## Board to ask for \$26 million

Despite seeing a new township hall voted down in the primary election, the Independence Township Board will be asking for a much more expensive proposal in November.

At their board meeting on Aug. 7, the trustees decided to put the township hall back on the ballot and add a community center with senior facilities including an operating budget to the mix. All told, they are asking the voters to pass a \$26 million project over 20 years.

The vote passed 4-2 with Supervisor Dale Stuart, Trustees Larry Rosso, Dan Kelly and David Wagner voting for the project while Treasurer Jim Wenger and Clerk Joan McCrary voted against the project. Trustee Dan Travis was unable to attend the meeting.

"To me it is an economical thing. I believe voters see a need for a new township hall but at this time do not want to pay for it," Wenger said. "I think it sends all the wrong messages since the township hall was voted down so overwhelmingly, as much as I think a township hall is needed."

At the Aug. 6 primary, the township hall and Clintonwood improvements proposal went down by a 3,984 to 2,363 margin.

Some on the board put the blame squarely on their own shoulders.

"I blame it on the board and I blame myself," Wagner said. "We didn't get out there and we didn't tell you (the public) why we needed it. We have had four studies done and we know for a fact it is overcrowded and inadequate. It is a disgrace."

Stuart said the board can not promote any issue put on the ballot, but he too was surprised about the lack of momentum behind the project.

"It is surprising that for years people were asking about a new township hall and none of those people stepped up to support it, talk about it, write letters to the editor, etc.," Stuart said.

The board mentioned numerous reasons why the voters might not have supported the proposal. The recent economic downturn, the events of Sept. 11 and the possibility of less revenue sharing from the state were all mentioned.

However despite the township hall being voted down the night before, the board had to make a decision on the November ballot at the Aug. 7 meeting since the ballot language had to be turned into Oakland County.

There was debate on the board whether they should go back to the public in November, or wait until the following election which is two years away.

"A community center can be done in 90 days," McCrary said. "We have passed items on the ballot before in a few months. We have a group to do it. Everything is in our hands. All we have to do is do it."

Two votes failed at the meeting before the third time was a charm for the board as they passed the proposal to link the township hall, community center and operating budget on the November ballot so if one fails they all fail.

"We can't in good conscience go to the community without an operating millage," Stuart said. "Unless it can be self-supported we can't do it. Our township doesn't have the money."

The money breaks down as \$6 million for the township hall, \$20 million for an 80,000 square foot community center with senior facilities and the .5 mil operating millage for four years.

The tax levy for operating cost would only be assessed as needed to supplement paid memberships.

## Living independent with Down Syndrome

Getting your first apartment is a momentous occasion in anyone's life. But especially in Beth Fouchey's.

The former Clarkston resident has Down's Syndrome, a condition caused by an extra chromosome resulting in mental retardation, flaccid muscle tone and physical limitations in most cases.

Beside, she's a normal 26-year-old woman who likes to have fun with friends, walk everyday, go to the mall, enjoy a dinner out and so on.

And since last November, she's been living in her own apartment, with the help of On My Own of Michigan, a private nonprofit organization based in Oakland County.

"I like On My Own," Beth said. Through it she's made many friends, has become a social butterfly, attends classes, and works full time.

"Many disabled adults don't belong in group homes, but can't reside in a community all on their own. (This program) helps mildly disabled adults learn how to live on their own, keep jobs, become regular people," Jane Fouchey, Beth's mother, said.

On My Own members do their own house-keeping, wash their own clothes, prepare their own meals, do normal everyday activities, as would any apartment renter. But On My Own of Michigan, founded in 1997, also offers members day-to-day support, structured social activities, professional counseling, assistance in corollary skills and enrollment in educational classes within the bustling Somerset Park apartments and Troy community.

And Beth couldn't be more pleased. "I don't want to be in my parents house forever."

Like anyone on their own for the first time, she's enjoying some new found freedoms. "I like to sleep in and stay up late," Beth says with a smile directed towards her mother.

She's also learning to do for herself anything from cooking such delicacies as spaghetti (she also makes a mean chicken patty and TV dinner) to organizing and household chores.

Beth's had to jump a couple hurdles including dealing with an issue of transportation. She's learned the best way for her to get around is to take the SMART Bus to work and back from the Birmingham Kroger's where she's a bagger, for example.

She's adjusted to living with a roommate, but that hasn't been hard. The two ladies get along great. Roommate Stacey Higginbottom said, "I love my roommate Beth. She's nice to me."

And other new experiences have surfaced. "When I get sick I have to take care of myself," Beth said. However, that's fine with her. "Nobody's helping me and I'm happy."

"She's really happy and has demonstrated she can live on her own," Jane said. "You never want your children to leave home, but when they prove they can be successful, it's really the right thing to do."

Jane and Ty Fouchey have lived in Clarkston since 1988, and have felt normalization was vital in Beth's growth.

## Inabnit to join race for Clarkston City Council

Clarkston resident Charles Inabnit has thrown his hat into the ring as a contender for the Clarkston City Council.

Inabnit joined incumbent council members Anne Clifton, Scott Meyland and Derek Werner and Mayor Sharron Catalo in filing for office before the 4 p.m. deadline Tuesday, Aug. 6.

Three council positions and the mayor's position will be up for grabs in the Nov. 5 general election. The top three vote-getters in the council race and the top vote getter in the mayoral race will each earn two-year terms on the council through November 2004.

Catalo has served as the city's mayor since April 1986, while Meyland has served on the council since August 1999. Clifton has served on the council since 1997, while Werner was appointed last year to fill the seat vacated when former council member Karen Sanderson resigned. Werner won an election last year to fill out the remainder of that term.

## Recent death spurs act of love and support

The recent loss of a 16-year-old boy in a car accident has hit home for many throughout the Clarkston area.

And a group of Clarkston teenagers decided to act, giving their time and efforts for the sake of having Keenan Shawn George's name and dreams live on.

Led by the initiatives of Lisa Licata, more than 50 of Keenan's friends and family joined together for a bowl-a-thon at Cherry Hill Lanes, July 26, to raise money for the Clarkston Community Schools Keenan George Memorial Fund to support the district's music program.

Days later, several also went door-to-door in local neighborhoods asking for donations.

In total, \$3,416 was collected. A handful of Keenan's close friends presented the money to his family, parents Mike and Kim, and brother Derek, in their home, the evening of Aug. 6.

The kids took a couple poster boards, fastened them together, and created a giant-size check to present.

"We wanted to do this in a special way," Lisa told the Georges.

Subsequently, tears began to fall. "It's been four weeks to the day," Mike told the teens. "I had a hard day, but you've brightened it. I can't tell you how much we appreciate this."

"His music will live on," Kim added.

Keenan had shown signs of an interest in music at two and three years old. He had been playing the guitar for most of his life and was even the lead guitarist for the band Euphoria. At 13, Keenan told his dad he couldn't imagine his life without music.

Mike said, "He sure had a great group of friends."

Kim said she wanted to put the check on Keenan's bedroom ceiling, above his bed, and amidst his walls of rock 'n' roll posters.

"The Georges are a great family and we were close with Keenan," friend Emily Finken said. "This is our way of showing support."

"And our way of showing how much we loved Keenan," Lisa, who raised nearly \$1,000 herself, added. She and her mother came up with the idea to hold a fundraising event. At first Mrs. Licata suggested a volleyball tournament, Lisa said. "I said, 'how about bowling?' Because I know Keenan loved to bowl."

In fact, Keenan was on a league at Cherry Hill Lanes and was a member of the Clarkston High School's Junior Varsity bowling team, where he was named the Most Improved Player last year.

In reflection, the Georges want to say a special thank you to Cherry Hill manager and Keenan's JV coach Terry Rauh for his recent support.

And of Keenan's friends, Mike said, "This is an exceptional group of young adults. It's one thing to care. But to put words into action, people should be recognized for that."

"I think it is an amazing honor for Keenan to be able to carry on his music, to help other kids carry on a passion for music like his," Kim said. "Keenan wanted to teach music, and it feels like he's teaching people now."

She continued, "The kids all worked hard and what they did is a tremendous honor for him. To keep hearing Keenan's name makes me feel like he's still here. I know he's up there watching."

The family plans on continuing support of the memorial fund and is considering holding a golf outing or other fundraising activities.

# Added Dixie improvements coming in Springfield

More Dixie Highway improvements are on the way. The Springfield Township Board, at their Thursday, Aug. 8 meeting, approved an amended agreement with the Road Commission of Oakland County for \$100,000 additional Dixie Highway improvements.

The current road work, which is fully underway, was costing the township \$500,000, but will increase to a total of \$600,000 with the construction of a turning lane at the northwest corner of Dixie Highway and Davisburg Road.

"The turning lane will begin on southbound Dixie, north of Davisburg, continue south, and wrap around on to Davisburg, just west of Dixie," Township Clerk Nancy Strole said. "This is sorely needed, because traffic backs up at certain times of the day."

Currently underway is the construction of a center lane from the southern entrance of the township at I-75 to north at Davisburg Road. Resurfacing will also

occur.

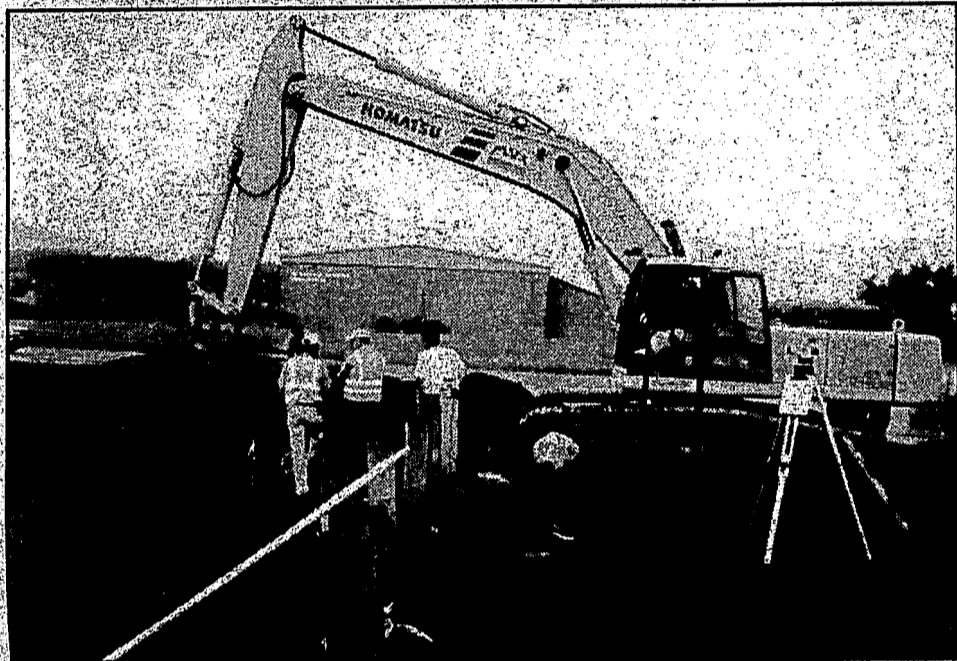
"Residents traveling will encounter some construction congestion, reduced to one lane, but I think they understand. We hope this will make traveling a lot safer."

Strole said travel safety on Dixie Highway was something the township had been concerned about for years and years.

"We desperately needed a center lane. There have been accidents. It's been unacceptable."

Construction should be completed before winter hits, with possible minor additional work finished next spring, Strole said.

# Ellis experiences different culture in Belgian school

When she first arrived in Mons, Belgium for her first day as an exchange student, Clarkston resident Lena Ellis couldn't speak a word of French.

However, that changed during the course of the 2001-02 school year, and by the time she arrived back in Clarkston July 19, she had learned the language and made friendships with many Belgian students.

"Originally, I didn't know any French," she said. "There was a girl in my class that helped me a lot and spoke a little bit of English. By the end of the year, I became friends with just about everyone in the school."

Ellis, who will be entering her senior year at Clarkston High School, was able to go on the student exchange trip through a program sponsored by Rotary International. She printed out an application off the Internet and submitted it to the organization.

"I had to get an interview with Rotary," she said. "After I was selected, I had to go back and learn how to be an ambassador."

She commented the way the schools approach learning in Belgium is different from how it's done back in Clarkston, using math as an example.

"Instead of teaching one subject of math in a year, they teach algebra and geometry at once," Ellis said. "We also concentrated more on languages over there. At Clarkston, we have after-school activities, but in Belgium, there's just academics."

However, what she learned in Belgium wasn't confined to the classroom — from learning different social customs to how to function on her own.

"They don't have a drinking age," she said. "You sit down and you eat for four hours. I learned to speak French, and I learned independence. I was separated from everything I knew."

While in Belgium, Ellis stayed with three different families, switching every four months.

The first family she stayed with was Evelyn and Alaine Lhereux. "It was good," Ellis said. "It was different because it was in the middle of nowhere."

She didn't have to move very far to stay with her next family — they turned out to be the Lhereuxs' next-door neighbors, Annie and Leon Evans. Ellis finished her stay in Belgium by staying at the home of Catherine and Mark Albert.

Now that she is back in the States, Ellis wants to complete her senior year at CHS and then study broadcast journalism, although she is not sure yet where she wants to go to college. She lives with mother Nancy Ellis in Clarkston, and has one brother, Vince, 19.

The Independence Township Board disrespected their constituents when they decided to put a \$26 million proposal for a new township hall, community center (with senior facilities) and an operating millage on the November ballot.

The vote was 4-2 with Treasurer Jim Wenger and Clerk Joan McCrary voting against it and Trustee Dan Travis absent.

### Proposed development must be stopped

The development of a multi-family attached rental/condominium, three story structure of 133 units (approximately 266 cars), population density will exceed the current infrastructure north side of Maybee, south off Lorac Drive, M-15 and Dixie Highway area. This endeavor shows a total disregard for public safety. A Fire Station and Oakland County Sheriff is located on Citation Drive. Increased traffic density could prove fatal, if our fire department can't timely get its trucks and equipment to a fire call. This parcel of land will be oversaturated with populace.

A traffic density study needs to be done by the Oakland Road Commission in order to get a true picture of the danger that the increased traffic will bring at the intersections of Maybee/Dixie and M-15/Dixie. A study must be made during the period of September through June, between the hours of 12 p.m. to 6 p.m. A study will not be accurate if done during the summer months when many families are away on vacation and school traffic is minimal to nonexistent.

The Road Commission should also include traffic patterns at M-15/Citation Drive and Maybee/Sashabaw corridors/intersections.

Further, desecration of wetlands is unconscionable. Once tampered with and/or removed, we have all lost a very delicate balance of nature never to be recovered. This area is a crucial part of the watershed to the Clinton River.

Additionally, this development may have unknown effects upon the water table that serves the surrounding neighborhoods and provides the necessary water for daily living. Today, water is one of the most precious and expensive commodities on the market and should be valued and recognized as such by the individuals of our community. If Hi Wood Village, also known as "Birdland," has its wells and water table destroyed, who will compensate us?

"Trillium Village." A Trillium is a wild flower protected by the State of Michigan. Isn't it interesting that the state protects the trillium wild flower, but who protects the residents of Independence Township? You are derelict in your responsibility to the community if more serious thought and reconsideration are not given to preserve the integrity of Clarkston.

The Independence Township Board and Planning Commission must rescind the development of the proposed Trillium Village and deny all approvals of any such future development to preserve the delicate balance, which exists at Ritter's Pond.

The community has put its trust and confidence in our elected and appointed officials. If this plan is approved, we will be truly disappointed in all of them. We will "remember" all of them at the next election.

The millage will be earmarked for operational purposes.

A public hearing is scheduled with the Department of Natural Resources at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, Aug. 25 at the Kirschgessner Auditorium at Clarkston High School, 6595 Middle Lake Rd., Independence Township.

### 25 YEARS AGO (1977)

■The Clarkston School Board, on a narrow 4-3 vote, scrapped plans to reinstitute fifth grade band during a special meeting called Monday by three of the board members. Trustee Carolyn Place, who called for the meeting, said she was under the impression that, if the millage passed, fifth grade band would be among the programs put back in the curriculum.

■Efforts are being made to organize the 300 or so homeowners on Big Lake and those who have access to it for the purpose of keeping the lake clear and pure. Marge Batchelder, a member of the steering committee appointed at the group's first meeting last spring, said a second meeting has been called for 11 a.m. Saturday, Aug. 20 at the Springfield Township Hall.

MDOT requested documentation of minor flooding that has been occurring at points along Washington and Holcomb roads.

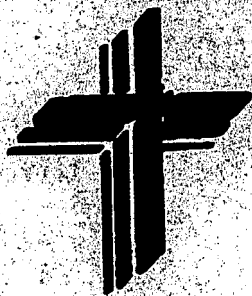
Councilman Dan Columbo said the city believes there is a problem with the catch basins. Since these are county roads, improvements would be the responsibility of the county, he said.

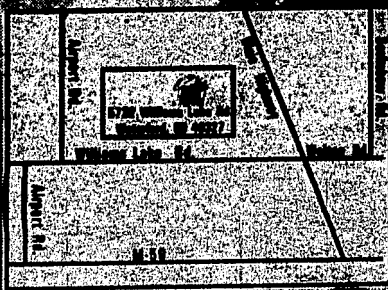

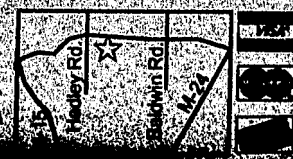

# Scientists study rattlesnakes' living patterns at Indian Springs

A team of scientists has converged upon Indian Springs Metropark in Springfield Township to study the habits of the eastern massasauga rattlesnake.

Dr. Bruce Kingsbury of Indiana-Purdue University, along with two graduate students, Candace Jones (a native of Toronto) and Jane Murawski (a native of Rochester, New York), are spending the summer studying the habits of the rare rattlesnake. They are conducting a two-year study on the snake's patterns and tendencies.

Jones is a graduate of Trent University in Toronto, and Murawski is a graduate of Michigan State University, who will be continuing her studies in the fall as a graduate student at Central Michigan University.

The two students arrived in the Clarkston area between the end of April and the beginning of May to work on the project. According to Jones, they have a couple of purposes behind the project.

"One is to learn about their (the rattlesnakes') movements," she said. "We're also trying to raise public awareness of the snakes. There's a lot of misinformation and we're trying to raise support."

During their studies, they surveyed

different areas of the metropark and analyzed different data, such as the area adjacent to the snake, the temperature of the snake, and the amount of grass in the area.

According to Metroparks spokesman David Moilanen, the study is funded through the Huron-Clinton Metroparks Authority, the Michigan Department of Natural Resources and U.S. Michigan Wildlife.

Moilanen stated Indian Springs was selected for the study because of two reasons: it is a known area for the massasauga rattlesnake and Indian Springs already has a nature and environmental education center, which makes access to information easier.

"One of the purposes of the study is to learn about the habits and movements of the rattlesnake, especially regarding their interaction with people," he said. "One of the interesting things we'll want to find out is where they hibernate. The overall purpose is to learn about why these snakes are dwindling in Michigan."

Moilanen noted that southeastern Michigan is a prime area to find these types of snakes, along with southern Ontario.

"These are the only poisonous snakes found in Michigan," he said. "This one is not aggressive and is smaller than some of its Western counterparts."

The two students will be done with their work at the end of August; however, Kingsbury will stay on to track the rattlesnakes in September and October. The team will revisit the area next spring to continue their study.

## Davisburg woman trying to educate

Many people search for a balance in their work life of making it in the business world and doing fulfilling work. Debbie Gruber has been able to strike that balance.

The Davisburg resident is an executive area manager at Arbonne International.

"I do many seminars and I teach women. We do a lot of education in our company. Sure we have a phenomenal product and it is great to sell it but what we also want to do is educate," Gruber said.

Gruber holds a free women's health seminar the second Tuesday of every month at the Columbiere Conference Center.

"We do it there versus somebody's home because of the amount of interest," Gruber said. "It is just informational."

Gruber has spent time trying to educate women about hormone replacement therapy and a recent study which found it detrimental to women. The study found the therapy increased breast cancer, heart attacks and strokes.

The Davisburg resident does classes on natural, safe alternatives.

"The classes are basically on different things that women can do. I teach different things in the environment that help contribute to menopausal PMS symptoms. We give the information to the women so they can decide for themselves which way they want to go," Gruber said.

Gruber encourages the women to take the information learned at the meeting to their own physician. She said the woman can then make an educated decision on what is best for her to combat menopause PMS

symptoms. Also taught is how to take care of your skin. "My main goal is to let women know there is a natural, safe alternative that they can use that will not cause side effects," Gruber said. "And if they are on hormones they must speak to their physicians and can not just cold turkey get off of them. That is the worst thing they can do. They can be weaned out very slowly."

She got introduced to the company as a consumer. Gruber went in and skeptically purchased skin products six years ago. After seeing how the products worked, Gruber got involved with Arbonne International and has been with the company ever since.

## Speed up your computer

I have been working with my computer at the office for more than two years without any major hardware or software upgrades. I am currently using a Pentium III 800Mhz CPU with 512 MB of RAM and a 60 gigabyte hard drive running Microsoft Windows 2000. Usually, I upgrade my computer at least once a year so I can try and keep ahead of the customers so we can maintain and support them.

Lately though, I have been trying to figure why I should upgrade. The difference between a processor from 1 year ago is not much different than a processor of today. They are faster, but it is not noticeable. At the office, we have customers who walk in with computers running Windows 98 and 64 MB RAM. They are slow running slow so we have to reformat RAM in it and run some updates and they think they have a new machine.

Now, I have to figure out how my computer can be upgraded that will give me the most bang with your local hardware store. I have a 40 GB hard drive. Please remember, if you have a 40 GB hard drive, so if you feel you need a 40 GB hard drive, 2.5 GHz with 512 MB RAM running Windows XP Professional, you are in luck. Here I have some ideas that will help you get the most out of your computer.

**Step 1** is to get more RAM. A \$50.00 for 128 MB(1) of RAM will give you Random Access Memory. This is where all programs and applications are run. If you have 64 MB or less this will be a big boost to your system speed. If your machine can take it.

**Step 2** is to check how much free hard drive space you have available on your hard drive. The hard drive is where applications and data are stored. If you have less than 250MB of disk space available, it may be time. You can try running Disk Cleanup on Windows machines to free up some space. The typical drive size today is 40 GB(1) and will cost you about \$125.00. You can even buy some that are more than 100GB. If your machine is older than 6 years, check with your local computer hardware store to see if your machine can support a larger drive.

**Step 3** is to keep your programs and operating systems up to date with the latest patches and service releases from the manufacturer. For Windows, go to Microsoft.com and click on Windows Update. For other operating systems, go to the manufacturer's website and click on updates. This will help you keep your system secure and running smoothly.
