## Clerks see challenges in elections issue

Most seem to agree that a proposal to consolidate elections will help voters.

Some wonder, however, who will help the clerks who must administer the elections.

"It will absolutely mean more work for city and township clerks," according to Nancy Strole, Springfield Township clerk.

If the proposal becomes law, the traditional June school elections — and special school bond votes on random dates — would be history, and all elections would be limited to four times a year.

The legislation, backed by state Rep. John Stakoe (R-Highland Township) would require school board elections to take place in odd years with either the November general election or in May of odd years. February and August would be other allowable election months (although the governor could call for other special elections).

Stakoe, who represents Independence and Springfield townships, is among supporters who say the new system would save tax dollars and make life easier for voters.

"The general consensus seems to be that we have a fairly good set of

ills," Stakoe said.

The Michigan House of Representatives has passed the legislation, and Stakoe believes the Senate will do likewise.

"The main thing is the voter will not be confused," Independence Township Clerk Joan McCrary said. "It will be a routine, like a holiday. We will all know election days."

The new law, if adopted, would require local clerks to administer all elections, but McCrary does not believe it will have major impact on her office. While this is the first year in memory that Clarkston Community Schools administered their own election, McCrary was an unofficial consultant to the school district.

"It won't make much difference," she said. "It would be very rare for us to have four elections in a year."

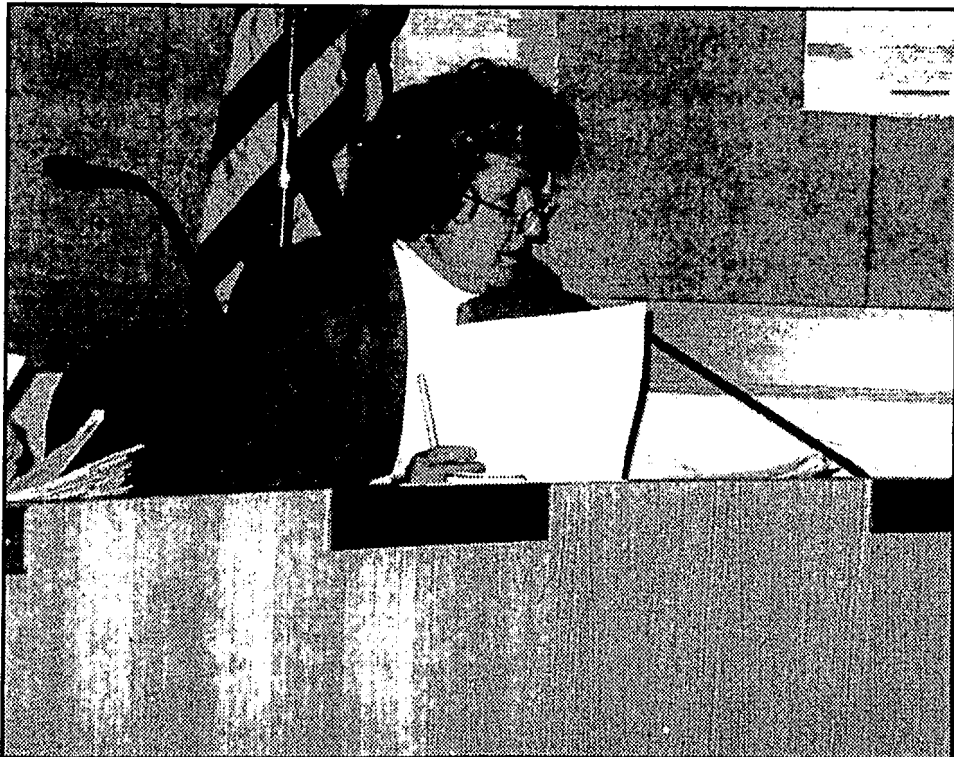
Springfield Township Clerk Nancy Strole is a bit more cautious, because her township is divided among three school districts, and precinct lines do not always coincide with school district boundaries.

For example, Springfield Township has "a few dozen parcels" located in the Brandon school district, with the rest of the township divided between the Clarkston and Holly school districts.

Stakoe said the idea is for all voters to vote in their general election precincts, even if some may have to use two ballots.

"There have been some discussions on how that could be worked out," he said.

## Township board debates fate of school liaison position

With the Clarkston schools' announcement to stop the funding of one of two liaison officers, Independence Township is left with a big decision.

The township government has split the cost of the second liaison officer, which is \$89,450, with the school district, but school officials' chose to make that one of their budget cuts for 2003-2004. Township officials generally recognize the need for this officer and are contemplating taking on financial responsibility alone.

"These kids need all the help they can get. It's not that we have bad schools,

but we do not want to create bad schools," Trustee David Wagner said at the Tuesday, June 17 township board meeting.

The position to be cut is currently working at the middle schools.

"The middle school liaison has the most important position. We need to talk to these kids and get a better understanding of what is going on with their lives, and we currently have the best liaison officer out there," said Wagner.

"We have to keep in mind that we are not funding the officer for the schools, we are funding it for the com-

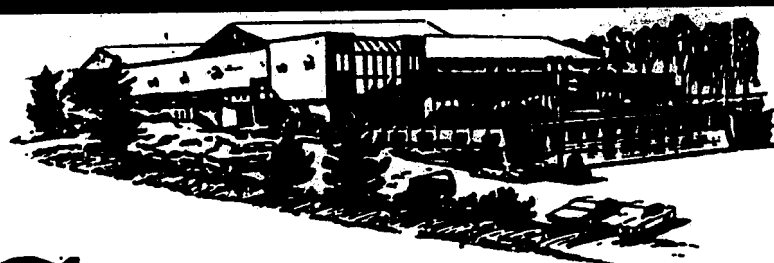

# The Second Front

## Deaf valedictorian making her mark in life

When Victoria Calaman was just a baby, people told her parents, Becky and Doug, she would never learn to read or write.

Today, the now 17-year-old of Clarkston, known as "Tori" to her family and friends, is valedictorian of her graduating class, a member of the National Honor Society and has earned numerous awards for academics and athletics.

"People told me that she would be learning disabled and that we shouldn't plan on college," Tori's mother said, remembering her daughter's early years.

See, at 17-months-old Tori contracted Spinal Meningitis. The sickness took her hearing, making her profoundly deaf, which means she has no hearing at all.

"She was saying three-word sentences when she lost her hearing," Becky said. "I understand information has to be given to her differently, but that she couldn't learn was hard for me to accept."

"I'm happy my mother didn't believe them," Tori said, with the help of an interpreter.

"Look at her now," Becky said.

On May 30, Tori graduated as valedictorian from the Michigan School for the Deaf (MSD) in Flint, a public residential school that serves students who are deaf or hard of hearing from birth to age 26 and who have been referred by their local school districts.

It's a place where Tori has thrived.

Just this year, Tori, who held a 3.55 grade point average, was the recipient of numerous honors including the Flint Association of the Deaf Auxiliary award for the best all around female student; a \$300 Michigan State Grange Scholarship for a student with outstanding scholarship going on to higher education; The Sandra Evans Memorial Scholarship from the AFSCME Local 188 for her written essay "How Did Attending MSD Prepare Me for the Future" and other qualifications; the *Detroit Free Press* All-State Honorable Mention Athlete Certificate; the Earl Jones Valedictorian and TV-5 Best of the Class recognition; the Flint Optimist Scholar Athlete Award; and prom queen for the second year in a row.

She has always been very active at MSD too -- playing basketball for four years (captain for the last two years); volleyball for two years (captain her senior year); cheerleading for four years (captain two years); track for two years; drama for two years where she won the Best Actress Award; a member of the Singing Hands choir for three years (performances are taped and aired by Channel 28 in Flint every year); was class officer for four years; and on the yearbook staff her freshman year.

"I like to keep active and busy. I just like to. I do it because I can. I'm no different than hearing people. Being deaf has nothing to do with it. I'm just a normal kid who is deaf," Tori, who interprets for a deaf and blind man at her church, St. Marks Deaf Catholic Community in Fenton, said.

That "normal kid" said she loves to shop, read books, chat day and night with friends, work on her art, and spend her summers as a camp counselor at the DeSales Center in Brooklyn, Mich. "I used to be a

camper there. I really liked it. When I was old enough I wanted to work for them."

And Tori can't wait to go to college in the fall. Accepted to four different universities, Tori chose to attend Gallaudet University in Washington D.C.

"I'm really undecided on a major," she said. "I know I want to help others someday like being a teacher or a doctor. I don't know all my options yet."

Tori says she is "so ready" to go to college. She isn't nervous and either is her mother.

"I would be nervous if I didn't think she was ready. But she is academically, socially, and emotionally. She'll

be just fine," Becky said.

"I'm certain you and I will be reading about her when she's made her mark on the world," Connie Schroeder said. Through Clarkston Schools, Schroeder drove Tori to school everyday since the fifth grade. (Tori started at MSD in the fourth grade.)

"I am so proud of her. She is an unspoiled, unselfish young lady and it is such a pleasure to know her," Schroeder said.

"I have always felt she deafened for a reason," Becky said. "I believe she will make a difference in someone's life. She probably already has."

# School budget includes more spending reductions

Clarkston school staffers may face a visit from the "supply police" if they don't participate in group buying opportunities in the district's new budget year.

That was one of the friendly warnings offered by Bruce Beamer, executive director of business and financial services, at Monday's school board meeting, at which the board approved a "major funds" budget for 2003-2004 with \$65.2 million in revenue and \$64.9 million in spending.

"It is a balanced budget, [but] there is no cushion" outside of fund equity, Beamer said. "Awareness of the budget throughout the district has been heightened."

The district's fiscal year begins July 1, and Beamer presented budget figures using new government-mandated accounting procedures. The term "major funds" covers both the traditional general fund and other funds such as special education and several categories of grants.

After a public hearing which drew no public comment, trustees approved a budget which officials said reflects an attempt to reign in costs because of less growth in revenue and achieve a board goal of building at least 15 percent in fund equity.

The district anticipates an increase of 100 students, but the amount of the per-pupil "foundation grant" is expected to be the same as last year, \$6,947. That increase will be mitigated by a reduction in state "categorical" grants (those earmarked for specific educational programs).

While non-homestead taxes will increase about \$330,000 because of increased valuation, Beamer said total "local" revenue is expected to decrease because of lower interest on investments and reduced rental of school facilities.

Thanks in part to voter approval of the full 18-mill "non-homestead" millage on June 9, officials were able to recall 10 teachers who had received layoff notices earlier this spring. Because of retirements and resignations, however, the district achieved a goal by reducing the total teaching staff by 3.14 full-time equivalent positions.

The budget implements several previously approved "reductions in planned spending" however, including a smaller contribution from the general fund to athletics, food service and other special accounts, elimination of one school police liaison position, elimination of district funding for field trips, reduction in funding for technical support and increased class sizes.

While the "major funds" show a balance, there is a projected shortfall of \$725,366 in the general fund. Beamer believes that could be erased by frugal spending, otherwise the fund equity would have to cover the balance.

While some accounting changes have moved some maintenance expenses out of the athletic budget, that fund still is "tight," Beamer said.

"It's going to present some issues in the athletic program next year," Deputy Superintendent Dave Reschke said, and Athletic Director Dan Fife and his staff are already working on how to keep

things balanced.

Since the athletics department depends on gate receipts for a significant amount of their revenue, Beamer said that budget will be reevaluated after the fall season.

Individual building accounts have also been reduced, and Beamer is adamant about keeping supply and maintenance costs down. Repair requests will be prioritized according to safety issues first, he said.

"We have what we have [in the account], and when we run out, we run out," Beamer said.

Board Treasurer Janet Thomas said some school buildings have larger budgets than others because some have higher seniority staff. She called on school employees to learn more about budget procedures.

"You're not dealing differentially with budgets in different buildings," she said. "Just get used to reading it."

The budget includes previously approved salary increases for all personnel, ranging from 2 to 3 percent depending on the classification. Salaries and fringe benefits constitute a full 86 percent of the operational budget.

"We had to give raises to compete with everyone in the community," Beamer said, quoting a consumer price index of 2.9 percent this past year. "We dealt as fairly as we could."

The district will enjoy savings of about \$400,000 in health coverage premiums, however, by shifting many employees to a new plan. Beamer said liability insurance premiums increased 20 percent last year.

The \$65 million "major funds" budget for 2003-2004 compares with an original 2002-2003 budget of \$61 million in revenue and \$59 million in spending. A final amendment approved Monday shows an end-of-year 2002-2003 budget with \$64 million in revenue and \$61.7 million in spending.

The projection shows that the district could end 2003-2004 with a fund equity of 12.7 percent, up from a low of 8 percent several years ago. Beamer said Clarkston is still in the "bottom range" among Oakland County school districts.

"There are some real large fund equities at some districts," board President Kurt Shanks said.

The budgets approved Monday do not include building projects to be paid by the recently-approved \$83.7 million bond issue. Bond money can be used only for building, and Beamer warned that future planning must include budgets to staff and operate new facilities.



# Independence Trustees discuss fireworks traffic

The skies will light up over Independence Township on July 4.

Just be careful not to cause any fireworks driving home.

At their Tuesday, June 17 meeting, the Independence Township Board approved three separate fireworks displays for Independence Day. All will occur at approximately 10 p.m., according to the applications.

Permits were approved for the Clintonwood Park display, sponsored by the Clarkston Area Chamber of Commerce and the township parks and recreation department; Lake Oakland, sponsored by the Clarkston American Legion; and the DTE Energy Music Theater in conjunction with the Smokey Robinson concert.

The simultaneous displays represent a change from previous years, according to Oakland County Sheriff Lt. Dale LaBair, commander of the Independence substation.

"They don't usually go at the same time," LaBair said in response to a trustee's question. "It creates a traffic nightmare, but nothing we can't get

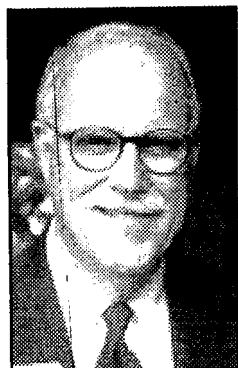
around."

LaBair said a previous problem was created when people leaving Clintonwood Park would stop to view the DTE show. That has been solved by directing traffic more to the south, he said.

Personnel is not a problem, as ample deputies have already been scheduled for the holiday, LaBair said. In addition, a memo from the Independence Township Fire Department said they will provide standby service for all three events.

Viewing the applications, which include details on the size and number of aerial shells planned for each show, Trustee Daniel Travis said it appears that the Clintonwood Park event will have twice as many as the other offerings.

"We have bigger and better," Travis said.

## Trustees OK ordinance, plat extension

In other business at the Tuesday, June 17 meeting of the Independence Township Board:

- On their consent agenda, trustees approved second reading of a new storm water regulation ordinance, which includes provisions for a special "Sashabaw corridor" drainage system.

The ordinance establishes township-wide storm water regulations for new development, but gives those in the special Sashabaw district the option of connecting with a planned drainage system.

- The board opened two public hearings — but heard no public comment — concerning two applications from Consumers Energy for "disruption permits." Trustees approved both.

The first will allow installation of approximately 944 feet of two-inch plastic gas main along Sashabaw Road to serve the Powers Professional Building.

The second will allow installation

of a 300-foot deep anode system at Clarkston and Eston roads to provide cathodic protection for a Consumers gas main.

Township engineer Jamie Burton said the device is similar to that used by the township to protect water pumps from corrosion.

- Trustees approved a two-year extension of the final preliminary plat for Hidden Lakes, located north of the Manors of Deerwood.

The plan calls for development of eight residential lots with public streets, enclosed storm sewers and municipal water and sewer systems.

While all underground utilities and street curbs have been installed, developers reported that, "Mother Nature is causing us some problems" with construction progress.

Officials said the developer may only need one year, but the routine procedure is to grant a two-year extension when warranted.

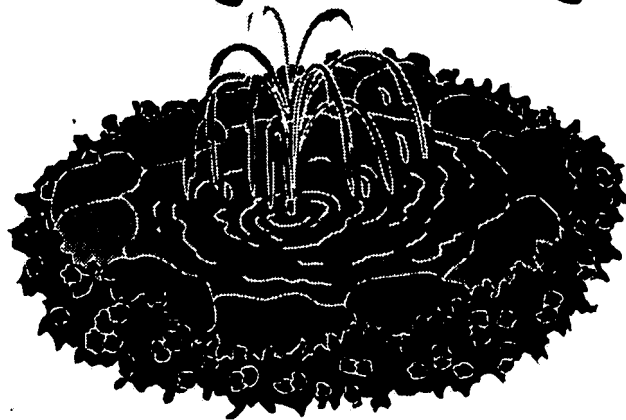

I used to get as many as five to 10 e-mails from friends forwarding outrageous stories about any number of things, this one among them, and I've found that the vast majority are simply myths, hoaxes and sometimes, plain lies started on a web page or e-mail, and forwarded ad nauseam to millions of people who don't take the time to check.

I've found several websites which exist simply to collect information on hoaxes, myths and urban legends, in order to better inform people who fall for this stuff. Snopes.com, truthminers.org, breakthefchain.org all have this "story" covered - go to www.snopes.com/

inboxer/outrage/pensions.htm for one example.

I remembered this story from many conservative friends who forwarded it to me, and I replied with one or more links like this. After reading the same in a newspaper by the publisher, I did a little more checking. In the first five pages of hits from Google, there were six web sites which were dedicated to researching and debunking the story (and many other e-mail/web rumors.)

Each of those explained in large or small detail about the facts about retirement for congressional members, how the Secret Service is paid (and how any compensation wouldn't even come close to paying the Clintons mortgage payment.) Most of the other sites were various conservative groups quoting the e-mail directly, or Rush Limbaugh reading the story, etc. - but without any investigation, simply reciting the story as if it was the truth and raising the outrage.

I understand that the opinion columns in any newspaper are just that - opinions. But it's a major disservice to your readers to simply state something which is, at least, not entirely true, and at worst, a blatant misrepresentation of the facts.

It's been almost three years since the Clintons have left the White House, and I know how scared some people are of the thought of Hillary running for president. My dad would have hated it every bit as much as the biggest anti-Hillary conservative (I wish I could have seen his face when the possibility was first raised) but he would have been the first to tell you that using a newspaper to spread misinformation is not just irresponsible, it detracts from the idea of a free and informed debate and decision process.

With the Clarkston area growing immensely, this ordinance needs to change to no burn days unless you live on more than five acres of property, or even none at all. Cities around us like Waterford, Rochester Hills and Pontiac have updated to have no burn days at all.

It always happens every year when it is a beautiful day and a few residents burn their leaves and cause the majority to keep their houses closed up, not enjoying the nice weather. Not to mention I have to power wash my house every year, and the fact that breathing the air is not good for you.

I repeatedly have asked the board members, through e-mails and personal contact, to look at this and at least let the voters decide. They always skirt

the issue and will have someone look into it. But they never do.

According to U. S. Environmental Protection Agency studies, besides being an irritant, leaf smoke contains many hazardous chemicals, including carbon monoxide and benzo, pyrene. Carbon monoxide binds with hemoglobin in the bloodstream and thus reduces the amount of oxygen on the blood and lungs. So carbon monoxide can be very dangerous for young children with immature lungs, smokers, the elderly and people with chronic heart or lung diseases.

Benzo(a)pyrene is known to cause cancer in animals and is believed to be a major factor in lung cancer caused by cigarette smoke. It is found in cigarette smoke and coal tar as well as leaf smoke.

So let's let the voters decide.

### 15 YEARS AGO (1988)

- Clarkston Oaks shopping center, planned for eight acres on Dixie Highway, could solve a dispute between Independence Township and the developer of an apartment of an apartment complex behind the proposed site. Plans for the 72,000 square foot center include a private road that would connect Lancaster Lake Apartments behind the site to the traffic signal at Dixie Highway and Maybee Road.

- A split vote forced the village council to table a proposal from the Michigan Department of Transportation to construct a \$6,000 two-spot parking bay on Main Street. When the Michigan Department of Transportation installs the traffic signal at the intersection of Waldon Road and Main Street in Clarkston later this year, several on-street parking spaces will be removed to provide room for a left-hand turn lane.

- Deer Lake Beach has no lease, but beach-goers will have no worries this summer. Independence Township officials say, however, they will not operate the beach next season without one. At its June 21 meeting, the township board discusses the beach lease with village council president Sharron Catallo. The village owns the beach site. Council members did not want a renewal of the last five-year contract, said Catallo, adding the village did not want to take over beach operations.

### 25 YEARS AGO (1978)

- The Clarkston Village Council is forwarding engineering plans for widening the Holcomb-White Lake-Depot road intersection to the Oakland County Road Commission. Even though two broad revisions of the plan which upped the estimated construction costs for the project were introduced in the final blueprints, the Clarkston Village Council voted unanimously to submit the plans to the road commission for approval.

- Only local nonprofit organizations may operate concession stands during parade days, the Clarkston Village Council decided Monday night. The question arose when two parties requested permission to sell foods on the street during the Fourth of July parade from both the Clarkston Jaycees and a private individual. Council members feared that allowing both parties to sell food would set a precedent of commercializing Clarkston parades.

- The eight Independence Township firefighters are now officially members of the Michigan State Fire Fighters Union and International Association of Fire Fighters. Seven of the firefighters voted to join the unions. The eighth member was out of town. Membership in the union required 51 percent of the firefighters' approval.

### 50 YEARS AGO (1953)

- Frank Ronk and his committee of firefighters have the program for July 4 in Clarkston already lined up. The day will start with a parade at 10 a.m., which will assemble at Miller Road and North Main Street. After dusk the crowd will gather on the grounds at the Clarkston High School for a very fine display of fireworks.

- The women employees of the Clarkston State Bank honored Mrs. Duane Hursfall at a farewell dinner at Cromers Restaurant in Flint last Thursday eveing. She was presented with a gift.

- John Francis Bennett was a winner of the Detroit Edison 50th Anniversary Scholarships at the University of Michigan. The committee considered academic standing along with school and community activities.

It seems while walking along Washington by the Mill Pond, one of the babies fell into a storm sewer, Clarkston Police Chief Ernest Combs said.

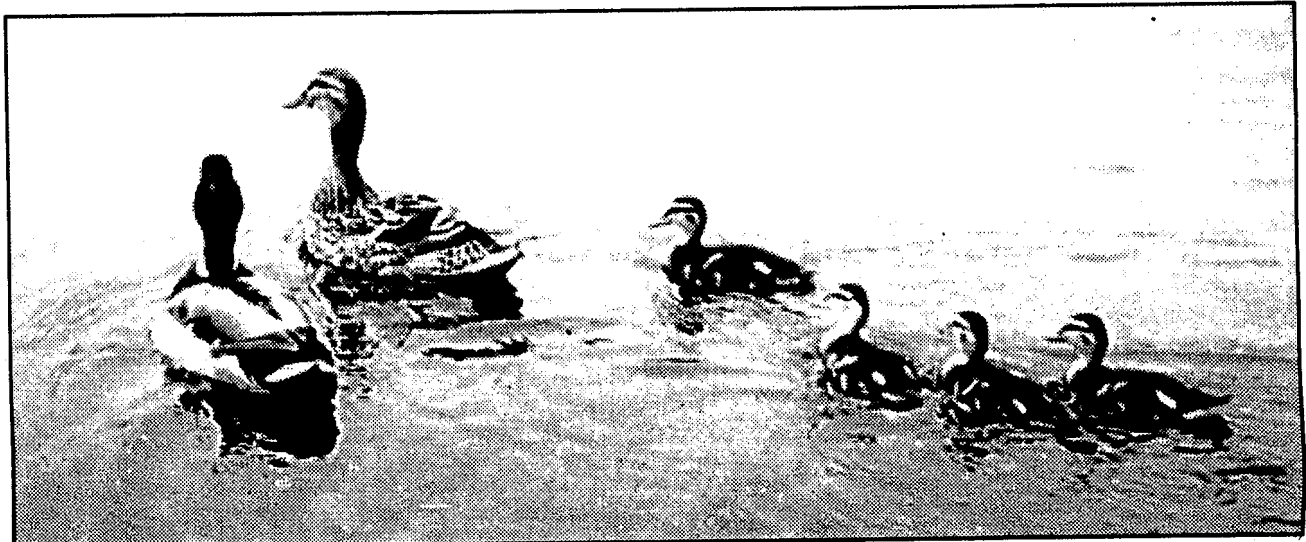
"But a citizen saw it and called the police department," he said.

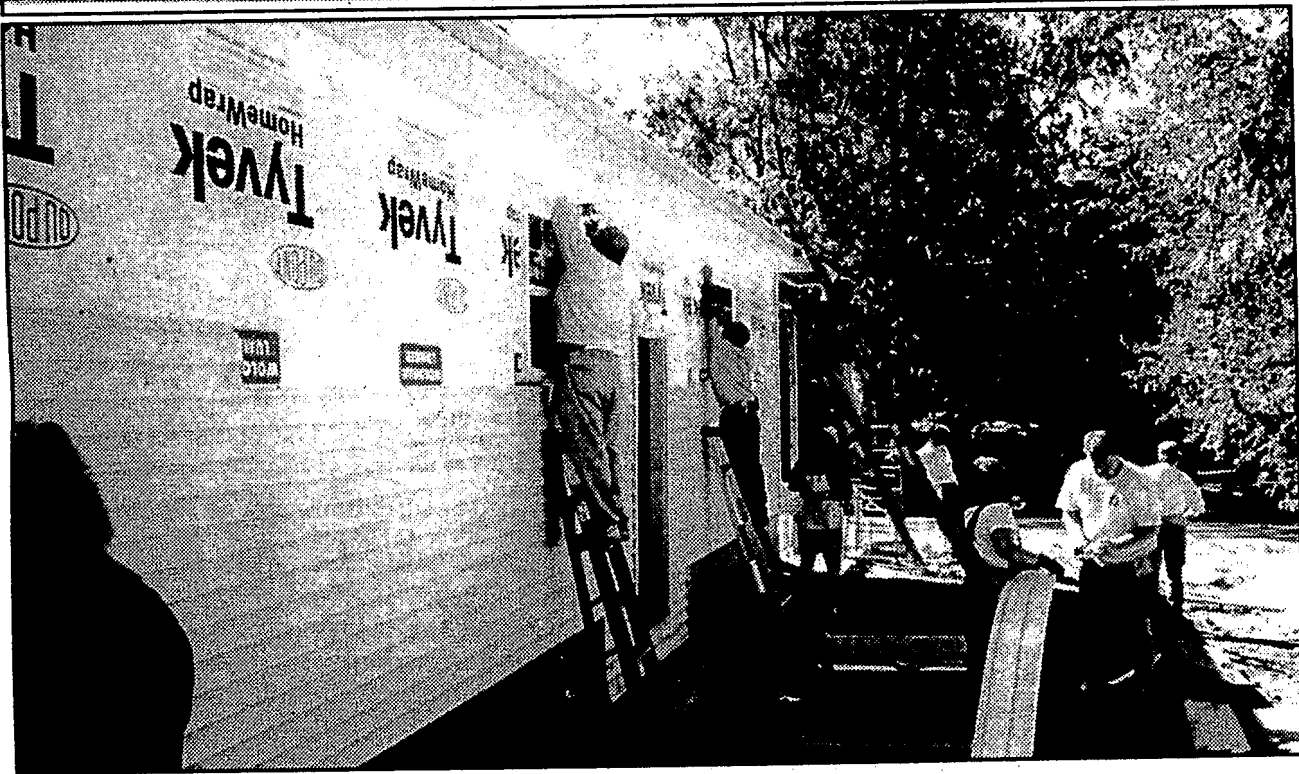

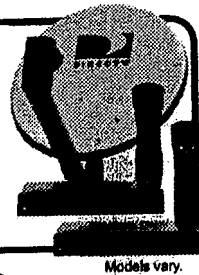

# Independence Township joins West Nile fight

Education and larvicide are the primary weapons to help prevent spread of the West Nile virus in Independence Township.

At a special meeting Thursday, June 12, trustees voted to approve a strategy including educational brochures mailed in property tax bills, application of larvicide in areas where carrier mosquitoes may breed and limited aerial spraying of adult mosquitoes.

The township will receive \$15,000 from Oakland County, and officials approved an additional \$50,000 from the general fund toward mosquito abatement.

Township DPW and parks employees will be called on to place larvicide packets in identified public catch basins.

Meanwhile, residents will be called on to inspect their own property for anything that could hold standing water. Buckets, toys, eavestroughs and other items should be cleaned, and items such as bird baths and pet water bowls should be changed at least twice a week, offi-

cials said.

The only aerial spraying would take place in areas such as township parks to protect people at evening events, according to Clerk Joan McCrary.

"It's in the trees above where they live," she said, and the spray will not be used near residential areas.

Officials have generally agreed that "functioning wetlands" are not a breeding ground for Culex or "urban" mosquitoes, the breed that carries the virus from infected birds.

"The main thing is that not all mosquitoes carry the virus," McCrary said.

## Teachers participate in math reform project

Clarkston Community Schools have been recognized for outstanding effort and commitment to improve mathematics instruction for teachers and students through a four-year Michigan Middle School Mathematics Reform Project.

The initiative, led by a district leadership team, involved 300 hours of professional development for middle school teachers, biannual conferences for the leadership team and workshops for middle school mathematics staff led by teacher leaders.

The Clarkston leadership team included John Diliiegghio, director of middle and high school; Kim Tayon, high school teacher; Mike Drystyniak, principal; and Staci Timmons Puzio, Missy Butki and Gerri Divine, teacher leaders.

Ninety school districts participated in the project at regional sites across Michigan.

The project was designed to prepare highly qualified teachers of middle school mathematics and provide faculty with exemplary classroom materials recognized by the American Association for the Advancement of Science as meeting the mathematical needs of the 21st century.

The project was coordinated by a team from Western Michigan University and funded by grants from the National Science Foundation, Michigan Department of Education, Herbert H. and Grace A. Dow Foundation, Steelcase Foundation, Dow Corning Foundation and the Rollin M. Gerstacker Foundation.

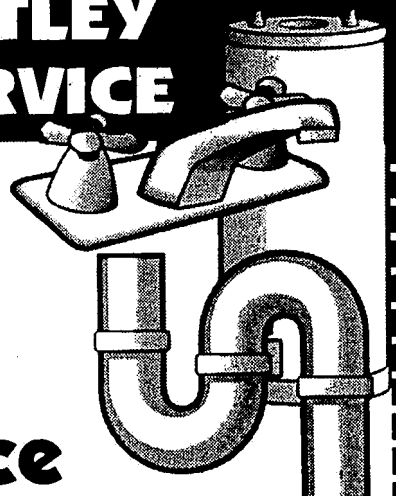

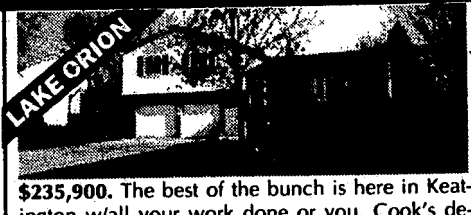

## Getting creative with your space

When entrepreneur Kathryn Kinney's career first began it was quite different than what it has become today.

The Clarkston resident had pursued figure skating since she was five-years-old. But while auditioning for the Ice Capades in Los Angeles in 1986, the then 36-year-old had a career-ending accident on the ice with a fellow skater.

Kinney did not know what she'd do next. "I needed a new thing," she remembers.

A friend invited her to move to Florida and offered her a job with Boca Raton Millworks. There, as a contract design coordinator, she was responsible for coordination of all companies involved in production and finalization of construction design detailing. Through Millworks, Kinney was sent to Nassau, Bahamas to coordinate construction of several floors of the Carnival Cruise Crystal Palace hotel.

So began her new career, which would take her through 13 years in design supervision for high rise and estate home construction.

Most recently, Kinney was the assistant superintendent in the construction design of a 30,000 square foot lobby area for the Montenero Pelican Bay, a multi-level luxury condominium complex in Naples, Fla.

But, for a number of reasons, Kinney resigned from the firm where she was employed. Mainly because she had the sudden urge she was needed back in Clarkston.

Kinney -- who grew up in Sault St. Marie, but whose family had a cabin on Walters Lake in Clarkston -- made the decision to drive back to Michigan to be with her mother who had been diagnosed with congestive heart failure.

Five hours after Kinney arrived in Clarkston, her mother suffered a heart attack. It was the first of three

heart attacks and eight visits to the emergency room.

For the next 18 months, Kinney would care for her mother, before she passed away in October 2002.

Now, her brother, Daniel, has also contracted the disease, and Kinney is caring for him.

"I'm supposed to be here," she said.

But Kinney said she does have time to leave the home for several hours of the day to work. So she decided to launch Space Creations, an interior design company.

It's a bit different than your typical interior design business. Kinney explained she uses materials the residents already have in their home, but does a creative redo.

Kinney -- whose business card reads "Creating beautiful spaces, with an eye for design and a hand for sewing" -- rummages through a homeowner's basement, shed or garage to find anything useful for remodeling.

"You can find phenomenal things," she said.

Kinney said her business is geared towards people who just don't have that

designer's touch.

"A lot of people don't know how to put things together."

And that's where Kinney's expertise comes in.

"I always wanted to do this really," she said, adding her services are great for people who don't want to spend a lot of money.

Since returning to Michigan, Kinney has worked on design projects at a farm house in Kalamazoo, a home

## New tax laws expand your investment opportunities

You've probably seen a lot of headlines on the Tax Relief Act of 2003. This legislation, recently signed into law by President Bush, will affect virtually everyone in the country. As an individual investor, you've got reasons to cheer the new tax laws. Many people will find that their taxes will decrease five percent or more under the new tax laws.

Let's review some of the tax act's key areas and see what actions they might suggest:

• **Lower dividend taxes:** If you've invested in dividend-paying stocks, your dividends were taxed at your individual tax rate (e.g., 27 percent, 30 percent, 35 percent or 38.6 percent.) But under the new laws, the tax rate on dividends will be cut to 15 percent. And if you're in the top 10 percent to 15 percent bracket, the dividend tax rate drops to five percent. These new, lower rates are effective retroactively to the beginning of 2003 through 2008. In 2009, dividend taxes are scheduled to revert to the old, higher rates.

Should you be interested in stocks that have a history of paying dividends, there are certain considerations to take into account. First, it's nice to get the dividends checks. (Keep in mind, though, that stocks do not offer a fixed rate of return and may not distribute dividends. Stocks are subject to market risks, including the potential loss of principal invested.) Also, when a company pays dividend, it can be a sign that

the business is well-run and concerned about the needs of its shareholders. Conditions can change at any time, but stocks with a track record of paying dividends tend to be more steady performers relative to non-dividend-paying stocks that have a limited track record.

Another advantage of dividend-paying stocks. Investors can consider reinvesting unneeded dividend income into additional shares of stocks.

• **Lower capital gains taxes:** The long-term capital gain rate has been reduced to 15 percent from 20 percent for many taxpayers. Taxpayers in the 10 percent and 15 percent ordinary income tax rate brackets will see a decrease in capital gains taxes from 10 percent to five percent. All of these reductions are effective for sales of securities after May 5, 2003. As is the case with dividend taxes, the new rate will remain in place through 2008.

If you've held some stocks for many years, and they've appreciated significantly, then the cut in capital gain taxes may benefit you greatly. Previously, you may have avoided selling these stocks - even if your diversification needs have changed - because you didn't want

to face a big tax hit.

Now, however, with the new, lower capital gain rate, you'll find it much more affordable to sell these stocks and make the changes you need to help you properly balance your portfolio. But talk to your tax professional as tax considerations should not be the driving factor for making investment decisions.

Other beneficial changes in the tax laws include:

• **Lower tax rates:** Earlier tax law changes lowered tax brackets for 2006, but the new legislation has sped up the timetable, so that the new rates are retroactively effective on Jan. 1, 2003. The 10 percent and 15 percent rates remain unchanged, but the 27 percent rate drops to 25 percent; the 30 percent rate drops to 28 percent; the 35 percent rate falls to 33 percent; and the 38.6 percent rate drops to 35 percent.

• **Reduction of Marriage Penalty:** Married couples who claim the standard deduction should benefit from this accelerated reduction of the marriage penalty tax. The standard deduction for married couples is increased to double the amount of the standard deduction for single taxpayers in 2003 and 2004.

• **Increase in Child Tax Credit:** The amount of the child tax credit is increased to \$1,000 (from

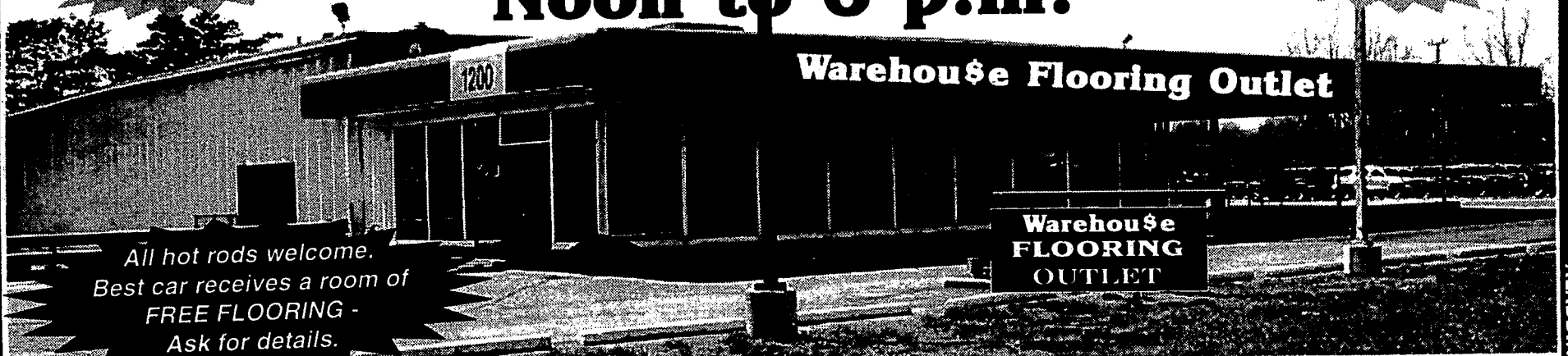

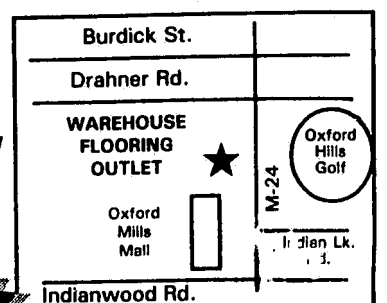

## Two arrested for breaking and entering

Two men were arrested and arraigned last week for breaking and entering in Springfield Township, and are thought to be responsible for several similar acts throughout Oakland County.

Daniel Howard Carpenter and Nathan Allen Hundley, both of White Lake, are in custody and were arraigned Friday, June 20 at the 52-2 District Court in Clarkston after burglarizing the Town and Country Market in Davisburg, June 18.

Both are charged with breaking and entering a building with intent, a 15-year felony.

Deputies from the Oakland County Sheriff's Department in Springfield Township were dispatched late Wednesday night to the market, which was found with a shattered glass entrance door and inside in disarray.

The suspect vehicle, a Lumina van, was spotted travelling westbound on White Lake. When a traffic stop

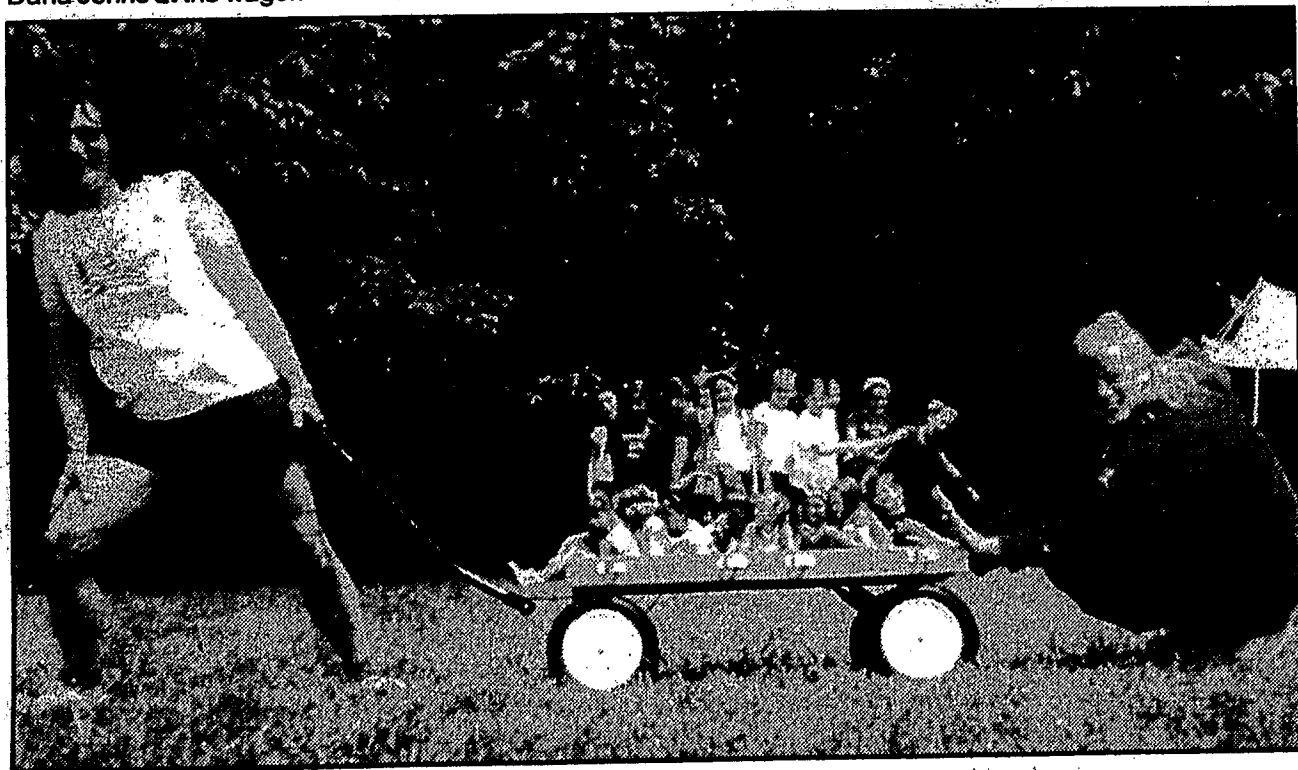

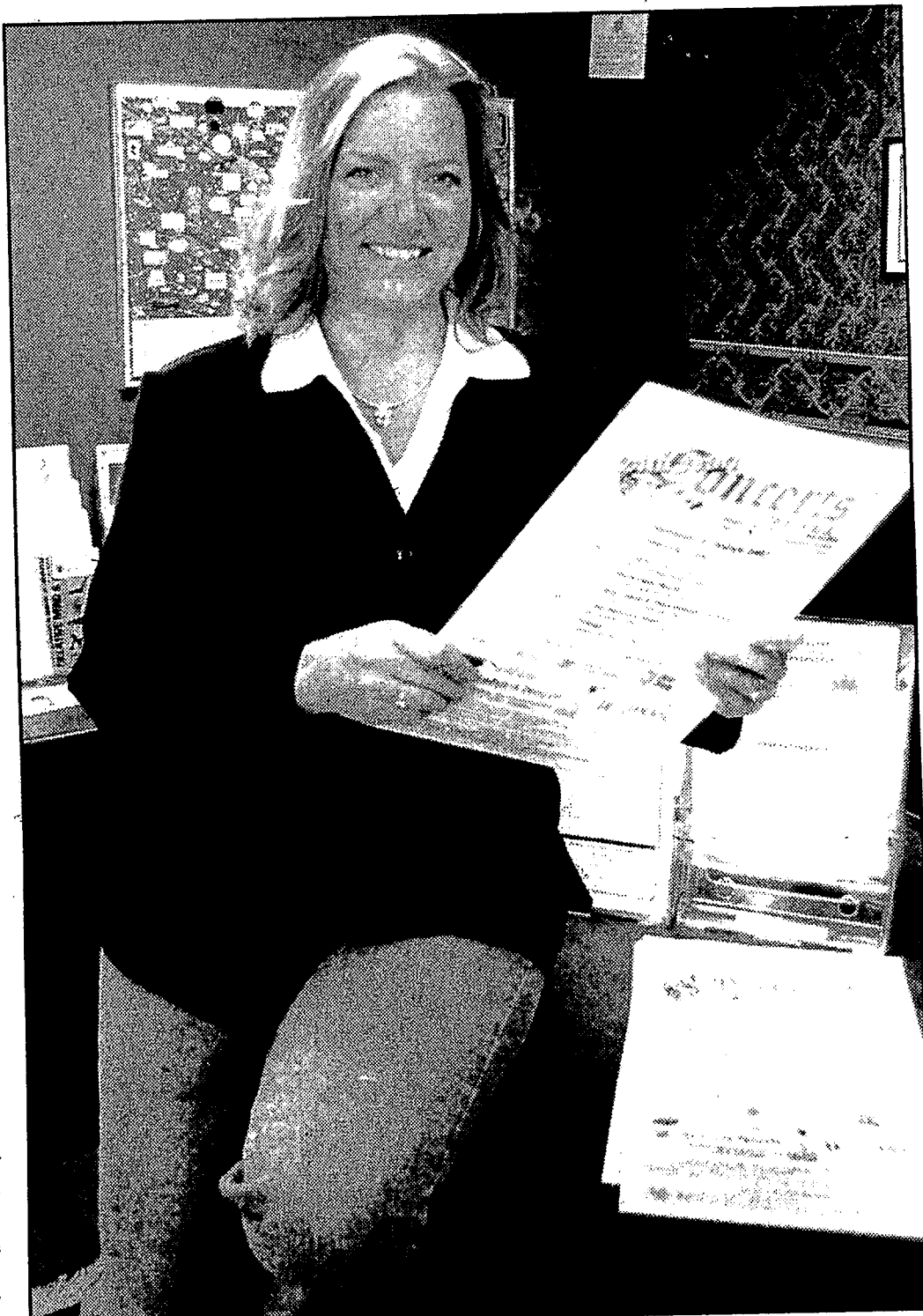
All the volunteer work led to a job offer as a part time administrative assistant with the Chamber.

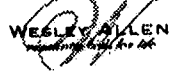
Shanks is also extremely excited about the Chamber golf outing which is slated for

Shanks isn't the only one in her family working hard for the community. Her husband Kurt Shanks is the outgoing president

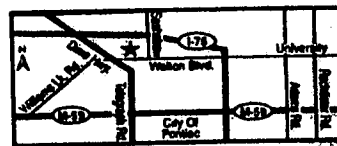

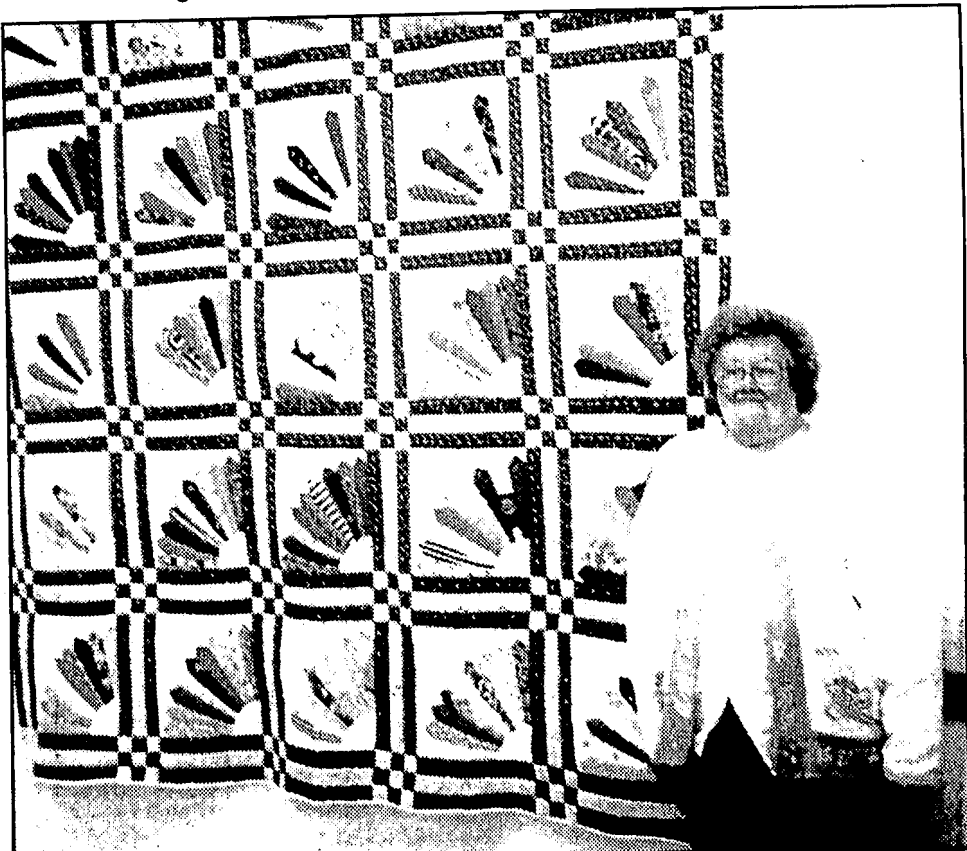

## Trees to honor school trustees

Trees will be planted as a lasting tribute to the service of Kurt Shanks and Janet Thomas, whose final school board meeting was Monday.

The Clarkston Board of Education voted June 9 to plant a tree in a location chosen by each. With each tree will be a commemorative plaque noting their years of service.

Each received standing ovations from the audience after fellow trustees offered tributes.

Trustee Mary Ellen McLean smiled when she said Thomas "came from the other side" when he moved to Clarkston from Rochester. Noting his service since 1995, McLean said he had been board treasurer and a bond campaign chairman as well.

"His integrity I don't think anyone could question," she said.

Shanks, who joked about losing control of the meeting agenda, offered thanks for the tributes and said, "It has been a pleasure."

Board Vice President Karen Foyteck outlined the changes in both culture and schools since Thomas joined the school board in 1975. She called Thomas' service to the district "extraordinary" and credited her with "steadfast dedication to students."

Shanks later said he has chosen Clarkston High School to be the location for his tree.

"The high school has meant a lot to me," he said, noting his work with the bond issue campaign that led to its construction. "It's something I take pride in. It stands for what this district is all about."

Shanks said one of his greatest satisfactions has been "working with a tremendous team of people." On the other hand, he has asked colleagues to give him a full year off from any school volunteer work.

"My wife and I are making a lot of plans," he said.

Thomas doesn't yet know where she will ask to have a tree planted.

"I'm still thinking. All my kids went to Pine Knob, so that's an option. Sashabaw Middle School, where all my kids went, will need some landscaping when they're done [with renovations], so I just don't know."

Thomas' history with the district made it difficult to focus on only one memory, but she summed it up succinctly.

"It's been rewarding to be able to work with the staff and the community," she said.

The fireworks are sponsored by the Clarkston Area Chamber of Commerce, Independence Township Parks and Recreation and Clarkston Rotary.

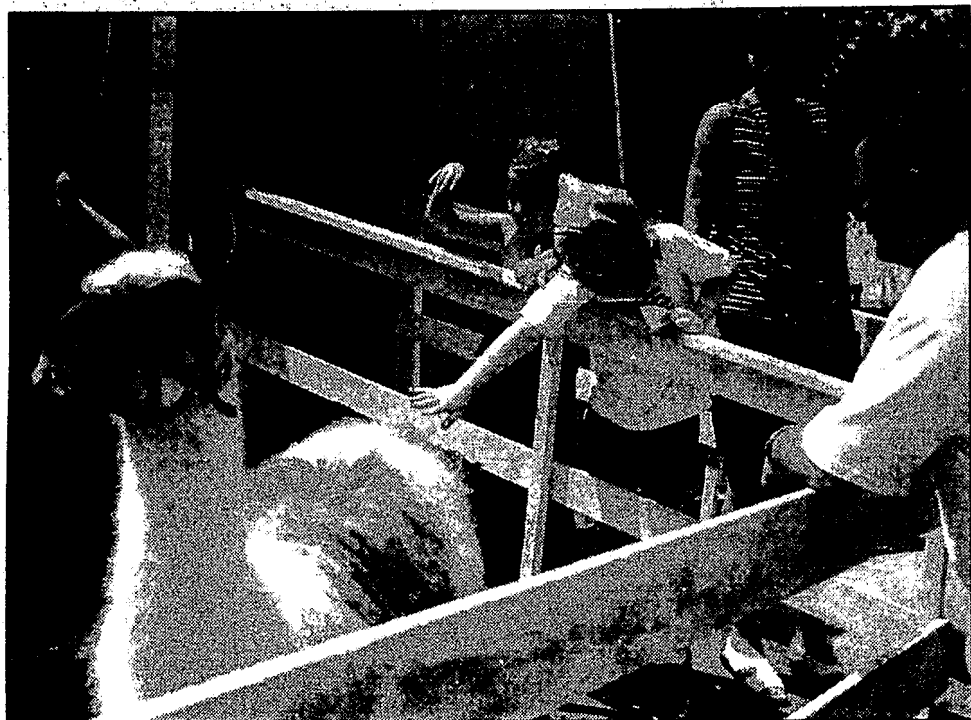

Arcello said an event like this is important in Clarkston.

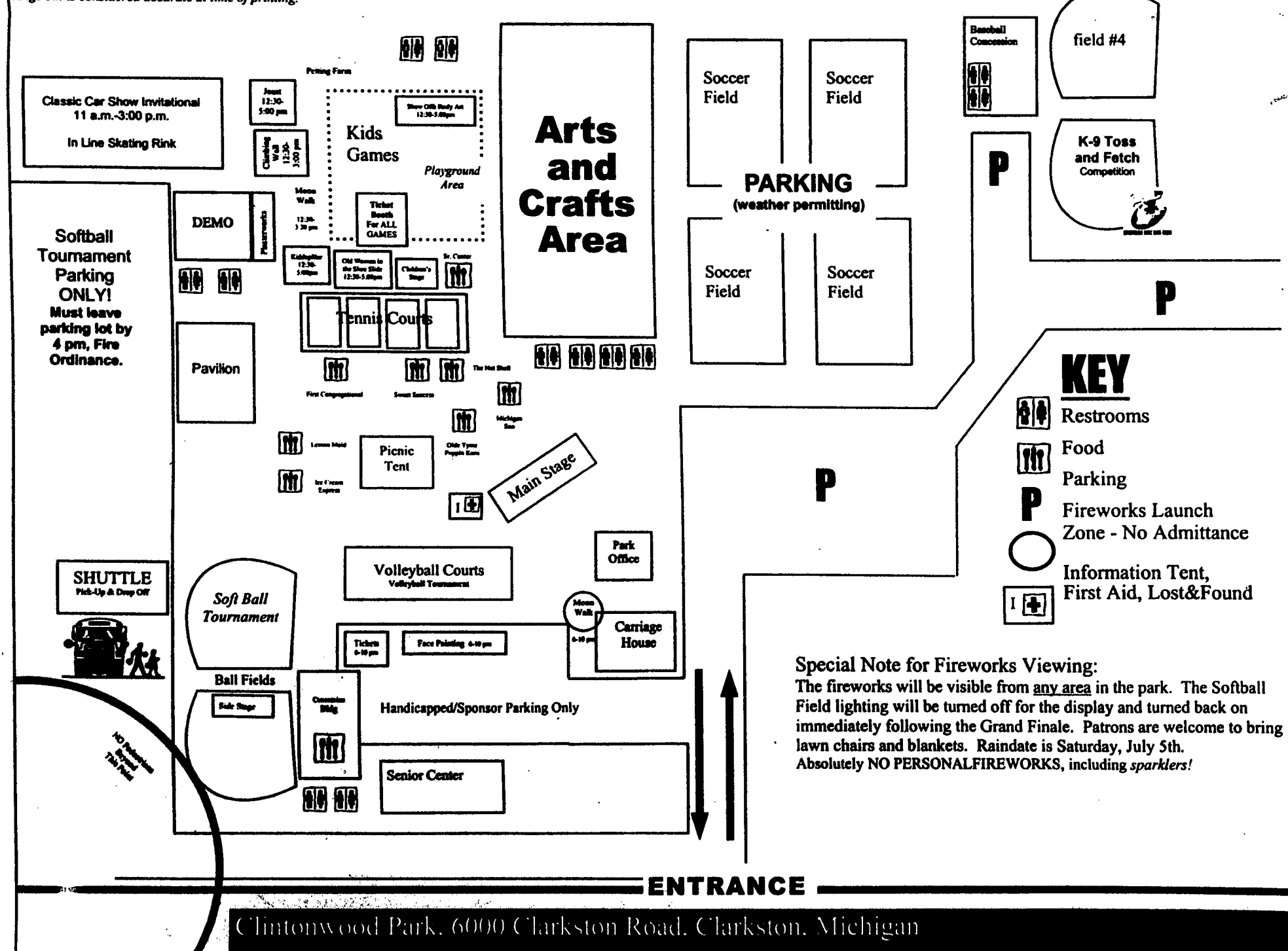

To help, a partial list of proper flag etiquette is printed below. Call a local veterans organization and request a full copy of the flag code to learn more.

## Standards of Respect

- The flag should never be dipped to any person or thing. It is flown upside down only as a distress signal.
- The flag should not be used as drapery, for covering a speaker's desk, draping a platform or for any decoration in general. Bunting is available for these purposes. The blue strip of the bunting should be on top.
- The flag should never be used for any advertising purpose. It should not be embroidered, printed or otherwise impressed on such articles as cushions, handkerchiefs, napkins, boxes or anything intended to be discarded after temporary use.
- The flag should not be used as part of a costume or athletic uniform, except that a flag patch may be used on the uniform of military personnel, firemen, policemen and members of patriotic organizations.
- The flag should never have placed on it, or attached to it, any mark, insignia, letter, work, number, figure or drawing of any kind.
- The flag should never be used as a re-

ceptacle for receiving, holding, carrying or delivering anything.

- The flag should be cleaned and mended when needed.
- When the flag is lowered, no part of it should touch the ground or any other object; it should be received by waiting hands and arms. To store the flag it should be folded neatly and ceremoniously.

## Displaying the Flag Outdoors

- When the flag is displayed from a staff projecting from a window, balcony or building, the union (stars) should be at the peak of the staff unless at half staff.
- When displayed from the same flagpole with another flag, the flag of the United States must always be at the top except the church pennant may be flown above

the flag during church services for Navy personnel when conducted by a Naval chaplain on a ship at sea.

- When the flag is displayed over a street, it should hang vertically with the union to the north or east. If the flag is suspended over a sidewalk, the flag's union should be farthest from the building.
- When flown with the flags of states, communities or societies on separate flag poles of the same height and in a straight line, the flag of the United States is always placed in the position of honor -- to its own right. The other flags may not be larger, and the flag of the United States is always the first raised and last lowered.
- When flown with the national banner of other countries, each flag must be displayed from a separate pole of the same

height, raised and lowered simultaneously.

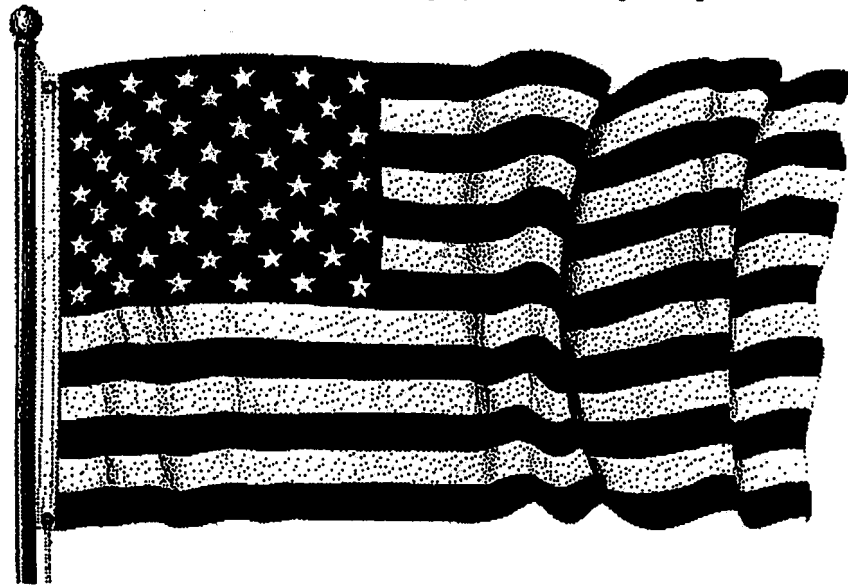
- The flag should be raised briskly and lowered slowly and ceremoniously. Ordinarily the flag should be displayed only between sunrise and sunset. It should be illuminated if displayed at night. The flag is saluted as it is hoisted and lowered. The salute is held until the flag is unsnapped from the halyard or through the last note of music, whichever is longest.

## The Salute

- To salute, all persons come to attention. Those in uniform give the appropriate formal salute. Citizens not in uniform salute by placing their right hand over their heart and men with head cover should remove it and hold it to left shoulder, hand over the heart.

## Displaying the Flag Indoors

- When on display, the flag is always positioned to its own right. Place it to the right of the speaker, staging area or sanctuary. Other flags should be to the left.
- The flag should be center and highest of a group of flags of states, localities or societies displayed.
- When one flag is used with the flag of the United States and the staffs are crossed, the flag of the United States is placed at its own right with its staff in front.
- When displaying the flag against a wall, the flag's union should be at the top, to its own right and to the observer's left.

# The Clarkston tradition continues

For more than 60 years the Independence Township Fire Department has made the streets of Clarkston come alive with the joys of the Fourth of July parade.

Time may have brought some changes in technicalities, but the parade remains an event full of fun, celebrating independence, and becoming a lasting tradition with Clarkston families.

Back in the day, when fire headquarters was the Station #1 on Church Street where the city police call home today, the parade was less structured.

"People would dress up and just show up at the old high school and they could be in the parade. There was no organization," Peggy North said, Fire Department secretary and parade coordinator for the past 14 years.

Now the parade has doubled in size, with an average 100 entries, and has grown to include grandstands;

a sound system with announcers Dale Ryan, the "voice of the Clarkston Wolves," and "sidekick" Dave Tinkus; an F16 fly-over from Selfridge Air Force base, and much more.

And it used to be only "Clarkstonites" attended the festivities, now North said, people come from all over. "We get calls (inquiring about the parade) from all over Oakland County."

It seems spectators take their parade very seriously these days. "People start coming to town at six or seven in the morning and tie their chairs down in place," Luke Studt said, fellow Fire Department secretary and parade coordinator.

This year's parade, whose theme is patriotism, will run from 10 a.m. to 11:30 a.m., starting from Clarkston Middle School on Waldon Road, traveling down Main Street and Miller, and dispersing at St. Daniel Catholic Church off Holcomb.

"This is a tradition in Clarkston and we want to carry

that tradition on," Studt said.

North agreed. "The biggest significance is that we're celebrating Independence Day in Independence Township. It's a tradition that started 60-some years ago and continues strong today."

## Attention parade participants

The Independence Township Fire Department asks July 4 parade participants to gather to form the procession at 9 a.m. at the Clarkston Middle School on Waldon Road. This allows time to get into orderly procession and assures the parade will be making its way down Main Street by 10 a.m. Come prepared with drinking water, snacks, sunscreen, etc. No restroom facilities are available in the staging area. Parade route ends at Holcomb and Miller Road at St. Daniel's Church.

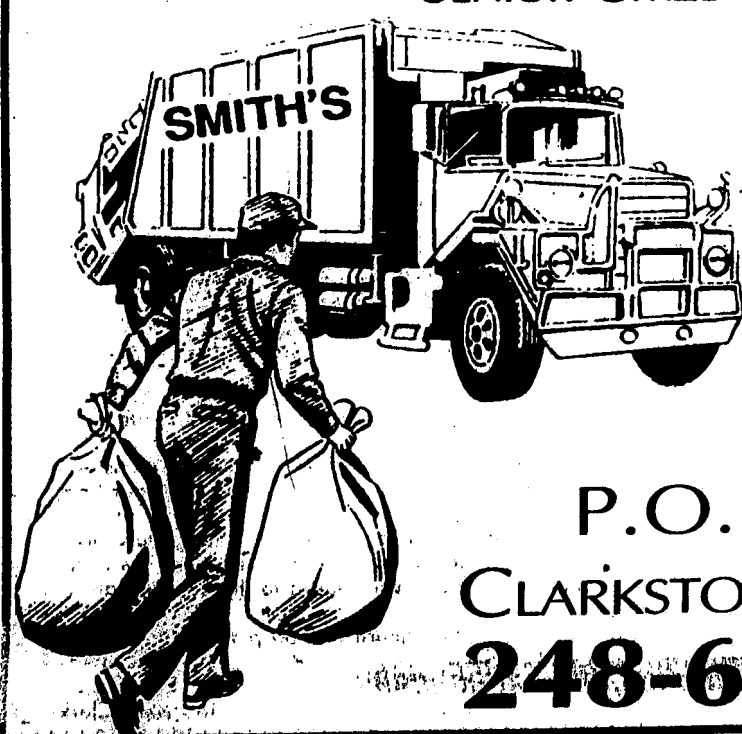

An Ordinance to amend, Chapter 19, Article II, Division I, Section 19-16 to adopt by reference the October 2002 Edition of the Uniform Traffic Code for Cities, Townships, and Villages (UTC) for the purpose of regulating traffic and motor vehicles in the Charter Township of Independence.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF INDEPENDENCE ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

#### Section 1 of Ordinance

Chapter 19, Article II of the Ordinance Code is amended by amending the Title of Division I, and the Heading that precedes it to read as follows:

**ARTICLE II. TRAFFIC CODE**  
**DIVISION I. UNIFORM TRAFFIC CODE**

#### Section 2 of Ordinance

This Ordinance is adopted for the purpose and intent to adopt by reference the October 2002 Edition of the Uniform Traffic Code for Cities, Townships, and Villages (UTC) promulgated by the director of the Michigan Department of State Police pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328 and made effective October 30, 2002, and all future amendments and revisions to the Uniform Traffic Code when they are promulgated and effective in this state, for the regulation of traffic and motor vehicles in the Charter Township of Independence. The further purpose and intent of this Ordinance is to rescind the previous version of the Uniform Traffic Code. Section 19-16 of the Ordinance code shall be amended to read as follows:

#### Sec. 19-16. Adoption.

The Uniform Traffic Code for Cities, Townships, and Villages is in full force and effect as promulgated by the Director of the Michigan Department of State Police pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328 and made effective October 30, 2002, and all future amendments and revisions of the Uniform Traffic Code when they are promulgated and effective in this state, are incorporated by reference.

#### Section 3 of Ordinance

Chapter 19 of the Ordinance Code is further amended hereby by adding Sections 19-16.1 through 19-16.3 as follows:

#### Sec. 19-16.1. References.

References to "municipality" or "governmental unit" in the Uniform Traffic Code for Cities, Townships, and Villages shall mean the Charter Township of Independence.

#### Sec. 19-16.2. Copies.

Printed complete copies of the October 2002 edition of the Uniform Traffic Code for Cities, Townships, and Villages shall be kept on file in the office of the Township Clerk and made available to the public at all times the office is open.

#### Sec. 19-16.3. Penalties.

The penalties provided in the Uniform Traffic Code for Cities, Townships, and Villages are adopted by reference.

#### Section 4 of Ordinance

If any provision of this Ordinance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions that can be given effect without the invalid provision. All proceedings pending and all rights and liabilities existing, acquired or incurred at the time this Ordinance takes effect are saved and may be consummated according to the law when they were commenced.

#### Section 5 of Ordinance

A summary of this Ordinance shall be published in accordance with the Charter of the township or independence and this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon the publication of the summary.
