det. Spud, a local potato police officer who is trying to get to the root of the problem.

Over the past few weeks, Head has been spudded in a variety of locations and all eyes are upon the case. The school's bulletin board is covered with pictures of the traveling tuber from Las Vegas to Switzerland. One picture shows a plateful of mashed potatoes with eyes, nose and mouth which reads:

"I hope you realize that we are serious about you not calling the police. If you do, this is what Mr. Potato Head will look like."

Another shows Head up to his neck (?) in a Michigan mug with a tiny U of M stocking cap upon his head. It says:

"Please save me. They are making me watch and cheer for U of M."

Others who have been implicated are eighthgrade math teacher Jeff Peariso, The Tossed Salad Group, Principal Lang and eighth-grader Bryon Beutler, who was seen rolling away from the assistant principal's office with Head on the tray of his wheelchair.


Krystyniak feels the spudnapper may be Peariso.
"Mr. Peariso certainly seems to be a prime suspect because of the heavy activity around his

room. Several of my informants have told me he's heavily involved," Krystyniak said.

Peariso is suspected for several reasons, including Lang's accusation that "He's cashing in on the pins" he has designed which feature Head in a variety of seasonal costumes. They have been sold to help fund "Paws With a Cause," an organization that trains dogs for the handicapped and blind. And because he's heading the eighth-grade trip to Washington which takes place in May, Lang and Krystyniak feel the whole potato napping may be a set-up.



"If he ends up in high political office we'll know something's up," Lang said.

But Peariso was quick to defend himself and feels the two administrators' accusations are half-baked.

"I just want to help out. I'm the middleman between the detective and the school," he said.

Lang is also suspected because Head turned up inher office a few weeks ago bound and gagged. After Krystyniak rescued him Head was gone again.

When asked about this, Lang hashed up.

Meanwhile, the search for the spud continues as Head's photo is displayed upon four-ounce cartons of school milk and missing-person mail flyers. Head is described as brown, blue-eyed, with the distinguishing birthmark characteristic of "a hole in the top of his head."

Updated announcements of current spud spottings are occasionally made over the school's PA system.



But recent messages have indicated Head is perhaps the only one who hasn't gotten himself into as stew.

"He went to Acapulco for Thanksgiving and is going to Aruba for Christmas," Peariso said.

Meanwhile, the school waits, hoping to find Head before it's too late and he disappears into a Ruffles bag. But his adventures might nip that in the spud.

"The story has a life of its own," Lang said.
