## Owner of unfinished Main St. house receives ultimatum

What some have considered a "Nightmare on Main St." appears to have been improved — but not completed.

At the Independence Township Board of Trustees July 1 meeting members voted 7-0 to have township attorney Gerry Fisher draft an document, ordering township resident Bob Martin to complete exterior construction of his residence on Main St. within 30 days — or they will serve him with a court order. Fisher expected the process to be "very expeditious."

According to township building director Bev McElmeel, Martin, who owns the first township parcel on the east side of Main St. just south of Waldon and the village, has violated two township ordinances — the noxious weed ordinance, because he has not kept lawn growth to under 12 inches, and the property maintenance ordinance, because he has not done any work on the exterior of his building for over a year.

"If he doesn't (complete the exterior), then we're going to seek relief in the courts. Then we hope the judge will allow us to enter the property and complete the exterior," McElmeel said.

McElmeel said Martin began construction of his building in 1992. Since then there have been numerous attempts to have him comply with various ordinances,

she said. He has been cited several times by the building department, including being presented with hand-delivered orders.

A couple of years ago Martin sued the township, asserting it had no right to tell him how to use his property. That suit was resolved in the township's favor, McElmeel said.

McElmeel said there have been some attempts to comply. For example, last year Martin received a variance from the township's zoning board of appeals when he needed setback approval for a shed. That issue was "resolved," McElmeel said.

But she has continued to receive complaints from residents who call the site an eyesore. All the township is asking is to "get the exterior done so people don't have to look at it. I think that's only fair to the community," McElmeel said. She keeps a thick file so residents will see and understand all the correspondence between the building department and Martin, she said.

Recently she passed the construction site and noticed more siding had been added. McElmeel said if Martin completes the siding to his building and addition, she will withdraw the complaint.

A good part of the problem has been Martin's lack of communication, McElmeel said. She indicated the township's willingness to work with him if he has a hardship problem.

## Republic Bank comes downtown

A new bank is coming to downtown Clarkston. With NBD Bank's Main Street branch scheduled to close in September, Republic Bank has decided to take advantage of a vacant storefront across the street from NBD and open a limited-service bank.

David Stickel, president of Republic Bank, a Flint-based institution, appeared before the city of Clarkston's planning commission and city council Monday night for site-plan approval. (The two boards were meeting in a special joint session.) He said he had been contacted by mayor Sharron Catalo about the demise of banking in the village.

"Sharron suggested we could use a bank in Clarkston and we thought that was a good idea," Stickel said. "We've had our eyes on the Clarkston market for years."

Though NBD is not giving its presence in the Clarkston area up entirely (a branch will remain on Dixie at Maybee), many downtowners, especially business people, have mourned the closing of the downtown branch. Petitions were even sent to the bank's parent company, to no avail.

Republic Bank will locate a branch in the 27 S. Main St. site formerly occupied by the Milieu store. According to Stickel, its main business will be mortgage loans, although other banking services will be available to its customers.

"It'll be more what is popularized as private banking or personal banking. We think it'll be a nice addition . . . We hope to drum up a lot of business for shoppers for the downtown businesses."

The site plan was unanimously approved by the planning commission, subject to several items being resolved, including lighting and signage being added to the plan.

## Storm skips over Independence

The severe storms that hopscotched around the metro Detroit area July 2 ignored the Clarkston area when it came to severe damage.

The Independence Township Fire Department reported that no calls regarding serious damage, injuries, trees or wires down were reported. The department did come to the aid of Groveland Township, however.

"We called everybody in so there would be coverage in all our stations and sent everybody we could over there to help," said Peggy North, secretary to fire chief Gar Wilson. Groveland also received assistance from other departments, including Ann Arbor and Pontiac, she said.

In Springfield Township, one person was killed when a tornado hit a mobile home park. A gas station was reported flattened in Holly.

On Monday, Governor John Engler declared Oakland, Macomb and Genesee counties a state of disaster.

### New officers named for board of education

New officers were elected July 1 at the annual organizational meeting of the Clarkston board of education.

Karen Foyteck is the new president of the board. Mary Ellen McLean is vice president; Sheila Hughes is secretary; Kurt Shanks continues as treasurer.

In addition, two new trustees were sworn in. Rick Crigger and Ron Sullivan were elected in June. In other organizational matters, the board will continue to meet on the second Monday of each month except in April, when it will meet on April 20. No changes were made in the level of compensation for board members (\$30 per meeting up to 24 times a year).

The board also set a special meeting for Monday, July 14 at 5 p.m. regarding the sale of the bonds approved by the voters in June.

### Patterson sends new well code proposal to county commission

Oakland County Executive L. Brooks Patterson has sent yet another proposal for a county well code to the Board of Commissioners.

The latest proposal, according to a press release from Patterson's office, contains provisions allowing all new and extensively repaired wells to be inspected to ensure they meet state standards. The inspection would include water testing.

The release does not address the issue of existing wells that have never been inspected.

A dispute between Patterson and the commissioners arose after information surfaced that some Oakland County wells contain unsafe levels of naturally occurring arsenic. The commissioners voted to have the county issue a map showing areas of suspected contamination so homeowners would know they should get their wells tested. Patterson refused to implement the program, even after his veto of the legislation was overridden.

## 'Caught in the crossfire'

### U.S. Marine shares his experiences in Congo's Brazzaville

A 1994 Clarkston High School graduate has been a real G.I. Joe. But all the glamour young men think of turned into harsh reality for U.S. Marine Corps Lance Corporal Robert Reichner, who was recently evacuated from the U.S. Embassy during civil war tensions in Brazzaville, the Republic of Congo.

According to recent reports, French troops began pulling out of the republic June 16 after a bitter clash between forces of President Pascal Lissouba and those of his rival, Gen. Denis Sassou-Nguesso, began escalating. Tensions have increased, sources say, because both are candidates in the July presidential election. According to the reports, fighting broke out in early June.

The situation has been an eye-opener and "a growing-up experience" for Reichner who was in back home in Clarkston last week. He was expected to leave for Washington D.C. on July 6, awaiting reassignment to a new post.

His sojourn in the Marine Corps began while he was a CHS senior. Like many, he was lured by an enlistment officer. It was easy to be hooked, says the 21-year-old, who today looks like your typical boy-next-door with his deep-set blue eyes, sprinkling of

freckles, infectious grin and short blonde do — although he says he "needs a haircut."

But there's definitely something different. A beyond-the-years maturity in those eyes. A new wisdom, perhaps.

Reichner said he has pondered the possibility since tenth grade when he figured there were "new vehicles crewman," who fixed radios and dealt with other mechanical situations at Camp Pendleton, California. Reichner received orders to be a Marine security guard, assigned to special duty with diplomatic security services. It was something he had applied for — and dreamed of.

"Marines are the only ones who guard embassies," he said. Soon he was assigned to the American

experiences outside of Clarkston ... It was something different. I didn't want to be like everybody else. I didn't feel mature enough, for one thing. I wanted to serve my country with honor. I didn't want to look back and see myself with a beer every Friday, waking up for (college) exams."

He'd always been interested in world affairs and loved subjects like social studies, geography and current events while in high school. So when he started his basic training in Paris Island, South Carolina, he felt he'd made the right decision.

After working briefly as an "amphibious assault Embassy in Brazzaville. Reichner says civil war actually began May 2.

"Three days after I was there, there was sporadic shooting throughout the city. On June 5, almost a month to the day, that's when the fighting broke out."

But it was "business as usual," he added. Reichner continued to guard the embassy's interior, explaining guards are not allowed to guard the outside. On June 8 there was a "big battle" near the embassy, he said, in which rounds and rounds of ammunition were fired. "We got caught in the crossfire ...

"I saw tanks roll by daily, armored personnel carriers, government soldiers. The situation was really becoming unstable there. From the eighth, we were locked in the embassy for 15 days in 'safe haven,' similar to a fallout shelter, he explained, relying on

rations and water.

Though one of his jobs was to console Peace Corps volunteers who were ordered to the shelter, "my knees were buckling," not just from fear, "but from the impact, the concussion of all those rounds hitting ... I saw the fire from machine guns. Trees down. Shredded. Branches flying ..."

The embassy eventually became blocked, Reichner said, with tree debris, and embassy windows were shattered.

Reichner admitted his parents, who were on vacation, "didn't know this was happening." When they found out, he called them via satellite to let them know he was "OK."

Finally, the embassy received orders to evacuate. U.S. Ambassador to the Congo Aubrey Hooks told them they had run out of food, run out of water, but "when we run out of power, we've got five days."

On the way to the airport, Reichner said he saw dead bodies everywhere. "The city was in rubble in places. Kids were running around with (weapons) and helmets too big for their heads."

Though devastated by the ruin, Reichner said he was "kind of sad I was leaving so soon. I didn't get to stay there that long. I enjoyed the experience of Africa — but I'd never buy a ticket to this place."

Presently he's awaiting his reassignment as an embassy guard. "I'd rather go to Europe now, Norway ... I just like that country."

The whole experience has definitely changed his way of thinking, as well as his "attitude." Pointing to the upcoming Fourth of July parade in Clarkston last week, Reichner admitted that, as "a kid" he'd think all the war veterans were "just a bunch of old men in tacky suits. But now I know they're not. They're up there for a reason."

While on leave — twice because of his assigned leave several weeks ago, as well as the evacuation — Reichner's done the usual things. He's visited his old CHS buddies, for example. But some things bother him. "A lot of my friends don't even know what went on," he muses. "They knew what happened in Zaire. We helped them evacuate there too."

But, he concedes, that's because he's been there, done that. One thing's for sure, he'll stay in the Marines. "The pay's good and there's a future... It's a good feeling defending and serving my country." He now lives by the U.S. Marine Corps slogan, "In every clime and place." More than ever, Reichner feels it's his duty to protect his fellow Americans.

And, he sighs, "It's good to see the American flag over U.S. soil, not Congolese soil. It's just good to see that flag."

Martin was contacted prior to the board meeting, informing him there would be a public hearing on his behalf July 1. He never appeared nor "requested adjournment of this date," township supervisor Dale Stuart told the board that night. McElmeel said the gesture was made so Martin "would have the opportunity to explain" his actions.

Several board members expressed their frustration, including trustee Larry Rosso, who said the problem has caused the township "constant consternation.

It's not the first time we've had a clamp-down." Rosso cited Martin's failure to "keep promises" and pointed to his negative "track record."

Martin did not call The Clarkston News after attempts were made to contact him.

### In other board action:

● The board unanimously approved a motion to waive the sound ordinance for the ninth annual Meadow Brook Historic Races at Waterford Hill Race Track August 1-3.

● The first reading for the Wireless Communication Facilities township zoning ordinance amendment was approved unanimously.

● The board approved a motion to accept a bid for a snow removal contract for Thendara Park subdivision.

● The board unanimously approved a motion to reclassify Department of Public Works maintenance person Chris Turk to the new position of DPW senior maintenance person. Turks' salary will be boosted from \$14.02 to \$15.11 per hour.

# White Lake project dies after trustee changes vote

White Lake isn't a long and winding road, but DDA discussions have seemed like one.

At the July 1 Independence Township Board of Trustees meeting, members, as well as the audience, got a big surprise when it was announced that trustee Larry Rosso wanted to change his vote supporting an extension of the Downtown Development Authority on June 17.

After several weeks of discussion, the board approved 4-3 that night to extend the DDA's tax-collecting purposes for another three years. The extension meant the township would have been able to capture \$1.4 million in tax revenues from Oakland Community College, Oakland County and Independence Township.

Though not included in the motion made by trustee Dan Travis, most board members understood the approved extension meant funds would be used to complete a three-lane, road-widening project on White Lake Rd.

Currently, White Lake is being widened from Mustang to Andersonville Rd. with federal funds, although the township has a 10-percent funding commitment, said township supervisor Dale Stuart. Every penny remaining in the DDA's \$400,000 fund balance will be used for that purpose, he said.

The DDA extension would complete the road-widening, from Mustang to just west of Dixie Highway.

Although no more funds may now be captured with the turn of events, the DDA still exists. It would take board action to dissolve it, Stuart said.

Extending the DDA has been a highly controver-

sial topic among township board members, who have pondered other projects along the White Lake corridor, as recommended by the DDA board. Among them have been streetlighting, maintenance and safety paths.

The main clash has centered around the fact that 55 percent of the tax revenues that can be diverted to the DDA must now be captured from the township. The DDA lost significant funding from area schools because of Proposal A.

Some board members have not wanted to see revenues diverted from township funds like library and police. Still, others have been unable to arrive at a decision. As many as "seven different opinions" have been discussed, Stuart said.

However, a pitch from Rudy Lozano, vice chairman of the Oakland County Road Commission, was apparently too tempting to resist. On June 17 Lozano said the RCO would kick in \$200,000 toward the road-widening project because it believed in the corridor's completion.

Voting for the DDA extension were clerk Joan McCrary and trustees Rosso, Dan Travis and Jeff McGee. Voting against it were treasurer Jim Wenger, trustee Neil Wallace and Stuart.

Last Tuesday Travis, who, with McCrary, has been the most avid supporter of the extension, said he found Rosso's decision to be "disturbing" and one that would set "a bad precedent" for the board. In his 20 years of township government a motion has never been rescinded, he said.

But others, including Wallace and McGee, felt Rosso had the right to reconsider. McGee — who said he understood "a vote for the DDA was a vote for the road" and stood to lose because he voted for the extension — nevertheless said "democratic" process should be followed to allow Rosso's reconsideration.

During the meeting the board voted to add the matter to the agenda, voted to rescind the motion made at the last board meeting, and finally voted not to extend the DDA for tax-capturing purposes, 4-3.

Before casting his vote, Rosso explained his position. He told the board he had misunderstood the motion June 17, thinking the vote meant the DDA would be extended but not that the money would be solely used for the road-widening project. He expected the board to target projects at a later date.

Rosso said last week he took the motion "literally. When (Travis) made the motion for a three-year extension, I thought that was supportable ... I supported the extension of the DDA, but I didn't support the road," he said. "I didn't believe that was an assumption."

Some sources, declining to be identified, said Rosso had been coerced by another board member to change his vote. Rosso denied that. According to him, a board member told him he was surprised Rosso had voted for the extension when he had argued so passionately against the road-widening project.

Realizing he'd made a mistake, Rosso called Stuart, who told him it would take a vote at the next board meeting to put the item on the agenda.

"It's a misunderstanding on my part (but) I can live with myself a lot better now," Rosso said. "I told my colleagues I would have voted that way at the first meeting." He admitted forces came "from both directions" and was told by some he'd be "humiliated" and "embarrass the township" if he changed his mind.

Rosso brushed that off. "It took more strength to do this," he said, adding that he had taken the matter very seriously. "I think if you're going to change your mind, you'd better have a damn good explanation for it."

# City master plan moves closer to adoption

Public hearing set for Aug. 4

Despite a recommendation from planners, the vacant land at the southeast corner of Main and Waldon will retain its single-family residential zoning—at least for now.

The city of Clarkston's planning commission and city council met jointly Monday night to go over final details of a proposed new master plan, and the main topic of conversation was the zoning on the corner. The owners of the land, Bob and Deanna Olsen, were in the audience. They have been denied a rezoning to commercial use for the land, where they would like to build an office building.

During the process of preparing the master plan, city planners from McKenna Associates Inc. have been working with the planning commission. When they presented their draft proposal, the vacant land in question was shown as multiple family residential.

Monday night's discussion got off quickly on the corner. Planner Lori Leland-Kirk said the decision was made to plan for multiple-family use there based on a number of things, including the city's long-standing opposition to extending the commercial downtown district.

"The idea is to concentrate density in the commer-

cial center ... put more people within walking distance of downtown," she said. "What we're trying to do is develop the streetscape on Main St., add to the downtown ... We have looked at the full range of uses of this site."

Leland-Kirk said zoning regulations allow a maximum of six units per acre in the multiple category. The land in question contains wetlands, so closer to three units would be likely, she added.

However, when members of the commission and council were polled, it was clear the vast majority wanted the parcel to remain single-family residential. A vote taken of the commission to retain that zoning passed unanimously.

Leland-Kirk said she thought the site could support single-family zoning, but she was questioned about that by Deanna Olsen.

"I thought I recalled you saying at the last meeting that single-family residential was not suitable. I wrote that down. So are you saying it is feasible for single-family residential or not?"

"I think it's feasible," Leland-Kirk responded. "I'm not sure it will get the community what it's looking for as vitality for downtown. This is my own personal opinion as a designer."

Leland-Kirk said Clarkston has about 1000 feet of commercial frontage downtown, the bare minimum by generally accepted standards for such a district to survive. In response to a question from councilman

David Savage, she said the city needs to study marketing and recruiting to get the mix of businesses it needs for a viable downtown.

"That has become obvious," she said. "You do need to focus next on the right mix of retail, how to bring it here and how to keep it. In this plan what we've done is laid the groundwork for that."

Despite Leland-Kirk's recommendations, it was apparent there is also considerable support for leaving the vacant land vacant, perhaps as a park. However, Leland-Kirk said the city would have to purchase the land to make that happen, something it failed to do when the land was on the market (it was previously owned by Independence Township). Even through the condemnation process, "You have to clearly show there was a public purpose in condemning," she said.

After the meeting, the Olsens said the proceedings had not been unexpected and they will proceed with their petition to the city's Zoning Board of Appeals for a change in the zoning.

"I didn't expect anything else," Bob Olsen said. "We're going to file with the ZBA. We feel they have an illegal moratorium (on rezonings) ... But we will definitely pursue our interests."

The planning commission set August 4 for a formal public hearing on the master plan, with adoption expected to come in September. The hearing begins at 7 p.m. at the fire hall on Citation Drive. (Park in the rear of the building and enter the door on the left marked sheriff's department.)







## In Focus

### A feel-good town

I'm not one of the world's most outgoing people. I have a hard time walking into a room full of strangers and introducing myself or starting a conversation.

But recently The Dennis and I found ourselves talking to strangers from around the country and even the world. The occasion was a vacation in Nashville during the annual ritual known to country music fans as "Fan Fair." Some 24,000 people come to town, pay \$90 each to get in and spend the week waiting in lines so they can get autographs, hugs and handshakes from their favorite country stars.

We've never been to Fan Fair but decided to go to Nashville that week anyway to take advantage of a lot of the corollary events going on around town. What we found was that in addition to hearing a lot of good music, we met a lot of nice people.

We met a 23-year-old woman from Holland who is a rabid fan of an up-and-coming band from New Jersey. A factory worker who spoke perfect English, it was at least her third trip to Fan Fair. We met outside the club where the band was going to play, and ended up crowding up against the stage with her.

At another club, another night, we met two couples from North Carolina who shared our table, and a North Carolina transplant whose son is in the music business. There you are crammed together, never having laid eyes on each other before. But once you find out you have something in common (the love of music), it's easy to carry on a conversation. Pretty soon we were offering each other food and talking about all kinds of things.

We also met two women from Grand Rapids at another event. They knew Clarkston from numerous trips to Pine Knob and before the show was over one even gave me a story idea about a Clarkston man.

The point is, everyone was united by their love affair with the music. And it's easy to see why: Country music artists are the most accessible, most appreciative of their fans of any artists I can think of. And I've been a music fan all my life—classical, rock, pop, you name it.

We attended a fan club party of one of our favorite singers. For \$15 we and 150 other of his biggest fans got a private concert in a small venue. Then, even though he'd signed autographs that entire morning at Fan Fair, he signed one for each person at the party and posed for individual photos. It took forever. When it was my turn I thanked him for throwing the party. He said "It's my pleasure to do it."

The music business has turned Nashville into a boom town that, despite its small size, now has its own hockey and football franchises, a Hard Rock Cafe and a Planet Hollywood. Even charities benefit: While we were there just about every day there was a charity event aimed at Fan Fair visitors. A bunch of money was raised for such organizations as the Red Cross. Everyone had a good time and you felt safe walking around downtown, even after midnight.

A Detroit can't help but feel a bit wistful. What can we do to bring that kind of fun and prosperity to our town. Casinos? Forget it. Bring Motown back? Well, it's a start.

## Applause for township's democratic process, but . . .

Over the past few weeks Independence Township has been considering whether or not to extend its Downtown Development Authority in order to complete capital projects in its DDA jurisdiction.

After much thoughtful wrestling, on June 17 the township's Board of Trustees approved an extension of the DDA for tax-capturing purposes for another three years.

Though we understood the extension was approved in order to generate \$1.4 million in tax revenues for the completion of a road-widening project on White Lake Rd., one township trustee misunderstood the motion, thinking the money might be targeted for other DDA-related purposes.

Trustee Larry Rosso, who voted in favor of the extension, asked for reconsideration of his earlier vote at the July 1 board meeting.

Knowing full well this change would topple the vote to the other side. Knowing full well his vote would end the DDA's Great White-Lake Hope. Knowing full well he might be embarrassed.

Instead of swallowing his right to the democratic process, Rosso came forward and bravely faced the board, admitting he misunderstood the motion. He

cared more about correcting his mistake than looking good.

Though some board members exercised their own democratic options in voting against his plea, the motion carried 4-3 to not extend the DDA.

We applaud Rosso's bravery and fellow trustee Jeff McGee's support. While McGee stuck to his guns and continued to vote for the extension, he encouraged Rosso to tap the democratic wellspring. Since the motion passed, the entire board should be applauded for following parliamentary procedure and backing Rosso's efforts.

But, when it comes to alerting all the players, we cease clapping. Both the DDA board and the Oakland County Road Commission should have been notified that the matter "might" be put on the July 1 agenda—even though township supervisor Dale Stuart said it wasn't a sure thing.

After all, isn't it just a matter of common courtesy? The fact that DDA money was to be used for the White Lake Rd. widening might have seemed cloudy to Larry Rosso. But we feel the possibility of its being discussed at the board meeting was one clear picture. EMC

According to both McCrary and Stuart, correct parliamentary procedure was followed for all motions made July 1.

When asked why members of the DDA board and Lozano were not contacted prior to the meeting, Stuart said the reconsideration wasn't a sure thing. "I had been told it MIGHT be considered as an agenda item," she said.

Some board members feel differently. Though she agrees that Rosso did the right thing to come forward, "My complaint is that no one was notified," said McCrary. "The DDA was not there to speak. Rudy Lozano was not even given the courtesy of a phone call." McCrary did not make the phone calls herself because "I didn't think this would happen," she said.

On Monday Lozano, who is also a township resident, said he was "terribly disappointed" that he was not contacted. "I just feel that was discourteous as hell ... to do a number like that," he said.

Township resident David Wagner, a former candidate for township trustee who was sitting in the audience last Tuesday, called the action "A low in township politics. I was thoroughly disgusted," he said.

Established in 1986, the DDA has enabled the

township to complete capital projects in its district — portions of White Lake Rd., M-15 and Dixie Highway. Examples of some past DDA-funded projects include both the Farmer Jack and Kroger shopping centers, Travis said.

On Monday, McGee said he stood by his opinion: "Why it was important to support the DDA's extension, though, in theory, the DDA is not a road fund." When Rosso wanted to change his vote, "I didn't think

it was appropriate to stand in his way. Though I still remain on the same side of the fence ... the original motion was defeated," he said.

The DDA board held a regular meeting Monday night in the township annex where Stuart, although not a member of that board, explained the township's action. Some board members complained of not being informed, although Stuart assured them, "It was not something we knew that was going to happen ... But there certainly was no intention to not include you."

It was evident many DDA board members were disappointed. "If they would consider any scenario to extend the DDA, then let us know. And we will go forward," said DDA chair Dick Ayers after the meeting.

### Homeowner warns of arsenic problem

With yet another attempt by our Oakland County Executive, Brooks Patterson, to prolong the implementation of the Board of Commissioner's Residential Well and Education Policy, I have been reflecting on the reason I became involved in this well policy in the first place.

I am determined to inform other homeowners of the naturally occurring arsenic and the health hazard arsenic poses in drinking water in some Oakland County wells. I will not be part of the name calling and the Who's The Boss approach to the well policy while the homeowners are the ones being hurt by not receiving the basic information they need to protect themselves and their families.

Although Patterson and the Health Department are trying to prevent the County Commissioners from allowing homeowners to know what to check their water for by the simple task of making a map showing contaminated areas, they cannot prevent me, a homeowner, from telling other homeowners what they can do right now to protect their own health and welfare.

While it is impossible to share all the information I have acquired in this one writing, I plan to break the information into segments and will continue to write to inform you. All of the information I will be giving will be the facts and I will try very hard to give the names and numbers etc. that you might need to check these facts.

The Board of Commissioners' Well Protection and Education Policy requires enforcement of current laws and complements the state of Michigan's Well Construction and Pump Installation Code. The board policy helps existing and new

homeowners in a user-friendly way. However, Patterson and the County Health Department have failed to implement the policy and favor a plan that does nothing for existing homeowners, does not let the homeowners know about contaminated drinking water in their area and would create high costs for some homeowners.

Through the hard work of the Board of Commissioners many laws and rules that have been in effect for over 15 years for residential wells are now finally being followed by the Health Department. The Board Task force put together a well education packet that is available through the county Health Department (call 858-5639). The state offers the 'Water Well Construction and Pump Installation Code Book' (517-335-9183) for free. Both are good guides for those that own or plan to own a water well.

The federal and state governments are currently involved in a \$600,000 study of arsenic that has been found in our drinking water. Some area doctors are treating patients for arsenic poisoning. If you have any questions about arsenic in your drinking water or about health effects, the state's toxic hotline number is 1-800-648-6942.

According to the Country Music Association, at 22 teen hunk Bryan White is the youngest contender ever to be nominated for Male Vocalist of the Year. He didn't clinch that title, but snagged Top New Male Vocalist at last year's Academy of Country Music Awards. Numerous other honors include a 1996 Country Radio Music Award nod for his hit "Rebecca Lynn."

His debut album, simply titled "Bryan White," reached gold just a few days before Christmas 1995 and is fast-tracking to platinum. Recently profiled in "People," White's sex appeal usually reaches a much-younger audience. In the last several months he's graced the pubescent pages of "16 Magazine," "Tiger Beat," "Teen" and "Teen All-stars."

## It's Lyme Disease season

### Prevention is the best tool, association says

It's that time of year for lawn tools, camping gear and summer clothes. And, according to the Michigan Lyme Disease Association, that means it's also prime time for exposure to lyme disease.

While researchers are working to find better diagnosis and treatment options, the association says awareness is the best protection for this tick-borne disease.

Early symptoms include any combination of the following: headache, nausea, fever, a spreading circular rash, aching joints and muscles, and fatigue. Prompt treatment with oral antibiotics can prevent later complications and expensive medication. Untreated, the body-wide infection can involve the heart, brain and literally every body function.

#### Prevention

Keeping your landscape mowed and trimmed makes it less attractive to the many insects capable of transmitting disease. However, if you must go into areas of tall vegetation, wear light-colored clothing with pants tucked into socks or boots and long-sleeved shirts buttoned at the wrists and neck. Protective head gear is also recommended. Use repellent containing

DEET on exposed skin and clothing. Follow container directions carefully.

Make checking yourself and family members for ticks part of your daily routine, especially during peak months and following events of possible exposure. If a tick is found, remove it promptly with a pair of tweezers.

Grip the mouth parts carefully and slowly pull the tick away from the skin. If mouth parts become detached, disinfect and call your physician.

The tick can be identified and cultured for lyme disease by sending it, in a clean, closed vial to Linda Purdy, 22603 Madison, St. Clair Shores, MI 48081. Include a blade of grass and put a pin hole in the cap to avoid suffocation, the association says.

The Michigan Lyme Disease Association is a non-profit organization comprised of volunteers who either have the disease themselves or in a family member. They say the future is looking brighter due to continued research. At the state level, there is a hotline, support groups, speakers and a survey of hot spots.

There are a few changes in the list of schools in Region II for 1997. Most notably is the absence of Dearborn Fordson, the team that upset Clarkston 34-20 in last year's first round regional game. The Tractors moved to Region III, meaning the only way the two teams could face each other again would be in the state semifinals.

The season opens Sept. 5 with a home game against Royal Oak Kimball.

A number of perennial football powers share Region II with Clarkston, including South Lyon, defending state champions Walled Lake Western, Monroe and Battle Creek Central. Also in the group is Brighton and superstar quarterback Drew Henson. Henson, along with Dane Fife, are considered the top two QBs in the state. Henson has committed to the University of Michigan.

The other schools in Region II are: Ann Arbor Huron and Pioneer, Belleville, Plymouth Canton and Salem, Davison, Flint Carman Ainsworth, Grand Blanc, Milford, Howell, Jackson, Lake Orion, Portage Northern, Temperance Bedford, Walled Lake Central and Waterford Mott.

The top four teams in the region qualify for the playoffs. A computer formula is used to determine those four teams, taking into account won-loss record and quality of opposition. Last year, Clarkston finished second in the region with a 9-0 regular season record.

My fellow newspaper people around the country had their creative talents tested once again when writing headlines about the Mike Tyson-Evander Holyfield fiasco. How about these gems: "Bite of the Century," "Sucker Munch," "The Champ and the Chomp," and "Undisputed Chomp."

It was another great moment in boxing history back on June 28 when Tyson - he of the suicidal tendencies and rape conviction - was upset about knocking heads with the heavyweight champ, so he bit his ear - twice.

Be reasons why Tyson turned cannibal in the ring vary from the logical to the sublime. He knew he was going to lose and didn't want to be embarrassed. He lost control when he thought Holyfield was taking a cheap shot. He mistook Holyfield's ear for those delicious fried elephant ears you can get at any fair.

Sure Tyson apologized, but he read a prepared statement that lacked such heart, the Tinman would have looked good next to him.

A suspension of a year or 18 months would be utterly useless because it's not unusual for a boxer to take that amount of time training for their next fight. This means the boxer doesn't really miss any actual matches.

Who else was ripped off? Never mind the thousands of high rollers who shelled out hundreds of dollars to get a ringside view of Tyson's midnight snack. Then there are the millions who shelled out at least \$30 to get the fight on pay-per-view. A Los Angeles man has filed a class action suit against Tyson and his handlers for the ripoff, and here's hoping they win something.

The most unfortunate part is that a man like Holyfield is mixed up in all this. Always classy and God-fearing, Holyfield represents the side of boxing that hasn't been seen since the glory days of the 1960s and 1970s.

Tyson is dangerous, unstable and in need of more help than prison could provide. In a sport filled with wrong things, the Nevada regulators should do the right thing and close the door on Tyson for good.





**Acclaimed plane to visit**

One of the last flying 1948 Lockheed Constellation Airliners will arrive at the Oakland International Airport July 14 and will be open to the public for tours.

Built to the specifications of Howard Hughes, the "Connie" is considered the most beautiful piston-engine airliner ever built and was the first pressurized aircraft in widespread use.

The airliner will come to Oakland County under the auspices of The Constellation Group of Scottsdale, Arizona. According to spokesperson Sheryl Hutcherson, "Many Americans took their first flight in a 'Connie' and many military personnel flew in or worked on them." The plane was used in the Berlin Airlift and in World War II, Korea and Vietnam. It was considered "the queen of the skies" in the '50s, used extensively by both the military and civilian airlines. It set records for size and speed.

This particular plane was the first Constellation delivered to the newly commissioned US Air Force in 1948. It flew in the Berlin Airlift and served until 1968, accumulating 16,000 hours of flight time. After retirement from the military, it was used as a spray plane until 1984, when it was acquired by a private collector interested in restoration. It was sold to The Constellation Group in 1987 and restoration began in 1991.

The plane will land at around 11 a.m. July 14 and will be open for tours from noon-6 p.m. on the terminal ramp through July 17. Admission is \$3 for adults, \$1 for children 6-12, or \$8 per family. All children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult.




