## City urges businesses to hook up to water now

Public hearing tonight at Independence Township Fire Hall on Citation Dr. at 7 p.m.

The issue of whether or not the City of the Village of Clarkston will hook up to the water supply of Independence Township was the topic of discussion April 13 at City Hall.

The water subcommittee, made up of Scott Meyland, Bill Basinger, Doug Roeser and Steve Arkwright hosted a "pre public hearing" for Clarkston business owners. Roughly 20 people attended the meet-

The point of the meeting was to help area business owners become better informed on the issue. The water subcommittee told area business owners that hooking up to the Independence Township water supply now would make good sense rather than waiting until a later date.

The first phase of the three-phase plan would see a 12 inch water main installed down Main Street. Phases two and three would be constructed in a manner that makes the most sense Meyland said.

"It depends on the needs or if there's a more cost efficient way to lay the phases out," Meyland said.

Gary Tressel, city engineer, said it makes the most sense for water to be installed while M-15 is torn up for resurfacing from Paramus Street to I-75 in Independence Township and through the City. The Michigan Department of Transportation is slated to begin work on the resurfacing project in the spring of 2001.

"It will cost a lot more if we were to do this later," Tressel said. "People should remember that the state is going to do its work on M-15 whether this passes or not. Either way there's going to be about four or five months of disruption. We're trying to coordinate other things that will help the community at the same time,"

## M-15 resurfaced this spring

Township Engineer Randy Ford announced the road paving project — which will include some widening at major intersections — at the April 4 Independence Township Board of Trustees meeting.

Ford told the board M-15 will be resurfaced for nine miles, from I-75 north to the Genesee County line.





# SCAMP goes silver

## 'A lot of good things have happened as an out-growth of SCAMP'

Clarkston's SCAMP program, a summer camp for children and young adults with special needs, celebrates its silver anniversary this year.

Started in 1976, SCAMP has been a 25-year labor of love for the Clarkston community.

Seventy-five children participated in the first program. About 300 students from north Oakland County and southeastern Genesee County participated

It was started by a group of people who realized the need for a camp experience for kids with special needs, said Bob Brumback, who was one of the organizers of the program.

"We had a lot of help from a lot of people over the years. The community accepted the program because they could see it and feel it," Brumback said. He added the staff and volunteers told stories of their wonderful experiences, and the compassion that the student aides learned.


In 1976, Brumback was director of special education for Clarkston schools. As in most communities, Clarkston's impaired students were sent out of the district to centers for training during the school year. But when summer came, there were no organized activities for them to attend, he said.

"The kids were sent home in the summer, and communities didn't take to them back then. There were a lot of misunderstandings. Some people were afraid of Down's Syndrome (and other conditions). Now they understand the mentally impaired are sweet and can be good workers. It's a changing scene out there.'

Brumback was also personally familiar with the challenges facing the mentally impaired and their families. His wife, Pat Brumback, currently assistant superintendent of Clarkston schools and director of special education, has a brother who is multiply impaired.

Brumback sought help from the Bloomfield Hills school district which at that time had had a summer program for five years.

"They helped us get organized. They had programs run through the schools for speech and hearing impairments and some for youngsters with emotional problems." Clarkston and Bloomfield Hills are still the only two

school districts in Oakland County with summer programs for the impaired, said Brumback.

Clarkston schools donated facilities at Sashabaw Middle School for the first SCAMP program, but were not able to help with funding.

Some federal and state funding was available in those days. Jack Hunt, who at 92 is still active in the program, said Brumback, had a mentally impaired grandson, and was able to get a \$5,000 grant from the Oakland County Association for Retarded Children. "It made the difference in our ability to get going," said Brumback.

Brumback said he, Hunt and Don Place, who then worked for Oakland Intermediate Schools as a consultant for mentally impaired programs, organized community resources to get the first summer program off the ground. He added the former Jaycees and Jaycettes clubs were instrumental in fundraising for the event.

The \$5,000 grant, state and federal funding, community fundraising and School and used Independence Oaks

ground, was dedicated . . . he poured

himself into it," Brumback said.

"We started at Sashabaw Middle County Park for swimming and camping. We struck up a relationship with those folks that continues today.

"I can remember the faces of the kids in wheelchairs laughing," he said. "We would all cry on the last day. My brother-in-law still squeals at the mention of SCAMP."

Over the years, "when we were recruiting teachers for Clarkston schools, some would know about the program and want to work SCAMP. Others would be hooked after the first time," said Brumback. "We started a system of teaming teachers, paraprofessionals, student aides and volunteers. Now we have people who have been volunteers, then a paid aide and have gone to college and come back a paid professional.'

The field of special education has seen great changes since the 1970s, Bruback said. "We started bringing kids back in the system in the late 1970s and early 1980s. Special education kids in Clarkston stay in the district. It's more accepted and data shows it makes a difference.

"In SCAMP we saw the gains being made because they were interacting with regular kids. A lot of good things have happened as an outgrowth of SCAMP."

Now that the kids are integrated year around, SCAMP is just as necessary because the staff at community recreation programs is not equipped to handle more impaired kids, said Brumback. "Summers are difficult, because it's still hard for wheel-chair bound kids to be active."

Brumback retired as director of special education in 1994. He now is a volunteer for SCAMP. "I'm the old man still hanging around," he jokes, then seriously, "It's special in my heart."

a small tuition from the families paid for the first year program, said Brumback.

The paid staff also worked for less money. "In the early years the teachers' union was working with us and allowed a different pay scale," he added.

"We didn't want the families to be burndened by the cost because there are great costs associated with raising impaired kids.

Jim Butzine, a social worker for Clarkston schools and new to the community in 1976, was SCAMP's first director and ran the program for about five years. "He had a tremendous back-

Traditionally about 90 percent of the students have one or more disabilities (autism, mental and or emotional impairment, learning disability, speech and language delay or physical handicap.) The remaining 10 percent are identified by school personnel as students "at risk" and in need of a positive summer experience.

This year SCAMP 2000 is projected to take place from June 26 through July 27

In 1977 the North Oakland SCAMP Funding Corporation was established. It is a non-profit, non-sectarian, volunteer organization that is committed to raising the necessary funds to operate the Clarkston SCAMP Pro-

The funds for the continuation of the progam depend solely on the tuition of the participants and the Funding Corporation's efforts to solicit private donations and conduct fundraising

The actual cost per camper in 2000 is \$665. The requested tuition for Clarkston families is \$250 this year. The difference is funded by the North Oakland SCAMP Funding Corp. Those who can't afford it receive full funding through SCAMPERships.

## Court safety path a priority

Linking pedestrians to Bay Court Park was the priority of Independence Township Board members in approving the 2000 Safety Path Program last week.

Parks and Recreation Director Ann Conklin told the board at the April 4 meeting she had received many requests from residents about whether this would be a priority area.

With approximately \$545,000 available, the Safety Path Committee reviewed the following areas earlier for consideration:

■Maybee Road from Sashabaw Road to the cemetery, estimated cost \$197,000

■Greenview Road from Clarkston Road to Pine Knob Road, estimated cost \$740,000

Clarkston Road to the Orion Township line, estimated cost \$93,000

■ Maybee Road, from Pine Knob Road to Clintonville Road, estimated cost \$240,000

■Andersonville Road from White Lake Court to the Springfield Township line, estimated cost \$65.000

■Andersonville Road from Bay Court Park to Clement Road, estimated cost \$504,000

Two other potential projects included Hubbard Road, from Cranberry Pointe to Hubbard Hills on the opposite side of Independence Elementary School; and Clarkston Road, from Ranch Estates to the corner.

Conklin said, after much discussion and deliberation, the committee recommended Andersonville from Bay Court Park to Clement as the priority area. Construction is expected to begin in spring 2001.

After some discussion, the board authorized engineering for the project, 7-0. Conklin said township engineers will now develop engineering plans and bid the project. Final bids will return to the board for authorization to proceed.

Construction from the park entrance to Clement will be challenging, Conklin said, "because the houses are very close to the road."

Several board members noted the safety issue,

including Trustee Dan Travis, who pointed to a recent fatal accident in which a 6-year-old boy was hit by a truck as he was crossing Andersonville from Lotus Lake near Clement. "Safety is the number one consideration," Travis said.

However, although he voted with the others to authorize the project, Trustee Neil Wallace noted Clement is a little-traveled road in Independence Township - and he was concerned about "directing children" and other pedestrians there.

Although Clement is a "priority route," explained Clerk Joan McCrary following the meeting, it does not have a safety path. She and others are concerned about pedestrians using Clement as a short cut from Andersonville to the White Lake safety path.

The path connects White Lake to the corner of Andersonville. However, there is no safety path from Andersonville to Clement because of the railroad tracks,

McCrary described Clement as a "dark" area. "With all the shrubbery, it would not be safe at dusk. I don't know about during the day. I would not want to walk there myself," she said.

"I don't think the safety path is going to do that much for safety ... Safety paths attract people," Wallace agreed.

In response, Conklin told the board 'the exact route" has not been finalized. "What we want is a connection to the park."

On Thursday, Conklin said "Clement was the alternative that we are looking at. Committee members are exploring the options."

Conklin said she anticipates summer safety path construction to include finishing the Clarkston Road route from Eston Road to Low Meadow Road to Greenview Road, pending easement acquisitions. Clarkston Road between Flemings Lake and Snowapple roads will also be completed, pending easement acquisitions, Conklin said. Minor repairs will be completed





## M-15 resurfacing to begin this spring

will be done in stages, with traffic shifted to one side of the road and construction taking place on the other side, Ford said.

The contract calls for two-way traffic to be maintained, utilizing a paved shoulder, but occasionally one lane will be closed with "flagmen" and warning signs to control traffic, Ford said. Most of the work will be done when traffic is lighter, including after the late afternoon rush hour. "The men will be working evenings and through the night," he said.

The following two intersections will see widening improvements:

Cranberry Lake Road will be widened to six lanes with two through lanes, a center left turn lane and right turn lanes. A traffic light will be installed at the intersection.

■The Rattalee Lake/Hadley Road intersection

will be widened to four lanes with one through lane, a center left turn lane, and right turn lanes.

There are no improvements scheduled for the Oakhill Road intersection. Also, no improvements will be made to the Hubbard Road intersection as this was redone a year ago, Ford said. The asphalt paving will be eight inches thick. Lanes will be 12 feet wide, with a sevento-eight foot shoulder on each side of the road.

Ford said the project will

be sensitive to residents who live along M-15. He said contact has been made with affected communities like Ortonville to alert them about the project.

Trustee Dan Travis noted Amy Drive, which is proposed to be extended west of M-15, will also eventually need a traffic signal. "There's going to be a need for another light there," he said. But he added he worried that, with additional signals along M-15, traffic congestion would escalate. "Traffic will be stalled because of the lights," Travis said.

In response to Trustee Larry Rosso's concern about existing safety paths, Ford said they would be "shifted" back from the road.

Ford said the concept of extending Amy Drive is only in the proposal stages. "It's not a done deal." Possible problems with congested traffic due to more traffic signals along M-15 "is something MDOT will have to look at," Ford said. "They would look to see if that signal (at Amy) is warranted.

Clerk Joan McCrary said later, like others, she is hoping for additional improvements along the congested roadway. McCrary is a member of the M-15 Corridor Improvement Task

McCrary said a \$5 million federal grant was secured by U.S. Rep. Dale Kildee (D-Flint) for preliminary engineering work to prepare M-15 for future widening from I-75 to I-69. As slated in Vision 2020's Target Plan, a boulevard or

parkway concept is eyed. McCrary said it will take an estimated \$40 million to complete the whole project.

"We hope to get federal monies from Kildee in conjunction with MDOT," she said.

Township Planner Dick Carlisle said, while this is all good and fine, meanwhile the dollars are rising.

"On M-15, particularly north of Cranberry Leke Road which is, at this stage relatively undeveloped, we are at the point that, if plans were put in place immediately, this project could be done at an affordable cost. However, the longer they wait, the more development is going to occur and the cost will go up, particularly due to right-of-way aquisition," Carlisle said.

"To say a parkway or boulevard concept is too expensive, frankly I don't buy that," he added. "But if MDOT continues to procrastinate in improvements, it will become a self-fulfilling prophecy and it will become too expensive."

on Sashabaw Road to Independence Oaks County Park. Finally, the Perry Lake safety path will be completed to I-75.

Trustee Jeff McGee asked about hooking up the township to the Orion Township line on Clarkston Road. Conklin said Orion hasn't decided its priorities including on "which side of (Clarkston Road)" it wants its path located. "We didn't feel it was smart to put a path down at this date in time," she said. That issue will be back "when Orion and Independence determine their priorities."

Township voters approved a half mill in 1998 for the safety path program for a 10-year extension, Conklin said. "But the 10 years didn't start until 2000. The current millage expired with the levy of 1999. We are in the first year of the second renewal," she explained, adding the Safety Path Program is now in its twenty-







greater risk of groundwater containments. Secondly, by going through with the proposal area residents have the potential to have lower fire insurance rates. Other advantages of connecting to Independence Township water supply are an estimated cost savings of \$750,000 of the entire project, minimal disturbances to area businesses and providing stubs for future extension of the mains to service the entire city.

Phase one of the project, or the installation of the 12 inch water main down Main Street would be funded by an \$800,000 general obligation bond, with assessment beginning in July of 2000. Another \$400,000 would be funded by special assessment districts. The \$400,000 SAD would only be assessed to those who would get a direct benefit of the water, mainly those residents and businesses on Main Street. The city will borrow no more than \$3 million and issue its general obligation tax bonds.

in 2000 is 1.4 mills (\$1.4 per \$1,000 of

taxable value). The estimated simple average annual millage rate required to retire the bonds is 3.87 mills (\$3.97 per \$1,000 of taxable value).


The remaining construction and general obligation bonds would be assessed at the time they are borrowed.

The committee also said if Clarkston would ever hook up to Independence Township's water supply, the cost savings of doing it in correlation with the M-15 improvements is a bonus. There would be cost savings from building in large segments instead of street by street special assessment districts. Also going ahead with the plan now saves the expense of boring Main Street in the future. It will also allow immediate access to an alternate water sources.

His disobedient children. I'm addressing His children today, those Blood-bought, born again believers. You




> Lord has done for us, the very least we can do is be thankful!





## Wolves beat no. 1 Troy

It didn't start out well for the Wolves as they fell behind 3-0 in the first inning, but that's all the runs the Colts scored as Clarkston smothered Troy 12-

"That was a big, big, big win for us today," Clarkston coach Phil Price said. "I sat the kids down after Grand Blanc and asked them if they wanted to be 17 individuals, 10 individuals and one group, or one group altogether. I think we showed good composure out there today."

After the Wolves fell behind early, it brought back memories for their starting pitcher, senior Chris Mitchell.

"This is the biggest win for us. We had a discussion after Grand Blanc. We're a lot tighter as a team now. We're

Crawford said the Wolves played with plenty of emotion during the game.

"We were fired up and didn't come out flat. If we keep playing like this we'll win the league," Crawford said.

The Wolves are off until May 1 when they play Davison.

Clarkston's four doubles team of Grant Gilford and Jon Szilvagyi also had a strong showing Ortwine said.


"They dominated. They lost only one game in three matches. They won 36 of their 37 games," Ortwine said.


"I think the kids feel good about themselves. There's a lot of sand and water on that course and our kids shot well," Sherrill said.
